Defining the Middle Line of a Further Portion of the Grey-mouth-Hokitika-Ross Railway.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Greymouth-Hokitika-Ross Railway (hereinafter termed "the said railway") is a railway the construction of which is authorised by "The Railways Authorisation Act, 1901": And whereas the said

railway has been partly constructed, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1905," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Crown Land reserved under "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1903."

(L.S.) **PLUNKET, Governor.**

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1903" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may from time to time appoint such suitable persons, not exceeding five, as he thinks fit to be a Commission under the said Act; such Commission may, if it deems necessary, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and shall make inquiries respecting the same and report to the Governor, and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown, private, or Native lands, in their opinion should be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves; and that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that any lands so recommended to be reserved shall be a reserve under the said Act, and thereupon such lands shall be inalienable unless by special Act of Parliament passed in that behalf, and no person shall cut or remove timber or in any way interfere with such lands, or damage the scenic features thereof; and such lands may be fenced, preserved, and conserved intact as and for an inalienable patrimony of the people of New Zealand:

And whereas the Governor has, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, appointed certain persons to be a Commission for the purposes thereof: And whereas the said Commission has, after making inquiries respecting the same, reported to the Governor and recommended that the area of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved as a scenic reserve: And whereas it is expedient that the said recommendation should be given effect to:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the area of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a reserve under the said Act.

Making Regulations for controlling the Traffic on Lake Rotorua and the Management of Wharves erected therein, and prescribing Dues for the Use thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twelfth day of January, 1906.

THE HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, K.C.M.G., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Harbours Act, 1878" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board the Governor in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by the said Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may, in cases where such powers would be exercised under by-laws to be made by a Board, exercise the same under regulations to be made in the manner provided in section two hundred and twelve of the said Act: And whereas there is no Harbour Board having jurisdiction in Lake Rotorua, which is a harbour within the meaning of that term as defined by the said Act:

And whereas it is desirable to make regulations for controlling the traffic on the said lake and for the management of the wharves erected therein, and to prescribe dues for the use thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the twelfth section of the said Act, and of all the other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the regulations contained in the Schedule hereto, and doth order that the same shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, apply to Lake Rotorua and the wharves aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the word "Department" means the Minister having charge of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, and any person acting for, by, or under the direction of such Minister; and "vessel" includes steamer, ship, launch, and boat.
2. All vessels plying on the lake shall be under the direction of the Department, and subject to these regulations.
3. Vessels shall not ply for hire, or carry any passengers, cargo, ballast, water, or otherwise, or be employed as a ferry-boat or tug-boat therein, without being licensed by the Department.
4. No person shall ply for hire within the lake, nor use any vessel for the conveyance of passengers, cargo, ballast, water, or otherwise, nor act as master of a ferry-boat or tug-boat therein only, without being licensed by the Department.
5. Applications for licenses must be made in writing, addressed to the Department, and must be accompanied by such certificates as are required by these regulations.
6. Before any license is issued to any vessel she must be inspected by the officer appointed by the Department, who will, upon approval, grant a certificate as to her dimensions, that she is fully equipped with proper gear and in a seaworthy condition, and that she is properly marked, as required by these regulations; also as to the number of passengers, and the quantity of cargo, ballast, water, or otherwise, she may with safety be permitted to carry:
Provided that, in case of steam-vessels, the number of passengers allowed shall in no case exceed the number stated in the certificate of survey granted by the Marine Department.
7. Before any license is issued to a master boatman, waterman, or other person plying for hire as before mentioned, the applicant must prove to the satisfaction of the Department, or some person appointed for the purpose, that he possesses a competent knowledge of the management of his craft, also that he is a person of respectability and free from intemperate habits.
8. Licenses shall be issued by the Department after they have been signed, numbered consecutively, and the particulars thereof entered in a book to be kept for that purpose.
9. Every license for a vessel shall contain the name of such vessel, also of the master and owner thereof, with the address of the latter, and shall specify the number of passengers, or the quantity of cargo, ballast, water, or otherwise, such vessel is licensed to carry.
10. A condition of every such license shall be that the applicant shall keep such vessel fully equipped with proper gear and in a seaworthy condition, and properly marked, as required by these regulations.

11. Every license for a master boatman or waterman shall contain his name and address in full, and there shall be from time to time indorsed thereon by the officer appointed for the purpose the names of the vessels with which he shall ply for hire.

