Improvements in or relating to heel-attaching machines.*

Extract from Specification.—According to the present invention, there is employed in a heel-attaching machine, for the purpose above described, the combination with a post or other convenient base and a movable work-support upon it, of a nail-driver arranged to drive a nail in a direction away from the work-supporting face of said support into the work supported thereby, and means to adjust the support into and retain it in positions in which this work-supporting face shall be in oblique relation to the path of the driver—that is to say, in such relation that the path of the driver shall not be normal or perpendicular to the plane or surface of that face, but shall have the same obliquity thereto as the nail is to have in relation to the face of the heel-seat lift into which it is to be driven, &c.

In the manufacture of brooms and brushes, securing the fibre or like material between twisted wires, bending such twisted wires so as to form a frame of any desired shape, and securing the ends of the wires within a socket-piece secured to the end of a handle, substantially as specified.

pose indicated, a hoop, peg, or the like, having feet projecting in opposite directions in a plane at right angles to the hoop, substantially as specified and illustrated.

The general construction, arrangement, and combination of parts composing my combined roller-protector for dredge ladders, elevators, and suchlike, all substantially as and for the purposes described. (2.) Protector for the rollers of dredge ladders, elevators, and the like, consisting of the combination with a tapered roller of a correspondingly tapered liner provided with a circular flange at one end and means for securing the flange to the roller, substantially as described. (3.) Protector for the rollers of dredge ladders, elevators, and the like, consisting of the combination with a tapered roller of a correspondingly tapered liner provided with a circular flange and a rim at one end forming a recess adapted to receive a washer provided with a bush embracing the end of the roller-spindle, and means for securing the washer and liner to the roller, substantially as described.

Extract from Specification.—The means devised comprise a long hopper with a narrow opening extending longitudinally in its bottom. Mounted outside the hopper is a shaft to which a number of radial knives are attached. The side of the hopper is provided with slots therein, and the knife-shaft is so mounted in relation thereto that as the shaft revolves the knives will pass into the slots and travel across the space in the bottom of the hopper. Beneath the hopper are mounted a pair of squeezing-rollers adjustable in their distance apart, and mounted on horizontally parallel axes. These rollers are carried in bearings upon a suitable frame at each end, and are provided with means whereby they may be rotated in opposite directions. Beneath the rollers is mounted transversely an endless travelling-table, composed preferably of laths of metal linked together. This table is arranged at an incline, and its lower end is placed beneath the point of engagement of the squeezing-rollers. The top end of the table extends upwards over a narrow water trough or tank, in which is mounted a similar endless travelling-table, also arranged to travel in an upwardly inclined direction, and projecting out above one end of the tank.

Claims.—(1.) A pin support located lengthwise along the centre of and within a spiral pin. (2.) A pin support located lengthwise along the centre of and within a spiral pin having its free end or point to extend beyond the penetrating point of the spiral. (3.) Said pin support as located in combination with the spiral having a spherically shaped head fixed to the shank, substantially as described in the specification and shown in the plans.

Claims.—(1.) A spiral having a straight pin support located within it, same extending beyond penetrating point of spiral, a shank thereon, in combination with a cap to engage said shank and to revolve. (2.) A spiral having a pin support within it, point of same extending beyond penetrating point of spiral, shank thereon, in combination with an inverted U-shaped cap to engage said shank and to revolve, substantially as described in the specification and shown in the plans.

Extract from Specification.—With the electric belt which forms the subject of the present application a constant cell or battery is employed, the current from which passes through an induction-coil, and from thence to two pairs of electrodes or flesh-discs, one pair being in front of the belt and the other pair at the rear of the belt. The two flesh-discs in each pair are supplied with an electric current of one denomination, either + or —, and the other pair with electricity of the opposite denomination, either + or —, as the case may be, from the other pair. The conducting wires that convey the current from the coil enter the belt about midway between the two pairs of electrodes, and intermediately between the point of entrance of the wires and the electrodes provision is made whereby the wire may be temporarily broken, and an extension attachment be connected, whereby the current may be conveyed to one or more of the several extremities of the body.

