A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1904," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Tauranga District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

TAURANGA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-east by the ocean from the Katikati Entrance of the Tauranga Harbour to the Tauranga Entrance; thence towards the east generally by a line along the middle of Tauranga Harbour to the mouth of the Waitao Stream; thence by the said Waitao Stream to the eastern boundary-line of Waitaha No. 2 Block; thence by the eastern boundary-line of the said Waitaha No. 2 Block to Waoku No. 2A Block; thence by the northern boundary-line of the last-mentioned block to its north-eastern corner; thence by the south-eastern boundary-lines of Waoku No. 2A and Waoku No. 2 Blocks, and the south-eastern boundary-line of the last-mentioned block produced to the northern boundary of Rotorua County; thence towards the south by Rotorua County to Piako County; thence towards the south-west by the said Piako County to a point bearing 247° from the source of the Kauritutaki River; thence towards the north-west by a right line to the source of the said Kauritutaki River; thence by a line along the middle of the last-mentioned river to its confluence with the Aoangate River; thence by a line along the middle of the said Aoangate River to its mouth; and thence by the Tauranga Harbour to the Katikati Entrance, the place of commencement.

TE PUKE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-east by the ocean from the Tauranga Entrance of the Tauranga Harbour to the mouth of the Whakatane River; thence towards the east by the said Whakatane River to the confiscation boundary-line; thence towards the south by the confiscation boundary-line to the eastern boundary of Rotorua County; thence towards the west and again towards the south by Rotorua County to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary-line of Waoku No. 2 Block; thence again towards the west generally by a right line to the southernmost corner of the said Waoku No. 2 Block; thence by Waoku No. 2, Waoku No. 2A, and Waitaha No. 2 Blocks to the Waitao Stream; thence by the said Waitao Stream to the Tauranga Harbour; and thence by a line along the middle of the Tauranga Harbour to the Tauranga Entrance, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and six.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and seventeen of "The Public Works Act, 1905," it is, *inter alia*, provided that the said section shall not apply in any case where the local authority having control of a road or street by resolution declares that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any specified road or street, or any specified part thereof, and such resolution is approved by the Governor in Council:

And whereas on the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and six, the Stoke Road Board, the local authority having control of the road known as Harley Terrace (being the road described in the Schedule hereto), did by resolution declare that the provisions of the said section should not apply to the said road: And whereas such resolution was in the following terms: "That the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen of 'The Public Works Act, 1905,' requiring the widening of a road when it is of less width than sixty-six feet shall not apply to Harley Terrace Road, fronting Cecil D. Beatson's property, being part of Section 80, Block III, Waimea":

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in exercise of the powers conferred by section three of "The Counties Act 1886 Amendment Act, 1895" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), the Patangata County Council and the Waipawa County Council respectively did, by an instrument bearing date the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and six, formally agree that the boundaries of the said counties should be altered to the extent set forth in the said instrument, and also in the Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient that such alteration of boundaries be approved by the Governor in Council, and that such altered boundaries be defined in terms of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that, on and after the publication of these presents in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the boundaries of the Counties of Patangata and Waipawa respectively shall be those set forth under their respective headings in the Schedule hereto.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Andrew Joseph Farmer, of Kawau Island (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore, and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore, at Bon Accord Harbour, Kawau Island, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 2746) showing the manner in which it is proposed to construct such wharf, the place where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf, which are shown on the plan marked M.D. 2746, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of one pound, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound, payable on the first day of November, dated from the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six.

3. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

4. His Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee, and deposited above high-water mark, or at such places as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

11. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

12. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause two of these conditions,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council, without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1903," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

14. The construction of the wharf shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and nine of "The Public Works Act, 1905" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that in any case where a road in one district is largely used by or for the purpose of traffic to or from any other district or districts, and the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the latter district or districts should contribute towards the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any portion of such road in the former district, the Governor may from time to time apportion the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any part of such road among the local authorities of the respective districts as he thinks fit; and for that purpose, and to enable effect to be given hereto, the provisions of section one hundred and eighteen of the said Act shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply:

And whereas the Birkenhead Borough Council has made application to the Governor to authorise the reconstruction of the road mentioned in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said road"), and to apportion the cost of constructing the said road between the said Council and the Council of the County of Waitemata:

And whereas by section one hundred and eighteen of the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may, with the view of determining whether or not the work should be done, or what proportion (if any) of the cost of the same should be borne by any local authority, and what local authority should do the work, direct any Magistrate or other person to be a Commissioner to inquire and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question aforesaid:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed, and an inquiry duly held: And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion thereon:

And whereas the Governor is of opinion that the said road should be reconstructed:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by the above-in-part-recited Act, do hereby authorise the Council of the Borough of Birkenhead to reconstruct the said road. And I do hereby declare that the cost of reconstructing the said road shall be borne by the Council of the Borough of Birkenhead and the Council of the County of Waitemata in the following proportions, viz.: The County of Waitemata to contribute the sum of two hundred pounds towards the cost of the work, and the Borough of Birkenhead to contribute the balance of the cost.

