management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid fix and determine whether all or any, and if so what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by any local authority or local authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid direct how, when, and to whom such payment is to be made:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct that the bridge known as the Wangaehu Bridge, at Kauangaroa, shall, from and after the date of this Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Council of the County of Rangitikei; and in further pursuance of the aforesaid powers and authorities I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge shall be borne by the Council of the County of Rangitikei and the Council of the County of Wanganui in the proportion of one-half of the cost respectively.

And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Council of the County of Wanganui shall be paid from time to time in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed out of the funds of the said county, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Council of the County of Rangitikei, and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said Council for and on account of such Council.

Licensing Trustees for the Port Chalmers Sailing Club to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Otago Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twentieth day of December, 1904.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, the Port Chalmers Sailing Club, of Port Chalmers (hereinafter called "the club"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license, under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore at Port Chalmers, in Otago Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a boat-shed; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 2781, two sheets), showing the place where it is intended to erect such boat-shed, the area of foreshore to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the boat-shed: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to Walter Brown Morgan, of Port Chalmers, engineer, George Leyon Asher, of Port Chalmers, clerk, and George Stephens, of Port Chalmers, ironmonger, as trustees for the club, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the trustees for the club as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the said trustees for the club to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated in red edging on the plan marked M.D. 2781 (sheet 1) so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a boat-shed, such license to be held and enjoyed by the said trustees upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such boat-shed, which is shown in red edging on the plan marked M.D. 2781 (sheet 1), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the said trustees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of ten shillings, payable on the first day of December, dating from the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and four, the first of such annual payments to be made on the said trustees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said boat-shed without payment.

5. The said trustees shall complete the erection of the said boat-shed in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 2781 (sheet 2), within six calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

6. The said trustees shall maintain the above-mentioned boat-shed in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said boat-shed and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the said trustees, or either of them, a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such boat-shed, requiring them within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the said trustees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said trustees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may at any time be resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said trustees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the said trustees for the club or either of them.

11. The said trustees shall be liable for any injury which the said boat-shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part or the part of the club.

12. In case the said trustees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boat-shed for the purposes aforesaid; or
- (3.) In case the club be in any manner wound up or dissolved,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the said trustees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the said trustees and to the club, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. The erection of the boat-shed shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the said trustees of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

Removing Restrictions against Alienation of Native Land.

PLUNKET, Governor.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Maori Land Laws Amendment Act, 1903," it is enacted that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, or in any Crown grant or other instrument of title, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Council, remove any restriction on the alienation of land owned by Maoris: Provided that the decision of the Governor on any recommendation of the Council shall be given within six months from the date of the receipt of such recommendation:

And whereas the Aotea District Maori Land Council, by recommendations made and passed by the said Council on the twenty-first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and four, and received on the fifteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and four, recommended His Excellency the Governor to vary or remove and revoke the restrictions against alienation contained in the instruments of title of the blocks of land particularised and set out in the Schedule hereunder written, so far as to permit the said lands to be leased:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon and vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities me thereunto enabling, and in accordance with the recommendation of the Aotea District Maori Land Council aforesaid, do hereby remove and revoke the restrictions now existing against the alienation of the blocks of land particularised and set out in the Schedule hereto, so far as to permit the said lands to be leased.

Rural Land in Marlborough Land District open for Selection on Lease in Perpetuity.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section one hundred and thirty-six of "The Land Act, 1892," and section two of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare and provide as follows, that is to say:—

1. The rural land enumerated in the Schedule hereto is hereby set apart for disposal by way of selection on and after the sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, at the rental specified in the said Schedule.

THE SPRINGS ROAD BOARD.

Grass-seed By-law.

A BY-LAW of the Body Corporate called the Inhabitants of the Springs Road District, made on the 13th Day of January, 1905, to regulate the Cutting of Grass-seed on the Roads of the District.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred upon and vested in them by "The Road Boards Act, 1882," and its amendments, "The Public Works Act, 1894," and its amendment, and "The Public Works Amendment Act, 1904," and every other power them hereto enabling, the inhabitants of the Springs Road District do hereby, by special order, make and ordain this by-law.

1. The short title of the by-law shall be "The Grass-seed By-law."
2. In this by-law—
"Board" means the Springs Road Board;
"Chairman" means the Chairman for the time being of the Springs Road Board;
"Clerk" means the Clerk for the time being of the Springs Road District.
3. No person shall, at any time after the coming into operation of this by-law, at any period of the year cut for seed any grass then growing upon any of the roads in the Springs Road District, under the control of the Springs Road Board, without the previous consent in writing of the said Board under the hand of the Chairman or Clerk thereof.
4. No person shall hereafter, at any period of the year, cut for any purpose whatsoever any grass then growing upon any of the roads in the Springs Road District, under the control of the said Board, without the previous consent in writing of the said Board under the hand of the Chairman or Clerk thereof.
5. Any person committing a breach of sections 3 or 4 of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
6. The Board shall be, and is hereby, empowered to cut, reap, harvest, thresh, sell, and dispose of all grass for seed, or, if it shall think fit, to sell and dispose of the right to cut and harvest all grass for seed for the time being growing upon any of the roads in the said district under its control to any person or persons whomsoever, and either by public auction, public tender, or private treaty, and upon such terms and conditions in all respects as it shall think fit.
7. All moneys received by the said Board from the sale and disposition of the said grass for seed, or the right to cut and harvest such grass-seed as aforesaid, shall belong to and form part of the Road Board Fund.
8. This by-law shall come into operation upon its being gazetted.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 6th February, 1905, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 30th January, 1905.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1904; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1904, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under "The Public Libraries Act, 1869," or "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900," pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; and from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions, pounds shillings and pence. And I do solemnly and sincerely declare that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received during the year was expended in the purchase of books for the library; and that by the rules of the library it is open to the public free of charge.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1882." (Signature.)