Claims.—(1.) For the purpose indicated, a vessel provided with vertical ribs upon its inner periphery, the faces of said ribs having projections and recesses, a beater within said vessel the edges of which are also shaped with projections and recesses, with means for revolving said beater, substantially as specified. (2.) For the purpose indicated, in combination, a vessel provided with vertical ribs upon its inner periphery, the faces of said ribs having projections and recesses, a beater within said vessel the edges of which are also shaped with projections and recesses, a spindle for said beater, a pinion fixed thereon, a spur wheel gearing with said pinion, a handle for revolving same, and a bracket carrying said spindle, with means for removably attaching said bracket to said vessel, as specified. (3.) For the purpose indicated, the improved churn consisting of the parts arranged, combined, and operating substantially as specified, and as illustrated in the drawing.

Improved cream-products, and apparatus for making the same.

Claims.—(1.) A product derived from cream by placing the latter in contact with absorptive material permeable by its fluid and impermeable by its solid constituents whereby the fatty globules of the cream with their adhering particles of casein and the like are retained unbroken and unaltered and the fluid constituents are removed. (2.) A substitute for cream consisting of the product described above diffused in water, milk, or other suitable fluid medium. (3.) An apparatus for treating cream comprising a partition impermeable by the fatty constituents and permeable by the other constituents thereof, a receptacle to hold the same, a non-absorbent spacer to support the partition, and means for receiving the excess of constituents permeable through the partition. (4.) An apparatus for treating cream comprising a partition impermeable by the fatty constituents and permeable by the other constituents thereof, a receptacle to hold the same, means for supporting the partition, means, as a vacuum pump, for creating a less pressure on the drainage side of the partition to facilitate the operation, and means for collecting the excess of constituents permeable through the partition, with or without means for excluding the outer air from the apparatus during the operation. (5.) A centrifugal machine inclosed in a vacuum chamber, the basket of the machine being provided with walls comprising material impermeable by the fatty constituents of cream and permeable by its other constituents, means for suitably sealing the chamber against the air, and means for supplying cream to the basket of the machine without allowing the same to come into contact with the outer air.

Claims.—(1.) For the purpose specified, a faucet-shaped stout casting, into the larger end of which the end of the trap-pipe of closet-basins, slop-hoppers, or the like, will come, said end being large enough to admit the trap-pipe end, and permit of rope-yarn being tamped down around said pipe-end and hot bitumen poured upon the rope-yarn, the lower part of the casting being reduced so as to adapt it to come into the soil-pipe and be jointed therein, substantially as described. (2.) A faucet-shaped stout casting that is employed to replace a short length of lead piping in the manner and for the purposes specified. (Specification, 1s. 9d.; drawing, 1s.)

Claim.—The compressed-air pump for pumping water up a pipe whose height exceeds that of a solid column of water balancing the compressed-air pressure, having the branch pipe from the compressed-air pipe to the water-discharge pipe above and near to the check valve in the latter, said branch pipe having an opening sufficiently large to distribute the air through the water in the discharge-pipe so that the weight of the latter does not overbalance the compressed-air pressure, substantially as described.

Improved method of converting into briquettes or lumps iron-sand, whether natural or prepared by reducing to powder iron-ore or iron-wastes.*

Claims.—(1.) The process of agglomerating into briquettes or lumps by means of a weak solution of alum powdered iron-ore or iron-wastes, or natural ironsands, or mixtures thereof, for hardening the same by exposure to the atmosphere or otherwise, substantially as described. (2.) The process of agglomerating into briquettes or lumps by means of a weak solution of alum powdered iron-ore or iron-wastes, or natural ironsands, or mixtures thereof, and hardening the said briquettes or lumps by exposure to a high temperature, substantially as described.

Claims.—(1.) The general construction of the water-supply pipe, in combination with an independent gas-conduct pipe, being in one piece of mechanism, thus avoiding the necessity of making two or more joints in generating-chamber, and preventing any interference with the free exit of gas into the gas-holder from any other generating-chamber of acetylene-gas generators. (2.) The continuation of the safety pipe from the top of the gas-holder through a suitable support up to any height desired into the open air. (3.) A weighted rod operating a sliding bar with spring, in combination with a levered valve regulating the supply of water to the generating-chambers, as substantially described in specification, and illustrated in drawings.

passes and fits the corrugated inner telescopic gas-and-air supply tube. The bottom of the chamber may also be provided with apertures for an auxiliary supply of air.

