Regulations for the Appointment of Staff and Enrolment of Boys in New Zealand Training-ships.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventh day of January, 1907.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by section four of "The Training-ships Act, 1906," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of the said Act, and do hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force on the seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these regulations, where not inconsistent with the context,—

"The Minister" means the Minister of Defence for the time being;

"The training-ship" means any ship or vessel declared to be a training-ship under "The Training-ships Act, 1906."

2. Applications for enrolment in the training-ships must be made in writing on the form laid down, and addressed to

the Secretary, Council of Defence, together with the medical-inspection form duly filled in and certified to by a medical practitioner, also two certificates as to character, one of which must be from a Justice of the Peace or a clergyman.

3. Applications must be made by the parent or guardian of the candidate, accompanied by a written consent to his enrolment, and on the candidate being finally enrolled an undertaking must be given that he will not be removed from the vessel (unless discharged) for a period of two years, or for such other period as the Minister may determine.

4. A candidate who is selected for enrolment must report himself to the Commander for the time being of the training-ship at Wellington within ten days from the date specified in the notice which will be sent to him, when he will be placed on probation for one week; on the expiry of which he will, if found suitable, be finally enrolled.

5. Boys will, on acceptance, be received on probation on board the training-ship.

The period of probation will be one week, when, should the boy then be found unsatisfactory in any respect, he will be immediately discharged.

6. Boys found satisfactory will then be enrolled and the necessary kit issued, the civilian clothing being returned, if it is, in the opinion of the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, worth returning, to the boys' parents or guardians, otherwise it will be destroyed.

7. No boy will be allowed, while in the service, to wear clothing other than that supplied to him on the training-ship. This condition will also apply to boys when on leave.

8. A free pass (second by railway and steerage by steamer) will, where necessary, be granted to boys attending for enrolment, also to their homes in the colony on the occasion of their annual leave.

9. In the case of boys failing to pass the official medical examination, which takes place either before or during probationary period, or are rejected after probation, similar passes will also be granted back to their homes in the colony.

10. In order to qualify boys to take service in either the British navy or the mercantile marine on completion of their training in the training-ship the minimum age at entry is fixed at thirteen years and a half, and the maximum at fourteen years and a half: both these limits of age may be varied at the discretion of the Minister. The period of service on the training-ship shall be not less than eighteen months nor more than two years, at the discretion of the said Minister.

11. No officer or member of the staff or crew, other than the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, shall be deemed to be a Civil servant within the meaning of the Acts regulating the Civil Service of the colony.

PAY AND EMOLUMENTS.

12. On enrolment every boy will be rated as a "second-class boy." The sum of 1d. per day will be placed to his credit on the books of the training-ship from the date of final acceptance.

13. On his being raised to the rank of "first-class boy," which may not take place until he has completed at least six months' service, his pay may, if the Minister so approves, be raised to the amount of 2d. per day.

14. On receipt of one "good conduct" stripe, which should not take place until he has completed at least one year's service, his pay may, if the Minister so approves, be further increased to the amount of 3d. per day.

15. On being promoted to the rank of "petty officer," which should not take place until he has completed at least fifteen months' service, his pay may, if the Minister so approves, be further increased by an additional 1d. per day.

DISCIPLINE (BOYS).

16. Boys who are disorderly or dirty in their behaviour, or disrespectful to the staff or crew, or who may make away with, destroy, or damage any portion of the equipment of the training-ship, or the property on issue to them, may, on a first offence, be reported by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship to the Minister for decision in accordance with these regulations.

17. Breaches of discipline, carelessness, disobedience of orders, bad conduct, &c., on the part of boys will be punished as may be directed by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, unless of such serious nature as to require the decision of the Minister.

18. Money placed to the credit of a boy is subject to fines and forfeiture, and will affect the credit of any such boy however concerned.

19. Shortages of, or destruction of, any portion of kit or other Government property will affect the credit of the boy or boys implicated to the value of the articles or property so lost or destroyed.

20. Should any continued breaches of discipline or other unsatisfactory conduct occur on the part of a boy or boys, the Commander for the time being of the training-ship will at

once report the matter to the Minister for consideration as to what punishment is to be inflicted, or whether the boy is to be dismissed the ship.

21. Any boy or boys absent from the ship, or his duty (if on shore), without leave shall be dealt with by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship; on a second offence occurring the matter shall be reported to the Minister for decision.

22. Should any boy be absent without leave for more than six hours he is to be suspended, and the matter may be reported to the Minister.

23. The Minister may, where not provided for or not repugnant to these regulations, make and issue such standing orders as may be found necessary for the daily routine and efficient government of the training-ship.

24. In all the foregoing regulations pertaining to discipline, and numbered 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, the decision of the Minister is to be final.

DISCIPLINE (STAFF).

25. In all cases when and where practicable, and when not provided for otherwise in these regulations, the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions may be taken as a guide and as forming part of these regulations in so far as the maintenance of discipline on the training-ship is concerned.

26. All members of ship's staff shall conduct themselves in a temperate and orderly manner; they shall show an unremitting attention to duty, which must be performed with alacrity and cheerfulness, both of which are conducive to the harmony of the ship.

