WHEREAS by section five of "The Inebriates Institutions Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations, which shall be published in the New Zealand Gazette, for the management, supervision, inspection, and regulation of institutions for inebriates, and for the care, treatment, and release of, and for the discipline and conduct to be observed by, patients and residents therein, and for the fees payable by patients and residents therein, and generally for the better carrying out the purposes of the said Act as it affects the said institutions, and the officers, patients, and residents therein: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the regulation set out in the Schedule hereto should be made: should be made:

should be made:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the hereinbefore-recited powers, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby, for the purposes of the said Act, make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto, and declare that it shall apply to every institution for inebriates under the said Act, and shall be read with and form part of the regulations made by the Governor in Council on the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and two.

Any patient who is in business on his own account may within the first week of his committal to an institution for inebriates, submit to the Superintendent for approval the name of an agent authorised to conduct his business. If the name or an agent authorised to conduct his business. If the agent so nominated is approved by the Superintendent he shall be allowed to visit and correspond with the patient without restriction. If the agent in any way supplies intoxicating drink to any patient, or assists or connives in the procuring of intoxicating drink for any patient, his privileges as agent under this regulation shall be withdrawn.

foregoing accounts have been examined and found correct, subject to the following remarks:—
(1.) The "Customs," "Railways," and "Territorial Revenue" receipts are not now examined by the Audit Office.
(2.) The Audit Office is unable satisfactorily to verify the receipts of gold revenue through the failure of the Mines Department to comply with a requisition for a certified statement of the amounts collectible as such revenue.
(3.) The "advances in the hands of officers of the Government" include payments to the amount of £12,751 5s. 4d., though the accounts of the same were received at the Treasury before the close of the year.

Locality and Description of Township of Otorohanga.

Otorohanga Township is situated within what is known as the King-country, on the North Island Main Trunk Railway-line, 114 miles from Auckland and fourteen miles from Te Awamutu. It is the oldest of the European settlements in the King-country, but it is only now that Europeans are able to obtain valid titles to the land there. There is a considerable European and Maori population at Otorohanga at the present time, and it has been known for some years past as a thriving business-place. There is a large area of Crown land in the vicinity, a great deal of which has already been taken up, and as settlement progresses Otorohanga will become a place of considerable importance. There is a daily train service to it from Auckland. There is a sawmill in the township employing a number of workmen both in the mill and in the adjacent bush. There is a Board school, a public hall, a temperance hotel, and a Methodist church in the township, and a creamery within a distance of four miles. There is a graded and formed road from Otorohanga leading to Kihikihi, Te Awamutu, and other parts of Waipa and Waikato Counties. Otorohanga is within easy reach of the celebrated Waitomo Caves, and is the nearest place to them at which proper accommodation for tourists can be obtained. The township is laid out in a pretty valley on the west side of the railway-station site and the railway-line. It is bounded on the south and east by the Waipa River, which has been well stocked with trout. LOCALITY AND DESCRIPTION OF TOWNSHIP.

Karewa Township lies about 12 chains from the original Karewa Township, a surveyed road connecting the two. There is steamer communication weekly from Onehunga, distant about 140 miles; also coach-road from Pirongia to Oparau, thence about eight miles by steam-launch to the township. The land is generally undulating, covered with grass, fern, and tea-tree; the N.W. corner is swampy, but capable of being drained; the S.E. portion is flat grass land.
