WHEREAS by section two hundred and fifty of "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that whenever the Governor is satisfied that any Native lands acquired by the Crown in any way, or purchased out of any sums authorised or to be authorised to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall, by Proclamation, declare such lands to be Crown lands, subject to be sold and dealt with as in the said Act is more particularly mentioned: And whereas the lands hereinafter mentioned have been purchased out of sums so authorised to be issued and expended as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, proclaim and declare the lands so enumerated as aforesaid to be Crown lands, subject to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of Crown lands in force in the land districts in which they are respectively situated.

5. Any person committing a breach of section 3 or 4 of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

The Board shall be and is hereby empowered to cut, reap, harvest, thresh, sell, and dispose of all grass for seed, or, if it shall think fit, to sell and dispose of the right to cut and harvest all grass for seed, for the time being growing upon any of the roads in the said district under its control to any person or persons who measure and either by public to any person or persons whomsoever, and either by public auction, public tender, or private treaty, and upon such terms and conditions in all respects as it shall think fit.

7. All money received by the said Board from the sale and disposition of the said grass for seed, or the right to cut and harvest such grass-seed as aforesaid, shall belong to and form part of the Road Board Fund.

Rules regarding the Manner of Electing a Representative of certain Education Boards on the Committee of Advice of the Wellington Training College.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, made under "The Education Act, 1904," regulations were made regarding training colleges and pupil-teachers: And whereas by clause two of the said regulations it is provided that for every training college there shall be a Committee of Advice, every training college there shall be a Committee of Advice, consisting of a member of the Education Board of the district in which the training college is situated, and also (with other specified persons) a representative of the other Education Boards (if any) in the university district, to be chosen, if there be more than one other Board, in such manner as the Minister of Education shall determine: And whereas a training college is being established in the Education Ba training college is being established in the Education District of Wellington, in the Victoria University District, wherein there is more than one Education Board other than Wellington Education Board, and it is therefore necessary to make provision as to the manner in which a representative of such other Education Boards shall from time to time be chosen:

Now, therefore, I, Richard John Seddon, Minister of Education, do hereby make the rules set forth in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of the aforesaid clause two of the said

regulations.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE Boards of the Education Districts of Taranaki, 1. THE Boards of the Education Districts of Taranasi, Wanganui, Hawke's Bay, Marlborough, Nelson, Grey, and Westland (hereinafter called "the electing Boards") shall from time to time choose their representative on the Committee of Advice of the Wellington Training College by means of elections to be conducted as hereinafter provided. Ordinary elections shall be held in the month of September ordinary elections shall be lieft in the month of September in each year, and any extraordinary election within such period, to be fixed by the Returning Officer, as will enable each of the electing Boards to vote at its first ordinary monthly meeting after its receipt of the list of candidates referred to in clause 5 hereof. The person elected at each election shall hold office until the next ordinary election is completed.

2. For the purpose of every election the Secretary of the Wellington Education Board shall be the Returning

Officer.

3. No person shall be eligible for election unless he is o. No person snan be eligible for election unless he is nominated by a member of one of the electing Boards, and the nomination paper bearing the candidate's consent in writing and the signature of the Secretary of the Education Board of the district is received by the Returning Officer before the nominations close.

4. On the occurrence of any extraordinary vacancy, and in the case of the first election immediately on the issue of these rules, the Returning Officer shall by writing notify the electing Boards of the date up to which nominations will be received, such date to be not earlier than fourteen days from the notification thereof. In the case of every ordinary election after the first election nominations shall close on the second Monday in August.

5. Within seven days after the date on which nominations have closed the Returning Officer shall notify to the electing

Boards in writing—

(a) The full name of every duly nominated candidate, and the names of the member by whom, and the education district in which, he is nominated; he dates between which the election will be

(b.) **The** held.

6. The electing Boards shall be entitled to exercise the of the District of Wanganui four votes; that of Hawke's Bay three votes; that of Nelson two votes; those of Taranaki, Marlborough, Grey, and Westland one vote each. The voting of each Board shall be effected by resolution passed at a duly constituted meeting thereof, and a notification in writing of the effect of such resolution signed by the writing of the effect of such resolution, signed by the Secretary and Chairman or other member of the Board, shall be sufficient evidence that the vote of such Board was given in favour of the candidate named therein.

7. If by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more candidates any election is not complete the Chairman of the Wellington Education Board shall have a casting-

vote.

8. Any dispute arising from the operation of these rules shall be referred to the Minister of Education, whose decision shall be final.