Claims.—(1.) Apparatus for the purpose indicated, comprising, in combination, a baking-dish, a well upon the bottom thereof, a tube projecting down into said well, the lower end of said tube conical, a nozzle upon the upper end of said tube, and means of supporting said tube with its lower conical end above the bottom of the well, substantially as specified. (2.) Apparatus for the purpose indicated, comprising, in combination, a baking-dish, a well upon the bottom thereof, a tube projecting downwardly into said well, the lower end of said tube conical, a nozzle upon the upper end of the tube, a perforated ring surrounding the tube, and arms connecting the ring with the tube, said ring being received by a recess in the bottom of the baking-dish, substantially as specified. (3.) Apparatus for the purpose indicated, comprising, in combination, a baking-dish, a tubular well closed at its lower end and having a flange upon its upper end, said flange fitting a recess in the bottom of the baking-dish, a back nut screwing upon the well, a tube having a conical lower end, a nozzle upon the upper end of said tube, a ring surrounding the tube, and arms connecting the tube with the ring, said ring being perforated and adapted to fit a recess in the well and being so arranged in relation to the tube that the tube is supported with its lower end above the bottom of the well, substantially as specified and illustrated.

Improvements in oil-lamps for railway signals and other purposes.

Extract from Specification.—“To effect these objects the burner is designed to give a small flame, and the light therefrom is directed by specially shaped and disposed lenses in the required direction or directions, the air for combustion being led into the interior of the lamp in such manner that it is distributed therein without directly impinging on the flame, thereby enabling a small flame to be used. An auxiliary wick, which may lead to the oil-reservoir or may derive oil from the burner-wick, is coiled around the upper perforated part of the burner-tube, and serves to keep the wick cool and prevent or retard charring, and also, acting as a storage chamber, continues to provide oil for combustion when the burner-wick is unable, on account of charring, to supply the oil required to maintain the light.”

Claims.—(1.) In a shaft-bearing, the combination with a support and an upright shaft, of an adjustable stop mounted on the shaft above said support, a bearing surrounding the shaft between said support and said adjustable stop, and including rolling anti-friction members, whereby the shaft is sustained by said bearing, and a lifting-device independent of said bearing acting on the shaft, whereby the shaft with its stop can be raised independently of said bearing and the stop then lowered to rest upon the bearing and support the shaft. (2.) In a shaft-bearing, the combination with a support and an upright shaft, of bearing-discs loosely surrounding said shaft, the lower disc being sustained by said support, rolling anti-friction members interposed between said discs, a stop-collar adjustably secured to the shaft and resting upon the upper bearing-disc, and a lifting-device independent of said bearing-members acting on the lower end of the shaft. (3.) In a shaft-bearing, the combination with a support and a depending socket located on the under-side thereof, of an upright shaft passing through said support and having its lower end arranged in said socket, bearing-discs loosely surrounding said shaft, the lower disc being sustained by said support, rolling anti-friction members interposed between

said discs, a collar adjustably secured to the shaft and resting upon the upper bearing-disc, and a lifting-screw independent of said bearing-members passing through the bottom of said socket and acting on the lower end of the shaft.

In reversible heels for boots and shoes, the combination with the top plate K, having the hole N, of the pad L attached thereto, substantially as described and explained, and as illustrated in the drawings. (3.) In reversible heels for boots and shoes, the combination with the bottom plate C, annular plate F, and projections a, b, c, and d thereon, spring G, and locking-pin H, of the top plate K, having the hole N therein, and pad L attached thereto, substantially as described and explained, and as illustrated in the drawings.

Extract from Specification.—There is an arrangement whereby the calendar for any year past or to come may be obtained by the manipulation of a sliding plate carrying day numbers arranged in a particular way behind apertures arranged also in a particular way, combined with the use of the well-known dominical letters. For the purpose of arriving at the dominical letter for the year required, the years are arranged in columns under the dominical letter to which they belong after calculation in the ordinary way, with a special provision for leap year by repeating such year in two successive columns. There is a universal time indicator, which may be used in combination with this calendar, consisting of clock markings round a circular opening behind which a circular piece rotates. This circular piece is graduated on its rim for longitude, and has an index hand or pointer fixed thereto or drawn thereon on the longitude of the place where the calendar is to be used. Consequently when this index hand is set to the time of such place the corresponding time of any place of which the longitude is known can be ascertained by inspection. Combined with the two previously described arrangements may be a day calendar of any suitable type adapted to show day, month, and date, and a timepiece may also be combined therewith.