27. The Commander for the time being of the training-ship, while upholding the authority of the various members of the ship's staff under his control, will check by timely reproofs any tendency he may notice to abuse of power, recommending by his example that firm but conciliatory manner of conducting duty which is the surest way to gain the confidence of the boys.

28. Any member of the staff who is desirous of lodging a complaint regarding the conduct of a boy or boys is to lay the matter before the Commander for the time being of the training-ship as soon as possible after the occurrence has taken place. On this being done the Commander will at once advise what steps are to be taken to prevent a recurrence of the trouble.

29. Alcoholic liquors will not be allowed to be brought on board without the permission of the Commander for the time being of the training-ship. Any member of the staff or crew found to be under the influence of liquor will be liable to suspension and be sent on shore. A report of such conduct to be sent to the Minister, who shall decide what action is to be taken in the matter. On a second similar offence within six months the offender will be dismissed. If the offence is committed at a greater than six months' interval from the first offence the offender shall be fined £1. Such fine may be recovered from the offender in any Court of competent jurisdiction, or may be deducted from any pay due to the offender: Provided that no such deduction shall be made except on the written permission or direction of the Commander for the time being of the training-ship first obtained. In case of a third offence the offender shall be dismissed.

30. Smoking will not be allowed on deck whilst any duty is being performed, either by the staff or crew.

31. When any member of the staff or crew is convicted of any serious offence by the civil power, the offender is to be suspended and reported by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship for the consideration of the Minister, who shall decide what action is to be taken.

32. Members of the staff or crew against whom debts are recovered in a civil Court will have the fact recorded in their defaulters' sheets, and entries of this description shall be a bar to all promotion or advancement, if not otherwise more severely dealt with, as may be directed by the Minister.

33. Any member of the staff or crew shall, unless otherwise decided by the Minister, forfeit the whole of his day's pay for every day he is absent without leave or under suspension.

34. A member shall be regarded as absent for one day—

(a.) When he is absent without leave for six consecutive hours.

(b.) When, owing to his absence without leave, he has been prevented from performing any of the duties apportioned to him, and which duties were thereby, owing to his absence, thrown on some other person.

35. If a member of the staff or crew is absent for twenty-four hours without leave, he shall be suspended by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, who will at once report the case to the Minister, who shall thereupon decide whether the member is to be fined, reduced, or dismissed from the ship.

36. In case of breaches or non-fulfilment of duty on the part of any member of the staff or crew, the offender is to be

suspended by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, and who shall report the matter to the Minister, whose decision in the case shall be final.

HOLIDAY LEAVE (BOYS).

37. Leave will be granted twice a year—i.e., twenty-one days at midsummer and fourteen days in midwinter, in all thirty-five days—subject to good conduct.

38. Parents or guardians will be notified at least ten days before leave is to be granted, and will be required to reply by letter to the Commander for the time being of the training-ship stating that they will accept such boy, provide for and maintain him until the expiration of his leave of absence; that they will meet him on arrival, take charge of, be responsible for, and on the expiration of his leave of absence see him and his effects safely away on his return journey to the training-ship. Should this assurance not be received, then the boy shall remain on board.

39. No boy or boys will be allowed leave, other than the half-holiday leave, until he has served at least three months on board the training-ship (since enrolment).

40. Allowance when proceeding on Holiday Leave.—When going home on leave each boy may, at the discretion of the Commander of the training-ship, and provided that he has sufficient to his credit, be allowed to draw for spending purposes during leave as follows (according to length of service):—

Having completed six months' service and less than nine months'	s. d.
Having completed nine months' service and less than twelve months'	5 0
Having completed twelve months' service and less than fifteen months'	10 0
Having completed fifteen months' service and less than eighteen months'	12 6
Having completed eighteen months' service and less than twenty-four months' (maximum allowance)	15 0

41. If the amount standing to the credit of a boy who has not been punished or fined for breaches of discipline is less than the prescribed amount set forth in the above list, he will, when proceeding on holiday leave, be allowed the minimum rate of pocket-money prescribed for boys of over six months' and under nine months' service.

42. *Holiday Kit.*—Sufficient kit for use whilst on holiday leave will be allotted to boys when proceeding on such leave; such kit will be inspected and counted on the boy's departure and return. Parents or guardians of such boy will be held responsible should any shortages of clothing occur on the boy's return to the training-ship at the expiration of such leave.

HALF-HOLIDAYS (BOYS).

43. Half-holidays will take place twice each week—viz., on Wednesdays and Saturdays, between the hours of 1.30 p.m. and 5 p.m. Leave will be granted to all boys (subject to good conduct) with the exception of one boat's crew.

44. Friends or relatives of boys will be allowed to visit the ship on the Wednesday half-holiday only; other visitors will be allowed on board on production of passes, which are to be obtained by application to the Secretary, Council of Defence.

45. On half-holidays each boy may, at the discretion of the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, be allowed to draw money (provided he has sufficient to his credit) to the extent of 3d. per week for spending purposes.

DISCHARGE.

46. On attaining the maximum age or length of service, or when leaving the training-ship finally through any cause whatsoever, boys will then be discharged, and the Commander for the time being of the training-ship will issue a certificate on the prescribed form, in which shall be stated the standard of education attained by the boy, his efficiency, length of service, and character.

INSTRUCTION.

