A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1906" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister of Lands, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, should be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the parcels of Crown land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and

exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the parcels of Crown land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a reserve under "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1903," and shall be subject to the provisions of that Act and "The Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1906."

To officers called on to perform postal duties in the sorting and delivery of mails or in other operations incidental thereto at Chief Post-offices, or to perform telegraph duties at offices at which there are regular shifts or changes of staff—namely, the offices at Auckland, Blenheim, Christchurch, Dunedin, Gisborne, Greymouth, Hokitika, Invercargill, Napier, Nelson, New Plymouth, Oamaru, Thames, Timaru, Wakapuaka, Wanganui, Wellington, and Westport: For Sunday attendance; for attendance on departmental holidays; and for attendance on other days in excess of forty-eight hours weekly.

(b.) To officers called on to perform telegraph duties for Press-work on Sunday at the following offices—namely, Ashburton, Buff, Feilding, Gore, Hamilton, Hastings, Hawera, Kaikoura, Lyttelton, Marton, Masterton, Onehunga, Palmerston North, Port Chalmers, Reefton, Rotorua, and Waitara.

3. For the purposes of these regulations "Sunday" means and includes Good Friday and Christmas Day also.

4. No overtime allowance shall be made to officers of either branch of the service unless the extra attendance exceeds twenty minutes. Attendance up to forty-five minutes shall count as half an hour; over forty-five minutes, as one hour. SUMMARY FOR JUNE, 1907.

The total rainfall for the month of June was considerably below the average in all parts of New Zealand, except in the Province of Wellington. In the south of the South Island, where this deficiency follows several months of light rainfalls, the shortage is especially marked, and Central Otago and South Canterbury are now experiencing a very dry winter.

The temperature was below the mean in all parts of the country, and frosts were common in places rarely visited. Frequent fogs were also a consequence of the low temperature and absence of high winds.

On the 3rd June a small secondary or westerly wave of low pressure was responsible for scattered showers in the South. This was followed by an anticyclone and remarkably fine weather everywhere until the 11th. Atmospheric conditions in the middle of the month were very unsettled during the passage of an extensive area of low barometric pressure from west, which embraced all parts of the country, but without causing either much wind or rain except in a few localities.

On the 25th a cyclonic disturbance of great dimensions from about W.N.W. made its first appearance in the extreme North, and spread its influence rapidly over the whole colony. This untimely visitor no doubt originated in tropical latitudes; but, excepting in those districts nearest to the centre, where the wind was of nearly hurricane force, the storm did not have such intensity as might have been expected from the rapid decline and rise in the barometer. The centre passed near to and to the north of Auckland, which experienced the usual sudden shift of wind to the opposite quarter after the centre had passed and after about four hours and a half of remarkable calm. The lowest pressure was about 28.6 in. The westerly winds that followed were strongest in the extreme north, but extended southwards as the cyclone moved in its easterly path. The highest barometric pressure recorded was 30.6 in. on the 7th June, and so the range of about 2 in. occurred in the month.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of 6, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