And I do hereby direct that the contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Waitemata County Council shall be paid out of the funds of the said County Council, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Borough of Birkenhead, and such payment shall be made to the Clerk of the said Borough Council for and on account of such Council.

or from such district or districts, and the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the latter district or districts should contribute towards the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any portion of such road in the former district, the Governor may from time to time apportion the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any part of such road among the local authorities of the respective districts as he thinks fit; and for that purpose, and to enable effect to be given thereto, it is also provided by the said Act that the provisions of section one hundred and nineteen of the said Act shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply in the case of the maintenance of the road:

And whereas a dispute has arisen between the Council of the Borough of Birkenhead and the Council of the County of Waitemata on the question of the maintenance of the road hereinafter mentioned:

And whereas by the said section one hundred and nineteen it is, *inter alia*, provided that the Governor may, with a view of determining what proportion (if any) of the cost of maintaining any work should be borne by any local authority, direct any Magistrate or other person to be a Commissioner to inquire and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed for the purpose aforesaid, and an inquiry duly held:

And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion thereon:

And whereas the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the cost of maintaining the road mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be provided and paid in the manner and in the proportions hereinafter respectively set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby apportion the cost of maintaining the road described in the Schedule hereto between the Council of the Borough of Birkenhead and the Council of the County of Waitemata in the following proportions, viz.: The Borough of Birkenhead to contribute nine-tenths of the cost, and the County of Waitemata to contribute one-tenth of the cost. WHEREAS by section one hundred and nineteen of "The Public Works Act, 1905" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Warrant publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Warrant, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Warrant; and may by any such

Warrant as aforesaid fix and determine whether all or any, and if so what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or local authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may by any such Warrant as aforesaid direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may from time to time, with the view of determining whether it is expedient to vest the exclusive care, control, management, and maintenance of any such bridge in any local authority, direct any person to be a Commissioner to inquire into and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid; and may by any subsequent Warrant, publicly notified from time to time, vary or alter such care, control, and management:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed, under the provisions of section one hundred and nineteen of "The Public Works Act, 1905," and an inquiry was duly held, with a view to determine what local authority could most conveniently and efficiently control the bridge known as the Aparima Bridge, mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter referred to as "the said bridge," and what proportion of the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge should be paid by any, and if so which, local authority or authorities: And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion as to the matters respecting which he was appointed to report:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the said bridge shall, from and after the date of this Warrant, be under the exclusive care and control and management of the Council of the Borough of Riverton; and in further pursuance of the aforesaid powers and authorities I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge shall, less such amount by way of contribution (if any) as may be provided by Government, be borne by the Council of the Borough of Riverton in the proportion of three-fourths and the Council of the County of Wallace in the proportion of one-fourth of the said cost respectively.

And I do hereby also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Council of the County of Wallace shall be paid from time to time in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed out of the funds of the said county, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Council of the Borough of Riverton, and such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said Council for and on account of such Council.

Rules and Regulations for the Management of the Tuapeka Commonage.

PLUNKET, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section four of "The Land Act, 1892," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke a Warrant, dated the fifth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, making regulations as therein appears for the management of Tuapeka Commonage, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the following rules, regulations, and orders for the management of the Tuapeka Commonage, described in the First Schedule to such regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. For the purpose of carrying out these regulations the following persons are appointed a Committee for the care, management, and protection of the said commonage,—

- JAMES KERR SIMPSON, of Wetherstone;
- ALEXANDER WALKER, of Wetherstone;
- ALBERT SWANWICK, of Wetherstone;
- WILLIAM JOHNSTON, of Blue Spur;
- ANDREW BARR, of Blue Spur;
- SAMUEL NUNS, of Blue Spur; and
- CORNELIUS DRISCOLL, of Blue Spur,

who shall be known as the "Tuapeka Commonage Committee" (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee"). Three of such Committee shall retire annually by ballot in December in each year, but they shall be eligible for reappointment as hereinafter provided.

