Money-order and Postal-note Regulations for Guidance of Public.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this sixteenth day of December, 1907.

Present:

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, K.C.M.G., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the sixteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and two, the twenty-third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and two, and the third day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and two, the eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three, and the sixth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four respectively, regulations were made under the authority of "The Post Office Act, 1900" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), fixing *inter alia* the rates of charges for the transmission through the medium of the Post Office by means of postal notes of money to and from places within New Zealand, and also fixing *inter alia* the rates of charges for the transmission through the medium of the Post Office or the electric telegraph, by means of money-orders, of money to and from places within and beyond New Zealand: And it is expedient to revoke such rates of charges and to make others in lieu thereof.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby revoke the rates of charges fixed by the said recited Orders in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby fix the rates of charges set forth in the Schedule hereto, and with the like advice and consent doth make the regulations set forth in the same Schedule for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned and for the delivery and payment of money-orders and postal notes, and doth direct that this Order in Council shall have effect on and from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

SCHEDULE.

MONEY-ORDERS.

1. Except as mentioned in the next paragraph, Money-orders are issued at the offices described as Money-order Offices in the general list at pages 56 to 98 of the Post and Telegraph Guide, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., except on Saturday, when the offices are not closed before 5 p.m.

2. The Money-order Offices at Auckland, Blenheim, Christchurch, Dunedin, Gisborne, Greymouth, Hokitika, Invercargill, Napier, Nelson, New Plymouth, Newton, Oamaru, Thames, Timaru, Wanganui, Wellington, and Westport close at 1 p.m. on Saturday, except when the Money-order portion of English mails is advertised to close later than 1 p.m., when the offices named will remain open until 2 p.m., if necessary. The Ashburton, Hastings, Te Aro, and Wellington South Offices close at 4 p.m. on Saturdays.

3. Money-order Offices are also Postal-note Offices and, with few exceptions, Post-Office Savings-Banks.

4. Telegraph Money-orders are only transmitted from or to Money-order Offices which are also Telegraph or Telephone Offices.

7. Money-order Telegrams can be sent as *urgent* upon payment of 1s. on each Order in addition to the ordinary rates. Such telegrams will rate as *Urgent Ordinary Telegrams* and be sent in the order of their receipt with other telegrams of the like code.

8. The remitter of a Money-order Telegram may have a private communication for the payee added to the official telegram of advice on paying for the additional words at the following rates: Ordinary, $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per word; urgent, 1d. per word, with no minimum charge.

Application Forms.

10. [Particulars of money-orders required must be furnished to the issuing Postmaster on the printed forms of application. Wherever practicable the form should be filled up by the applicant.

Particulars required.

11. No money-order can be issued unless the applicant furnish in full the surname and, at least, the initial of one Christian name both of the remitter and payee, together with the remitter's address. The exemptions are as follow: If the remitter or payee is a peer or a bishop, his ordinary title is sufficient; if a firm, trading under the name of the persons comprising it, the usual designation of such firm will suffice. The remitter is at liberty to desire, at the time of issue, that the order be crossed thus: and Co., and be made payable through a bank. Prefixes such as Mr., Mrs., Miss, Messrs., Revd., Doctor, are not allowed. The remitter, when applying for an order payable to a married woman, should be careful to give the Christian name or forename of the payee and not that of her husband.

Orders cannot be cancelled.

12. An order once issued cannot be cancelled, and should repayment or transfer be required, application must be made on a form provided for the purpose, which can be obtained at any Money-order Office.

Order may be crossed by Holder.

13. The holder of a money-order is always at liberty to direct, by crossing it, that the order be paid through a bank, notwithstanding that its payment was not originally so restricted.

Limit of Amount of Money-order.

14. The maximum amount for which a single order may be issued is shown in the preceding list of countries, &c.

No Fractions allowed.

15. No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

Orders on Austria, Germany, Samoa, India, Japan, and Foreign Countries, &c.