47. Boys will be instructed in the following subjects:—

Seamanship.—Comprising parts of the ship, knotting, splicing, sail-making, rigging, worming, parcelling, serving, heaving and marking the lead-lines, heaving and marking the log-lines, flag- semaphore and Morse signalling, rigging tackles, anchor gear, boat pulling and sailing, sending spars up and down, compass, steering, block-stopping, &c.

Gunnery.—Comprising guns-crew drill, loading, training, laying, aiming, guns-mountings, gun-cleaning, charges, projectiles, &c.

Squad Drill, Rifle Exercises, and Bugle-calls.—As taught in the Imperial service.

Company Formation and Marching.—Will be taught on shore as weather permits.

Exercises.—Single-sticks, sword-bayonet exercise, and club-swinging will be taught occasionally.

Rudiments of Navigation.—Will be taught as boys attain proficiency in other details.

Engine-room.—Instruction in engine-room and stokehold duties will be given by the permanent engineer in charge.

OFFICERS (QUARTERS AND DUTY).

48. The instructors comprise the following:—

- (1) First instructor: All classes of work on deck, aloft, drill, gunnery, boats, &c.
- (2) Instructor: All classes of work on deck, aloft, drill, gunnery, boats, &c.
- (3) Instructor: All classes of work on deck, aloft, drill, gunnery, boats, &c.
- (4) Instructor: All classes of work on deck, aloft, drill, gunnery, boats, &c.
- (5) Engineer: All work in engine-room and stokehold, also drill and bugle-calls.
- (6) Engine-room hand: Subordinate to engineer for engine-room and stokehold duties.
- (7) Schoolmaster: Scholastic teaching and lectures as arranged with the Commander of the ship.

49. The first instructor will rank as the ship's first officer. The other instructors will rank as the "petty officers" of the ship, and will exchange routine at the discretion of the Commander.

50. The instructors (4), schoolmaster (1), engine-room hand (1), and engineer (1) will each take their turn sleeping on mess-deck in the room provided there for that purpose; two of the aforementioned will always sleep there. The instructors (4) will exchange their rooms for this purpose when required to do so and as directed by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship.

51. One-half of the permanent staff will sleep on board at night continuously.

52. In harbour during bad weather, or when ship is under steam, the entire staff and crew will, if so ordered by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, remain on board.

53. All members of the staff are to see that the training-ship is kept clean, well ventilated, and in all respects equal to a ship of the British navy.

54. The regularity of the boys messing is of the first importance, as their health, good order, and comfort in a great measure depend upon it; the strictest attention of officers is therefore demanded to this. Two officers will always be present on the mess-decks during meals to insure that all matters relating to messing are satisfactory.

55. If any complaints as to the food, &c., are made by the boys the officer will at once report it to the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, who will take steps to prevent a recurrence, and, if necessary, report the matter to the Minister.

56. All members of the staff or crew (excepting boys) shall, whilst on duty, wear the uniform laid down.

Modification of Customs Duties under "The New Zealand International Exhibition Act, 1906."

DUTIES OF CUSTOMS.

1. The Collector of Customs at Christchurch may allow goods imported for the purposes of the Exhibition to be cleared without payment of duty in any of the following cases, that is to say:—

- (a.) Calendars, post-cards, and other advertising matter and articles relating to exhibits from beyond New Zealand, on condition that such articles are distributed free of charge within the Exhibition buildings or grounds.

(b.) Busts, shields, plaques, brooches, badges, charms, and other mementos made of copper from the "Victory" and "Foudroyant," sold or distributed in connection with the "Victory" stall at the Exhibition in aid of the funds of the British and Foreign Sailors' Society.

2. Where show-cases, stands, fittings, or materials imported for the purpose of the Exhibition and used in the Exhibition buildings or grounds by any exhibitor are sold, removed, or disposed of for use or consumption in New Zealand, the Collector shall assess them at a fair value for duty after making allowance for depreciation in value through use, and the duties of Customs shall be paid on them in accordance with such assessment, which shall be final.

HOBART MARINE BOARD.

By-law No. 23.—Regulations for the Denison Canal.

1. The Denison Canal, between Norfolk Bay and Blackman's Bay (hereinafter called "the canal"), shall be under the charge of an officer appointed by the Board, and hereinafter called "the Superintendent," and the master or person in charge of every vessel using or about to use the canal shall comply with all directions given by the Superintendent.

2. The master or person in charge of any vessel about to enter the canal from Norfolk Bay shall not permit his vessel to enter the canal at any time when the arm of the semaphore at the western entrance thereof is raised, and the master or person in charge of any vessel about to enter the canal from Blackman's Bay shall not permit his vessel to enter the canal at any time when the arm of the semaphore at the eastern entrance thereof is raised.

3. The master or person in charge of any vessel shall not permit his vessel to remain in the canal, or in or about the approaches thereof (except for the purpose of passing through the same) unless authorised to do so by the Superintendent, and shall remove his vessel forthwith from the canal and the approaches thereof when so directed by the Superintendent.

4. The master or person in charge of every vessel passing through the canal or the approaches thereof shall navigate such vessel with all possible care, and so as not to damage the banks of the canal.

5. The bridge across the canal will only be opened to allow the passage of vessels between sunrise and sunset from the 1st day of April to the 30th day of September inclusive, and between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. from the 1st day of October to the 31st day of March inclusive.

