A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Town Districts Act, 1904," that, notwithstanding the repeal by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," of "The Town Districts Act, 1881," and "The Town Districts Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1883," the Governor may, in the manner prescribed by "The Town Districts Act, 1881," declare that any area wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district, and thereupon the last-mentioned Act, and also "The Town Districts Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1883," shall be in force in such town district: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under "The Town Districts Act, 1881": And whereas the number of householders within such area is not less than fifty:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Town Districts Act, 1904," and "The Town Districts Act, 1881," and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said area shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district under "The Town Districts Act, 1881," by the name of the Morrinsville Town District. And in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto are State forests under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under "The New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said lands are now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said lands, and a statement of the reasons why they are no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either of such Houses objecting to the issue of this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by "The New Zealand State Forests Act Amendment Act, 1888," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Proclamations specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto, so far as they relate to the lands described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*; and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after such date the parcels of land described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this sixteenth day of December, 1907.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, K.C.M.G.,
PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by section twelve of "The Habitual Criminals and Offenders Act, 1906," His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The ordinary prison regulations and general orders will apply, as far as practicable, to the management, control, and discipline of the establishment generally, the term "Manager" being substituted for that of "Gaoler" in every case.

Consultative Committee.

2. There shall be a Consultative Committee for each Reformatory Prison, consisting of the Stipendiary Magistrate residing in the district in which the Reformatory Prison is situated (who shall visit the institution once, at least, in every month), the Visiting Justices, and the Manager. The Committee will be required to consider carefully the case of each prisoner, to deal with any specific matter referred to it and to advise the Minister thereon. The Stipendiary Magistrate shall preside at each meeting of the Committee, and shall arrange for holding regular quarterly meetings and such extra meetings as may be found necessary. Two members shall form a quorum, and minutes shall be kept of the proceedings of each meeting.

3. At the regular meetings punishments which have taken place since the last meeting shall be reported, together with particulars of marks and money awarded to each prisoner, result of appeals outstanding, requests in request-book, and other necessary details of treatment.

4. Every prisoner shall be brought singly before the Committee at their regular meetings to insure that no case is overlooked.

Stipendiary Magistrate and Visiting Justices.

5. The Stipendiary Magistrate and Visiting Justices shall have the same power to hear and determine complaints as in the case of ordinary prisoners under the Prisons Act, and may similarly direct punishment or otherwise deal with offenders, but in cases of deprivation of marks the value of marks fined shall not exceed ten shillings.

6. At every visit the Stipendiary Magistrate and Visiting Justices, in company with the Manager, shall consult with the various officers concerned respecting the industry, conduct, and progress of each prisoner; they shall carefully investigate any complaints made to them, and, when necessary, furnish a report to the Minister or Inspector.

Gaol Surgeon.

7. The Gaol Surgeon will forward quarterly reports to the Inspector respecting the condition of health, &c., of each prisoner, and give special attention to those on the lower dietary scales.

Treatment of Habitual Criminals.

8. Every prisoner will have a separate cell, in which he will sleep, have his meals, and keep such of his belongings as may be sanctioned by the Manager.

9. Indulgences will be granted on account of good conduct and industry, and such indulgences will include postage-stamps, tea, coffee, cocoa, tobacco, cheese, fish, fruit, newspapers, pipes, butter, jam, milk, extra lighting, extra issue of books, and any other such privileges as the Manager may sanction.

10. No prisoner shall take indulgences or extra articles of food outside his cell, or share them with others, without being liable to punishment, including forfeiture of marks and privileges.

Employment.—Earning Marks.

11. Each prisoner will be employed according to his ability, and will perform such labour as the Manager may

direct daily, suited to his capacity and physical condition. The work should be of a productive, reformatory, and educational character, and, whenever practicable, and not inconsistent with disciplinary requirements, the prisoner should be employed at the trade at which he is most proficient and which will do the most to fit him for honest self-support when at liberty.

12. An account will be opened in each prisoner's name, showing the various payments and deductions, and this is to be audited on the occasion of each visit of the Inspector. At any time prisoners are to be informed on inquiry of the state of their account.

(1.) Marks may be earned as follows :—

For a full day's work, with exemplary conduct, 8 marks.

For a fair day's work, with good conduct, 7 marks.

An indifferent day's work, or bad conduct, 6 marks.

13. After deducting 6 marks per diem, or 2s. 6d. for the prisoner's keep, the 6d. or 3d. per diem will be credited to the prisoner's account, as the case may be; and prisoners who only earn 6 marks per diem will be liable to be punished unless some good cause can be shown for their failing to earn the higher number of marks.