12. The officer appointed by the Department may at any time inspect or measure any vessel plying on the lake, or test the accuracy of any measurement, and may appoint the time, place, and manner when, where, and in which such measurement or inspection shall be made; and, if he finds that these regulations are not duly complied with, he may suspend or cancel the license for any such vessel.

13. The expense of measuring or remeasuring, and of marking, such vessels shall be borne and paid by the owner or owners of such vessels; and if any such expense has been incurred by the Department no license shall be issued until the owner has repaid the same to it.

14. No license under these regulations shall be held to give any right to carry cargo in any vessel until the requirements of the Customs laws and regulations have been duly complied with.

15. No vessel plying within the lake shall carry more passengers, cargo, ballast, water, or otherwise than the number or quantity allowed in the license.

16. Every master boatman or waterman shall carry about with him, and shall produce on demand to any officer of the Department, or to any person by whom he may be employed, his license and the license for the vessel with which he is plying for hire, also a printed copy of the table of fares or other authorised charges.

17. All licenses shall be issued for such periods only as shall expire on the 31st December in any year, but these may be renewed year by year at the discretion of the Department.

18. Applications for renewals of licenses must be sent to the Department on or before the date of expiration.

19. Fees for licenses shall be paid to the Department according to the following scale per annum:—

20. The fares to be charged by watermen shall not exceed those shown in the table of fares, which the Department is hereby authorised to make and to alter from time to time as it deems expedient.

21. Any licensed master boatman or waterman found guilty of dishonest or improper conduct, or of using abusive or insulting language, or of plying with a boat which the Department shall consider to be not fully equipped with proper gear and not in a seaworthy condition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 and to have his license cancelled or suspended, at the discretion of the Department.

22. Every boat licensed to carry passengers shall have its name and the name of the owner thereof, or of the waterman plying with it for hire, legibly painted on a board securely fixed in the stern of such boat.

23. Every licensed master boatman or waterman who shall carry in any vessel more passengers or cargo than the vessel has been licensed to carry, and any such master boatman or waterman who shall demand more than the proper fare, or who shall without sufficient reason refuse or neglect to take a passenger in his boat when required, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

24. Any licensed master boatman or waterman lending his license to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

25. The Department is hereby empowered to take such means and to give such orders and directions as it deems necessary for the purpose of preventing risk or accident, confusion, or overcrowding of boats alongside of vessels; and any person wilfully disobeying any orders so given shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

26. Any person obstructing or impeding the navigation of the lake, or obstructing any landing-place, by any vessel, cable, warp, or other article, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5; and in case such obstruction or impediment be not removed when ordered by the Department, it may cast off, cut, or remove any such obstruction at the risk and expense of the master or owner thereof.

27. No pitch, tar, resin, or other combustible matter shall be lighted or heated on board of any vessel while lying alongside or near any other vessel or wharf; nor shall any vessel be fumigated or smoked for the extermination of vermin without permission in writing from the Department.

28. Proper tarpaulins shall be used in discharging or taking in ballast, coals, rubbish, gravel, earth, or filth of any kind, so as to prevent any part thereof from falling into the lake.

29. Steamships at all times when under way must have, in addition to the helmsman, a responsible person on the bridge in charge of the ship, and also a responsible person in charge of and attending to the engine. The utmost care must be taken by the person or persons in charge to prevent accidents to other vessels.

30. If the master of any vessel that is being navigated within the lake neglects to observe any of the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea" which may from time to time be made by His Majesty's Order in Council (which regulations are by section 191 of "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903," brought into force in the colony), he shall, in addition to any liabilities he may incur by so doing, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

31. In every case where a vessel having passengers on board, or engaged in carrying passengers, or, if a steamship, lawfully entitled to carry passengers, is or lies alongside of any wharf the following special provisions shall apply:—

- (1.) The master of such vessel shall keep for the use of passengers or persons coming from or going on board such vessel a proper and secure gangway with double side-rails, or stanchions with ropes rove taut through the same, the top rail or rope being not less than 3 ft. 3 in. high, and shall cause such gangway to be securely fixed to and extend from one portion of the ship's deck or side-rail to the wharf, with a good solid bearing at each end, and to be so kept fixed so long as such vessel is or lies alongside such wharf.
- (2.) If the outer end of any such gangway rests on the vessel's side-rail the master of the vessel shall keep substantial steps fixed to lead from the end of the gangway to the vessel's deck.
- (3.) The master of the ship shall, if the ship be in use, keep a proper bright light fixed, and burning bright and clear, over such gangway from sunset to sunrise, in such a manner as to light the whole length of it properly.

