WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf the property of His Majesty in any local governing body or person, upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest the management of the wharf at Akaroa, known as the Wainui Wharf, in the Akaroa County Council (hereinafter called "the Council"), on the terms and conditions herein set forth, and to make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by "The Harbours Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest, as from the second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and three, the management of the Wainui Wharf at Akaroa, which is shown on plans marked M.D. 1548 and 1549, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, in the Akaroa Council, subject to the following conditions; and doth hereby make the regulations specified in the Schedule hereto, which shall take effect from the date hereof, for the use of said wharf: use of said wharf :-

#### CONDITIONS.

1. That all His Majesty's subjects shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and of ingress

and egress thereon and therefrom.

2. That His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty,

the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

3. That the Council shall maintain and keep the abovementioned wharf, and all erections on the wharf, in good order and repair; and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Marine Department.

4. That any person authorised by the Minister having Charge of the Marine Department (hereinafter called "the Minister"), or any officer acting with his approval, may at all

reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and any buildings erected on the wharf, and view the state of repair thereof; and that, upon his leaving at or posting to the last known and that, upon his reaving at of posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made

5. That the Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected,

on the said wharf any building or structure whatever except with the consent of the Marine Department.

6. That the Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Marine Department, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto that may be required

by the Marine Department.
7. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or

regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.

8. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or any person appointed by him for that purpose pose.

9. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and three, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained

10. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor, on giving to the Council three calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor or the Minister, or any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council, their successors or assigns. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

11. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

2. The said lands may be purchased for cash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase, or on lease in perpetuity: provided that in the case of lands containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, they shall be selected on lease in perpetuity only and shall not be purchased for cash.

3. For the purposes of "The Bush and Swamp Crown Lands Settlement Act, 1903," the lands described in the said Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be "heavy-bush land."

4. No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for a period of four years from the date from which in each case respectively such lands are disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such lands during such period.

5. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years shall not be demanded: provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS, 1903, No. 867.—PATENTS, DESIGNS, AND TRADE-MARKS.—INTERNATIONAL ARRANGE-MENTS.—GERMANY.

Order in Council applying the Provisions of the Patents, &c., Act to Germany.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 9th day of October, 1903.

#### Present:

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 103 of "The Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Act, 1883," as amended by section 6 of "The Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks (Amendment) Act, 1885," it is enacted as follows: (1.) If Her Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government or Governments of any foreign State or States for mutual protection of inventions designs, and trade marks or even of them. of any foreign State or States for mutual protection of inventions, designs, and trade-marks, or any of them, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design, or trade-mark in any such State shall be entitled to a patent for his invention, or to registration of his design or trade-mark (as the case may be) under this Act, in priority to other applicants; and such patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the application in such foreign State. Provided that this application is made, in the case of a patent, within seven months, and, in the case of a design or trade-mark, within four months, from his applying for protection in the foreign State with which the arrangement is in force. Provided that nothing in this section contained shall entitle the patentee or proprietor of the for protection in the foreign State with which the arrangement is in force. Provided that nothing in this section contained shall entitle the patentee or proprietor of the design or trade-mark to recover damages for infringements happening prior to the date of the actual acceptance of his complete specification, or the actual registration of his design or trade-mark, in this country, as the case may be. (2.) The publication in the United Kingdom or tre Isle of Man during the respective periods aforesaid of any description of the invention, or the exhibition or use therein during such periods of the design, or the publication therein during such periods of a description or representation of the design, or the use therein during such periods of a description or representation of the design, or the use therein during such periods of the trademark, shall not invalidate the patent which may be granted for the invention, or the registration of the design or trademark. (3.) The application for the grant of a patent, or the registration of a design, or the registration of a trademark, under this section must be made in the same manner as an ordinary application under this Act; provided that, in the case of trade-marks, any trademark the registration of which has been duly applied for in the country of origin may be registered under this Act. mark the registration of which has been duly applied for in the country of origin may be registered under this Act. (4.) The provisions of this section shall apply only in the case of these foreign states with respect to which Her Majesty shall from time to time by Order in Council declare them to be applicable, and so long only in the case of each state as the Order in Council shall continue in force with respect to that State:

And whereas it pleased Her late Majesty Queen Victoria to make an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said enactment, by and in virtue of a declaration signed and sealed by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris on the 17th day of March, 1884, duly conveying the accession of Great Britain and Ireland to the International Convention and Britain and Ireland to the International Convention and Protocol for the Protection of Industrial Property, signed by representatives of certain Powers on the 20th day of March, 1883, and duly ratified on the 6th day of June, 1884, power being reserved to Her Majesty to accede thereafter to the provisions of the said convention and protocol on behalf of the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, and any of Her Majesty's possessions, which declaration of accession was duly accepted by the French Government on behalf of the signatory powers by and in virtue of a declaration dated the

signatory powers by and in virtue of a declaration dated the 2nd day of April, 1884:

And whereas by various Orders in Council Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that the hereinbefore-recited provisions of the said Act should apply

An application under that section shall be accompanied by a complete specification, which, if it be not accepted within the period of twelve months, shall, with the drawings (if any), be open to public inspection at the expiration of that period:

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition.