16. (a.) As payment in Austria, Germany, German New Guinea, Samoa, India, Japan, and Corea, Formosa and Pescadores Islands through Hong Kong, Egypt, through Ceylon, and Foreign Countries, &c., named on pages 200 to 216 of Post and Telegraph Guide, except the British Agencies at Constantinople, Salonica, Smyrna, and Panama, is not made upon the orders issued in New Zealand, but upon new orders issued by the Austrian, German, New South Wales, Samoan, Indian, Hong Kong, or London Offices, and forwarded by post to the payee in accordance with the address furnished by the issuing office, it is very important that the complete postal address of the payee should be given.

(b.) The remitter should retain the order issued in New Zealand, but should advise the payee of the name of the remitter as given to the issuing office, and also of the delay in payment of the order which may probably occur from the transmission of the advice through the Austrian, German, Indian, Hong Kong, Ceylon, or London Offices.

(c.) In the case of other countries an order will be handed to the remitter to be transmitted by him to the payee for presentation at the office of payment.

India.

(d.) Amounts of money-orders issued in New Zealand on India are paid in rupees, annas, and pies; the rupee being the standard of value in India.

(e.) As, however, the value of the rupee is subject to constant variation, no tables of conversion can be given. All Orders on India are issued in sterling, and the equivalent in rupees is settled by the Post Office at Madras on the arrival of the Advice List from New Zealand.

(f.) Money-orders drawn in India on New Zealand are issued in the currency of India, and the equivalent in sterling is calculated by the Post Office at Madras at the rate of exchange current in India at the date of preparing the Advice List for despatch to New Zealand.

Natives of India, Corea, Formosa and Pescadores Islands.

17. In the case of natives, the name of tribe or caste and father's name must be given. The full name and address of the payee is required in vernacular whenever the payee is a native. Forms for this purpose are supplied by the Department.

Orders on the United States of America and Canada.

18. The full postal addresses of both payees and remitters must be furnished by the remitters of orders issued for payment in the United States of America (including Hawaii) or Canada for entry in the relative advices.

Telegraph Orders.

19. Money-orders for transmission by telegraph can be issued and made payable at Money-order Offices within New Zealand where there are Telegraph Offices, and similarly in New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, Victoria, and Western Australia through Perth.

Payment of Money-orders.

20. (a.) When a money-order is presented for payment (otherwise than through a bank) the Postmaster has first to see that the signature of the payee (which must be written in ink) is in agreement with the name given in the advice. The Postmaster has then to request the applicant to furnish the name of the remitter, and, if the reply is correct, pay the order, unless he has good reason for believing that the applicant is neither the rightful claimant nor sent by him.

(b.) When an order is presented through a bank, crossed by stamp or in writing with the name of the bank by a person known to be in its employment, payment will be made without the signature of the person named in the advice as the payee.

Advice of Payment.

21. (a.) The remitter of a money-order issued in New Zealand on any Money-order Office within New Zealand, the Australian Commonwealth, United Kingdom, Natal, and Transvaal may, if he so desire, obtain an official advice that the order has been paid.

(b.) Application must be made to the office of issue, either at the time of issue of the order or subsequently, and for the service a fee of 2½d. must be paid.

(c.) Should advice of payment of an inland money-order telegram be required the remitter must pay the cost of including the words "advise payment" and his address in the telegram of advice, in addition to the fee of 2½d.

Payment cannot be demanded on Day of Issue.

22. Payment of a money-order not issued for transmission by telegraph cannot under any circumstances be made on the day of issue.

Payment can be stopped by Remitter.

23. The remitter of an order has full control over the money until payment has been made by the Department, and can therefore stop payment, obtain repayment, or alter name of payee.

No Liability after Payment.

24. After once paying a money-order, by whomsoever presented, the Department is not liable to any further claim.

Void Orders.

25. If payment of an order, whether issued in New Zealand or abroad, is not obtained before the end of the twelfth calendar month after that in which it was issued (for instance, if issued in January, and not paid before the end of next January) payment can only be made under special authority granted by the chief office of the country of payment.

Money-orders Lost, &c.

26. (a.) Application for the issue of a duplicate order, for stoppage of payment, or transfer from one office to another must be made to the chief office of the country in which the order is payable.