32. Whenever the hatch of a vessel is open for the purpose of working cargo or otherwise, and there is not sufficient daylight for persons working at or near it or passing near it to see clearly that it is open, then the master of the ship shall place a light or lights at such hatch of sufficient brilliancy to enable persons to see that it is open, and shall maintain such light during the time the hatch is so open and insufficiently lighted.

33. After work has ceased for the day on board of any vessel all hatches shall be put on and properly secured to prevent accidents; and before closing the hatches an officer of the vessel shall go into the hold and into the between-decks and satisfy himself that there are no signs of fire.

34. Every vessel arriving at a wharf shall be moored where the Department directs, and shall not be changed or moved from any berth thereat without permission.

35. It shall not be lawful to anchor a vessel so as to obstruct the approach to any wharf.

36. The master or officer in charge of any vessel shall slack down or heave in any warps, or heave ahead or astern, or haul off from any wharf when ordered by the Department to do so.

37. The Department may order any vessel to be removed from any berth alongside any wharf, or from any anchorage, to any part of the lake, whenever in the opinion of the Department such removal is proper for the general accommodation of shipping, and it shall be the duty of the master or officer in charge to obey such order.

38. Every master or officer in charge of a vessel shall on all occasions, when ordered by the Department, do whatever the Department may consider necessary or expedient with the view to the safety and interest of the whole shipping, and in consideration of the state of the weather or any other circumstance.

39. The Department shall have power to close any wharf or any portion thereof whenever in its opinion it is advisable to do so, and the wharf or portion thereof so closed shall not be used for traffic.

40. No person shall be allowed on any wharf or in the sheds or buildings used therewith unless he has, in the opinion of the Department, legitimate business thereon.

41. No person shall disobey the orders of the Department or its officers when acting in the due performance of their duty, nor in any way obstruct the traffic on any wharf, pier, jetty, or landing-place, nor make use of abusive or improper language thereon.

42. No person shall scribble upon, cut, scratch, or otherwise deface any part of any wharf, or any shed thereon or connected therewith.

43. Any person who accidentally or otherwise damages or destroys any of the Department's property shall be liable for the cost of repair or renewal thereof.

44. If any person fails, refuses, or neglects to do anything required by these regulations, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined or authorised to be done, or wilfully does anything prohibited by these regulations, every such person so offending shall, where no other penalty is imposed by these regulations, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

45. The following dues shall be payable to the Department for the use of the wharves on the said lake:—

46. All vessels which do not pay their wharfage dues in advance shall be deemed to be irregular trading-vessels, and wharfage dues shall be payable accordingly.

47. The half-year will commence on the 1st days of January and July in each year.

48. All wharfage dues payable by irregular trading-vessels shall be paid to the Department, or to some one appointed by it to receive them, the payments to be made by the master or owner of the vessel upon application.

49. All goods not removed from the wharves or sheds within seven days will be charged double rates—viz., 2s. per ton; with a minimum charge of 6d.

WHEREAS by "The Kauri-gum Industry Amendment Act, 1902" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council declare that land set apart under "The Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1898" (hereinafter termed "the principal Act"), as a kauri-gum reserve, and which is no longer required for the purpose of gum-digging, shall be no longer subject to the principal Act, and shall thereafter be dealt with by the Land Board as ordinary Crown land; provided that such Order in Council shall only be issued in pursuance of a resolution of the Land Board, supported by such independent evidence as the Governor in Council deems necessary:

And whereas the Land Board of the Auckland Land District has duly passed a resolution recommending that the Koheroa No. 1 Kauri-gum Reserve described in the Schedule hereto be excepted from the operation of the principal Act, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the Koheroa No. 1 Kauri-gum Reserve described in the Schedule hereto shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the principal Act, and shall hereafter be dealt with by the Land Board as ordinary Crown land.

The two new lights will be in the same tower, and the focal plane of the subsidiary red light will be 34 ft. below the focal plane of the double-flashing light.

The elevation of the base on which the new tower stands is 231 ft. above H.W.O.S.T. The balcony-floor is 40 ft. above the level of the base, and the tip of the weather-vane 68 ft. above the base.

The focal plane of the double-flashing light is 282 ft. above H.W.O.S.T., and the focal plane of the subsidiary red light 248 ft. above H.W.O.S.T.

The position of the new tower will be 30 degrees 15 minutes 12 seconds S. latitude, 30 degrees 46 minutes 51½ seconds E. longitude.

