Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 600, against 602 in July—a decrease of 2. The deaths in August were 304, an increase of 15 on the number in July. Of the total deaths, males contributed 172, females 182. One hundred of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 32.89 per cent. of the whole number; 74 of these were under one year of age.

There were ninety-one deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Twelve men, 66, 68, 70 (two), 74, 77, 78, 79, 80, 82, 83, 85, and twelve women, 65, 68, 69, 71, 72 (two), 73, 76, 78, 79, 82, 92, died at Auckland; thirteen men, 66, 67 (two), 68, 70 (three), 71, 79, 80, 82, 83, 86, and eight women, 66, 72 (two), 77, 79, 81, 83, 85, at Wellington; fourteen men, 66, 69, 70, 72 (two), 76 (two), 77, 78, 79, 83, 85, 87, 90, and seven women, 70 (two), 73, 74, 76, 80, 82, at Christchurch; and eighteen men, 65, 67, 71, 72, 73 (three), 74 (two), 76 (two), 77, 78 (two), 79, 80, 82 (two), and seven women, 65, 66, 73, 75, 76, 77, 80, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—Of 39 deaths at the four chief centres, including suburbs, 18 were caused by whooping-cough—4 at Auckland, 10 at Wellington, 1 at Christchurch, and 3 at Dunedin. Measles was fatal in 6 cases—2 at Auckland, 2 at Wellington, and 2 at Christchurch. Diphtheris caused 4 deaths—1 at Auckland, 1 at Wellington, and 2 at Christchurch. From diarrhœal diseases only 2 deaths are observed. There were also 1 death (each) from scarlet fever and influenza, both at Wellington, and 1 from typhoid fever at Auckland. The above, with 6 deaths from puerperal septicæmia, &c., complete the total mortality.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of 45 deaths, 17 were the result of phthisis, 9 of tubercular disease, and 16 of cancer.

Local Diseases.—The mortality comprised 150 deaths, or 49.34 per cent. of the total from all causes. Of these, 33 deaths were from diseases of the nervous system, 50 of the circulatory, and 41 of the respiratory systems. These last include bronchitis and pneumonia, from which the mortality was heavy. Diseases of the digestive system account for 12 deaths, and those of the urinary system for 11, leaving 3 caused by diseases of the organs of reproduction and locomotion.

Violent Deaths.—Of 17 deaths, 11 were accidental and 6 suicidal. Among the former are 5 cases of drowning. One of the suicides was effected by throwing himself under a railway-train, 2 by poison, and 1 (each) by drowning, hanging, and starvation.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the four centres from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

Note.—In the early part of the month the weather was calm and pleasant, except for very cold nights. It was afterwards very unsettled and showery. Thick fogs were experienced during two nights. The minimum on the grass on the 5th was the lowest this winter, and the earth temperatures were also 47° at 1 ft. and 49° at 3 ft. on that date. The mean earth temperatures were 49° at 1 ft. and 50° at 3 ft. The 1 ft. temperature increased 3° and the 3 ft. 1° during the month. The mean dew point was 42·1°, mean humidity 79 per cent., and mean elastic force of vapour 278 in.

SUMMARY FOR AUGUST, 1907.

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The month was ushered in with fine weather under anticylonic conditions everywhere, but afterwards the weather was very unsettled, especially in the North. The rainfall was unusually irregular. In the North Island in the Province of Wellington it was generally somewhat below the average. On the north-west side of the Island in many places nearly double, but on the opposite side south of East Cape the rainfall was much less than usual. In the South Island the principal feature is the break-up of the prolonged drought which has prevailed in South Canterbury and North Otago: little rain, however, fell in Central Otago. On the West Coast nearly all the stations are 2 in. below the average for the month. Canterbury had bountiful rains in the latter half of the month, and in some cases the fall was three times the usual. Nelson and Mariborough Provinces, with the exception of some places open to the easterly rains, had about the average for the month. The easterly rains were very heavy in many places, as may be seen from the tables herewith. Southland and Stewart Island were much below the usual, but on the east coast of Otago the rainfall was in many places above the average.

The barometer was below the normal for most of the month, and dipped for the passage of five consecutive disturbances, two of which were of a distinctly cyclonic character, though in most places accompanied by remarkably little wind, and the rain, as above shown, of a partial or patchy nature.

After the first week, with its warm days and frosty or foggy nights, the more humid conditions which prevailed nearly every day brought moderate temperatures with little range, and spring growth commenced well and early in most parts.