14. Seven marks per diem may be granted for exemplary conduct on Sundays and holidays.

Deduction of Fines.

15. Fines inflicted by the Court, Stipendiary Magistrate, or Visiting Justices shall be at once deducted from the credit balance standing to the prisoner's account, and will debar the offender from purchasing extras till such time as he has again earned the amount lost, and prisoners must have £2 standing to their credit before they are permitted to purchase indulgences or remit money.

Privileges.

16. Prisoners after being one month clear of report, and who are earning full marks, will be allowed to write a letter and have a visit of half an hour's duration once every month for the first year of their imprisonment, and once every fortnight in their second year, and weekly in their third year or after. The Manager may, if he sees fit, grant a letter in lieu of a visit at any time.

17. Prisoners desirous of obtaining any educational or other book not in the library may apply to the Manager, who, if he considers the case deserving, will endeavour to obtain the book applied for.

18. The Manager will use his discretion as to relaxing any of the regulations when he sees fit to do so, reporting the matter at the next meeting of the Consultative Committee, as it is not expected that the rigid methods usually adopted in prisons can always be made applicable to a reformatory.

19. The following days will be observed as prison holidays: Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, King's birthday, Prince of Wales's birthday.

Petitions.

20. Prisoners may at any time during their detention petition, on the prescribed form, for release. The petitions will be referred to the Court before which the petitioner was tried, and afterwards forwarded to His Excellency the Governor for his decision.

21. Any prisoner will be allowed to address the Inspector in writing upon any subject connected with his case or position, and the Manager shall forward the statement to the Head Office without delay, making any comments he may think fit.

22. Any prisoner will be permitted, if he so desire, to complain of the treatment to which he is subjected to the Stipendiary Magistrate, Visiting Justices, or to the Inspector, but any complaints must be made promptly, and must be of a specific character.

23. The Manager when forwarding petitions for release should state if definite employment can be found for the prisoner, and every facility should be given to an eligible prisoner to communicate with discharged prisoners' aid societies or any kindred organizations or reputable persons likely to find employment for him. Prison officers are enjoined to render all possible assistance in this respect, as unless suitable employment is obtained for a prisoner prior to discharge there is little hope of his being able to lead a reformed life.

And whereas it is desirable that the by-law hereinafter set forth should be made for harbours where there is no Harbour Board:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the hereinbefore-in-part-recited Act, doth hereby order and declare that on and after the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette* the harbour by-law set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be in force in harbours where there is no Harbour Board.

“The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883” (hereinafter called “the said Act”), to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark of Tautuku River, Clutha County, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of “The Harbours Act, 1878,” has deposited a plan, in duplicate, in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 3112) showing the place where it is intended to erect such wharf, the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to carry out such works: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed works will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the Council on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which are particularly shown and delineated on the plan marked M.D. 3112, in duplicate, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf; such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term “Minister” means the Minister of Marine, as defined by “The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903,” and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf, which is shown on the plan marked M.D. 3112, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the Council shall, on demand, pay to the Minister the annual sum of one shilling, such annual payments to date from the date hereof.

4. His Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. The Council shall complete the erection of the said wharf in accordance with the approved plan marked M.D. 3112, within twelve calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

6. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, the Council shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of “The Harbours Act, 1878,” or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months’ previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council.

11. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the Council’s part.

12. In case the Council shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for the purposes aforesaid,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council, without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, the Opunake Wharf Company (Limited), of Opunake (hereinafter called “the company”), in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore at Opunake, in the Provincial District of Taranaki, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf and the necessary sheds in connection therewith; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of “The Harbours Act, 1878,” deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 1593 and 1650) showing the manner in which it was proposed to construct such wharf and sheds, the place where it was intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore or land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it was made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work would not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans were approved by the Governor in Council without modification or addition: And whereas, pursuant to such application, a license was by Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-third day of the same month, granted and issued to the company under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, for the term of fourteen years, computed from the date of the said Order in Council, on the terms and conditions therein expressed:

And whereas the company duly constructed the said wharf and sheds, and the same are now under the control and management of the company:

And whereas the company in the year one thousand nine hundred and four made application for a fresh license under the said Act for a term of three years, computed from the expiry of the term of the said first-mentioned license, and such license was granted for the said term of three years: And whereas the company has made application for a fresh license under the said Act for a further term of two years, computed from the date of expiry of the said further term of three years hereinafter mentioned, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pur-

suance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the aforesaid wharf and sheds in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto to be taken by the company for the use of the said wharf, and doth also hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force and take effect on the nineteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight, being the date of the expiry of the term of the first-mentioned license.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. THE concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf and sheds, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 1650, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

2. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

3. His Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

4. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

5. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and sheds and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or sheds, requiring the company within a reasonable time; to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of two years, computed from the 19th day of January, 1908, unless such rights, powers, and privileges are sooner altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister.