The iron conical tower is painted with red and white bands, and the lantern painted white. It is placed immediately behind the site of the old inland or westward beacon on the headland above Green Point, and is on the line of leading-marks bearing on the Aliwal Shoal. The inland or westward beacon has been removed. The existing seaward or eastern beacon, latitude 30 degrees 15 minutes 15 seconds S., and longitude 30 degrees 47 minutes 5 seconds E., will remain unaltered, and the line of leading-marks indicating the Aliwal Shoal is the seaward or eastern beacon bearing upon the centre of the new Green Point Lighthouse.

The double-flashing dioptric light will be visible between the true bearings N. 22 degrees E. to S. 33 degrees W., or, assuming the magnetic variation of 23 degrees 30 minutes W., through the magnetic bearings N. 45½ E. to S. 56½ W. The subsidiary red light will be visible between the true bearings N. 61½ W. and S. 88½ W., or between the magnetic bearings N. 38 W. and N. 68 W.

The double-flashing light should be visible from a distance of 23 nautical miles in clear weather.

The intensity of the flash is 240,000 candles.

The distribution will take place on the 6th February, 1906, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 30th January, 1906.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1905; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATIONS FOR DECEMBER, 1905.

THE weather during the month of December, though on the whole drier and warmer than experienced in the corresponding period of last year, was somewhat dull and resulted in a late summer. Much of the weather was, however, very agreeable. When during the daytime the clouds dissipated hot sunshine was felt everywhere, but the mornings and evenings were often cloudy. Evening showers were frequent, but the nights mostly clear. Moderate winds prevailed, except on the 20th and 21st. The backwardness of the summer season last year and this is accounted for by the increased humidity and cloudiness of the atmosphere, which may possibly be traced to greater solar activity upon the wide oceans of the Southern Hemisphere. Sun-spot theories, though not wholly coming up to expectations, chiefly because they do not readily account for differences in various latitudes, nevertheless attract attention when it is found, as lately in New Zealand, that anomalous weather conditions have accompanied the period with a maximum number of sun-spots. To these periods (recurring every eleven years) lower mean temperatures, more rain, and a greater number of atmospheric disturbances are generally attributed, while periods of minima are found to be warmer, drier, and more settled.

In the northern parts of both Islands the amount of rainfall, with the exception of a few stations, was considerably below the average of the month, although in most cases the actual number of "rainy days" was greater. The total fall was generally above the average in the southern parts of both Islands—viz., Taranaki and North Wellington districts in the North Island, and in parts of South Canterbury, Otago, and Southland especially.

Anticyclonic conditions prevailed in the first week of the month. The weather was fine, and summer seemed to come with a burst. Dews and a few very light frosts were recorded at this time. On the 5th light showers fell in parts of the South Island, and other parts of the North Island were also visited with rain in the next few days. The 12th was fine everywhere, but the weather was very warm and muggy. The highest temperatures were recorded at this time; the thermometer registered 85° at Gisborne, 86·6° at Christchurch, 87·2° at Lincoln, and 83° at Dunedin.

The most general rains of the month followed—on the 13th and 14th with the fall of the barometer on the West Coast, and on the East Coast particularly with the rise of atmospheric pressure on the 15th and 16th. Several local thunderstorms were recorded on the 13th and 14th. The weather was somewhat cold and unseasonable between the 19th and 24th. Light rains were general at this time. Snow fell on the high mountains on the 21st and 22nd, and thunder and lightning were then recorded in a few places. A touch of winter in summer also occurred (in many valleys especially) on Christmas morning, when a frost was experienced. Christmas Day and Boxing Day were generally fine and pleasant throughout the colony. About the 28th rain fell in many districts, and some heavy falls were recorded in the Poverty Bay district. Mr. H. Guthrie-Smith, of Tutira Lake, thus describes: "The atmosphere on morning of 28th very heavy and close, without sun. At 1 p.m. mist from the east draped the hills, and a few drops fell; at the same time thunder was heard in the west and south-west. The wind veered to the south, changing later to the west, accompanied by terrific deluges of rain and a few large hailstones; 78 points fell in eleven minutes. Blue sky was observed, the clouds lifted from the hills, and a wind blowing from the east veered again to the west, and again brought heavy rain, but less heavy falls for a shorter period. Steady rain then set in from the south-east, and stars were out by 10 p.m. I do not remember heavier rain than during the eleven minutes." Hail fell in some places with the rise of the barometer, and rather chilly southerly winds succeeded to the end of the month.

