Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority granted to him by "The Harbours Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby prescribe that, from and after the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the dues and rates set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf.

SCHEDULE.

1. The dues and rates hereby prescribed shall apply to the wharf so constructed by the County Council of the County of Hokianga as aforesaid.

2. Every person who shall use the said wharf with any vessel shall pay to the County Council of the County of Hokianga, or to its officer or other person appointed or authorised by it to receive the dues and rates hereby prescribed, for the use thereof, as follows, that is to say,—

For every vessel lying alongside the wharf—

(a.) One halfpenny per ton per day or part of a day for every ton register up to 100 tons.

(b.) Exceeding 100 tons, $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton per day or part of a day for the first 100 tons, and $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton per day or part of a day for every ton over 100 tons.

Every person who shall use the wharf for landing or shipping goods, or whose goods are stored in any shed on the wharf, shall pay wharf-dues in respect of the landing or shipping, storage, and receiving such goods, as follows, that is to say,—

(a.) For all goods landed, shipped, stored, or received, at weight or measurement, according to shipping usage.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twelfth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eighteenth day of January then instant, certain regulations were made, under the provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," for controlling the traffic on Lake Rotorua, and for the management of the wharves erected therein, and prescribing dues for the use thereof: And whereas it is expedient to make the further regulations hereinafter set forth in addition thereto:

1. The following provisions shall apply with respect to the dinghy-grid and shed at the wharf at the Town of Rotorua:—

(a.) Spaces on the grid, each 5 ft. wide, may be leased from the Department from year to year at a rental of £1 per annum payable in advance, but the renewal thereof shall be at the discretion of the Department.

(b.) The lessee of each space rented will be entitled to the use of one of the oar-lockers.

(c.) Each dinghy shall have the name of the lessee of the space occupied painted on the hull in a conspicuous position.

(d.) All dinghys, when not drawn up on the grid, must be moored at least 50 yards from the wharf and so as not to obstruct the approach thereto.

(e.) Any dinghy drawn up on the grid not bearing the name of one of the lessees of spaces, and also any dinghy moored for more than one hour at a time within 50 yards of the wharf, or so as to obstruct the approach thereto, may be removed to the works-yard.

(f.) The cost of repairing any damage done to the grid or shed shall be paid by the person causing such damage or, when he was acting on behalf of any lessee, by such lessee.

2. The preceding regulation shall form part of and be read with the said regulations made on the 12th day of January, 1906.

REGULATIONS.

The period from the first day of December in one year to the twenty-ninth day of February in the next succeeding year, both days inclusive, is hereby prescribed a close season in respect of the fish of the species of Mugil known as mullet or kanae, during which close season it shall be unlawful for any person to take any such fish contrary to the provisions of the said Act.

2. These regulations shall, until revoked or altered, have force and effect in all waters, as defined by the said Act, in the North Island of New Zealand.

3. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds nor less than twenty shillings, to be recovered as is by the said Act provided.

Vaccination Districts constituted.

Removing Restrictions against Alienation of Native Land.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Maori Land Laws Amendment Act, 1903," it is enacted that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, or in any Crown grant or other instrument of title, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Board, remove any restriction on the alienation of land owned by Maoris: Provided that the decision of the Governor on any recommendation of the Board shall be given within six months from the date of the receipt of such recommendation:

And whereas the Aotea District Maori Land Board, by a recommendation made and passed by the said Board on the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and received on the fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seven, recommended the Governor to remove and revoke the restrictions against alienation contained in the instrument of title of the block of land known as Komangarautawhiri A No. 3, so far as to permit the said land to be sold by public auction:

Alterations to the Scale of Fares, Rates, and Charges in Force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under "The Government Railways Act, 1900," I, Joseph George Ward, Minister for Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of fares, rates, and charges in force on the New Zealand Government railways open for traffic, such alterations to come into force on and after the 29th day of July, 1907:—

PART III.—GOODS: REGULATIONS.

DEPASTURING STARVING STOCK.

46. Starving stock sent from stations on the Lawrence, Otago Central, and North Otago Railways to Southland for depasturing will, on the return journey, be conveyed free of charge from the original destination station to the original forwarding station, provided,—

(a.) That the consignment note for the outward journey is indorsed with the following certificate:—

"I hereby certify that the stock entered hereon are being sent for depasturing purposes."

(b.) On the return journey a statutory declaration must be made in the following form:—

"I hereby certify that the stock entered on the consignment note attached hereto were consigned from to for depasturing on 1907, and are now being returned. I also certify that no portion of the stock has been sold or exchanged."