Physical Requirements for Candidates for Commissions in the Royal Navy.

THE undermentioned particulars as to the physical examination of candidates for commissions in the Royal Navy, received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, are published for general information.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS IN THE ROYAL NAVY.

WITH a view to preventing candidates who may be physically unfit for His Majesty's service from incurring the inconvenience and expense of preparing for commissions in the Royal Navy, it is suggested that they undergo examination by the medical adviser of the family, or any other qualified medical practitioner, to whom the following points may be submitted as those upon which candidates will, previous to entry, be physically examined at the Admiralty.

It is to be understood that this private examination is merely suggested as a guide for intending candidates, and to lessen the chances of disappointment, and that it is by no means intended to take the place of, or to influence in any way, the regular official physical examination.

1. A weak constitution, imperfect development, physical weakness, either hereditary or from chronic disease, wounds, or injuries.

2. Skin-disease, unless temporary or trivial.

3. Malformation of the head, deformity from fracture or depression of the bones of the skull, impaired intellect, epilepsy, paralysis, or impediment of speech.

4. Blindness or defective vision, imperfect perception of colours, fistula lachrymalis, or any chronic disease of the eyes or eyelids. Full normal vision is required as determined by Snellen's tests, each eye being separately examined, for all candidates for appointments in the executive or engineer branches, and for the Royal Marines.* Full normal vision is not required for candidates for other branches of the Royal Navy, but any defect of vision must be due to errors of refraction which can be corrected to normal by glasses, and each case will be specially considered on its merits.

5. Impaired hearing, or discharge from one or both ears, or any disease of the external, middle, or internal ears.

6. Disease of the bones of the nose, or of its cartilages, nasal polypus, or disease of the naso-pharynx.

7. Disease of the throat, tongue, palate, or tonsils; many unsound teeth,† unhealthy gums, disease of the glands of the throat or neck, external cicatrices, if at all extensive, and especially if adherent.

8. Functional or organic disease of the heart or blood-vessels, deformity or contraction of the chest, phthisis, hæmoptysis, bronchitis, asthma, dyspnoea, aphonia, chronic cough, or any symptom of lung-disease or tendency thereto.

9. Undue swelling or distension of the abdomen, obesity, disease or enlargement of the liver, spleen, or kidneys. Rupture, weakness, or distension of the abdominal rings; any disease of the bladder or incontinence of urine.

10. The existence of any defect of the genital organs, or of varicocele.

11. Any disease of the stomach or bowels.

12. Paralysis, weakness, impaired motion, or deformity of the upper or lower extremities, from whatever cause; a varicose state of the veins, especially of the leg. Bunions, distortion or malformation of the hands, feet, fingers, or toes.

13. Distortion of the spine, of the bones of the chest, or pelvis, from injury or constitutional defect.

No person will be admitted into His Majesty's service unless he has had small-pox or has been vaccinated. Before joining he must produce a certificate of having been revaccinated since infancy.

It is requested that in the case of a nominated candidate, should the preliminary private examination make it apparent that he is not likely to pass the subsequent official physical examination, the Admiralty may be informed of the fact without delay.

* Under present regulations, candidates for the Royal Marines are examined by an Army Medical Board, and must conform to the Army Medical Regulations. When the direct entry of candidates into the Royal Marines ceases, all candidates will come under the above regulations.

† I.e., seven teeth defective or deficient in persons under seventeen years of age on the date of entry, ten defective or deficient teeth in persons above the age of seventeen—a tooth being considered as defective when it cannot be made permanently serviceable by dental repair. Credit is also given for teeth which have not erupted. Candidates must, however, possess some sound opposing molars and incisors. The numbers given above are intended as a general guide, and are not necessarily strictly adhered to, provided the general condition of the teeth is good.

GENERAL SUMMARY FOR DECEMBER, 1904.

