Native Land reserved under "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1903."

PLUNKET, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1903" (hereinaf or referred to as "the said Act"), it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor may from time to time appoint such suitable persons, not exceeding five, as he thinks fit to be a Commission under the said Act; such Commission may, if it deems necessary, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and shall make inquiries respecting the same and report to the Governor, and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown, private, or Native lands, in their opinion, should be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves; and that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that any lands so recommended to be reserved shall be a reserve under the said Act, and thereupon such lands shall be inalienable unless by special Act of Parliament pa sed in that behalf, and no person shall cut or remove timber or in any way interfere with such lands, or damage the scenic features thereof; and such lands may be fenced, preserved, and conserved intact as and for an inalienable patrimony of

features thereof; and such lands may be fenced, preserved, and conserved intact as and for an inalienable patrimony of the people of New Zealand:

And whereas the Governor has, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, appointed certain persons to be a Commission for the purposes thereof: And whereas the said Commission has, after making inquiries respecting the same, reported to the Governor and recommended that the parcel of Native land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved as a scenic reserve: And whereas it is expedient that the said recommendation should be given effect to:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date of the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette, the parcel of Native land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a recovery and a the said Act. reserve under the said Act.

BY-LAWS regulating Heavy Traffic on Roads in the Remuera Road District.

In pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Road Boards Act, 1882," and "The Public Works Act, 1894," and the several amendments thereof, the Remuera Road Board hereby makes the following by-laws, which shall come into operation upon the 22nd day of May, 1905.

1. The owner of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic used in carting stone, earth, or scoria ash upon any of the roads within the boundaries of the Remuera Road District shall, before using such vehicle upon any such road, apply to the

before using such vehicle upon any such road, apply to the Remuera Road Board for a license, and shall pay to the Remuera Road Board the yearly license fee following, that is to say: For vehicles having tires of the width of $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. or over, £5; for vehicles having tires under $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. in width,

is to say: For vehicles having tires of the width of $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. or over, £5; for vehicles having tires under $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. in width, £10.

2. Provided nevertheless that the Board may in its discretion, and on application by the owner or driver of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic used in carting stone, earth, or scoria ash, permit the owner or driver of such vehicle to use such vehicle for the purpose of carting stone, earth, or scoria ash upon or over all or any of the roads within the boundaries of such road district, without having paid such license fee, upon the payment to the said Board of the following charges by way of compensation for any damage likely to such roads: For every load carried on any one day upon or over any such road, 1s.; if more than three loads are carried in any one vehicle in any one day upon or over any such roads, then for that day, 3s.

3. Any person who, after coming into operation of this by-law, shall use any vehicle for heavy traffic within the boundaries of the Remuera Road District without having first paid the said license fee for such vehicle, or without having first obtained the permission of the said Board under clause 2 of these by-laws and paid the charges prescribed thereunder, or who shall do or cause to be done, or be concerned in doing, anything contrary to any provisions of these by-laws, or who shall omit to do anything required to be done by him by any such provision, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these by-laws, and on conviction thereof shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.

4. "Heavy traffic" shall mean the transportation of any

"Heavy traffic" shall mean the transportation of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall, together with any stone, earth, or scoria ash being transported thereon, weigh more than 1½ tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels. "Owner of any vehicle" shall include a bailee or hirer entitled to the possession and use or profit thereof.

5. Any constable or any officer of the Board may stop and detain any vehicle which in his opinion infringes any of these by laws, and inspect, examine, and measure the tires thereof, and the weight of any such vehicle and the contents thereof; and the driver or person for the time being in charge of such vehicle shall permit such in pection, examination, measurement, and weighing to be made accordingly, and shall, if so requested by any such cons'able or officer of the Board, take such vehicle, together with the contents thereof, to the such vehicle, together with the contents thereof, to the nearest public weighbridge, and then and there weigh the same, and no person shall obstruct any such constable or

same, and no person shall obstruct any such constable or officer in or about the making of such inspection, examination, measurement, or weighing.

1. In these by-laws, if not inconsistent with the context.—

1. In these by-laws, if not inconsistent with the context,—

"Offensive matter" includes nightsoil, fæcal matter of any sort, parts of nightsoil-cans or other plant used in the removal of nightsoil, malodorous fish, animal, or vegetable substances, refuse, garbage, or rubbish, and includes any other matter or substances of an offensive or noxious nature.