FREE CARRIAGE OF FODDER FOR STARVING STOCK.

Hay, straw, chaff, grain, green fodder, and ensilage purchased and to be used for the sake of keeping alive stock starving by reason of the recent drought will be carried free to the stations on Lawrence, Otago Central, and North Otago Railways affected by the recent drought, on production by the consignor of a statutory declaration in the following form:—

"I hereby certify that the (a) consigned by me from (b) to (c), has been purchased and is to be used for the sole purpose of keeping alive stock starving by reason of the recent drought."

For the purposes of these regulations North Otago will be regarded as including the district Waikouaiti to Morven inclusive.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PERU EXTRADITION ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1907.

Buckingham Palace, 7th May, 1907.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 7th day of May, 1907.

Present:

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

LORD PRESIDENT, EARL OF SEFTON, EARL BEAUCHAMP, LORD TWEEDMOUTH, LORD ALLENDALE, LORD JUSTICE KENNEDY, MR. WINSTON CHURCHILL.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four, between His Majesty and the President of the Republic of Peru, for the extradition of criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Treaty of Extradition between Great Britain and Peru.

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Peru, having determined, by common consent, to conclude a Treaty for the extradition of criminals, have accordingly named as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, William Nelthorpe Beauclerk, His Majesty's Minister Resident in Peru;

And His Excellency the President of the Republic of Peru, José Pardo, his Minister for Foreign Relations;

Who, after having exhibited to each other their respective full powers and found them in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, in accordance with the stipulations of the present Treaty, any persons who, being accused or convicted in one of the two countries of one or more of the offences enumerated in the following Article are found in the territory of the other.

ARTICLE II.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder (including parricide, infanticide, poisoning) or attempt or conspiracy to murder. The Peruvian Government may, however, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up any person charged with a crime punishable with death.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Procuring or attempting to procure abortion.
4. Rape, abduction, and indecent assault.
5. Unlawfully detaining or kidnapping children, abandoning or exposing them.
6. Bigamy.
7. Wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
8. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
9. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
10. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
11. Arson and other malicious injury to property if such injuries are indictable.
12. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.
13. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any Company punishable with imprisonment for not less than one year.
14. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.
15. Counterfeiting or altering money or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
16. Making or having possession of instruments adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm or for the forgery of documents. Forgery and uttering what is forged.
17. Offences against bankruptcy law.

18. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.

19. Piracy by the law of nations.

20. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

21. Extradition is also to be granted for other crimes or offences against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are Extradition offences and are punishable by not less than one year's imprisonment.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the law of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE III.

Each of the High Contracting Parties reserves the right to grant or refuse the surrender of its own subjects or citizens.

ARTICLE IV.

The surrender shall not take place when the person claimed by the Government of either of the two nations has already been tried and sentenced by the authorities of the other for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be awaiting trial in the territory of one of the two nations, or be undergoing sentence in it on account of any other crime than that for which his extradition is claimed, his surrender shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal or on the expiration of his sentence, or by pardon or otherwise.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered may in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime, or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively; in default of these by the Consular Officers, and in the absence of both of these, directly from Government to Government.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

Also, in case of extradition being demanded by Great Britain for a crime which is an offence against some statute, a copy of the said statute shall be sent; and if for a crime at common law only, an extract from some text-book generally recognised as authoritative may be sent as indicating the punishment applicable to the offence giving rise to the requisition.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

When either of the Contracting Governments considers the case urgent it may apply for the provisional arrest of the

criminal and the safe keeping of any objects relating to the offence.

Such request will be granted provided the existence of a sentence or warrant of arrest is proved and the nature of the offence of which the fugitive is accused is clearly stated.

The warrant of arrest to which this Article refers should be issued by the competent judicial authorities of the Country applying for extradition. In the United Kingdom the accused shall on arrest be sent as speedily as possible before a Police Magistrate. The prisoner shall be discharged if the State applying does not complete the requisition within the term of ninety days counting from the date of the arrest of the prisoner.

ARTICLE XI.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove by the documents presented, which shall contain a description of the person claimed and any particulars which shall serve to identify him, that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

ARTICLE XII.

In the examinations which they may have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the Authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by oath of some witness or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the country where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to the State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within ninety days from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to or the proper Tribunal thereof shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XV.

When extradition is conceded the papers and other articles connected with the offence or its authors, or which were in their possession at the time of their arrest, shall be delivered to the State to which extradition is granted.

This State shall be bound to return them after the termination of the trial, if any person shall satisfy the authorities of the State granting extradition that they have a right to them.

