HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the fourth section of "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that, whenever any Harbour Board is desirous of executing or constructing any harbour works upon lands vested in such Board or upon lands of the Crown of such a nature that the same could, under "The Harbours Act, 1878," only be carried out and executed under the authority of a special Act, the Board may apply to the Governor in Council for a special Order, and, if the Governor in Council thinks fit, such Order may be media and gravitad.

and, if the Governor in Council thinks fit, such Order, and, if the Governor in Council thinks fit, such Order may be made and granted: And whereas the Auckland Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain land in Auckland Harbour, and to construct for that purpose a breastwork of re-enforced concrete with stone-rubble backing, and the said work is of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Board has applied to the Governor in Council for the issue of a special Order: And whereas the conditions precedent to the granting of a special Order prescribed by the said Act have been duly performed and observed, and it appears expedient that such Order should be made: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation:

injury of navigation : _____Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New

Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorise and empower the Board to reclaim certain land from the sea, and to construct for the purpose of such reclamation a breastwork as hereinfor the purpose of such reclamation a preastwork as nerein-before mentioned, as shown on plan and specifications marked M.D. 2909, such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with the said plan and specifica-tions, subject to the provisions of the said Act. And it is hereby ordered and declared that the said work shall be completed on or before the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

Amending Regulations for Trout-fishing, Auckland Acclimatisation District.

PLUNKET, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this first day of March, 1906.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of October W HEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and four, certain regulations were made under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), providing for trout-fishing within the Auckland Acclimatisation District as therein defined: And whereas t is expedient to revoke numbers two, twelve, twenty, and twenty-four of the said regulations and to make other provisions in lieu thereof :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers con-ferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the said regulations numbers two, twelve, twenty, and twenty-four, and in lieu thereof doth hereby order as follows :--

2. Every whole season license shall entitle the holder to fish in all the waters of the said Auckland Acclimatisation District for the period extending from the first day of November in any one year to the thirtieth day of April in the year following, both days inclusive: subject, however, to the special limitations and restrictions hereinafter men-tioned tioned.

tioned. 12. The period from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of October following, both days inclusive, is hereby appointed a close season, during which it shall be unlawful for any person to fish for or take any Salmonidæ or trout, or in any way to injure or disturb the same. No person shall have in his possession any Salmonidæ or trout between the first day of May and the first day of November following: Provided that this regulation shall not apply to fish taken by officers of the said society for purposes of acclimatisa-tion. tion.

20. Nothing herein contained, or contained in any license issued under these regulations, shall be deemed to authorise any person to fish for or take Salmonida or trout in any

any person to fish for or take Salmonidæ or trout in any of the following streams or waters—namely, the Utuhina Stream, the Fairy Spring, the Ngongotaha Stream, the Waiteti Stream, the Awahou Stream, the Hamurana Spring and Stream—all being streams flowing into Lake Rotorua, except during the period extending from the first day of December in any one year to the thirty-first day of March in the year following, both days inclusive. 24. Notwithstanding anything in these or any other regu-lations contained, it shall be lawful for the said society to purchase trout in the County of Rotorua from holders of licenses. and to sell trout so purchased, and to establish a shop or depot for that purpose, and to appoint a manager of managers thereof: Provided always that the whole of the net profits from such buying and selling shall be devoted by the said society to the purposes of the distribution, rearing, cultivation, and protection of fish in the district of the said society, and an account of the receipts and expenditure of such buying and selling shall be shown in the annual state-

society, and an account of the receipts and expenditure of such buying and selling shall be shown in the annual state-ment of accounts of the said society. And in pursuance of the like power and authority it is hereby declared that the foregoing regulations shall be read and construed as part of the said recited regulations of the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four.
