WHEREAS a branch of the Foxton - New Plymouth Railway-namely, from Waipuku to Mount Egmont

VV Railway—namely, from Waipuku to Mount Egmont (hereinafter termed "the said railway")—is a railway the construction of which is authorised by "The Railways Authorisation Act, 1904": And whereas it has been determined to construct and maintain the same:
