WATERWORKS BY-LAWS.

Ellerslie Water-supply Area.

Regulations for supplying Water to Consumers in the afore said Area.

ALL water shall be supplied by meter only, or by the authority of the Board.

2. Every consumer shall pay at the rate of 1s. 6d. per

1,000 gallons.
3. The minimum charge shall be 5,000 gallons per quarter,

and this quantity must be paid for quarterly whether consumed or not.

4. All quantities the meter registers more than 5,000 gal-

4. All quantities the meter registers more than 5,000 gallons for each and every quarter the consumer shall pay for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

5. Applications for water shall be made at the office of the said Board, where the necessary forms shall be obtained.

6. The quarterly period shall terminate on the thirtieth days of March, June, September, and December of each year.

7. All money due must be paid within fourteen days of the ending of each and every quarter. If not so paid, the Board will turn off the water from each consumer who has not

8. The Board only agrees to sell water to any consumer on the same conditions as it is supplied to the said Board.

9. The fees for cutting off and turning on of water by the said Board shall be 5s. each.

10. The Board is prepared to supply meters at the following rates: Half-inch, £3 5s.; three-quarter inch, £3 15s. Payment for meter must be made when lodging the applica-

tion for supply.

All meters must be Davies and Shepherd's make, and a All meters must be Davies and Shepherd's make, and a certificate must accompany each meter as to its correctness, and be lodged at the office of the Board before water is turned on from the main. No second-hand meters will be allowed to be used without the approval of the said Board.

11. The Board will hire meters to consumers at the rate of 3s. for half-inch per quarter, and 3s. 6d. for three-quarter inch, which must be paid quarterly in advance.

12. Water will be sold from stand-pipe, or hydrant, or from mains to outside consumers at such prices and on such terms

mains to outside consumers at such prices and on such terms as may be agreed by the Board.

13. No consumer who has requested the Board to supply him with water shall permit any person not an inmate of his household to take any water from the premises of such con-

nousehold to take any water from the premises of such consumer.

14. Builders shall be supplied by meter at 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons. They shall deposit the cost of the meter, which shall be retained as security that the meter is left in good order. No rent will be charged for the meter, but the cost of laying water on must be paid with the application. The minimum quantities shall be 2,500 gallons per quarter or

any portion of a quarter.

15. All meters shall be enclosed in an iron box of sufficient

15. All meters shall be enclosed in an iron box of sufficient size to protect the meter, and locks of meters to be uniform and supplied by the Board at the expense of the consumer.

16. Competent plumbers may be licensed by the Board to lay pipes and do any work in connection with water-supply on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for every authority issued.

17. No plumber shall do any work connected with the water-supply without giving at least seven clear days' notice thereof and receiving written authority from the officer appointed by the Board.

18. Plumbers shall be responsible for all damage done or

18. Plumbers shall be responsible for all damage done or caused by them in performing any work whatever, either through bad workmanship or inferior material, or for any other cause or reason.

19. All work shall be done to the satisfaction and approval of the Waterworks Engineer or other officer appointed by the Board, and must be passed by him before the water shall be turned on at the main.

shall be turned on at the main.

20. Should any meter be out of repair, or cease to register, or register inaccurately, the officer duly appointed by the Board shall estimate the consumption at the average of the previous four quarters and decide the amount to be charged to the consumer, who shall be liable to pay accordingly, and such decision shall be final. For the first quarter the previous average daily consumption shall form the basis of such settimate.

estimate.

21. All drawing-cocks used must be of the best quality and most approved description, and must be those known as "screw-down valves," and in exposed or public places must be enclosed with a wooden or iron box under lock and key.

22. In addition to the valve-cock at the junction of the main in each service a second valve-cock shall, if ordered by the Board, be placed in a strong wooden box within the boundary of the property supplied at the expense of the consumer. In no case will the use of instantaneous closing taps, valves, or cocks be permitted.

23. Meters must be fixed in such position and place as may be approved by the Board's officers, and in all cases must stand on brick or wood approved by the said officers.

24. All hose-connections to be by meter only.

25. Urinals in hotels, in lodging or boarding houses where accommodation is provided for five or more lodgers, and also water-closets in the same or private house, 17s. 6d. per

annum, or by meter.

26. The Board hold the right to discontinue supplying any 20. The board noise the right to discontinue supplying any consumers on the shortage of water or any other cause beyond the control of the Board, and for the breach of any of the foregoing regulations, and the Board shall not be liable or responsible for any loss or inconvenience caused by such breach.

#### Teachers' Examination, 1907.

Education Department,
Wellington, 23rd February, 1907.

THE following lists contain statements of the principal results of the examination held in January. It must be understood that the granting of a certificate depends only in part upon the result of an examination, and that candidates that have not had the experience required by the regulations, or that do not receive the necessary marks from an Inspector of Schools, have no claim to a certificate. Further, in accordance with clauses 11 and 12 of the regulations, no person can receive a teacher's certificate who does not produce (a) satisfactory evidence of age, and (b) sufficient documentary evidence of freedom from all such physical defects as are incompatible with efficiency in teaching and in the management of a school. (No medical

certificate is accepted under this clause unless it is on the form provided, and is signed by a medical officer approved Lassen, Mary

by the Minister.)

The first list contains the names of the successful candidates for Classes B, C, and D. The names of the candidates who, having been partially successful in former years, have now passed in the subjects in which they formerly failed are included in this list. The second list gives the names of candidates that require to obtain a further qualification in one or two subjects to complete the examination for the respective certificates. In the case of candidates that relied partly upon work done at University Examinations, the results of those examinations have been taken into consideration in preparing these lists. The third list gives the names of the candidates that have passed in one or more subjects of the examination for Class C under clause 31 or clause 32 of the regulations. In the fourth list are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of special

candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of special mention, in accordance with clause 37.

Candidates whose names are in the second list will be advised as to the subjects in which they will have to be further examined to complete the requirements.

The next examination will take place in January, 1908, beginning about the 6th of the month. Notice must be given so as to be in the office of the Department by the 30th September. Candidates that have obtained "partial pass" must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to receive any further intimation of the date at which the notices become due. Locality and Description of Te Kuiti Township.

Te Kuiti Township is situated within what is known as the "King-country," on the North Island Main Trunk Railway line, 127 miles from Auckland. It has for some time been a thriving business place, and there is a consider-able population there at present.