6. The fees and charges set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be paid to the Superintendent forthwith upon any vessel entering the canal by the master or person in charge thereof, and no vessel shall be taken through the canal by the master or person in charge thereof until all fees and charges owing or payable in respect of the use by such vessel of the canal, or of the wharf at the western entrance thereof, have been paid.

7. The master or person in charge of every vessel which shall embark or disembark passengers at, or shall use, the said wharf, and shall not land or load cargo there liable to pay wharfage rates, and shall not be liable to pay the fee for the use of the canal, shall pay to the Superintendent the same charges as are by Part I of By-law No. 1 made payable by river steamers and river barges.

8. No fee for the use of the canal shall be payable in respect of any vessel which has used the said wharf and which passes through the canal for the sole purpose of turning such vessel and returning at once through the same.

At a meeting of the Marine Board of South Australia, held at the Marine Board Offices, Port Adelaide, on the twenty-ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and six—present: Arthur Searcy, Esq., J.P. President; W. Berry, Esq., Captain J. H. Gibbon, Angus Campbell, Esq., J.P., R. Fricker, Esq., Captain F. W. Vasey, A. S. EXPLOSIVES.

1. Whereas by "The Marine Board and Navigation Act, 1881," section 364, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Board from time to time, with the consent of the Governor, to define, for the purposes of this Act, the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, and to classify explosives; and where the composition, quality, or character of any explosive has been defined as aforesaid, any article alleged to be such explosive which differs from such definition in composition, quality, or character, whether by reason of deterioration or otherwise, shall not be deemed, for the purposes of this Act, to be the explosive so defined: The Marine Board, pursuant to the powers conferred thereby, do hereby define and classify the undermentioned explosive, which is also added to the authorised "List of Explosives" in force for the time being:—

EXPLOSIVES.

Class III.—Nitro-compound.—Division I.

2. *Monobel Powder*.—Consisting of neutral nitrate of ammonium, thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine and woodmeal (for bleaching or purifying, of which no chemical agents have been used, or, if used, have been absolutely removed), provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 11 per cent. by weight of the finished explosive. The whole to be sufficiently absorbent in quality to prevent exudation of nitro-glycerine. Provided that the explosive is contained in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

3. This regulation shall take effect on the 1st day of February, 1907.

The distribution will take place on the 6th February, 1907, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 28th January, 1907.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the

receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1906; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

LEASES, PARENGARENGA AND PAKOHU BLOCKS.

Locality and Description.

The leases are situated around Parengarenga Harbour, at the northern extremity of the Auckland Land District, in Parengarenga, Muriwhenua, Hohoura West, and Tarawara Survey Districts. Access from Awanui is by track to the west coast, and along the beach to Hukateri, thence through Hohoura to Parenga (about the middle of the leases), a total distance of about fifty-five miles. There is a fortnightly steamer service from Auckland, 240 miles distant. The altitude of the land is generally from sea-level to 430 ft., but rising to 1,060 ft. in the north. About 19,600 acres consists of bare sandhills, about 1,000 acres of bush, and 250 acres of raupo swamp; the balance is undulating land of inferior clay and sandstone, covered with stunted manuka and fern. With exception of the bush land the whole is gum-bearing, but the ground in Runs E, F, and G has been very little worked for gum. The swamps, when drained, are suitable for agricultural purposes, and the land as a whole is suitable for rough runs.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

- The respective sections will be offered by public tender for lease for pastoral purposes, and with a right to work, win, dig, cut, use, possess, sell, and dispose of kauri-gum or flax in or upon or under the said land, or growing or which may grow on the said land.
- Each lease shall be for a term of ten years, commencing from the first day of March, 1907.
- Every tender shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the President, Tokerau Maori Land Board, Native Land Court Office, Auckland, and marked on the outside as follows: "Tender for lease of Lot No. , as advertised in the newspaper of the day of 19 , " and shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect set forth in Form K in the Schedule hereto.
- If any person desires to tender for more than one lot, a separate tender for each such lot must be made, and separate declarations as required by the last preceding rule. And each such tender must be accompanied by six months' rent and £3 3s., also stamp duty and registration fee.
- Tenders will be received up to 4 p.m. on the 28th day of February, 1907, and all tenders will be opened simultaneously by the Board on the 1st day of March, 1907, at 11 a.m.

Every tender shall be deemed to be informal and incapable of being accepted where the rental tendered is less than the upset rental fixed as aforesaid.

6. The highest tenderer, if his tender shall equal or exceed the upset rental, shall be declared the lessee, and be entitled to possession of the lands so soon as he has duly executed a lease thereof, and has complied with all other conditions lawfully prescribed in that behalf. But the Board reserves to itself the right to call upon him, if it thinks necessary, to enter into a bond for an amount to be fixed by the Board, and to furnish two sureties, to be approved by the Board, for the due fulfilment of the terms and conditions of the lease.

7. If the rent offered by two or more persons is the same amount, and is higher than that offered by any other tenderers, then the Board shall, after opening all the tenders, decide by lot, in such manner as it shall think fit, which of such two or more persons shall be declared the lessee.

8. The deposits and fees paid by the unsuccessful tenderers for any lease shall be returned to them by the Board immediately after any tender for such lease has been accepted.