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company.

9. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the company.

10. In case the company—

- (1.) Commits or suffers a breach of the conditions hereinafore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Ceases to use or occupy the said wharf or shed; or
- (3.) Is wound up or dissolved,

then and in any such case this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice of the fact to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested.

11. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

Order prohibiting the Importation into the Cook and Northern Islands of certain Perfumed Spirits and Perfumery except under Conditions.

PLUNKET, Governor.

WHEREAS by section thirteen, subsection two, of "The Cook and other Islands Government Act, 1901," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Warrant or Order, prohibit, either absolutely or subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, the importation into the said Islands of arms or other munitions of war, intoxicating liquors, opium, or any other article of any kind which in his opinion is likely to be injurious to the inhabitants thereof; and by subsection three of the said section thirteen it is further provided that the Governor may impose penalties for the breach of any such Warrant or Order, and may make provision for the recovery of any such penalty by forfeiture of the ship or goods, or otherwise: And whereas in the opinion of the Governor the importation of certain perfumed spirits and perfumery into the Cook and Northern Islands except under conditions is likely to be injurious to the inhabitants thereof by reason of their using the same as drink of an intoxicating nature:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that, from and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Cook Islands Gazette*, the importation of the following perfumed spirits or perfumery—to wit, Florida-water, eau-de-Cologne, lavender-water, and bay-rum, or any colourable imitation thereof respectively—into the Cook and Northern Islands shall be prohibited except subject to the following conditions:—

1. Any person desiring to import any of the said perfumed spirits or perfumery shall apply in writing to the Collector of Customs at Rarotonga for permission so to do, and such application shall state the amount of such perfumed spirits or perfumery proposed to be imported. The said Collector of Customs may thereupon, if he thinks fit, give permission in writing for such importation.

2. All perfumed spirits or perfumery imported pursuant to such permission shall be imported only at Rarotonga, and in separate packages addressed to the importer (being the person so applying for permission to import) through the said Collector of Customs.

3. Perfumed spirits or perfumery so imported may, as the said Collector of Customs thinks expedient, either be delivered to the importer or be stored in the King's bond or some other place of safe custody under the control of the said Collector of Customs for delivery to the importer from time to time in such quantities as the said Collector of Customs thinks fit: Provided that delivery shall not be given until all duties and charges payable to the Crown have been duly paid.

4. Every person or his agent importing perfumed spirits or perfumery in accordance with this Order, and every person selling such perfumed spirits or perfumery, shall keep a full and true account of all such perfumed spirits or perfumery sold by him, showing the date when and the person to whom such perfumed spirits or perfumery were sold. Such account shall be open for inspection by the said Collector of Customs at any time.

5. Any person importing any of the aforesaid perfumed spirits or perfumery except in accordance with the provisions hereof, or any person contravening in any way the provisions of this Order, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, to be recovered in the High Court of the Cook Islands, and in addition the said Collector of Customs may seize and forfeit for the benefit of the Crown all perfumed spirits or perfumery imported contrary to the provisions of this Order.

Amended Regulations under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," and "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907."

PLUNKET, Governor.

WHEREAS by Warrants dated the eighteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and one, the sixteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three, the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and one, the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three, and the thirteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven, respectively, certain regulations were made by the Governor fixing the terms and conditions for the disposal and occupation of lands acquired under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and its amendments: And whereas the said Act has been amended by "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907," and it is expedient to revoke the said recited regulations so far as they relate to lands which have not already been offered for selection, and to make others in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and its amendments, doth hereby revoke the above-recited regulations, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that such revocation and the regulations hereby made shall take effect on the day of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

AS TO RURAL LANDS.

1. In every case where agricultural or mixed agricultural and pastoral lands acquired under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," are to be disposed of by renewable lease, in accordance with the provisions of Part I of "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907," they shall be disposed of by the Land Board of the district (hereinafter called "the land district") wherein the lands are situate in the manner and upon the terms and conditions hereinafter appearing.

2. Every lease shall be for a term of thirty-three years, to be reckoned from the next 1st day of January or July following the date of the lease, and shall in addition include the period between the date of the lease and such day. The lease shall be dated as on the day whereon the Land Board declares that the applicant has succeeded in obtaining the allotment.