"The Board" means the Remuera Road Board.

"The district" means the Remuera Road District.

2. No person shall leave, spill, cast, place, deposit, bury, or otherwise dispose of any offensive matter in, to, or upon any land within the limits of the district, except at such depot or depots as shall from time to time be approved by the Board on the application of any person desiring to the Board on the application of any person desiring to deposit offensive matter.

deposit offensive matter.

3. No person shall leave, spill, cast, place, deposit, bury, or otherwise dispose of any offensive matter in, to, or upon any public place within the district.

4. No person who shall be engaged within the district in the trade of scavenging or removing nightsoil shall—

(a) Remove cast carry or transport any offensive

(a.) Remove, cart, carry, or transport any offensive matter in pans, boxes, or other receptacles which are not distinctly marked or branded with the name of the person so removing, carting, carrying, or transporting the same:

(b.) Remove, cart, carry, or transport any offensive matter in pans, boxes, or other receptacles which shall not be watertight, and covered by a lid or covering in such manner that no offensive smell or

odour shall emanate therefrom:

(c.) Remove, cart, carry, or transport any offensive matter, pans, boxes, or other receptacles in any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle which has not the name of the owner clearly and legibly painted in letters at least 2 in. in height, in white paint on a dark ground, on some conspicuous part of any such cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle:

(d.) Drive, take, conduct, or convey any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle upon which any offensive matter is laden in or through the district, or any part thereof, unless such cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle has been first registered by the owner with the Board, and has painted thereon, in some conspicuous part of the same, in letters at least 2 in. in height in white paint on a dark ground, the

registered number assigned to such cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle by the Board.

5. No person shall drive, take, conduct, or convey any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle in, through, or upon the district, or any part thereof, whilst any offensive or noxious smell or odour emanates from any such cart, wagon, float or other vehicle or the contexts thereof.

wagon, float, or other vehicle, or the contents thereof.

6. No person shall leave or permit to remain, either unburied or buried as herein provided, in any public place, or within 20 chains of any public road or dwellinghouse, any offensive matter for a longer period than two hours.

7. No contractor or person engaged as employer or employee in the business of scavenging or removing nightsoil shall leave, or permit to be left, on any road or in any public place within the district any offensive matter for more than four hours after the Board, or any member of the Board, or any person in the employ of the Board, shall have given him notice in writing that such offensive matter has been left,

spilt, or cast from any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle owned, employed, or used by such contractor or person.

8. No person shall leave unburied or uncovered at any depot approved by the Board any offensive matter for more than two hours after such offensive matter shall have arrived

at such depot.

9. No person shall bury, deposit, or leave any offensive matter at any place within 20 chains of any public road, or within 20 chains of any dwellinghouse or place where cows are milked, or in which milk is stored, kept, vended, or sold.

10. No person shall deposit, place, or bury any offensive matter upon any land the surface-drainage of which enters any well or watercourse the water of which is used for

any well or watercourse the water of which is used for domestic purposes, or for the watering of horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals.

11. Every person bringing, placing, or depositing any offensive matter into or upon any depot approved by the Board shall forthwith bury all nightsoil, fæcal matter, garbage, rubbish, animal and vegetable matter in such a manner that there shall be at least 6 in. of soil covering all parts of such nightsoil, fæcal matter, garbage, rubbish, animal and vegetable matter, and shall leave the surface of the soil covering any such matter so buried level with the surface of the surrounding land: and every such person the surface of the surrounding land; and every such person shall bury all fish heads or entrails so that not less than

shall bury all fish heads or entrails so that not less than 18 in. of soil shall cover such fish heads or entrails, and shall leave the surface of the soil covering any such fish heads or entrails level with the surrounding land.

12. No person shall bring or convey into, through, or upon the district any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle containing any offensive matter except between the hours of 10 o'clock post meridian of the one day and 4 o'clock ante meridian of the next succeeding day.

13. No person shall drive, convey, or carry any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle, or any empty box, pan, or receptacle for offensive matter, in or through the district unless the same, after having been emptied, shall have been deodorised, and is free from noxious or offensive smell or odour. odour.

odour.

14. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence; and, in the case of a continuous offence, to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day during which such offence continues.

15. These by-laws shall come into force on the 22nd day of May, 1905, and shall apply to the whole of the district.

GENERAL SUMMARY FOR APRIL, 1905.