9. When the Board shall declare any person to be the lessee of any block it shall forthwith notify the same to such person by registered letter, addressed to such person at the address given in the tender, and shall in such notice require such person, within thirty days after such notice, to execute the lease in triplicate. If two or more persons jointly tender, the notice shall be posted to each of such persons. Such notice shall be in the Form L in the Schedule to the regulations under the Act, or to the effect thereof.

10. If any person who has been declared a lessee shall fail to execute his lease within thirty days after being required by notice so to do, then his deposit and the above-mentioned sum of £3 3s. shall be absolutely forfeited to the Board, and the right of such person to obtain such lease shall absolutely cease and determine.

Where any lessee shall forfeit his right to a lease as aforesaid, and as often as such a case shall occur from time to time until the land be leased, or until there be a failure of tenderers whose tenders are formal, the Board may, at any time within seven days from such forfeiture, declare the next highest tenderer for the same lease whose tender is not informal to be the lessee, or, if the rent offered by two or more persons is the same amount, and is higher than the rent offered by any other tenderer save the one who has so forfeited his right to a lease as aforesaid, may decide by lot which of such other persons shall be the lessee. Every person declared a lessee under this section shall, upon his paying the deposit and fees as aforesaid, be declared to have become the lessee on the day of the opening of the tenders as if he had been so declared on such day.

11. If no tender shall be received prior to the time fixed for opening the tenders for any of the leases advertised for sale, any person may at any time thereafter apply for any one of such leases, unless the same shall have been withdrawn from lease by the Board, and be declared the lessee thereof at the upset rental fixed, upon complying with the other conditions prescribed as to tenders. If, in any such case, two or more applicants shall lodge their tenders on the same day, the right to the lease shall be decided by lot.

12. The Board may at any time reduce the upset value of land which it has failed to lease for one year, and may again call for tenders for the same at such reduced value.

13. The lease to be granted in pursuance of any tender may be in the form set out hereunder, or to the effect thereof.

14. No tender shall be accepted or lease granted except the same be in accordance with the provisions of "The Maori Lands Administration Act, 1900," and its amendments, and these regulations.

15. Any person of the age of seventeen years and upwards may become a lessee hereunder, and if under full age shall be as capable of executing a lease, and shall be bound by the terms thereof, and of the said Act, as if such person was of full age.

16. The term fixed by the lease shall be ten years, to take effect in possession and not in reversion; but such lease may be renewable as provided hereafter.

17. Every lease shall be prepared by the Board, and shall be in such form, and shall contain such covenants, conditions, and agreements, not being inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act or these regulations, as the Board may prescribe by regulations which it is hereby authorised and empowered from time to time to make, and from time to time to alter, amend, or revoke, and which may either be general, or applicable to any particular case or class of cases, and shall be subject to the stipulations following:—

- (1.) The demise shall reserve unto the lessor all mines, metals, minerals, coal, lignite, slate, or freestone in or upon or under the land, with power to work, win, use, possess, sell, and dispose of the same, or any part thereof respectively, except such as may be required by the lessee for the lessee's own use but not for sale or disposal; with power also to the lessor to make roads through the demised lands, and for such purposes or any of them to erect or build houses and other convenient buildings thereon, on paying compensation for damage done to the surface only, the amount of such compensation in case of disagreement to be ascertained and determined by arbitration.
- (2.) The lessee shall and will during the term of the lease pay the rent reserved thereby free and clear from all deductions or abatements whatsoever, and shall and will pay all rates, taxes, charges, or assessments now made or hereafter during the said term assessed, charged, or imposed upon the demised premises, or tenant in respect thereof, or upon any buildings or improvements thereon; and in case any of the said rents shall at any time be and continue in arrear and unpaid for fourteen days next after any of the days appointed for payment thereof, the lessee will (if demanded) pay to the lessor interest upon such arrears at the rate of £8 per centum per annum, calculated from the time appointed for the actual payment of such rent to the time of actual payment thereof; and such interest shall for all purposes, whether of distress or otherwise, be deemed to be rent payable under the demise, and be payable and recoverable by distress or otherwise in the same manner as the rent reserved under the demise may or can be.
- (3.) No lessee shall transfer the possession or occupation of the land leased to or occupied by him, or any part thereof, by sale, underlease, or other disposition, except the Board shall sanction the proposed transfer, and until such lessee has been twelve months in possession or occupation of the demised land.
- (4.) When a statutory declaration is required from any lessee, no transferee, and no purchaser of any lease under any power of sale vested in any mortgagee, assignee, or trustee in bankruptcy, shall be admitted into possession or occupation of the land comprised in such lease until he has deposited with the Board a statutory declaration in the same form or to the same effect.
- (5.) Every lawful transferee of any lease, or purchaser as aforesaid of any lease, shall have all the rights and privileges, and be subject to the same obligations, as the original lessee: Provided that the transferor shall be liable for the instalment of rent which shall become due next after such transfer.
- (6.) No transfer of any lease shall be valid unless all the conditions upon which the lease was granted have been complied with as to payment of rent or otherwise up to the date of such transfer.
- (7.) If any lessee or licensee shall fail to fulfil any of the conditions of his lease within sixty days after the day on which the same ought to be fulfilled, his lease shall be liable to be forfeited, and he shall be deemed, upon such forfeiture, to be in illegal occupation of the land comprised in the lease, and the Board may proceed for recovery of possession thereof without prejudice to the right of the lessor to recover any rent then due or payable, or any right of distress, action, or suit that may have arisen prior to such re-entry.