3. Each lease shall contain a perpetual right of renewal for further successive terms of thirty-three years.

4. The land shall be divided into allotments as the Minister of Lands (hereinafter called "the Minister") determines, and no lease shall comprise more than one allotment; but an allotment may comprise one or more sections of the settlement whereof it forms part; and, subject to the limit of maximum area prescribed by these regulations, the Land Board, with the approval of the Minister, may at any time before the disposal of any allotment alter the area thereof, or divide it into other allotments.

5. (1.) The yearly rental in respect of each allotment shall be an amount equal to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on the capital value of the land (exclusive of the buildings thereon), computed in manner prescribed by section 51 of "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," and shall be payable in equal parts, half-yearly, in advance, to the Receiver of Land Revenue, on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July in each year, the first half-year's rent being due on the 1st day of January or July first following the date of the lease, and being payable out of the hereinafter-mentioned deposit.

(2.) With the first half-yearly payment rent shall also be paid for the period elapsing between the date of the lease and the due date of such half-yearly payment.

6. Every application shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and every applicant shall make the declaration therein set forth, or to that effect.

7. Every applicant shall, to the best of his ability, answer the questions set forth in his application, and such other questions relating to his means and ability to work the land and fulfil the conditions of the lease as the Land Board may see fit to ask. Failure to answer any such question to the satisfaction of the Land Board will entail the rejection of the application.

8. (1.) No application will be considered unless it is accompanied by a deposit consisting of an amount equal to the rent for the first half-year of the term of the allotment applied for, together with the sum of one guinea to defray the cost of the lease: Provided that, where more than one allotment is applied for, it shall be sufficient if a deposit is made equal to the half-year's rent of the allotment whose rent is the highest.

(2.) An applicant may apply for more than one allotment, provided that, together with the land he already holds, he does not apply for more than the maximum area prescribed by these regulations; but no person shall be allowed to acquire or to hold more than one allotment.

(3.) If there is only one applicant for any allotment, he shall *prima facie* be entitled to be declared the successful applicant.

(4.) If the applicant is successful in obtaining an allotment, his deposit, or a sufficient part thereof, shall be retained and applied in payment of the half-year's rent, or of the half-year's rent and sinking fund, in respect of such allotment, or of the interest only, as the case may be; the residue, if any, shall be returned to him; and if the deposit is insufficient, he shall forthwith complete the payment of the first half-year's rent, or rent and sinking fund. There shall not be any right to withdraw any application or right to claim a refund of any deposit: Provided that the Board may, in its discretion, on application, permit the refund of any deposit on being satisfied that the application was genuine and made in good faith, and that the grounds for withdrawal are *bona fide* and not contrary to the spirit of these regulations.

(5.) In cases where two or more applicants apply for the same allotment a ballot shall be taken by the Board to decide priority of choice.

9. No person shall be capable of applying for or holding any allotment in any of the following cases, that is to say:—

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- (1.) If at the date of his application he is directly or indirectly, either by himself or jointly or in common with any other person or persons, the owner, tenant, or occupier of any land whatsoever under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," or any former Land for Settlements Act, or the owner in fee-simple, or the tenant or occupier under a lease for a term of more than one year's duration, of any other land in New Zealand which, with the allotment applied for, would exceed in area 5,000 acres of third-class land, or 2,000 acres of second-class land, or 640 acres of first-class land, or a total area of 5,000 acres calculated as hereinafter follows.
- (2.) (a.) For the purpose of computing the above area every acre of first-class land shall be reckoned as $7\frac{1}{2}$ acres, every acre of second-class land as $2\frac{1}{2}$ acres, and every acre of third-class land as 1 acre.
- (b.) Any land which has not been classified shall, if of an unimproved value of £4 per acre or upwards, be deemed to be first-class land; and if of an unimproved value of less than £4 but not less than £2 per acre, shall be deemed to be second-class land; and if of an unimproved value of less than £2 per acre, shall be deemed to be third-class land.
- (c.) Land held under lease the term of which expires within nine months shall not be deemed to be land held or occupied within the meaning of this regulation, unless the lessee has a right to a renewal of such lease.
- (3.) If at such date he is the owner of real or personal property the total value whereof, after deducting the incumbrances thereon, exceeds the following proportion of the capital value (exclusive of buildings) of the allotment applied for, that is to say:—
- (a.) Three times such capital value where the area of such allotment does not exceed 100 acres;
- (b.) Twice such capital value where such area exceeds 100 and does not exceed 500 acres;
- (c.) One and a half times such value where such area exceeds 500 acres:

Provided that the Land Board may, with the consent of the Minister, accept an application for an allotment from a person who is the owner of real or personal property the total value whereof exceeds the aforesaid limitations. For the purpose of giving effect to this proviso, clause 5 of the declaration contained in the First Schedule to these regulations may be varied accordingly.