2. On the second Wednesday in January in each year an election shall take place from among the holders of licenses to depasture cattle or stock upon the said commonage (hereinafter termed "license-holders") for the purpose of electing three members of the Committee instead of the three retiring members; and the names of such persons, when so elected, shall be submitted to the Governor for approval, and if so approved they shall take the place of the three retiring members.

3. The Committee shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Wednesday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the Lands Office, Lawrence, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six.

4. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Committee, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

5. Any three of the said Committee shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

6. The members of the Committee shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Wednesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor. At such meeting a Secretary shall also be appointed by the Committee.

7. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

8. If, by retirement, resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

9. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Committee present at a meeting.

10. The words "great cattle" shall be construed to mean and include cattle, horses, mules, and asses, male or female, and their offspring above six months of age; and the words "small cattle" shall be construed to mean sheep, male and female, and their offspring above the age of six months.

11. License-holders may run great or small cattle upon the lands described in the First Schedule upon the conditions mentioned in the depasturing license, to be obtained as hereinafter provided.

12. Persons desirous of obtaining a depasturing license must lodge with the Receiver of Land Revenue at Lawrence an application in writing in the form or to the effect contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and deposit therewith the license fee payable hereunder. If such application be refused the fee shall be refunded to the applicant.

13. The Committee shall have power to refuse to grant any license, also to limit the number of cattle which may be depastured under any license. They shall also have power to specify the kind of cattle which may be depastured under any license.

14. The number of cattle to be depastured shall be mentioned in the license, and the rent to be paid in respect of such license shall be calculated upon the following scale, that is to say:—

For every head of great cattle mentioned in the license, if such license is issued before 1st July	s.	d.
.. .. .	6	0
For every head of great cattle mentioned in the license, if such license is issued after 1st July	4	0
For every head of small cattle mentioned in the license, if such license is issued before 1st July	2	6
For every head of small cattle mentioned in the license, if such license is issued after 1st July	1	3

Every such license shall be in the form or to the effect contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in every year, when such license may be renewed in accordance with the foregoing provisions. Every license shall be granted subject to the conditions herein set forth, and shall be signed by the Chairman of the Committee.

15. The revenue derived from license fees or otherwise from the said commonage shall stand first charged with the cost of the destruction and prevention of the spreading of rabbits upon such commonage, such cost to be ascertained in such manner as may be fixed and determined by the Chief Inspector of Stock.

16. All cattle depastured must be branded, and the brand and a description of the cattle must be registered with the Ranger. The Ranger shall issue a certificate of registration in such form as he thinks fit, and the fee for every such certificate shall be one shilling. But if the brand is registered with the application, no further registration shall be necessary.

17. No great cattle suffering from any disease shall be depastured upon, nor shall any pigs or goats be allowed to trespass or be at large upon or within, the lands described in the First Schedule. No bull, ram, or stallion shall be depastured without the express permission in writing of the Chairman of the Committee. Any person or persons committing a breach of this provision shall be liable, on the information of such Chairman, as for trespass of cattle on Crown lands; and the Chairman of Committee for the time being is hereby empowered to lay any such information.

18. If any licensee shall at any time commit or suffer a breach of the conditions or terms upon which the license is granted, as the same are herein set forth, the Chairman of the Committee may, on such evidence as he thinks fit, cancel and determine the license held by such licensee, and he shall have no claim to any refund or allowance in respect thereof.

19. No person shall remove beyond the boundary of the land described in the First Schedule any cattle other than those belonging to him, or for the removal of which he shall have authority from the Ranger, under a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

20. If any person, not being licensed as aforesaid, shall depasture any great cattle or small cattle upon the lands described in the First Schedule, or a greater number of such cattle than shall have been apportioned to him, every such person shall be liable, on the information of the Chairman of the Committee, as for trespass of cattle on Crown lands, and also to any penalty or disability imposed in respect of unlawful occupation of Crown land.

21. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to interfere with the powers or duties of the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the district in which the lands described in the First Schedule are situated, whether under "The Land Act, 1892," or under any other law or statute for the time being in force; and the said lands described in the First Schedule hereto shall, subject to the special provisions hereinbefore made, remain and be Crown lands for the purpose of the said Act, and subject thereto.