The month of April marks mid-autumn in New Zealand; and at this period atmospheric pressure is usually higher than at any other time of the year. In the past month, although the barometer was fairly high and not subject to extremes, it was somewhat unsteady, and the weather showery in consequence. Westerly winds had a very marked prevalence throughout the colony, and were generally moderate. Two westerly or antarctic depressions affected the greater part of the country on the 3rd and 21st; while a mild sub-tropical cyclone brought an abundance of rain in most parts about the 16th and 17th. At this time there occurred at Hawke's Bay a remarkable and fortunately rare storm in New Zealand. It is very singular that an almost exactly similar storm visited the same district on the same date eight years ago. Mr. T. R. Moore, of Waimarama, writes: "On Monday night, 17th April, there was a phenomenal storm of wind and rain. It began with a light, dirzizing rain from the south-west and south. As it got dark the wind and rain increased, until one was a burricane and the other a deluge. For thirty years that I have been here nothing has ever approached this storm. It took the tops off pine-trees, and drove the rain under the galvanised-iron roof and the weather-boards, flooding the rooms facing that way. In the morning the whole place was under water, and the creeks higher than ever seen before. When I registered the fall at 9 a.m. there was, as a result of a little over thirteen hours' rainfall, 7:37 in. of rain in the gauge." Mr. G. C. Williams, of Mangakuri, registered a total of 6:37 in. for the 17th, and notes that the fall was associated with thunder, and had an intensity of an inch an hour for four hours.

When it is remembered that a single inch of rain means over 101 tons of water to the acre, this shows wirat a strain would be put upon the drainage system of the Napier Plains. On the 17th April, 1897, occurred a flood, with loss of life, and the records of the rainfall then may be compared with those given above THE month of April marks mid autumn in New Zealand; and at this period atmospheric pressure is

in excellent condition, the late harvesting was very protracted and trying work. Some crops were still in the stock at the end of April.

The dry period experienced generally until April did not permit of the usual early growth of winter feed; so the rains of April were mostly welcomed for the pastures and feed-crops. These were much benefited, but in many parts were not altogether satisfactory at the end of the month. Frosts occurred unusually early, but did not do much damage; although as far north as Rangiahua, Hokianga Harbour, Mr. W. R. Coxhead reports having experienced several sharp frosts, which were most unusual for April. Kumara-plants and maize were cut off—an occurrence never previously noticed in his eighteen years' residence in that locality. Frosts occurred on about four nights in parts of both Islands, and several heavy dews were generally experienced. Autumn mists, haze, and fogs were common, and in the mornings frequently preceded days of most agreeable weather. Fog was heavy at the end of the month. Atmospheric currents—upper and lower—were frequently noticed going in opposite directions. Snow fell on the 3-d, 17th, and 22nd, and at other times, on high lands and mountains, but soon melted. Thunder, lightning, and hail accompanied the trough of the antarctic depressions in some parts on the 3-d, and in many on the 20th and 21st. Farmers mostly desired to be early with their ploughing this autumn, but were kept back by the hardness of the soil until after Easter. Stock is reported as healthy and in good condition.

 - Definitions.—In this by-law the expression—
 "Heavy traffic" has the meaning assigned to it by section 130 of "The Public Works Act, 1894."

 - "County" means the County of Southland.
 "Road" means and includes any road, bridge, ferry, or ford under the care, control, or management of the Council of the County of Southland.
 "Person" means and includes any incorporated com-

 - pany or body.
 "Owner" means and includes the owner, lessee, bailee, employer, or driver of any vehicle.

 - balee, employer, or driver of any vehicle.

 3. This by-law shall apply to—

 (a.) Every vehicle or machine engaged in heavy traffic on any road within the county, and which shall itself or together with any thing or things being transported thereon weigh more than one and a half tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels.

 (b.) Every vehicle engaged in heavy traffic on any road within the county and drawn by means of bullocks, irrespective of the weight of such vehicles, either separately or together with any load
 - either separately or together with any load thereon.
- thereon.

 Excepting in all cases—

 (1.) Exemptions.—Any threshing-mill.