(b.) Application for repayment, alteration of name, or correction of error in name of payee or remitter must be made to the post-office of the country in which the order was issued. All such applications should be made on the prescribed forms, which can be obtained at any Money-order Office.

(c.) In the case of applications for duplicate orders or alteration of the name of payee or remitter, they must be accompanied by an additional inland commission in postage-stamps.

(d.) Repayment or transfer, whether of an original or duplicate order, will not be authorised until it has been ascertained that payment has been stopped at the office on which the order was originally drawn.

POSTAL NOTES.

For list of offices see pages 56 to 98 of the Post and Telegraph Guide. Postal notes for fixed sums from 1s. up to 20s. are issued and paid at all Money-order Offices up to close of business at 5 p.m., and are issued but not paid at the offices described as Postal-note Offices only.

1. Every postal note shall be numbered, and shall be for one of the following amounts, and in respect of each postal note the following poundage will be paid:—

Broken amounts may be made up by the use of postage stamps, not exceeding 6d. in value, affixed to the back of any one postal note. These stamps must be affixed only by the senders or remitters of such postal notes.

2. Before a postal officer issues a postal note the amount of the note and the poundage thereon shall be paid to him, and he shall sign the note and stamp it with the proper stamp, specifying the day of the month on which the note is issued.

3. The blanks in a postal note for the name of the person entitled to the money (in the regulations referred to as "the payee"), and for the name of the office at which it is to be paid, may be filled in at the time of issue or after.

4. When a postal note is presented for payment with the name of the payee inserted, payment will only be made to the signature of the person so named; or, if a note is already signed by the person named as the payee, it must be indorsed on the back by the presenter.

5. Every person to whom a postal note is issued should keep a record of the number, date, and name of the office of issue, to facilitate inquiry if the note should be lost.

6. On application, accompanied by a fee of 6d., to the Accountant, General Post Office, the person to whom a postal note is issued or paid may, within two years of the date of issue, be informed of the particulars of payment of such postal note. The fee of 6d. covers any inquiry dealing with the remittance of a specific sum made up of one or more postal notes.

7. If a postal note be crossed "_____ and Co.," payment will only be made through a banker; and if the name of a banker is added, payment will only be made through that banker.

8. If any erasure or alteration is made, or if the note is cut, defaced, or mutilated, payment may be refused.

9. After a postal note has once been paid, to whomsoever it is paid, the Postmaster-General will not be liable for any further claim.

10. The regulations under which postal notes are issued allow the Postmaster to refuse or delay the payment of a note; but he must at once report his reasons for so doing to the Postmaster-General.

11. These notes are not payable out of New Zealand.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Auckland, this twenty-sixth day of December, 1907.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seven, regulations were made and rates of postage prescribed under the authority of "The Post Office Act, 1900" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), for the conveyance of parcels by means of the Post Office: And whereas it is desirable to revoke such regulations and rates of postage, and to make others in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations and rates of postage set forth in the Schedule to the above-recited Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations and prescribe the conditions and rates of postage respectively set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth further order and declare that such regulations and conditions and rates of postage shall have effect on and from the date of publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

General Regulations.

2. In these regulations the term "New Zealand" includes the Cook and other islands referred to in "The Cook and other Islands Government Act, 1901," that is, the Cook Islands—namely, Rarotonga, Mangaia, Atiu, Aitutaki, Mitiaro, Mauke (Parry), and Hervey (Manuae); Palmerston (Avarua); Niue (Savage); Pukapuka (Danger); Rakaanga, Manihiki, Penrhyn (Tongareva), and Suwarrow Islands.

Posting and Labelling.

3. All packages of such a nature as to require special protection to assure their safe transmission through the post should be sent as parcels, otherwise that protection cannot be afforded. The postage must be fully prepaid in postage-stamps, which should be affixed by the sender or the person handing in the parcel to a label which may be obtained at the counter. The label must then be affixed to the right-hand top corner of the parcel.

Parcels not to be dropped into Letter-box.

