General Regulations under Fisheries Conservation Acts .--Fishing Season, License Fees, &c.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the said Acts on the fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and four, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Acts, and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall have force and effect in each acclimatisation regulations shall have force and effect in each acclimatisation district throughout the colony :-

REGULATIONS.

1. "The said Acts " means "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," and its amendments.

Act, 1884," and its amendments. 2. Licenses to fish for trout and perch may be issued by the secretary of any duly registered acclimatisation society, or by any one authorised by such secretary in that behalf, and such licenses shall entitle the person named therein to fish in every acclimatisation district from the first day of October in any one year to the thirtieth day of April in the year following, subject to the said Acts and to any special regulations made thereunder in force in any such district: Provided that such secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who within the previous two years has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout or perch, or of any regulation made thereunder :--thereunder :

3. In the Rotorua district every such license as aforesaid may be issued under the hand of the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, or by any one specially authorised by him in writing in that behalf.

4. Such licenses shall be issued at the following rates :-

Licenses for men : One pound for the whole season. Licenses for women, and for boys attending school or under the age of sixteen years : Five shillings for

the whole season.

5. Every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto.

6. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that with natural or artificial fly, insect, or fish only.

7. No person shall have in his possession any of the Salmonidæ or trout between the first day of May and the Salmonidæ or trout between the first day of May and the thirtigth day of September in any year, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish : Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department or of an acclimatisa-tion society, or the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, for purposes of acclimatisation.

8. No person shall east or throw into any stream or waters in which trout or salmon exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow into or place near the bank or margin of any such stream or waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to pro-hibit the depositing in such stream of *debris* from any mining claim.

9. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

10. No person shall fish for trout or perch without a license, and every person much lish for total of point without a nember constable, or officer of the said society, or of any person pro-ducing a license, produce and show to such Ranger, officer, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout or perch or killing such trout or perch.

11. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any p rson shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

12. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout or perch, nor shall any of the above-muntioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

13. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net or any instrument or device or means for taking fish in any river, stream, or waters, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river, stream, or waters.

14. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of ery river or stream shall be deemed to include every outevery river or stream shall be deemed to include every let of the same and the sea shore between such outlets , and shall extend over a radius of five bundred yards from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low water.

15. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any salmon, trout, or perch, or any part thereof, unless he has a license to do so under regulations for taking trout or salmon at sea or in tidal waters, or for selling them.

16. No person shall take or catch more than twenty trout or more than twenty pounds weight of trout in any one day.

17. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

18. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

Commission to inquire into the Coal-mining Disaster at Nightcaps.

To all to whom these presents shall come, and to William Reeve Haselden, Esquire, of Wellington, District Judge; Huntly John Harry Eliott, of Hutt, Esquire; Henry Andrew Gordon, Esquire, of Auckland, Mining Engineer; and Alexander Forbes, Esquire, of Kuitangata, Secretary to the Otago Coal-miners' Union of Workers: Greeting.

W HEREAS a disaster occurred at the coal-mine at Nightcaps, known as the N ghtcaps Colliery, the property of the Nightcaps Coal Company (Limited), on the twenty-first day of June last, which caused the deaths of three persons working therein: And whereas it is expedient that a Commission should be issued for the purpose of inquiring into the cause of the said disaster, and into the working of the existing law in respect to the prevention of such disasters, and for the other purposes hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, know ye that I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, reposing trust and confidence in your knowledge, integrity, and ability, and acting by the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by "The Commissioners Act, 1903," and of all other powers and authorities

SUMMARY FOR JULY, 1907.

THE average conditions of the weather in midwinter were this year more pronounced than usual. In July the climate is usually drier in the south and wet in the north, only the conditions were extreme this year, for north of latitude 39° the rainfall was excessive, while from the average it fell away in the south to as low as one-sixth of the mean, and remarkable droughts held sway in North Canterbury and Central Otago. In the first half of the month the weather was very unsettled from the passage of three extensive areas of low pressure from the westward. Between the 20th and 23rd heavy rains came along with a cyclonic area over the North Island, and some remarkable rainfalls may be noted in the returns for about this time. The winds were generally light and variable. The temperature was not so warm, but more even in the north, and in the south it was at times very cold, with a greater number of frosts than usual.
