(L.S.) PLUNKET, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS by "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1903" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor may from time to time appoint such suitable persons, not exceeding five, as he thinks fit to be a Commission under the said Act; such Commission may, if it deems necessary, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and shall make inquiries respecting the same and report to the Governor, and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown, private, or Native lands, in their opinion should be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves; and that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that any lands so recommended to be reserved shall be a reserve under the said Act and thereupon such lands shall be inalienable unless by special Act of Parliament passed in that behalf, and no person shall cut or remove timber or in any way interfere with such lands, or damage the scenic features thereof; and such lands may be fenced, preserved, and conserved intact as and for an inalienable patrimony of the people of New Zealand:

And whereas the Governor has, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, appointed certain persons to be a Commission for the purposes thereof: And whereas the said Commission has, after making inquiries respecting the same, reported to the Governor and recommended that the parcel of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved as a scenic reserve: And whereas it is expedient that the said recommendation should be given effect to:

Regulations for Sambur or Ceylon Deer Shooting, Counties of Manawatu, Oroua, and Kairanga.

PLUNKET, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

In Excellency The Governor In Council.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same (hereinafter called "the said Acts"), His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations respecting the Sambur or Ceylon deer shooting season within the Counties of Manawatu. Orona, and Kairanga (hereinafter Counties of Manawatu, Oroua, and Kairanga (hereinafter called "the said district").

REGULATIONS.

1. Sambur or Ceylon deer (stags or bucks only) may be taken or killed within the said district from the 1st day of July, 1905, to the 31st day of July, 1905, both days inclusive

2. Licenses to kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Wellington, and the Postmasters at Palmerston North, Bull's, Foxton, and Marton, on payment of a license fee of twenty shillings, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Acts and these regulations.

3. No licensee shall be allowed to take or kill more than three stags or bucks; and, further, the said Chief Postmaster and Postmasters shall not issue more than one license to

take or kill deer to the same person.
4. No hind or fawn will be allowed to be killed on any pretext whatever; and no dogs will be allowed to accompany

either the licensee or any attendant he may have with him.
5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorising any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 67,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons, at the Census of March, 1901.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 543, against 472 in April—an increase of 71. The deaths in May were 226, an increase of 37 on the number in April. Of the total deaths, males contributed 129, females 97. Sixty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 30.09 per cent. of the whole number; 59 of these were under one year of age.

There were sixty-six deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Ten men, 66 (two), 67, 70, 71 (two), 72, 73, 77, 90, and eight women, 65, 69 (two), 70, 71, 80, 82, 83, died at Auckland; nine men, 65 (two), 67, 68, 72, 73, 78 (two), 84, and one woman, 78, at Wellington; five men, 65, 71, 76, 79, 83, and eight women, 67, 69, 72, 74, 80 (three), 86, at Christchurch; and twelve men, 66, 67, 69, 71, 74, 75, 76, 78 (two), 79, 83, 88, and thirteen women, 67 (two), 68, 69, 70 (two), 71, 73, 74, 75, 79, 86, 89, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at each of the four centres.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—There were 12 deaths at the chief towns with their suburbs from diseases in this class during the month of May. Influenza caused 1 death at Dunedin and diphtheria another at the same place. Enteric fever was fatal in 1 case at Auckland. Three deaths from diarrhoal diseases occurred at Auckland and 1 at Dunedin. The remaining deaths for the month at the four centres were 3 from septicæmia and 1 from puerperal septicæmia; besides

The remaining deaths for the month at the four centres were 3 from septicæmia and 1 from puerperal septicæmia; besides 1 (of a child) from specific disease.

Constitutional Diseases.—Nineteen persons died of cancer at the chief towns in May—8 at Dunedin, 6 at Christchurch. There were 14 deaths from phthisis, and 6 from other tubercular diseases. There were 4 from diabetes, and 2 others complete the total of 45 deaths, being 20 per cent. of the deaths from all causes.

Local Diseases.—The deaths in the chief towns were 121, being 53 per cent. of the whole. Twenty-nine were from diseases of the nervous system, 22 of the circulatory, and 24 of the respiratory (bronchitis, croup, and pneumonia), 32 resulted from diseases of the digestive system, 1 of the lymphatic, 10 of the urinary (5 Bright's), and 3 of the reproductive system. system.

Violent Deaths. — Of 11 deaths, 9 were accidental and 2 suicidal. Of the former, 1 person was killed by a tramcar and another run over by a train. One death was caused by falling down stairs, and 1 described as from "laceration of brain." A child was killed by phosphorus poisoning, an infant by being overlain. Two deaths resulted from misadventure under anæsthetics. The last was by a shock from internal injury. The suicides were by poisoning and drowning.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic inflamma of the seconds health. sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