The foregoing conditions as regards leases shall operate and shall be deemed to bind the Board and the lessee as fully and effectually as if they were set forth in every lease.

18. The lessee shall be liable for all rates, taxes, or assessments of every nature or kind whatsoever imposed upon the occupier of the lands included in his lease during the term for which he is lessee.

19. The Board, upon being satisfied that any lease has been lost or accidentally destroyed, may grant a new lease in lieu thereof, upon such terms and conditions and upon payment of such fee in each case as it shall think fit. When any indorsement is required to be made on any lease, and the same is lost or destroyed as aforesaid, the Board may grant a new lease in lieu thereof, and make the required indorsements thereon, or, if it shall so think fit, may incorporate the substance of the indorsements with the terms of the original lease, and insert them together in the new lease.

20. The Board and the lessee shall each execute the lease in triplicate.

21. Every lease, after execution thereof as aforesaid, shall be registered by the Board under "The Land Transfer Act, 1885," or any Act hereafter passed in lieu thereof, in like manner, as nearly as may be, *mutatis mutandis*, as a Crown grant is registered; and the lease which is retained in the office of the District Land Registrar shall form a folium of the register-book in such office, and on it all dealings therewith shall be registered; but no fee shall be payable by way of contribution to the assurance fund on the registration of any such lease.

All dealings with or transmissions of land comprised in such lease shall be made in accordance with the provisions of the last-mentioned Acts, and be in all respects subject thereto.

22. All dealings with or under leases in contravention of the provisions of the said Act as to transfers of leases shall be absolutely void, and the District Land Registrar shall refuse to register any dealing with or under a lease until he is satisfied that the said provisions have been complied with.

23. Whenever a lease is to be sold or otherwise disposed of, the valuation of the improvements shall, in all cases where it is not otherwise provided by the said Act, be made as by section eighty-three hereinafter provided; and payment of such valuation shall be made to the Board on or before the day of the commencement of the term of the new lease by the purchaser of such lease.

Whenever a lease is forfeited for breach of conditions, the Board shall cause such valuation to be made on recovering possession of the land.

24. The amount of the valuation of the improvements, when paid by the purchaser of a new lease, shall be paid by the Board to the original lessee, less any arrears of rent or other moneys due in respect of such land by the outgoing tenant; and, in case of forfeiture, less also the amount of expenses incurred in recovering possession of the land and the lease or other disposal thereof.

25. In every case of the forfeiture of a lease for breach of conditions, the payment of the amount of the valuation of improvements, or of any part thereof, shall be absolutely at the discretion of the Board.

26. If payment of any such valuation is not made as aforesaid, the Board may sue for and recover the same in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the person who should make such payment.

27. No outgoing tenant shall have any right or claim against the Maori owners or the Board in respect of the value of any improvements made by him on the lands in his occupation, in case any person shall fail to pay such value to the Board.

28. All claims for compensation in respect of any matters arising under the said Act, or for value of improvements or other matters, shall, unless otherwise specially provided, be settled in the manner provided in Part III of "The Public Works Act, 1905," for which purpose the said Part III shall be deemed to be incorporated with the said Act.

In every such claim the Board shall be the respondent.

29. Where it is provided or agreed that any matter shall be referred to arbitration, then such reference, unless herein otherwise provided, shall be to one or more arbitrators appointed by the parties on each side respectively, and an umpire to be appointed by such arbitrators.

(a.) If either party shall fail to appoint an arbitrator within twenty-one days after being requested in writing to do so by the other party, then the arbitrator appointed by the other party shall alone conduct the arbitration, and his decision shall be final and binding on both parties.

(b.) If the said arbitrators shall fail to agree upon the matter referred to them within twenty-eight days of the same having been so referred, then the matter so referred shall be decided by an umpire to be appointed by the said arbitrators, whose decision shall be final and binding on both parties.

(c.) Every such arbitration shall be carried on in the manner prescribed by "The Arbitration Act, 1890," and be subject to such last-mentioned Act in the same manner as if the reference to such arbitration had been made by consent of parties under a deed.

(d.) Each party shall pay his or its costs of such reference, and any costs incidental to the appointment of an umpire shall be paid equally by the parties to the arbitration.

(e.) Such arbitrators or umpire shall have all the powers vested in Commissioners by "The Commissioners' Powers Act, 1867," as well as all the powers given to them by "The Arbitration Act, 1890."

30. Before any appraiser enters into the consideration of any matters referred to him under the said Act, he shall, in

the presence of a Justice of the Peace, make and subscribe a declaration as in the Form N in the regulations, or to the same effect and meaning.

Renewal of Leases.

31. Not sooner than one year and not later than three months before the end of the term for which the lease is granted, a valuation shall be made by arbitration, or in some other manner that may be agreed upon between the Board and the lessee, of the then value of the fee-simple of the lands then included in the lease, and also a valuation of all substantial improvements of a permanent character made by the lessee during the term and then in existence on the land then comprised in the lease.