4. Packets for transmission by parcel post must bear the words "Parcel Post" written or printed conspicuously in the left-hand top corner, and must be handed in at a Post Office counter or delivery-window. Every parcel should bear the name and address of the sender on the cover, but in such a position as not to be mistaken for the address of the parcel. The officer to whom it is handed must check the size, weight, and postage affixed before accepting the parcel. Parcels must not be posted in posting-boxes; infringements of this rule render inland parcels liable to a fine of 6d. on delivery, and foreign parcels to detention.

5. Postmasters are forbidden to hand a parcel back to the sender, except as provided in the regulation headed "Undelivered and Unclaimed Parcels."

Customs Declaration.

6. The sender of a parcel addressed to any place beyond New Zealand must make a Customs declaration (on a form to be obtained at any Post Office) describing the contents and stating the value, and also giving the name of the office of destination and the sender's signature and place of residence. A false declaration involves the forfeiture of the parcel, and renders the sender liable to prosecution under the Customs laws.

Limits of Weight and Size.

7. Parcels not exceeding 11lb. in weight, 3ft. 6in. in length (see **regulation 9**), or 6ft. in length and girth combined, are accepted for transmission to all places within New Zealand excepting those not served by railway, coach, or steamboat (see **next regulation**), to the Australian States, and to the United Kingdom. Thus a parcel measuring 3ft. 6in. in length can be 2ft. 6in. in girth, while one of 3ft. in length may be 3ft. in girth, &c. The limits of weight and size of parcels for other countries will be found in the Rate-table which follows. Wheels must not exceed 2ft. in diameter. Parcels weighing up to 20 lb. each, addressed to the Clerk of Writs, Wellington, may be accepted from Registrars of Electors and Returning Officers.

8. Parcels for or from New Zealand offices not served by coach, railway, or steamer (see **pages 56 to 98** of Post and Telegraph Guide) must not exceed 5lb. in weight, 2ft. in length, and 1ft. in breadth or depth; nor can parcels for those offices be accepted which are of too fragile a nature to permit of their safe transmission in mail-bags.

9. Fishing-rods and golf-sticks in packages up to a maximum length of 4ft. 6in. may be accepted. Their transmission is allowed only between New Zealand offices served by railway, coach, or steamboat.

How to Pack.

10. The public will greatly facilitate the work of the Post Office and help towards the safe delivery of parcels by taking care that parcels are in all cases compactly, strongly, and securely packed, especially those with fragile or perishable contents. It should be borne in mind that a parcel must be frequently handled before it reaches its destination, and, although every care will be taken by the officers through whose hands it passes, it will be impossible to avoid occasional damage if the packing is defective. Any parcel damaged, insufficiently protected, or insecurely packed, presented at a post-office, will be challenged. If, however, the presenter of such a parcel insists upon its being forwarded, it will be marked "Sender's risk," and accepted on such condition.

11. Parcels containing perishable articles, such as game, fish, eggs, &c., may be accepted for inland transmission. Razors, scissors, needles, knives, forks, or other sharp instruments, liquids, or semi-liquids, such as paints, &c., bottles, or glass in any form, may be forwarded both inland and to such of the countries beyond New Zealand as do not specially prohibit their introduction (see **prohibitions** in the table which follows). *All such articles must, however, be securely packed (as indicated at **page 13, paragraph 14**, of Post and Telegraph Guide), so as to prevent all risk or injury to other parcels or the officers of the Post Office.*

Prohibitions.

12. Parcels bearing or containing writing or marks of an offensive or indecent character, or containing gunpowder, cartridges, matches of any kind, or anything explosive or liable to sudden combustion, bladders containing liquid, live animals, offensive or filthy matter, or any substance likely to cause injury to other parcels or to the officers of the Post Office, rags of any kind, also all clothing of every kind which has ceased to be in actual wear and does not form part of the personal effects of any passenger or any other person on board a vessel arriving in New Zealand, are not accepted for transmission. Bottles or packages of liquid, as clinical specimens for examination or analysis, cannot be admitted into the post for transmission to the United Kingdom. Parcels or packages containing intoxicating liquor cannot be admitted into the post for transmission to a Maori village or to a prohibited district (including a no-license district and a Native proclaimed area) unless accompanied by the certificate of a qualified chemist or medical practitioner that the liquor is being supplied for medicinal purposes only. Parcels addressed to countries beyond New Zealand must not contain any perishable articles, such as fish, game, &c. Soft ripe fruit cannot be carried safely by post unless it is so packed that the juice cannot exude. Secure packing is necessary to avoid damage to other parcels, and parcels insecurely packed run every risk of being refused transmission. Tin boxes with tightly fitting lids are suitable receptacles for fruit intended for the post. In addition to the foregoing, parcels are liable to the further prohibitions indicated in column 7 of the table which follows.

