HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Awitu Road Board (hereinafter called "the Board") did, in the year one thousand nine hundred and two, apply to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy part of the foreshore in Manukau Harbour in order to erect a wharf at Orua Bay; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 2548) showing the area of foreshore and the manner in which it was proposed to erect the said wharf: And whereas the Governor in Council did, on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and two, what: And whereas the Governor in Council did, on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and two, approve of the purpose for which the said foreshore was to be occupied, and granted a license for the purpose aforesaid on the terms and conditions therein expressed: And whereas the said Board has applied for authority to make certain alterations in the said wharf at Orua Bay described in the said Plan M.D. M.D. 2546; and in accordance with in the said Plan M.D. No. 2548; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-eixth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the said Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 2971 (such plan being supplementary to the above-mentioned Plan No. 2548), showing the additional foreshire and land below low-water mark interested to be securified and the netween the factor of the said water to be securified. tended to be so occupied, and the nature and extent of the said alterations intended to be made: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the Board under the said Act for the purpose last aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

on the terms and conditions hereinatter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the Board as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and

exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Board to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf at Orua Bay is to be erected, as shown on the Plan M.D. 2548 as amended by the Plan M.D. 2971 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf as altered at Orua Bay, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Board upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf, which is shown on the plans marked M.D. 2548 and M.D. 2971 respectively.

3. That all His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

4. That His Majesty, or the Governor and all officers in

4. That His Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment. 5. The Board shall maintain the above mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the

Minister. 6. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Board a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the Board, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the Board shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Board 7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Board and deposited above highwater mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, by the Harbourmaster at Manukau, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force until the

first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board.

11. The Board shall appoint all officers necessary for the control and management of the said wharf.

12. The Board shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any fault or neglect on its part.

any fault or neglect on its part.

13. In case the Board shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions here-inbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a pericd of thirty days, then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council,

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company, and deposited above highwater mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 553, against 516 in April—an increase of 37. The deaths in May were 207, an increase of 39 on the number in April. Of the total deaths, males contributed 124, females 83. Fifty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 28:50 per cent. of the whole number; 49 of these were under one year of age.

There were forty-nine deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Ten men, 65, 70 (two), 75 (three), 76, 80, 81, 84, and five women, 65, 69, 70, 78, 80, died at Auckland; eight men, 65 (two), 67 (two), 72, 73, 74, 89, and six women, 65, 68, 71, 73, 80, 82, at Wellington; five men, 65, 68, 75, 78, 84, and two women, 80, 82, at Christohurch; and seven men, 65, 72, 74 (two), 78, 79, 88, and six women, 70, 71, 72, 74, 79, 82, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christohurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite shough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christohurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, but raises it at Christohurch.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—There were 7 deaths in the four chief cities and their suburbs caused by this class of disease during May. Diphtheria caused 1 death at Dunedin, and diarrhœal complaints 4 at Auckland. Specific disease was fatal in 2 cases—1 at Auckland, and 1 (a child 3 months old) at Wellington.

Dietetic Diseases.—Alcoholism caused 4 deaths, 3 of these being at Dunedin, and 1 at Christchurch.

Constitutional Diseases.—There were 39 deaths from constitutional diseases during May, 17 being the result of cancer (Auckland 6, Wellington 7, Christchurch and Dunedin 2 each), and 14 of phthisis (Auckland and Wellington 3 each, Christchurch 2, and Dunedin 6). Other forms of tubercular disease resulted in 3 more deaths. Of the remaining number, 3 were caused by diabetes.

Developmental Diseases. -These caused 26 deaths, 14 being from premature birth, 1 from congenital malformation, and

11 from old age.

Local Diseases.—Of 98 deaths in May in this class at the four centres, 19 were caused by diseases of the nervous system, 25 of the circulatory, 19 of the respiratory, 19 of the digestive, 1 of the lymphatic, 12 of the urinary (8 Bright's disease), and 3 of the reproductive systems.

Violent Deaths.—There were 15 deaths in this class at the four chief towns—13 by accident or negligence and 2 by suicide. One person was crushed by a railway-truck while shunting, 1 was choked by a piece of orange, and 2 died from inhaling poisonous fumes. Of the others, 3 were drowned, 1 died from burns, 1 was run over by a traction-engine and 1 by a trap, 1 died through fracture of skull, and 2 deaths were caused by collision with tramcars—1 in Wellington, and 1 in Dunedin. The suicides were both by shooting.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

TOTICE is hereby given that a Civil Service Junior Examination and a Junior National Scholarship and Free Place Examination will be held in December, 1906, beginning on or about the eleventh day of the month; and that a Civil Service Senior Examination and an examination for teachers' certificates of Class C and Class D will be held in January, 1907, beginning on or about the 6th day of the month. the month.

The Civil Service Junior Examination is prescribed as the examination which holders of Junior National Scholarships are required to pass at the end of the second year of their scholarships (Junior Scholarship Continuation Examination). It is also a qualifying examination for senior free places in secondary schools and district high schools; further, it is the first examination for pupil-teachers.

With the Junior National Scholarship Examination will be taken the Junior Free Place Examination (including the examination for junior free places in technical schools), and candidates may qualify for junior free places in either examination.

Entries for the examinations for Junior National Scholar-Ships, for Junior Free Places, for National Scholarship Continuation, and for Senior Free Places must be made through the principals or head teachers of the schools attended, and will be received by Secretaries of Education Boards not later than the 30th September, 1906.

Entries for other examinations will be received by the Inspector-General of Schools, at Wellington, until the 30th September, 1906, or, with a late fee of £1 in addition to the ordinary fee, until the 15th October, 1906.

All entries must be made on the proper forms, which may be obtained from the office of any Education Board or of the

Education Department.

Candidates for Senior National Scholarships are reminded that, in forwarding to the University authorities their application to be admitted to the examination for a Junior University Scholarship, they must at the same time give notice of their intention to compete for a Senior National Scholarship.

Candidates who have to pass in elementary handwork for the teachers' certificate, or otherwise, are examined at various times and places. Those who desire to be examined in good time in this subject are recommended to apply early.
