#### NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

"22. Females will be admitted as cadettes, but they will be appointed only to such vacancies as are suitable to females. They will belong to the Non-clerical Division only, but will be required to produce the certificates prescribed for cadets in the Clerical Division. The age for admission for females is between sixteen and twenty-five vears, but women not above the age of forty years may be appointed to the Non-clerical Division if they have for a term of two years previously been continuously employed by the Department as Postmistresses or in any other capacity. Not more than three persons of the same family shall be employed in the Department at one time (see Clerical Division). Not more than one daughter in a family shall be eligible for appointment as a telephone-exchange cadette. Married women are not eligible for appointment, and females must resign when they marry. The Governor, during the period of probation, may at any time dismiss any cadette from the Department for any reason which may be deemed sufficient." "22. WHEREAS by section four of "The Native Land Laws Amendment Act, 1895," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, except from the operation of section one hundred and seventeen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a limited period or otherwise, and either generally or for such purposes and subject to such restrictions as shall be in such Order specified, any land, wheresoever situate, which is for the time being subject to the operation of the said section, or any interest therein or right over the same, or may in like manner make such exception in favour exclusively of any lessee or other person who has been bond fide in occupation of and has made improvements on such land, or has paid money to Native owners for lease or purchase thereof, prior to the passing of the said Act: Provided that no Order in Council under the provisions of this section shall take effect until after the expiration of two months from the date of the publication thereof in the Gazette: Provided also that every alienation under the provisions of this section shall be confirmed by the Court in terms of section fifty-three of the said Act:

1. The local authorities named in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall have respectively the number of votes 1. The local authorities named in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall have respectively the number of votes set opposite them in the second column of the said Schedule, and their representative or representatives shall meet at the time and place set opposite the names of such local authorities in the third and fourth columns of the said Schedule respectively to elect such member or members as have been apportioned to such local authorities by Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four.

2. The Presiding Officer to conduct the election in each case shall be the person named in the fifth column of the said Schedule, opposite the name of each local authority. 5. The Presiding Officer at every meeting of local authorities as aforesaid shall make a return in writing to the Secretary of the Board to which any member has been elected, setting forth the names of the person or persons elected to serve as members of such Board. The Secretary shall thereupon notify the Inspector of Hospitals of the result of such election or elections for publication in the Gazette, and such publication shall be deemed to be prima facie evidence that the persons named therein were duly elected in terms of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885."

6. In the event of the number of votes on each side at any election being equal, the Presiding Officer shall give a casting vote.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

Harbour, Chatham Sound:—

Holland Island is steep-to on the eastern side, there being depths of over 10 fathoms at a distance of 50 yards from the shore. On the northern side shoal water extends

From the northern side of Kitson Island a sandy shoal, with rocks that dry at low water, extends 1 mile in a N. 45° W. true (W.N.W. ½ W. w'ly mag.) direction, the extremity of the shoal lying 1½ miles N. 37° 30′ E. true (N. ¾ E. mag.) from Holland Island. This shoal ground extends to the eastward of Kitson Island and dries at low water across to Lear Point.

This shoal has two heads with 4 fathoms over them, and forms two channels, the western Columbia River Entrance.—Can Buoy to be replaced by one having a depth of 21 fathoms and the eastern one a Bell Buoy.—About 1st October, 1907, South Channel buoy, a perpendicularly striped first-class can buoy, marked S C lies ½ mile N. 73° E. true (N.E. n'ly mag.) from Holland

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Counties Act, 1886," and "The Public Works Act, 1905," and every other Act or Acts amending the same, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Waimea County hereby makes the following by-law for the good rule and government of the Waimea County. Such by-law to come into force on the 2nd day of December, 1907

1. This by-law may be cited and referred to as By-law No. 3 of the Waimea County, and shall be read with and form part of By-law No. 1 of the Waimea County.

2. (a.) No person shall take across the suspension bridge over the Motueka River near its junction with the Baton River, in the Waimea County, being a bridge under the care, control, or management of the Council of the Waimea County, any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle which itself or together with the load thereon or attached thereto shall exceed three and one-half tons in weight.

(b.) No person shall take any engine, agricultural or other

(b.) No person shall take any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle upon or across such bridge while any other engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle shall be upon such bridge.

(c.) No person shall drive, lead, or take over such bridge more than 200 sheep, 20 oxen, or 10 horses at one time.

3. Every person who shall do, or cause to be done, or be concerned in doing anything contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law, and shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (25) sterling.

4. This special order and by-law shall come into force on the 2nd day of December, 1907.