13. The importation of any of the following articles into New Zealand by parcel-post is prohibited: Books or music being pirated copyrights of British authors, any indecent or obscene print, painting, lithograph, photograph, engraving, book, or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, publication, packet, or card having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character; matches of any kind; any explosive, dangerous, or

noxious substance; any living creature, except live bees and harmless entomological specimens; coin—namely, false money or counterfeit sterling, coin of the realm or of any British possession not up to standard; spirits; tobacco, except (a) a present from a person abroad to a friend in New Zealand, or (b) a sample to sell from of new brands sought to be introduced into New Zealand on a Postmaster being satisfied as to the *bona fide* character of the representations made by the recipients; opium in any form suitable for smoking; vine-cuttings, and any found in the post as received from abroad will be handed over, with wrappings, to the Customs; rags of any kind; all clothing of every kind which has ceased to be in actual wear, and not forming part of the personal effects of any passenger or any other person on board a vessel arriving in New Zealand. The Customs Department has decided that in the case of parcels of second-hand clothing arriving by post, the contents of which are not discovered to be second-hand until after being opened, delivery is not to be made until the clothing has been properly fumigated under the direction of Post Office officials. Should any such parcels arrive, addressees must be given notice that parcels will be held to allow of fumigation being carried out. Playing-cards are admitted at the following New Zealand ports only; Auckland, Dunedin, Gisborne, Invercargill, Lyttelton, Napier, Nelson, Oamaru, Timaru, Wanganui, and Wellington.

Coin, Paper Money, and Letters.

14. For places beyond New Zealand parcels must not contain any letter or invoice, coin, bank-note, or draft, or anything marked for delivery at an address other than that borne by the parcel itself. For places within New Zealand parcels may contain invoices, coin, bank-notes, or drafts. A parcel containing coin, or a bank-note, or a draft must be registered and sealed; unsigned or cancelled bank-notes must be sealed, but need not be registered. For every letter enclosed in any parcel, and for each article directed to an address other than that on the parcel, the parcel is liable to a surcharge of double the postage which such enclosure would have cost if sent separately.

Bullion and Jewellery.

15. Parcels containing jewellery, watches, articles of manufactured gold or silver, and suchlike valuables should be insured and specially packed as hereinafter instructed in regulation 9, under the heading of "Insurance of Parcels." Parcels of bullion may not exceed, for places within New Zealand, 6 lb. in weight, and for places beyond, 3 lb. If addressed to any place within New Zealand, parcels containing jewellery, &c., and bullion, may be registered in lieu of being insured, or, excepting bullion, may be insured and registered if desired; but their insurance or registration is not compulsory unless the contents are over 10s. in value. Parcels containing bullion cannot be insured. The transmission of parcels of jewellery, &c., and bullion to certain countries is prohibited. (See prohibitions, in the table of British, Australasian, and Foreign Parcel Post charges). Bullion for the Australian States cannot be sent by parcel-post, but may be forwarded by registered-letter post, if weighing not more than 3 lb. Packages containing gold mined in the North Island, if addressed to countries beyond New Zealand, can only be posted at Money Order Offices, and senders must pay thereon the gold export duty (2s. per ounce) in addition to the usual parcel-postage. No parcel may contain coin unless clearly intended for purposes of ornament, or bullion exceeding £5 in value, addressed to the United Kingdom, or for places in transit through the United Kingdom.

Franked Parcels from the United Kingdom.

16. Senders of parcels posted in the United Kingdom and addressed to New Zealand may defray all charges arising on them, such as Customs duties, redirection fees, &c. Such parcels should be indorsed "Free of all charge."

Registration, Certificates of Posting, and Acknowledgment of Receipt.