The frequent light showers had a beneficial effect upon the growth of grass and many crops, but greatly retarded shearing everywhere, and the sowing of turnips in the South. Vegetables grew wonderfully, and the small fruits especially benefited, plums, grapes, and pears promising large crops. In South Canterbury it is remarked that "the absence of sunshine is presumably accountable for the lateness of the season. Early pears which used to ripen now are showing no signs of ripening. Gooseberries, which used to be quite over by this time, are still to be had."

From Timara, Renwicktown, Mr. R. F. Goulter reports that the month was dry, and that this year plums came into full bearing, trees that never bore fruit before then being loaded. This he attributes to there being no frosts in October, and also to the absence of beetles, presumably the small bronze beetle (*Encolaspis brunnea*).

Other observers also report that the cicada is not so numerous this year as last. Reports as to cereal crops are more varied, but are generally very much more promising than last year at this time. Potato-blight has continued to spread in several parts, but judging from the reports it is not thought to be nearly so serious as last year. On account of the exuberant growth of feed stock are reported as mostly healthy and in fair condition; in some places they have not done well for fattening, but with the hardening of the feed will benefit greatly.

The total population of Auckland and its suburbs was 87,226 persons, and that of Christchurch with its complete suburbs amounted to 57,041 persons, at the Census of March, 1901.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 562, against 545 in November—an increase of 17. The deaths in December were 188, a decrease of 4 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 94, females 94. Fifty-seven of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 30.32 per cent. of the whole number; 46 of these were under one year of age.

There were fifty-three deaths of persons 65 years and upwards: Thirteen men, 65, 66 (three), 68 (two), 71, 73, 74, 75, 76, 78, 88, and four women, 75, 79, 82, 83, died at Auckland; five men, 67 (two), 68, 70, 71, and five women, 66, 68, 69, 73, 74, at Wellington; four men, 68, 69, 75, 86, and four women, 67, 68, 76, 84, at Christchurch; and nine men, 68, 71, 72, 77 (two), 79, 80, 82, 85, and nine women, 69, 71 (two), 72, 76, 77, 79, 81, 82, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch, but raises it at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality in this class at the four chief towns and their suburbs was very low in December, 1905, comprising 6 deaths. Five of these were from diarrhoea—3 deaths at Auckland, and 2 at Wellington. There was also 1 death at Christchurch from puerperal septicæmia.

Constitutional Diseases.—There were 38 deaths at the four centres, being 20 per cent. of the mortality from all causes. Cancer caused 16 deaths—3 at Auckland, 3 at Wellington, 5 at Christchurch, and 5 at Dunedin. From phthisis and other tubercular diseases the deaths were 12; from anæmia, 4; rheumatism and diabetes, 3 each.

Local Diseases.—More than one-half of the total deaths at the chief towns belonged to this class, being 93 in number, or 52 per cent. of all causes. Of these, diseases of the nervous system caused 20, of the circulatory 20, and of the respiratory 23 deaths. From diseases of the digestive system there were 26 deaths, of the lymphatic 1, urinary 6, and reproductive systems 2 deaths.

Violent Deaths.—Of 19 deaths at the four cities and suburbs, 13 were accidental and 6 suicidal. Of the former, 1 death was caused by injury to spine, 1 by fall from horse, 1 by crushed kidney, 1 from being run over by coach, and 1 from being thrown out of buggy. One death resulted from fall of earth and 1 from hæmorrhage after a fall. There were also 1 accidental death from bullet-wound, 2 from burns, 1 from overdose of laudanum, 1 from drowning, and 1 from suffocation. Of suicides, 2 were by shooting, 1 by cutting throat, 1 by overdose of chlorodyne, 1 by drowning, and 1 by hanging.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

Arrivals and Departures in 1905.

Registrar-General's Office, Wellington, 16th January, 1906.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1905, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The arrivals in the colony last year (32,685) exceeded the number recorded in 1904 (32,632), and the departures during 1905, which numbered 23,383, were also greater than those in the previous year—viz., 22,277.

The excess of arrivals over departures last year was 9,302, against 10,355 in 1904.

The comparative tables show that the colony has drawn to itself in each of the ten years 1896 to 1905 more population than it has parted with.

The figures under the heading "United Kingdom" for 1905 show an excess of 3,699 arrivals over the departures, and from Australian States there is an excess of 5,765, but for other countries a loss of 162.

Of the 32,685 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 3,538, or 10.82 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 23,383 departures the children numbered 1,751, or 7.49 per cent.