The publishing of the valuations made as aforesaid may be effected by serving a copy of the same on the lessee and another copy on the Board; and thereafter, but not later than two months before the expiry of the term for which the lessee then holds the lands, the lessee shall elect, by notice in writing delivered to the Board, whether he will accept a fresh lease of the said lands for a further term of ten years from the expiration of the then term, at a rental equal to not less than five pounds per centum on the gross value of the lands after deducting therefrom the value of the substantial improvements of a permanent character as fixed respectively by the valuation.

32. If the lessee shall not elect to accept a renewal as above mentioned, or shall refuse or neglect to execute a lease within seven days after the same is tendered to him for the purpose, a lease of the said lands shall, not later than one month before the end of the term for which the terminating lease was granted, be put up to public competition by public tender for such term as the Board may consider fit, on the following terms and conditions:—

- (a.) The upset rent shall be such rent as shall be fixed by the Board, not being a greater sum than that at which the lease was offered to the outgoing lessee under the last preceding clause.
- (b.) The amount of such upset rent shall be stated in the advertisements calling for tenders; and it shall be a condition of tender that the tenderer shall, together with his tender, deposit the amount of one half-year's rent, which shall be returned to him if he fails to obtain the lease.
- (c.) If any person other than the outgoing lessee be declared the purchaser, he shall, within seven days after the day fixed for opening the tenders, pay over to the Board the amount of the value of the substantial improvements of a permanent character as fixed in manner provided by the last preceding clause.
- (d.) When the day has arrived on which the terminating lease expires, or thereafter, if the Board shall have satisfied itself that the outgoing lessee has let the new lessee into quiet possession of the lands to be leased, and that none of the improvements on the lands which were thereon when the valuations mentioned in the last preceding clause were made have been destroyed or appreciably damaged, the Board shall pay over to the outgoing lessee the amount received by it from the incoming lessee as aforesaid.
- (e.) If any of the improvements as mentioned in the preceding subclause have been destroyed or appreciably damaged, as in the said subclause referred to, then the value of the improvements so destroyed, or the cost of repairing such damage, shall be decided by the Board or some person appointed by it; and the amount so fixed, with the costs attending such decision, shall be deducted from the amount payable as aforesaid to the outgoing lessee, and, save the amount deducted for costs, shall be returned to the incoming lessee.

33. If such lease shall not be disposed of as above mentioned to some person other than the lessee, or if such person fails to execute the lease in triplicate within thirty days, or to pay the sum offered by him as aforesaid within thirty days, from the day on which the tenders were opened, then the lessee may again, within sixty days after the day fixed for the opening of the tenders, elect in manner aforesaid whether he will accept a fresh lease as aforesaid; and if he does not elect to accept the same, or refuses or neglects to execute such lease within seven days after the same is tendered to him for the purpose, then he may continue as lessee of the said land from year to year, so long as he shall pay the rent reserved by his lease and observe and perform the covenants and conditions contained in the same or in this Act, or until the Board shall succeed in finding a purchaser of the new lease, unless, prior to the finding of such purchaser by the Board, he shall elect to accept a new lease for the said further period of ten years as aforesaid.

34. The Board, in selling a renewed lease to a purchaser, may make provision that the right to take possession under such new lease shall always commence on the 1st day of January or of July in any year.

35. All the provisions of the foregoing rules and regulations (except the provisions as to cultivation) as regards the tenders for sale, form, and conditions of first leases made under the said Act, and otherwise howsoever as regards such leases, shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to the sale, form, and conditions of the new or renewed leases above mentioned, and to the lessees thereunder, and otherwise howsoever, except as herein is otherwise expressly provided.

Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing regulations contained, the Board reserves to itself the right to refuse to accept the highest or any tender.

3. That I am acquiring the land solely for my own use and benefit, or for the exclusive use and benefit of myself and co-purchaser or co-lessee—namely, _____—and not directly or indirectly for the use or benefit of any other person or persons whomsoever.
4. That I do not hold or own, either in severalty or jointly with any other person or persons at the date of making this declaration, any land within the colony, except the land set forth in the Schedule hereto.
5. That, including the land now applied for, but exclusive of leases of Maori land held by me at the date of the passing of "The Maori Lands Administration Act, 1900" (20th October, 1900), I am not the holder or owner, directly or indirectly, either by myself or jointly with any other person, of any land anywhere in the colony exceeding in the whole 2,000 acres of freehold land, inclusive of not more than 640 acres of first-class land.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1882."

FORM OF LEASE.

This deed, made the _____ day of _____, 190____, between the _____ District Maori Land Board, in the Colony of New Zealand (which said Board, with its successors and assigns, is hereinafter termed "the lessor") of the one part, and _____, of _____, in the Land District of _____, in the said colony, (hereinafter, with _____ executors, administrators, and permitted assigns, referred to as and included in the term "the lessee"), of the other part, witnesseth that, in consideration of the rent hereinafter reserved, and of the covenants, conditions, and agreements herein contained and implied, and on the part of the lessee to be paid, observed, and performed, the lessor doth hereby demise and lease unto the lessee all that piece or parcel of land, containing by admeasurement _____ acres _____ roods _____ perches, a little more or less, situate in the District of _____ aforesaid, and being Section numbered _____, Block _____, Survey District of _____; as the same is more particularly delineated and described in the plan drawn hereon, and therein coloured red in outline; together with the rights, easements, and appurtenances to the same belonging; to hold the said several premises intended to be hereby demised unto the lessee for a term commencing from the first day of March, 1907, and expiring on the thirtieth day of June which shall first ensue after the expiration of ten (10) years from such date, and renewable for one further term of ten (10) years, on the conditions prescribed by the regulations under the provisions of "The Maori Lands Administration Act, 1900," and its amendments in force at the date of the execution hereof as modified hereby, yielding and paying therefor unto the said Board the annual rent of (£ : :), payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each and every year during the said term, free from all deductions whatsoever. The first payment of such rent having been made, the next payment to become due to be made on the first day of _____ next:

Provided always, and it is hereby expressly agreed by and between the parties hereto, in manner following:—

- (1.) The lessee shall have for the term of the said lease the right to work, win, dig, cut, use, possess, sell, and dispose of for his own use and benefit any kauri-gum or flax in, upon, or under the land comprised in this lease, or growing or which may grow on the said land.
- (2.) That out of the said land half a chain is reserved on each side of the existing tracks giving access to the portions of the blocks known as Parengarenga Nos. 3, 4, 5A No. 1, 5A No. 2, 5A No. 3, 5B No. 1, 5B No. 2, and 5B No. 3, and Pakohu Nos. 1, 2B No. 1, 2B No. 2, 3A, 3B, and 5, set apart by the lessor for the occupation and support of the Maori owners of those blocks; and the lessor reserves the right to open up and reserve out of the said land hereby demised any new roads or tracks, not exceeding 1 chain in width, that may be required for this or any other purpose:
Provided, however, that such new roads or tracks shall be laid out so as to interfere as little as possible with the fences or other improvements of the lessee.
- (3.) That ploughing for the purpose of obtaining kauri-gum on the said land or any part of the said land is absolutely prohibited.
If the lessee shall plough any portion of the said land he shall, within nine months after such ploughing, lay down every such portion with suitable grass or crops.
- (4.) That the right is reserved to the Board to grant permission to Natives to take firewood for domestic purposes from any part of the said land, but so that such permission shall be granted only upon the condition that the Natives to whom the same shall be granted shall in exercise of their rights thereunder do no damage to the fences, improvements, or property of the lessee, and so that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to exonerate any Native from liability in respect of damage caused or done to fences, improvements, or property of the lessee.
- (5.) That save as above the lessee shall not permit, and shall use his best endeavours to prevent, the destruction or burning of timber or bush standing or growing on the said land.
- (6.) That all trenches or holes over 1 ft. in depth which the lessee or those employed or licensed by him may open or dig on the said land and which are not in the nature of improvements shall be filled in, and the surface left, as regards such holes or trenches, as nearly as possible in the same condition as when the lessee took possession under this lease.
- (7.) That the lessee shall prevent the growth or spread of gorse, broom, sweetbriar, blackberries, and other noxious weeds on the said land, and clear the said land therefrom, in accordance with the provisions of "The Noxious Weeds Act, 1900."
- (8.) That no flax growing or which may grow on the said land is to be cut more than once within each three years, and the method of cutting is to be as directed by the Board.
- (9.) The terms "improvements," "substantial improvements," and "substantial improvements of a permanent character" wherever used in this lease or in any of the said regulations herein

implied shall mean and include reclamation from swamps, clearing of gorse, broom, sweetbriar, or scrub, cultivating or planting with trees or live hedges, the laying-out and cultivating of gardens, fencing, draining, making roads, sinking wells or water-tanks, constructing water-races, sheep-dips, making embankments or protective works of any kind, in any way improving the character and fertility of the soil, or the erection of any building.

- (10.) The lessor, or any agent appointed by the lessor, may at all reasonable times enter upon the said land and view the state thereof, and may serve upon the lessee, or leave at his last or usual place of abode, or fix upon some conspicuous part of the said land, a notice in writing of any defect, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to amend the same in accordance with the covenant, condition, or restriction in that behalf contained or implied in this lease.
- (11.) The rent hereby reserved may be paid to the President of the Tokerau District Maori Land Board, or to any officer who may be authorised by a notice under the hand and seal of the lessor, and duly published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to receive the same, and the receipt of the President or such person so appointed shall be a good discharge to the lessee.

And it is hereby further declared and agreed that these presents are intended to take effect as a lease under the provisions of the said Act and regulations, and that the said provisions shall, *except as to the provisions of sections numbers sixty-four (64), subsections three (3), four (4), five (5), and six (6) of section sixty-seven (67), section seventy-three (73), and section seventy-four (74) of the said regulations, which are hereby expressly negatived, and except so far as the said provisions and regulations are expressly modified or negatived hereby*, be binding in all respects upon the parties hereto in the same manner as if such provisions had been fully set out herein; and that if any dispute or disagreement shall arise between the parties hereto touching the construction of these presents or in anywise relating hereto, such dispute or disagreement shall be referred to arbitration in the manner set forth in the regulations aforesaid; and neither of the said parties shall take or cause to be taken any steps or proceedings to set aside or call in question any award or decision which may have been given upon any such reference as final.

In witness whereof the seal of the District Maori Land Board was affixed hereto, and the President and members of the said Board have, as lessor, hereunto set their hands, and these presents have been also executed by the said lessee, the day and year first above written.