17. Parcels for delivery in New Zealand and for the United States of America may be registered on the same conditions as letters. Parcels directed to places beyond New Zealand, except the United States of America, cannot be accepted for registration, but the sender may obtain a certificate of posting on payment of a fee of 3d. Such certificate will include as many parcels as the sender chooses to enter on a list to be handed in in duplicate with the parcels. For an additional fee of 2½d. for each parcel an acknowledgment of receipt (A.R.) by the addressee will be obtained in any of the Australian States and forwarded by post to the sender. For an additional fee of 2d. a receipt for parcels delivered within New Zealand may be obtained from the addressee on delivery and forwarded to the sender. Neither certificate of posting nor registration involves any liability on the part of the department beyond that named in the clause headed "His Majesty's Liability."

Parcels may be Examined.

18. Parcels may be opened and examined by postal officers, but this does not make it obligatory that the ends shall be left open by senders. After so opening, the examining officer shall securely refasten them.

Delays in Transmission.

19. Parcels may be delayed when their transmission would interfere with the due despatch of letter-mails.

20. The Postmaster-General is not responsible for any loss which may arise through the delay of any parcel.

Delivery of Parcels.

21. At places served by letter-carriers delivery of parcels will be made by them as far as practicable. Where letter-carriers are not employed, or where they are unable to deliver parcels, delivery must be taken at the Post Office. Senders are recommended to inform addressees by post of the despatch of parcels, so as to assure prompt delivery.

22. A parcel (other than one containing jewellery, or any article of gold or silver, or any precious stone) received from a place beyond New Zealand, addressed to a Post Office "to be called for," or for other reason required to lie at a Post Office, will, after it has remained in the office seven clear days (excluding Sundays and holidays), be charged demurrage at the rate of 1d. a day. A parcel containing jewellery, or any article of gold or silver, or any precious stone, received from a place beyond New Zealand, after it has remained in the office fourteen days (excluding Sundays and holidays), will be charged demurrage at the rate of one per centum per diem on the declared value thereof. No demurrage, however, will be charged on a parcel addressed to a place at which there is no house-to-house delivery, or for a person on board ship.

23. Parcels cannot be delivered until all charges due thereon, such as Customs duty, redirection fees, &c., are paid.

Undelivered and Unclaimed Parcels.

24. When a parcel is refused by the addressee, or known to be undeliverable, the sender will be immediately communicated with, and he may elect to have it redirected to another place or returned, but in the case of a parcel received from a place beyond New Zealand he must pay a fresh rate of postage for such redirection or return. Any charges which may have accrued on an undelivered inland parcel in respect of redirection, posting out of course, compulsory registration, or express services, or charges of any other kind, are waived on the return of the parcel, all undelivered inland parcels being returned to the senders without any charge whatever.

25. Unclaimed parcels will be retained at the office from which they should be delivered for one clear month, exclusive of the one in which they are received. At the end of that period the sender will be advised that they cannot be delivered, as provided in the next preceding regulation.

26. Inland parcels, if not claimed by the addressees or senders within three months, exclusive of the one in which they have been received, will be forwarded to the Dead Letter Office and disposed of as the Postmaster-General may direct. Parcels with perishable contents may be destroyed immediately they become offensive. Parcels from countries beyond New Zealand, if unclaimed, will be retained until the expiry of six months from the date of posting of the advice of non-delivery, and then returned through the Dead Letter Office to countries of origin.

Redirected Parcels.

27. Redirected parcels are liable to a new rate of postage for each redirection, except parcels addressed to officers and seamen of His Majesty's ships in New Zealand waters, which are readdressed without charge within New Zealand.

His Majesty's Liability.

28. In the event of any damage or loss occurring during transit, His Majesty may with his own consent be liable to pay compensation to the owner, but not exceeding in any case a greater sum than two pounds sterling in respect of any parcel.

INSURANCE OF PARCELS.

1. The Postmaster-General is not legally liable to make good any claim arising out of the conveyance of a parcel sent by post, but, subject to the following regulations, he will pay compensation up to the limits hereinafter set out for the loss or damage of a parcel posted in New Zealand for delivery therein, or to any of the countries enumerated in the following tables, against which a limit of insured value is entered.