The weather of December was, on the whole, decidedly unseasonable; but, while the cloudiness of the atmosphere prevented solar heat from coming direct to the earth, it also protected the soil, especially at night, as with a blanket, from undue loss of accumulated heat, keeping it almost continuously above 42° Fahr., which is generally regarded as the temperature above which active growth takes place. The maximum-solar-radiation thermometer *in vacuo*, influenced only by the sun's rays, was very much below the monthly mean, but the terrestrial-radiation thermometer gives a mean about the usual. Thus, notwithstanding other drawbacks, grain-crops have made unmistakable progress, and are fairly promising. The chief cause of lament, however, has been that the unsettled conditions of the atmosphere prevented not only the earlier sowing of cereals, but later on also of turnips, &c. Orchards and gardens which previously suffered damage have not recovered; vegetables are by no means plentiful; the yield of fruit generally is small and backward, and stone-fruits are reported as very scarce. Early-sown potatoes suffered very much, and in some parts rotted in the ground, but fruit-trees are almost free from disease. Though perhaps not so nutritious as the dairy-farmer would desire, feed has been plentiful in most parts; and the stock, which were in good heart after a mild winter, did well through a trying spring, and are this summer in good condition. In agriculture, the showers, which were general until after the 23rd, made the soil in a more friable condition than it would have been on account of the strong, drying winds following the heavy rains of spring. Tillage went on in some parts, however, under difficulties. Shearing progressed, but was much hindered, and haymaking greatly delayed, by the rough weather.

On the 5th and 6th of the month the weather was very wintry throughout the country. Thunderstorms were prevalent in the North, hail was heavy in many parts of both Islands, and the high lands of the South were covered with snow. Electrical conditions culminated in thunderstorms in various parts also between the 7th and 16th, and thunder and lightning were also recorded at New Plymouth and Dunedin on the 21st, and at Hunterville on the 29th and 30th.

Conditions were severe in parts between the 13th and 16th, and heavy hail and snow fell on the ranges of Marlborough, and elsewhere on the 14th. A warm cloudy atmosphere with a north-west wind about the 19th caused the snow to melt on the mountains, and a record flood was noted at Otaki on the 21st.

Delightful weather was experienced generally just before Christmas, but stormy conditions again succeeded. This spell of warm bright weather produced a prolific brood of insect-life, flies and mosquitoes swarming immediately.

In the returns the light rainfall recorded at 9 a.m. on the 1st instant was credited to the previous day according to the new rule.

The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 87,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons, at the Census of March, 1901.

† By an extension of the boundaries of Dunedin City, Caversham was included from 1st November. It is, however, separately given in the Vital Statistics till the end of the year on account of the report for 1904, which will embrace a twelve-months period.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 514, against 497 in November—an increase of 17. The deaths in December were 178, a decrease of 5 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 95, females 83. Forty of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 22.47 per cent. of the whole number; 30 of these were under one year of age.

There were forty-four deaths of persons of 65 years of age and upwards: Eight men, 67, 68, 73 (two), 74, 78, 80, 85, and three women, 65, 68, 96, died at Auckland; three men, 68, 73, 76, and nine women, 65, 67 (two), 71, 73 (two), 74, 76, 77, at Wellington; five men, 67, 72, 73 (two), 75, and two women, 65, 72, at Christchurch; eight men, 65, 66, 71, 76, 81, 86, 87, 91, and six women, 67 (two), 73, 75 (two), 86, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—There were 11 deaths from diseases of this class at the four chief towns with suburbs in December. In the miasmatic order, scarlet fever caused 1 death at Wellington, influenza 1 at Dunedin, diphtheria 3 at Wellington, and enteric fever 1 at Auckland. From diarrhoeal complaints there were 4 deaths, 3 at Wellington and 1 at Christchurch. The remaining death was from erysipelas.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 46 deaths at the chief centres in November, 15 were attributable to cancer, 11 to phthisis, and 11 to other tubercular complaints; 4 deaths from diabetes, 2 from anæmia, 2 from tabes mesenterica, and 1 from rheumatic fever complete the total.

Local Diseases.—Of 94 deaths, or 52.81 per cent. of the whole mortality for the month at the chief centres, 23 were caused by diseases of the nervous system, 30 of the circulatory, 18 of the respiratory, 12 of the digestive, 6 of the urinary, 1 of the lymphatic systems, 1 of the organs of locomotion, and 3 of the reproductive system.

Violent Deaths.—Of 9 deaths, 7 were accidental: 6 persons were killed at Auckland, 2 by fracture of skull, 1 by laceration of brain, 1 (a carter) died from fracture of spine, and 2 by drowning; there was also 1 death at Wellington, caused by contact with electric wire. There were 2 suicides, 1 at Auckland by shooting, and 1 at Dunedin by cutting throat.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1904, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The arrivals in the colony last year (32,632) exceeded the number recorded in 1903 (30,883), and the departures during 1904, which numbered 22,277, were also greater than those in the previous year—viz., 19,608.

The excess of arrivals over departures last year was 10,355, against 11,275 in 1903.

The comparative tables show that the colony has drawn to itself in each of the ten years 1895 to 1904 more population than it has parted with.

The figures under the heading "United Kingdom" for 1904 show an excess of 2,720 arrivals over the departures, and from Australian States there is an excess of 7,770, but for other countries a loss of 135.

Of the 32,632 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 3,506, or 10·74 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 22,277 departures the children numbered 1,567, or 7·03 per cent.