 (2.) Any cart or vehicle while being used by any farmer for transporting the produce (including Phormium tenax) of or manure for his own farm, or any cart or vehicle used by any ratepayer for carrying or transporting logs, sawn timber, firewood, coal, lignite, bricks or tiles, for his or her own use or for domestic consumption, and not for use in connection with any industry carried on by him or her, or on his or her land, or in which he or she has any interest: Provided that the exceptions contained in this subsection shall not apply to section 12 hereof.

 4. License Res.—On every vehicle or machine to which
- 4. License Fees.—On every vehicle or machine to which this by-law applies there shall be paid to the Council of the county a yearly license fee according to the following

 - (a.) On a portable engine, the yearly fee of two pounds ten shillings.
 (b.) On any two-wheeled vehicle or machine not being a traction engine or portable engine, the yearly
 - fee of five pounds.
 (c.) On any vehicle or machine having more than two wheels and not being a traction engine or port-able engine, the sum of ten pounds.

- (d.) Licenses for vehicles drawn by bullocks: On any vehicle drawn by bullocks and not being a traction engine or portable engine, and irrespective of the number of wheels, the sum of ten pounds.
- 5. Licenses for Portion of a Year.—Any person may, in lieu of paying the license fee payable for a year in respect of any such vehicle or machine, pay one-fourth, one-half, or three-fourths of the amount of such fee, and on payment of any such proportion thereof the vehicle or machine in respect of which such payment is made shall thereupon be licensed under this by-law, either for one-quarter, one-half, or three-quarters of a year, according to the amount paid.
- 6. Issue of Licenses.— Every such payment as aforesaid shall be made to the County Clerk, at the County Offices, Invercargill, and a license shall thereupon be issued by the Clerk under his signature, specifying the amount paid, the period for which it is paid, and the kind of and other means of identifying the vehicle or machine in respect of which the payment is made, and the mode of traction thereof, and in case of vehicles the number of wheels thereof. And every such license shall be numbered, and shall be prima facie evidence of the contents thereof. evidence of the contents thereof.

 7. Numbering Licensed Vehicles.—Every vehicle or machine in respect of which any such payment is made shall, while of the kind and while employing the mode of traction, and in case of vehicles while having the maximum number of wheels in respect of which such payment is made, have the number of the license and the letters S.C.C. painted on some conspicuous part of the body of the vehicle or machine on the off side, in white letters or figures not less than two inches in length, one inch in width, on a black ground, and shall be deemed to be licensed to engage in heavy traffic on the roads within the county for the period for which the payment is made and no longer computing from the date of such payment.

Unlicensed Vehicles.—No vehicle or machine to which this by-law applies shall be engaged by any person in heavy traffic on any road within the county unless at the time it is so engaged a license fee under this by-law is in force in respect thereof, applicable to its kind, mode of traction, and number of wheels. number of wheels.

Examining Vehicles and Loads.—If the County Clerk, or any person authorised in this behalf in writing under the seal of the County Council, is of opinion that any vehicle or machine infringes this by-law, he may request the driver thereof to stop the same, and the driver shall stop the same forthwith until the weight of such vehicle or machine, or the lead thereon or the weight or measurement of the country load thereon, or the weight or measurement of the contents thereof, can be ascertained, and in default of the driver so doing he shall be guilty of an offence under this by-law, and, further, such Clerk or other person may thereupon stop and detain such vehicle or machine until the weight thereof, or the load thereon, or the weight or measurement of the contents thereof, can be ascertained.
- 10. The driver of any vehicle or machine so stopped shall truly answer all such questions as such Clerk or other authorised person shall reasonably put to him as to the load or contents of such vehicle or machine, and the quantity, weight, size, or measurement of the same, and permit the Weight, size, or measurement of the same, and permit the Clerk or other person to mount such vehicle or machine for the purpose of verifying any answers given to him, or for ascertaining the quantity, weight, size, or measurement aforesaid, and the driver thereof shall do all things necessary to cause the vehicle or machine to be stopped while such Clerk or other person is engaged in his functions under this plants of this by law. clause of this by-law.

Certain Heavy Traffic to cease in June, July, and August in every Year.—That heavy traffic consisting in a traction-engine which shall itself or together with any material to be used for the construction of dredges or for dredging purposes, or any coal or lignite, or sawn timber, drawn by it or transported thereon, weigh more than one and a half tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels, shall cease upon all roads within the county during the months of June, July, and August in every year, unless special permission in writing of the Chairman of the Council shall have been obtained for each occasion. been obtained for each occasion.