2. The fees herein prescribed are payable in addition to the ordinary postage in order to secure such compensation.

3. All such fees must be prepaid by means of postage-stamps, which the sender must affix to the parcel with the stamps in prepayment of the postage.

4. A certificate must be obtained by the sender on posting an insured parcel, which must be produced by him when any claim for compensation arises. No charge will be made for such certificate.

5. No parcel may be insured for a sum in excess of the real value of the contents. An invoice, or description of contents and the value of each article contained in the parcel, must be enclosed therein. Over-insurance is a bar to compensation.

6. Parcels containing any of the following articles are excluded from acceptance under these regulations, viz.: Liquids or semi-liquids, perishable articles such as eggs, butter, fruit, flowers, confectionery, &c., fragile articles such as glassware, &c.

Under no circumstances will compensation be given for the loss of or damage to a parcel containing any of the above-mentioned articles.

7. Every parcel intended to be forwarded under these regulations must be carefully and substantially packed, with due regard to the nature of contents and the length of the journey, and must be secured in such a manner as to prevent tampering with it without leaving obvious traces of violation; for instance, seals should be placed over each join or loose flap of the covering of a parcel, and, if string be used in packing, a seal must be placed on the ends of the string where they are tied.

8. All seals on a parcel must be of the same kind of wax or lead, and must bear distinct impressions of the same device; and the device must not consist merely of straight, curved, or crossed lines. Coins may not be used for sealing.

9. Parcels containing jewellery, or any article of gold or silver, must be enclosed in strong boxes or cases, which must be securely fastened in wrappers of linen, canvas, strong paper, or other substantial material. The seals must be placed along the edges of each join or loose flap at distances of not more than 3 in. apart. For places outside New Zealand to which the insurance system extends such parcels must be insured for at least part of their value; for places within New Zealand, they must be either registered or insured (or registered and insured, if desired), unless their contents are not over 10s. in value.

10. If a parcel tendered for transmission under these regulations does not, in the opinion of the officer to whom it is tendered, fulfil the foregoing conditions as to packing and fastening, he shall refuse to forward it. The onus of properly packing and fastening the parcel lies upon the sender, and the Postmaster-General assumes no liability for loss or damage arising from defects of packing or fastening which may not be observed at the time of posting.

11. When a parcel posted under these regulations is redirected from one country, State, or colony to another, a fresh fee becomes payable for each such transmission; if this fee be not prepaid, it will be collected before delivery of the parcel. Insured parcels can be redirected to any place within New Zealand or to any of the countries mentioned in the postage table against which a limit of insured value is entered.

12. In the event of the contents of a parcel being damaged, the parcel should, as far as practicable, be retained in the condition in which it was received from the office of delivery, and be submitted, when required, to the examination of a responsible officer.

13. Compensation for a parcel lost or damaged in the post will not exceed the amount of the actual loss or damage, but no compensation will be paid for a parcel containing any prohibited article, or which has been delivered without external trace of injury and has been accepted, without remark, by the addressee, or when loss or damage arises from flood, tempest, shipwreck, earthquake, war, or other causes beyond control.

14. No application for compensation will be entertained unless made within three months from date of posting if the parcel originated in New Zealand, and within six months if in any other country. Such application may be made to the postal administration of either country or colony of origin or delivery, but the certificate of posting must be produced when required.

15. The final decision upon all questions of compensation rests with the postal administration of the country or colony in which the loss or damage has taken place.

16. Any insurance effected contrary to the foregoing provisions is invalid.

17. The sender of an insured parcel addressed to the United Kingdom may obtain an acknowledgment of its due receipt by the addressee by payment at the time of posting of a fee of 2½d., in addition to the ordinary postage and insurance fees. No inquiry as to the delivery of an insured parcel for the United Kingdom will be made except by means of an acknowledgment-of-delivery form, to which must be attached the fee of 2½d.

18. Where not repugnant to the foregoing regulations, the general regulations hereinbefore contained relating to parcels apply also to parcels forwarded under these regulations.
