- "Cattle" means and includes any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, and foal; any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, and calf; any ram, ewe, wether, and lamb; any mule, ass, goat, boar or sow.
- 2. No person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal on, upon, or along any footway or footpath constructed for foot-passengers only within the district.
- 3. No person shall wheel any barrow or truck, or use, drive, or conduct any velocipede, bicycle, tricycle, or other vehicle of any description on, upon, or along any footway or footpath constructed for foot-passengers only within the district.
- 4. No person shall leave or allow to remain upon any district road or any district bridge, or upon or over any channel or surface drain in any district road, any logs, timber, bricks, stone, building or other materials, so that such logs, timber, bricks, stone, building or other materials shall be a source of danger, or shall delay, impede, or obstruct the passage of any person, horse, or vehicle over such district road.
- 5. No person shall, upon any district road, except at places which shall have been appointed by the Board for the purpose, load any vehicle with or place upon or attach to any vehicle any timber or logs.
- 6. No person shall use or allow to be used any sledge for the carriage or transport of logs, timber, or other materials along or on any district road or district bridge, and no person shall permit, suffer, or allow any logs, timber, or other materials to be dragged on or along any district road.
- 7. No person shall take any engine, agricultural or other machine, or any load or materials of any kind weighing more than 2½ tons avoirdupois, on one pair of wheels across any district bridge without the written sanction of the Board first had and obtained.
- 8. No person shall drive or ride at other than a walking-pace across or upon any district bridge which has a span of 20 ft. or upwards.
- 9. No person shall, at other than a walking-pace, drive, lead, or take any horses, cattle, engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle across or upon any district bridge which has a span of 20 ft. or upwards.
- 10. Each vehicle mentioned in the first column of the First Schedule of these by-laws which shall be driven, taken, or used upon or over any district road or district bridge from the 21st day of May to the 21st day of October in each and every year, and having the number of wheels mentioned on the same line in the second column of the said Schedule, and carrying the maximum weight mentioned on the same line in the third column of the said Schedule, shall have the minimum width of tire mentioned on the same line in the fourth column of the said Schedule; and if the width of the tires of the wheels, or any of them, of such vehicle be less than is required by the said First Schedule, the owner and driver of such vehicle shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law.
- 11. For the purpose of these by-laws the number or quantity mentioned in the second column of the Second Schedule to these by-laws of the articles mentioned on the same lines in the first column of the Second Schedule will be deemed a weight of 1 ton.
- 12. Any person acting under the authority of the Board may at all times examine and measure the tires of the wheels of any vehicle, and may examine, weigh, and measure any vehicle, or the load thereon, which in his

opinion infringes these by laws; and no person shall obstruct or interfere with the person acting under such authority, or refuse to permit such examination and measurement.

13. Every person who shall commit a breach of or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and for such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5.



Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 532, against 431 in February—an increase of 101. The deaths in March were 206, a decrease of 19 on the number in February. Of the total deaths, males contributed 120, females 86. Eighty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 39.80 per cent. of the whole number; 73 of these were under one year of age.

Eighty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 35 50 per cent. of the whole number, 10 of these were under one year of age.

There were forty-four deaths of persons of 65 years of age and upwards: Six men, 70, 71, 72, 73, 78, 79, and five women, 72, 73, 78 (two), 89, died at Auckland; five men, 66, 71, 72, 74, 85, and four women, 68 (two), 84 (two), at Wellington; six men, 66, 69, 71, 74, 78, 82, and five women, 66, 71, 72, 73, 75, at Christchurch; and seven men, 65, 66, 67, 70, 72, 78 (two), and six women, 67, 69, 74 (two), 77, 79, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Wellington and Dunedin, but raises it at Auckland and Christchurch.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality for March at the four centres and their suburbs comprised 29 deaths in this class, of which 21 were attributable to diarrhoeal diseases—9 at Auckland, 3 at Wellington, 2 at Christchurch, and 7 at Dunedin. Of 6 deaths from miasmatic diseases, 5 were by typhoid fever—4 at Auckland and 1 at Dunedin. Influenza caused 1 death at Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths numbered 31 at the four centres—14 being from cancer, 10 from phthisis, and 6 from other tubercular diseases. One death from rheumatic heart-disease completes the total.

Local Diseases.—Of 109 deaths, 24 resulted from diseases of the nervous system, 23 of the circulatory, 10 of the respiratory, 42 of the digestive, 2 of the lymphatic, 7 of the urinary, and 1 of the integumentary systems.

Violent Deaths.—There were 9 accidental and 3 suicidal. Of the accidental deaths, 2 were caused by electric trams, 1 by fall from cab, 1 by brain-compression, 1 by shooting, 1 by falling on a glass bottle, 1 by falling into boiler, 1 by drowning, 1 by strangulation. Of suicides, 2 were by shooting and 1 by poison.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