10. Allotments will be disposed of to the applicants therefor in accordance with the regulations for a system of ballot published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 12th day of December, 1907.

11. Every applicant who obtains an allotment under these regulations shall, from the date of the lease, reside continuously thereon.

12. It shall not be lawful for a lessee under this Act to transfer the land comprised in the lease within the period of five years from the date of such lease: Provided that, on the death of a lessee or on the happening of any extraordinary event which in the opinion of the Land Board of the district in which the land is situated renders a transfer necessary or expedient, a transfer of the lease may, with the sanction of the Land Board and the Minister, be made.

13. The lessee shall put on the land comprised in his lease substantial improvements as under, that is to say:—

- (1.) Within one year from the date of his lease, to a value equal to 10 per cent. of the aforesaid capital value of the land;
- (2.) Within two years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another 10 per cent. of the aforesaid capital value of the land;
- (3.) And thereafter, but within six years from the date of the lease, to a value equal to another 10 per cent. of the aforesaid capital value of the land;

and in addition thereto he shall, within six years from the date of his lease, put

on the land substantial improvements of a permanent character within the meaning of section 3 of "The Land Act, 1892," to the value of £1 an acre for every acre of agricultural land (first class), 10s. an acre for every acre of mixed agricultural and pastoral land (second class), and 2s. 6d. an acre for every acre of third-class land. For the purposes of this clause the Land Board shall determine and specify in the lease what proportion of the land comprised therein is agricultural, what proportion is mixed agricultural and pastoral land, and what proportion is third-class land.

14. For the purpose of determining whether the lessee has put upon the land substantial improvements to the value and within the time prescribed by these regulations (but for no other purpose), there shall be included the value of all substantial improvements existing on the land at the date of the lease, which improvements shall be deemed to be improvements required by regulation 13, and also all capital sums paid by the lessee in respect of the value of buildings under regulation 24, nevertheless to the extent only of the actual value of such of the said improvements and buildings as are subsisting at the time when their value is included as aforesaid.

15. "Substantial improvements of a permanent character" mean and include reclamation from swamps, clearing of forest, gorse, broom, sweetbriar, or scrub, cultivation, planting, gardens, fencing, draining, making roads, sinking wells or water-tanks, constructing water-races, sheep-dips, making embankments or protective works of any kind, or in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil, and include the erection of any non-movable building.

16. The lessee shall, within two years from the date of his lease, have the land fenced with a ring-fence, and such fence shall be a sufficient fence within the meaning of "The Fencing Act, 1895."

17. The lessee shall once a year throughout the term of his lease, and at the proper season of the year, properly cut and trim all live fences on the land at the date of the lease, or subsequently planted thereon, and stub all gorse not growing as fences, and also stub all broom, sweetbriar, and other noxious plants.

18. The lessee shall not take more than three crops, one of which must be a root-crop, from the same land in succession; and either with or immediately after a third crop of any kind he shall sow the land down with good permanent cultivated grasses and clovers, and allow the land to remain as pasture for at least three years from the harvesting of the last crop before being again cropped.

19. The lessee shall at all times during the term of the lease so farm the land, if the area of the whole exceeds 20 acres, as that not less than one-half of the total area shall be maintained in permanent pasture.

20. The lessee shall not cut the cultivated grass or clovers for hay or seed during the first year from the time of sowing as aforesaid, nor shall he at any time remove from the land or burn any straw grown upon the land.

21. The lessee shall, whenever necessary, but not less than once a year during the term of his lease, properly clean and clear from weeds, and shall at all times during the said term keep open all creeks, drains, ditches, and watercourses upon the land, and the Commissioner of Crown Lands (hereinafter called "the Commissioner") or any Crown Lands Ranger of the land district shall have the power at any time to enter upon and make through the land any drain that he deems necessary, without payment of any compensation to the lessee.

22. In the event of the lessee at any time failing to comply with any of the conditions hereinbefore mentioned relating to the trimming of live fences and stubbing gorse, broom, and sweetbriar, or other noxious weeds, and to the cleaning, clearing from weeds, and keeping open all creeks, drains, ditches, and watercourses, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to have such work done, and to recover the cost of the same from the lessee in the same manner as rent.

