Vesting Control of Tikorangi Bridge, Huirangi-Tikorangi Road, in the Clifton County Council, and apportioning the Cost of Maintenance.

PLUNKET, Governor.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and nineteen of "The Public Works Act, 1905" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Warrant publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be conbridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be con-structed, over or across any river or arm of the sea re-spectively shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Warrant, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Warrant; and may by any such Warrant as aforesaid fix and determine whether all or any, and if so what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, re-pairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or local autho-rities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may by any such Warrant as aforesaid direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made: And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that

And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

SPECIAL Meeting.—Resolved on the 24th day of November, 1905:— In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by "The Counties Act, 1886," the Raglan County Council hereby resolves as follows: That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £400, authorised to be raised by the Raglan County Council, under the provisions of "The Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1901," and "The Counties Act, 1886," for the purpose of forming and metalling portions of the Tuakau-Raglan Road, the original loan of £4,000 being insufficient to complete the work, the said Raglan County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of $\frac{1}{4}$ d. in the pound upon the rateable valuation of all rateable property of the Special rating District of Onewhero, boundaries of which are as follows—Commencing at a point where the northern boundary-line of Section 21, Block VIII, Maioro Survey District, intersects the coast-line; thence N.E. following S. bank of Waikato River to road-line adjoin-ing Section 95, Onewhero Parish; thence southerly follow-ing said road-line to eastern line of Sections 157; thence southerly along eastern boundary-lines of Sections 157, 33, 22, and Opuatia No. 4, and thence westerly along southern bound-aries of Opuatia No. 4 and No. 5c to eastern line of Section 90; thence S.W. along said line to road-line, following said road-line S. and W. to S.E. corner of Section 98; thence fol-lowing southern boundary of Section 98 to eastern boundary of Section 109, following said line and southern line of Sec-tion 109 to intersection of Putataka Parish line; thence northerly along said road to road-line; thence along road-line, along southern boundary-line of Section 27, following said

Wellington, 13th November, 1905. OTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 6th February, 1906, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 30th

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose member-ship is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town. 2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be for the current of the institution of £25

given to more than one library in the same town. 2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.
 Application to share in the distribution must be by

means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secre-tary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1905; and such

declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows :-
