WHEREAS by "The Scenery Preservation Act. 1903" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor may from time to time appoint such suitable persons, not exceeding five, as he thinks fit to be a Commission under the said Act; such Commission may, if it deems necessary, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and shall make inquiries respecting the same and report to the Governor, and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown, private, or Native lands, in their opinion should be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves; and that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that any lands so recommended to be reserved shall be a reserve under the said Act, and thereupon such lands shall be in alienable unless by special Act of Parliament passed in that behalf, and no person shall cut or remove timber or in any way interfere with such lands, or damage the scenic features thereof; and such lands may be fenced, preserved, and conserved intact as and for an inalienable patrimony of the people of New Zealand:

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF HEAPHY BLOCK.

This block is situated on the west coast of Nelson Land District, between the Heaphy River and Gunner Creek on the north and the Kohaihai River on the south. It is well and permanently watered.

The soil is generally rather poor, but it is good along the coast and within a mile back from the Heaphy River. The formation is principally granite, but there are good limestone outcrops at Kohaihai Bluff and generally within a mile of

the Heaphy River. The land is forest-clad, the timber consisting principally of brown- black- and silver-birch, kamahi, and a little totara and rimu, but not in sufficient quantity to make it of value for milling purposes. The altitude of the country varies from sea-level to about

3,500 ft. The land when cleared and grassed will be suitable for

pastoral purposes. The climate is remarkably even and temperate, rather humid in winter, and considerably hot in summer, although the heat is tempered by the sea-breeze. The rainfall is probably less than at Karamea, and considerably less than at Westport.

Access to the northern portion of the block is from Colling-wood, a distance of about fifty-seven miles along a well-formed wood, a distance of about fity-seven miles along a well-formed bridle-track. Access from the south is from Karamea via the beach by horse or vehicle at low spring tide to the mouth of the Kohaihai River, a distance of $10\frac{1}{4}$ miles. At ordinary low tides, however, horses can only be taken along the beach for about nine miles. The hotel nearest to the block is at Karamea, and the nearest settler (at whose place horses may be left) is Mr. G. T. Harris, who occupies Section No. 4, Block I., Oparara, about eight miles from Karamea. Mr. Harris has a hut with bunks therein, which can probably be made available for the

bunks therein, which can probably be made available for the temporary accommodation of people wishing to inspect the land. There is another settler—Mr. J. R. Simpson—who occupies Section No. 15, Block V., Oparara, he and Mr. Harris being the only residents along the beach north of the Oparara River.

Good coal has been found in Gunner Creek, and fair-quality ligneous coal has been found on the high ground along the

Collingwood and Heaphy Track. The River Heaphy is navigable by small steamers, and about a quarter of a mile up the river from the mouth there is a good anchorage.

The nearest school to the Heaphy Block is situated on the

left bank of the Oparara River near the bridge. It is proposed to form bridle-tracks from the Kohaihai River up the coast and up the Gunner Creek.

No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for the period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, and three years in the case of light-bush land, from the date from which in each case respectively such lands are disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such lands during such period.
5. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, and

selector the further installments of rent payable by min for a period of four years in the case of heavy-bush land, and three years in the case of light-bush land, shall not be de-manded: provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such installments of rent percents. of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose member-ship is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be given to more than one library in the same town. 2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.
3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.
4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1905; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:--

METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATIONS.

THE RAINFALL of November amounted to a little above the average in most parts of New Zealand, and although the showers were generally light, yet heavy rains fell at nearly all the stations on one or two days of the month, and their distri-bution had marked differences in time.

In the NORTH ISLAND the heaviest rains were-

On the 1st and 2nd in the north and west.
 On the 9th on the East Coast, and but little fell on the eastern side of the

Kaimanawa Ranges after that date. (3.) On the 25th and 26th precipitation was heavy over the Taranaki and Wellington Districts.

In the South Island-

(4.) Heavy rain fell in the northern parts on the 1st and 2nd, but it was

(4.) Heavy rain fell in the northern parts on the 1st and 2nd, but it was afterwards very dry in Marlborough.
(5.) On the 8th there was a severe thunderstorm, accompanied with hail in parts over South Canterbury; and
(6) Rain fell heavily in Southland on the 15th and 23rd. Local thunderstorms occurred during the month in many parts, and these records need fuller examination; more observations are also required. The weather during the month was generally dull. For the first ten or twelve days it was very showery. A few remarkably sunny days occurred in the middle of the month, but during the last fortnight rough westerly winds prevailed. Barometric pressure was below the mean for the month, and it was especially so in the South. Between the 17th and the 30th three distinct areas of low pressure passed over the South Island, while the barometric gradients accounted for the heavy gales which occurred at this time.

sure passed over the South Island, while the barometer was fairly high in the North. These changes and the steepness of the barometric gradients accounted for the heavy gales which occurred at this time. THE TEMPERATURE of the air was higher than it was in the corresponding month last year, but did not come up to what is expected in the last month of spring in New Zealand. The cloudiness of the atmosphere, acting as a blanket, prevented the radiation of heat from the ground, and thus dews were not formed, and only one particularly sharp frost was noted in the plains of South Canter-bury, on the morning of the 24th. THE EFFECTS of the weather were evident in vegetation, &c. Although growth was marked and feed abundant, yet lack of sunsnine and the high winds everywhere kept things in a backward state. The drying winds quickly eva-porated the water on the surface of the soil, so that it became dry and hard. Garden pests were destroyed, rank growth stopped, and, it is believed, the potato-disease was checked by the same means. Hay-crops are reported fair, and oats looking well. Orchards and gardens, though damaged by the winds, are promising, but stone fruits for some reason have not set as well as expected, and in some parts the yields will be small. Extremes being absent, the lamb-ing was very successful. The shearing is late on account of the weather, but it is mentioned by observers that though the wool is dry and harsh, yet it is parts, and, for the want of their shelter, to fields, especially on low sandy coasts, good grass land being ruined with sand-drifts. One observer mentions that a tremendous gale of wind on the night of the 17th uprooted or broke down about if ty trees near the house. These were chiefly *Pinus insignis* and gum-trees, and it was noteworthy that spruces and other trees stood the test much better, only three spruces losing their tops. The willow-trees were also sally stripped of their leaves, and during the night of the 23rd were lashing the ground. Some destruction was caused in pla

New PLYMOUTH Meteorological Observatory has been in existence from May, 1852, and but two breaks have occurred in the continuity of the records: the instruments were destroyed in the Maori war in 1860, and no observations were taken for five months, and also between 1881 and 1893 there were no records. Through the former site being no longer available, Mr. G. W. Palmer, who has for six years well discharged the office of meteorological observer, has resigned, and it is to be hoped that his successor will soon be appointed. Observations of rainfall and temperature, though of value to the colony at large, are most important to each locality. Local government bodies should be primarily interested in questions relating to the climatic changes, for only by taking into account particular information re rainfall, &c., can engineers, builders, and others apply the results of experience gained in other parts of the world to their own problems of drainage, building, &c. The Government is providing a number of self-reco ding rain-gauges for obtaining particulars as to the rate of rainfall, and it is expected that local bodies will avail themselves of the oppor-tunity of securing reliable information from the use of these instruments.



Locality and Description of Taumarunui Township.

Taumarunui Township is picturesquely situated at the junction of the Ongarue River with the Wanganui River, Junction of the Ongarue River with the Wanganul River, and on the right or northern bank of the latter.