23. The lessee shall pay all rates, taxes, and assessments levied on or payable in respect of the land during the term of his lease.

24. In the case of land with buildings thereon which have been valued separately, in pursuance of section 54 of "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," the following special provisions shall apply:—

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- (1.) The ascertained value of the buildings shall be set forth in the sale-plan and in the deed of lease, and the amount so set forth shall be final and conclusive evidence of such value.
 - (2.) Subject to the provisions for postponement contained in subsection (3) of section 54 of "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," the amount so set forth, together with interest thereon at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, computed from the 1st day of January or July next following the date of the lease, shall be paid by the lessee by equal half-yearly instalments in advance, extending over such period, being not less than seven nor more than twenty-one years, as, with the approval of the Minister, the Land Board thinks fit to determine, and until paid shall be deemed to be a charge on the land and on the lessee's interest therein: Provided that during such postponement (if any) the interest alone shall be payable by half-yearly instalments in advance.
 - (3.) Such instalments shall be payable in the manner and on the dates hereinbefore appointed for the payment of rent: Provided that the lessee may at any time pay the whole or any less number of the then future instalments under a duly proportionate rebate of interest.
 - (4.) The amount of such instalments (where they consist of combined principal and interest, and not of interest alone) shall be calculated according to the table shown in the Second Schedule hereto, which shall be deemed to be final and conclusive.
 - (5.) So long as any such instalment remains unpaid the lessee shall, at his own cost in all things, insure the buildings and keep them insured in the name of His Majesty in an amount equal to the full insurable value thereof, in the State Fire Insurance Office or some other reputable insurance office, to be first approved by the Commissioner.
 - (6.) The lessee shall deposit with the Commissioner the policy of insurance forthwith upon effecting the insurance, and shall also duly pay all premiums in respect thereof, and deposit with him each premium-receipt not later than the forenoon of the day on which such premium becomes payable.
 - (7.) If the lessee at any time fails or neglects to effect or maintain such insurance, or to duly pay any such premium or deposit such policy or receipt, it shall be lawful for but not obligatory on the Commissioner, at the cost in all things of the lessee, to effect such insurance in such sum as aforesaid, or in any other sum, or to pay such premium as he thinks fit.
 - (8.) The amount of such insurance may, with the consent of the Commissioner, be reduced from time to time, provided that it is not reduced below the total amount of the aforesaid instalments for the time being remaining unpaid.
 - (9.) In the event of the buildings so insured, or any of them, being destroyed or damaged by fire, all moneys payable to His Majesty under the insurance shall be recoverable by the Commissioner, who, after deducting the expense (if any) incurred in recovering the same, shall, in his discretion, apply the residue thereof, or a sufficient part thereof, either in or towards restoring the buildings or in or towards paying the unpaid instalments (a duly proportionate rebate of interest being made in the case of instalments not then due), and any surplus shall be payable to the lessee.
 - (10.) Every such instalment as aforesaid, as it becomes due, and every sum paid by the Commissioner in respect of cost of insurance, shall be payable by and may be recovered from the lessee in the same manner as rent.
25. The lessee shall at all times during the term of his lease keep in good repair and condition, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, all buildings and erections for the time being standing on the land, and shall not destroy, pull

down, or remove them, or any part thereof, without the previous permission of the Commissioner in writing.

26. If and so often as the lessee makes default in the due and full payment of any rent under the lease, or of any instalment in respect of the value of buildings as aforesaid, or of any sum in respect of cost of insurance as aforesaid, or of any other moneys payable under the lease, or in the faithful observance and performance of any other of the provisions of these regulations, or of the lease, then and in any such case the Land Board may, without any previous or other notice or demand, forfeit the lease, and in such case all his interest therein shall absolutely cease and determine, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of regulation 33, respecting valuation of improvements; but such forfeiture shall not affect any right or remedy on the part of His Majesty to recover from the lessee any money due to His Majesty, or release the lessee from any penalty or liability in respect to anything done or omitted to be done by him.

27. (1.) Any owner of a renewable lease may at any time make payments to the Receiver of Land Revenue in sums of not less than £10 and not exceeding in the whole 90 per cent. of the capital value of the land comprised in his lease.

(2.) The capital value of the land for this purpose means the value in respect of which the rent payable under the said lease is calculated.

(3.) On any such payment being made the rent reserved by the lease shall thereafter abate proportionately.

