IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by "The Sheriffs Act, 1883," and of every other power and authority in that behalf enabling me, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the first day of October next, the boundaries of the Sheriff's District of Wanganui and Bangitikei, and of the Sheriff's District of Wellington, shall be altered, and that thenceforth the boundaries thereof shall be the boundaries described in the First Schedule hereto; and I do hereby further proclaim and define the district described in the Second Schedule hereto to be, on and from the first day of October next. a hereto to be, on and from the first day of October next, a Sheriff's district under the said Act.


