Vesting Control of the Aorere Bridge and Approaches in Collingwood County Council.

PLUNKET, Governor. (L.S.) PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid fix and determine whether all or any, and if so what, part of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or local autho-rities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may by any such Proclamation as aforesaid direct how,

when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:
And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the
said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct that the said bridge, together with the approaches thereto, as defined in the Schedule hereto, and known as the Aorere Bridge, shall, from and after the date of this Proclamation, be under the exclusive care and control and management of the Collingwood County Council; and in further pursuance and exercise of the aforesaid powers and authorities I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge, with the approaches thereto, is to be provided and paid by the Collingwood County Council out of the funds of the said Council.

#### SCHEDULE.

That bridge over the Aorere River on the main road between Collingwood and Ferntown, in Block XIV., Pakawau Survey District, in the Nelson Land District, together with the approaches thereto; as the site of the said bridge and approaches are delineated on the plan marked R. 3901,

deposited in the office of the Chief Engineer of Roads, at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon coloured red.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Town Districts Act, 1904," that, notwithstanding the repeal by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," of "The Town Districts Act, 1881," and "The Town Districts Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1883," the Governor may, in the manner prescribed by "The Town Districts Act, 1881," declare that any area wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district, and thereupon the last-mentioned Act and also "The Town Districts Act, 1881 Amendment Act, 1883," shall be in force in such town district: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under "The Town Districts Act, 1881": And whereas the number of householders within such area is not less than fifty: And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders within the said area have concurred in the said petition, and the said petition has been confirmed by a resolution passed by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the members of the Council of the County of Hawera, being the county wherein the whole of the proposed town district is situate:

WHEREAS by section three of "The Cook and other Islands Government Act Amendment Act, 1902," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, direct that any of the laws in force in New Zealand proper (other than the laws relating to the sale of intoxicating liquors) shall have operation and be observed in the said Islands, either in whole or with such modifications as may be necessary to adapt them to the conditions and circumstances of the said Islands and the inhabitants thereof:

Before registering any adoption the Registrar shall require in respect thereof a certificate by the Chief or a European Judge of the Cook and other Islands Land Titles Court, or by the Resident European Magistrate or Agent at the Island where such adoption takes place, that he has inquired into the circumstances of the said adoption, and that he is satisfied that the same is a bonâ fide adoption according to Native custom and ought to be given effect to.

8. Such inquiry shall be made in open Court after receipt of the application by the Registrar or by the Resident European Magistrate or Agent. Every application shall, at least three days before the hearing thereof, be duly notified by notice in writing posted at the Courthouse. Registration of every adoption shall be duly notified by the Registrar in the Cook Islands Gazette.

9. The fee payable in respect of each application under Regulation 6 shall include the certificate and registration fee, but shall not include fees incidental to hearing unless so ordered.

Regulations under which Advances may be made to Occupiers of Land in Mataroa Village Settlement.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eighth day of July, 1905.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and seventy of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor in Council is authorised to make regulations under which advances of money may be made by the Colonial Treasurer from any sums voted for the purpose by Parliament to occupiers of village-settlement lands under section one hundred and sixty-nine of the said Act, in order that

they may be enabled to profitably occupy their respective allotments:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations upon which advances of money may be made to occupiers of the lands in the Mataroa Village Settlement described in the Schedule hereto:—

#### REGITATIONS.

An advance of a sum not exceeding £50 may be made to the lessee within the first five years from the date of selection towards the cost of building a dwellinghouse.

2. Applications for advances must be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, at Wellington.

3. No advance shall exceed three-fourths the value of the building agreeted by the lessee man his

building erected, or to be erected, by the lessee upon his section.

4. No advance shall be made save on the written certificate of an Inspector appointed in that behalf by the Land Board, specifying the total value of the work done by the lessee, the amount to which tenders have been accepted for the erection of any buildings, and the amount of the advance to which he is entitled, and certifying that such work has been well and faithfully done and to the Inspector's satis-

5. Such advance, together with interest thereon at the rate of five per cent. per annum computed from the date of the advance, shall be repayable by the lessee by equal half-yearly instalments in advance, extending over such period, being not less than five nor more than ten years, as, with the approval of the Minister, the Land Board thinks fit to prescribe. All such payments shall be made to the Receiver of Land Revenue, at Wellington, on the half-yearly rent-days: Provided that the lessee may at any time during such period repay the whole or any less number of the then future instalments under a duly proportionate rebate of interest. 5. Such advance, together with interest thereon at the rebate of interest.

6. A certificate under the hand of the said Commissioner shall at all times and from time to time be conclusive evidence as to the date and amount of the advance, the amounts and due dates of the instalments, and the sums paid and unpaid in respect thereof.

7. As long as any instalment remains unpaid, the lesses shall insure all buildings and erections in the name of His Majesty, in a sum equal to the full insurable value thereof, and for the purposes of this provision the covenant for insurance set out in the Fourth Schedule to "The Land Transfer Act, 1885," shall be implied in the lease.

- In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section one hundred and thirty-six of "The Land Act, 1892," and section two of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare and provide as follows, that is to say:—
- 1. The rural lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto are hereby set apart for disposal by way of sale or selection on and after the twenty-ninth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and five, at the respective prices specified in the said Schedules.
- 2. The said lands may be purchased for cash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase, or on lease in perpetuity: provided that in the case of lands containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, they shall be selected on lease in perpetuity only, and shall not be purchased for cash.
- 3. For the purposes of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," the lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be "heavy-bush land," and the land in the Second Schedule shall be deemed to be "light-bush land."
- 4. No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for the period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, and three years in the case of light-bush land, from the date from which in each case respectively such lands are disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such lands during such period.
- 5. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, and three years in the case of light-bush land, shall not be demanded: provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.
