(L.S.) PLUNKET, Governor. A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS by a notice published in the New Zealand Gazette of the third day of November, one thou-sand nine hundred and four, it was therein stated that it was the intention of the Governor to take compulsorily, under the powers in that behalf conferred by "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," and its amend-ment, the land mentioned in such notice: And whereas, in pursuance of such notice, a claim for compensation was made by William Edward Bidwill and Ernest Tancred Dillon Bell, the executors and trustees of the last will of Charles Robert Bidwill, deceased, and the claim has been determined by the Compensation Court sitting at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wel-lington, in manner provided by such Acts: And whereas, in pursuance of the said Acts, an order was made by the said Court on the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and five (now duly filed in the office of the Supreme Court at Wellington afore-said), declaring the land which the Minister is entitled to take, being the land specified in the Schedule hereto, and declaring the amount of compensation and costs to be paid in respect to the taking of such land: Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said Acts, and of all other powers and authoritis in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto (being the land specified in the aforesaid order dated the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and five) is compulsorily taken under the said Acts.

FIRST SCHEDULE. TAWAHA SETTLEMENT.

ALL that parcel of land, situate in the Land District of Wel-lington, containing by admeasurement 3,350 acres, more or less, being part of Sections 19, 20, 36, and 87, Block V., Huangarua Survey District; Sections 103, 104, and part Ngapuki Block, Block IX., Huangarua Survey District; and part of Sections 21, 90, and 91, Block VIII., Wairarapa Survey District, together with right of way over part of Section 91, Morca Block, being bounded towards the north-west by part of Section 68, Sections 88 and 89, Wards Road, Battersea Road, and the Martinborough Road, the Otakura Stream, Sections 80, 28, 79, and part 78; towards the south-west by part of Section 91; towards the south-east by the Te Maire Road; again towards the south-west by part of Sections 91, 90, 21, and 78N to the Ruamahanga River; again towards the south-east and south-east by the Otaraia Road and the Kaitara Road; again towards the north-east by Section B1 and the Tawaha Block to the starting-point: as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.G. 19309, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon edged with the colour red: excepting thereout the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, containing by admeasurement 1,000 acres more or less. ALL that parcel of land, situate in the Land District of Welmore or less.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

FIRST, all that parcel of land known as the Homestead Block, containing 739 acres, together with all erections and buildings thereon, being all the land comprised in certificate of title, Vol. 103, folio 99.

Second, all that parcel of land, containing 261 acres, more or less, being parts of Sections 36, 103, and 104, Moroa

Block, and part of Ngapuki Block, Block IX., Huangarua Survey District, as the said parcel of land is delineated on Plan $\frac{8}{15}$, S.O. 23776, deposited in the office of the Chief Surveyor, at Wellington, and thereon outlined in red, bounded as follows: Commencing at the north western junction with the Featherston-Martinborough Road of a new road laid off or intended to be laid off by the respondent and marked on the said plan "Ferry Road; thence north-west along the said Featherston - Martinborough Road 675.1 links on a bearing of 310° 31'; thence north-west along the said road 650.3 links on a bearing of 234° 6' to the middle line of the Horseshoe Lagoon; thence commencing in a westerly direction along the middle of the said Horseshoe Lagoon for the following distances and on the following bearing 285° 42', 1850.7 links bearing 292° 18', 549.2 links bearing 285° 42', 1850.7 links bearing 292° 18', 549.2 links bearing 285° 42', 1850.7 links bearing 200° 45', 290 links bearing 186° 45', 310 links bearing 269°, 210 links bearing 126° 45', 508 links bearing 143° 30', 593.6 links bearing 129° 45', 185 links bearing 143° 30', 593.6 links bearing 113° 30', 285.4 links bearing 148° 30', 593.6 links bearing 113° 30', 285.4 links bearing 128° 49'; thence south-west 146.4 links on a bearing of 224° 37'; thence south-west 146.4 links on a bearing of 224° 37'; thence south-west 146.9 links on a bearing of 135° 4'; again south-east 910.8 links on a bearing of 150° 15'; again southeast 29.8 links on a bearing of 150° 15'; again south-east

1463.8 links on a bearing of 159° 10' to the middle line of the main drain running from the Horseshoe Lagoon to the Ruamahanga River, as shown on the said plan; thence north-east along the middle line of the said drain 503.5 links on a bearing of 54° 22', and 465.8 links on a bearing of 42°; thence north west along the middle of the said drain 110 links on a bearing of 326° 25'; thence north-east 2023.3 links on a bearing of 70° 31' 45", and 109 links on a bearing 69° 59' to the western side of the said Ferry Road; thence along the western side of the said Ferry Road 1197.3 links on a bearing of 35° 28', 1668.9 links on a bearing of 13° 56', 1158.8 links on a bearing of 7° 26', and 267.2 links on a bearing of 21° 19' to the point of commencement.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable William Lee, Baron Plunket, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over His Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and five.