28. (1.) When and so long as the payments so made are not less in the aggregate than 33 per cent. of the said capital value, the lessee shall for the residue of the term have possession of the land freed from all covenants and conditions contained or implied in the lease other than the covenant to pay rent and the conditions as to residence, but the lessee shall not thereby obtain any right to extract minerals or commit any other waste or depreciation of the land.

(2.) All moneys so paid shall be a debt due by the Crown to the owner of the lease for the time being, and such debt shall run with the lease, and shall be payable when the lease is renewed or is determined by effluxion of time, forfeiture, surrender, or otherwise.

(3.) At any time during the currency of the lease any moneys so paid shall, so far as they exceed 33 per cent. of the capital value, be repaid on the application of the person entitled thereto, and thereupon the rent payable under the lease shall be adjusted proportionately.

29. All moneys so paid by a lessee shall be paid into the Land for Settlements Account, and shall be available for the purposes of "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900."

30. The lessee shall not open up any mine on the land comprised in his lease without the previous permission of the Commissioner in writing.

31. The full and free right to enter on the land comprised in the lease and search for and take and remove gravel or stone for making or maintaining roads is reserved to His Majesty: Provided that the lessee shall be entitled to compensation for any surface-damage caused thereby, but to no other compensation or remedy whatsoever.

32. The lessee shall not cut down or remove any of the trees growing on the land demised without the consent of the Commissioner in writing first obtained.

33. In the event of the forfeiture or surrender of the lease, the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," respecting valuation of improvements and the payment or other disposal thereof shall, so far as the same are applicable, apply to the improvements made by the lessee.

34. For the purpose of distinguishing the improvements existing on the land at the date of the lease from those subsequently made by the lessee, the first-mentioned improvements and their value shall be fixed by the Land Board, and be specified in the lease: Provided that to the extent to which the lessee pays the aforesaid instalments in respect of the value of buildings, to the same extent shall such buildings be deemed to be improvements made by him.

35. The right is reserved to the Crown or to its delegated authority to take water-races, and to lay water-pipes over any lands disposed of, without compensation; the rentals of the sections to be reduced in proportion to the area taken when any such right has been exercised.

36. In any case where the channel of any creek, or natural or artificial water-race or watercourse, runs on more sections than one, then each lessee on whose land any part of such channel runs shall have the right to the reasonable use and enjoyment of a reasonable proportion of the water that would flow in such channel if it were not stopped or diverted by any other lessee; and, for the purpose of securing such right as between the respective lessees, it is here declared that no lessee on whose land any portion of such channel runs shall at any time alter such portion, or stop or divert the water flowing therein, save to such extent as the Commissioner deems reasonable, and the decision of the Commissioner shall be final and conclusive.

37. The lease shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Third Schedule hereto, and may contain such additional provisions, not inconsistent with "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907," or these regulations, as, with the approval of the Minister, the Land Board thinks fit.

AS TO PASTORAL LANDS.

38. In every case where pastoral lands acquired under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," are to be disposed of by way of renewable lease in accordance with the provisions of Part I of "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907," the same shall be disposed of by the Land Board of the land district in the manner and on the terms and conditions hereinafter appearing.

39. Every lease shall be for the term of thirty-three years, to be reckoned from the 1st day of January or July following the date of the lease, and shall, in addition, include the period between the date of the lease and such day. The lease shall be dated as on the date whereon the Land Board declares that the applicant has succeeded in obtaining the allotment.

40. (1.) The land shall be divided into allotments of such area as the Land Board, with the approval of the Governor, thinks necessary for the profitable occupation thereof, although such areas may exceed the limits of area permissible independently of section 77 of "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907."

(2.) To any such area of pastoral land there may be added any low-lying land acquired under or subject to the provisions of "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," which the Land Board, with the approval of the Governor, considers necessary for the proper working of the said pastoral land, whether such low-lying land is or is not contiguous thereto.

41. The yearly rent in respect of each allotment shall be an amount equal to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on the capital value of the land (exclusive of the buildings thereon), computed in manner prescribed by "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," and shall be payable in equal parts half-yearly in advance to the Receiver of Land Revenue, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year, the first half-year's rent being due on the 1st day of January or July first following the date of the lease, and being payable out of the prescribed deposit.

42. Every application shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and every applicant shall make the declaration therein set forth or to that effect.