ARTICLE XVI.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the colonies and foreign possessions of His Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws in such colonies and foreign possessions allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority

of such colony or possession by the Chief Consular Officer of the Republic of Peru in such colony or possession.

The Governor or chief authority may dispose of the requisition in accordance with the laws of the territory in which he exercises authority, and shall be at liberty to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any colony or foreign possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The present treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

It shall be ratified after receiving the approval of the Congress of the Republic of Peru, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Lima as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and affixed thereto their respective seals.

Done at Lima, this 26th day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at Lima on the thirtieth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 20th day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Peru, and of the said Treaty with the President of the Republic of Peru:

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

DREDGING, SOUTH CHANNEL, PORT PHILLIP.

Referring to Notice to Mariners No. 136, dated 27th March, 1905,* it is hereby notified that the dredger "John Nimmo" and the attendant anchor-punt will, within a few days, resume operations in the vicinity of the pile light, South Channel, and the work of widening the artificial cutting of the South Channel will be continued at the south edge of the channel.

Two red-can buoys will be moored in the vicinity of the dredger to mark the alignment of the dredging operations. It is requested that care be taken to avoid such two red-can buoys.

There will be exhibited a basket ball by day and two red lights by night, from the port or starboard side of the dredger, to indicate the side on which vessels navigated through the channel are to pass the dredger. When such basket ball or red lights are amidships, vessels as aforesaid may pass the dredger on either side.

Two white mast-head anchor-lights will also be exhibited by night, one near the stem and one near the stern of the dredger.

The anchor-punt, from which will be exhibited a white mast-head anchor-light by night, will also be moored in the vicinity of the dredging operations.

Caution.

Mariners and others in charge of vessels passing the dredger must proceed at the slowest possible speed, and must stop propeller engines when passing the dredger's chains.

Zayas Isl. is about 3 miles long nlv. and sly. and 2 miles broad; the summit, which is near the srn. end, is flat-topped, and 295 ft. above H.W.; the N.-wrn. extr. of the isl. a low wooded pt. is about 11 miles S. 69° W. from Table Hill summit. Dry ledges extend for about ¼ mile from this pt. There are several rks., 20 ft. above H.W., off the srn. extr. of Zayas Isl. The position of this isl. appears to differ considerably from that shown on the chart. June.

THE following report of the person appointed by the Governor, under the provisions of "The Native Schools Sites Act, 1880," to ascertain the title of certain Natives to land at Waikare, in the County of Bay of Islands, having been adopted by the Governor, is published in accordance with the said Act.

GEO. FOWLDS.

REPORT UNDER "THE NATIVE SCHOOLS SITES ACT, 1880." WHEREAS certain Natives have consented to appropriate for a school-site a portion of Waikare No. 1 Block, situate in Block XI, Russell Survey District, more fully described in the Schedule hereto, the title to which has not been finally determined by the Native Land Court:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand appointed me, the undersigned, to inquire into and ascertain the title to the said piece of land, and to obtain the consent of such Natives as may be deemed to be the owners thereof to such appropriation, and otherwise to proceed in respect of such land in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: And whereas I have made such inquiry as commanded:

Now, therefore, I do hereby report that, having duly notified in the *Kahiti* and a local newspaper the time and place of holding such inquiry, I sat at the Courthouse, Russell, on Thursday, the 11th day of July, 1907, at 11 of the clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of such inquiry, when several Natives of adult age were present claiming interests in the said Waikare No. 1 Block, within which the proposed school site is situated.

The notice convening the meeting and the description of the land proposed to be appropriated were duly read over in the Maori language to those assembled, and Plan No. 14121, delineating the position of the said land, was laid before them and likewise explained to them in their own language to their full comprehension and satisfaction. It was then agreed unanimously that Dave Wherekake, Kereama Hoori, Henare Hemara, and Mita Wepiha should be named as owners of the proposed school-site; it being expressly decided that such fixing of owners should in no way be made use of in the claims now or hereafter to be before the Native Land Court in respect of the surrounding lands, nor prejudice the rights of any person or persons whomsoever to such adjacent lands.

Subject to such reservation, and on the condition that the reserve for a school-site already appropriated by the Natives to the Crown in the neighbouring block to Waikare No. 1, and known as "Waihaha" Block, should cease to be a reserve for a school-site and be returned to the true owners thereof, the said Dave Wherekake, Kereama Hoori, Henare Hemara, and Mita Wepiha, claiming interest in the said Waikare No. 1 Block, consented to the appropriation by the Crown of the land hereinafter described for a school-site under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act.

3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