43. No person shall be capable of applying for or holding any allotment in any of the following cases, that is to say:—

- (1.) If at the date of his application he is, directly or indirectly, either by himself or jointly or in common with any other person or persons, the owner, tenant, or occupier of any land whatsoever under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," or any former Land for Settlements Acts, or the owner in fee-simple, or the tenant or occupier under a lease for a term of more than one year's duration, of any other land in New Zealand which, with the allotment applied for, would exceed in area 5,000 acres, computed as prescribed by regulation 9, or the area of the allotment applied for, whichever may be the greater area.

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- (2.) If at such date he is owner of real and personal property the total value whereof, after deducting the incumbrances thereon, exceeds one and a half times the capital value (exclusive of buildings) of the allotment applied for.
44. The lessee shall reside continuously on the land comprised in his lease, or by "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," deemed to be so comprised.
45. The lessee shall put on the land comprised in his lease substantial improvements as under, that is to say:—
- (a.) Within one year from the date of his lease, to a value equal to 10 per cent. of the price of the land; and
 - (b.) Within two years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another 10 per cent. of the price of the land; and
 - (c.) Within six years from the date of his lease, to a value equal to another 10 per cent. of the price of the land; and
 - (d.) On bush land he shall, in addition to the foregoing improvements, put, within six years from the date of his lease, substantial improvements of a permanent character to the value of £1 an acre for every acre of first-class land, 10s. an acre for every acre of second-class land, and 2s. 6d. an acre for every acre of third-class land.
46. The lessee shall at all times during the term of the lease maintain in permanent pasture not less than two-thirds of the total area of the land.
47. The lease shall as far as practicable be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Third Schedule hereto, and may contain such additional provisions, not inconsistent with "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907," or these regulations, as the Land Board thinks fit.

GENERAL.

48. Subject to the provisions of "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," and its amendments, "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907," and the foregoing regulations, the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," and the regulations thereunder with respect to applications for and the grant of renewable leases, the stipulations and conditions subject to which such leases may be granted, the rights and powers of the lessor and of every person or authority in his behalf, the rights, powers, and functions of the Land Board and the Commissioner in relation to the land and premises comprised in such leases, and the estate, interest, rights, duties, and liabilities of the lessee, shall, so far as the same are applicable, apply to renewable leases granted under these regulations.

Whereas the allotment of land described in the First Schedule hereto is rural (or pastoral) land which has been acquired by the lessor under "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900" (hereinafter called "the said Act"): And whereas, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act and the regulations in that behalf made thereunder (hereinafter called "the said regulations"), the lessee duly applied for a renewable lease of the said allotment, and on the day of , one thousand nine hundred and , his application was duly granted by the Land Board of the land district wherein the said allotment is situate (hereinafter called "the Land Board"): And whereas there are now situate on the said allotment the buildings specified in the Second Schedule hereto, the value whereof has been duly ascertained to be the sum therein mentioned: And whereas, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act and the said regulations, the said sum, together with interest thereon at the rate of 5 per centum per annum computed from the first day of , one thousand nine hundred and , is payable by the lessee by the respective instalments and on the respective dates mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto: And whereas the capital value of the said allotment, apart from the said buildings, is :

Now this deed witnesseth that in consideration of the rent hereinafter reserved, and of the covenants, conditions, and agreements herein contained and implied and on the part of the lessee to be paid, observed, and performed, the lessor doth hereby demise and lease unto the lessee all that piece of land containing by admeasurement acres roods perches, a little more or less, situated in the Land District of , and being section numbered , of Block , in the Survey District of , as the same is more particularly described in the First Schedule hereto and delineated in the plan drawn thereon, and therein coloured red in outline; together with the rights, easements, and appurtenances to the same belonging: To hold the said several premises intended to be hereby demised unto the lessee for the term of thirty-three years, to be reckoned from the first day of , one thousand nine hundred and , and including in addition the period between the date of this lease and such day: Yielding and paying therefor during the said term unto the Receiver of Land Revenue for the said Land District of , free from all deductions whatsoever, the clear annual rent of , computed from the said first day of , one thousand nine hundred and , and payable in manner following, that is to say:—

- (a.) By a payment of before the execution of these presents, such payment (which has been duly made) being in respect of rent in advance for the first half-year, computed as aforesaid, together with rent for the period elapsing between the date of this lease and the commencement of the said first half-year; and also
- (b.) By the payment thereafter of half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each and

every year during the said term, the first of such payments to become due and to be made on the first day of , one thousand nine hundred and :

And also paying, in respect of the value of the buildings specified in the Second Schedule hereto, unto the aforesaid Receiver, the respective instalments specified in that Schedule at the dates therein respectively mentioned in that behalf.

And the lessee doth hereby covenant with the lessor as follows, that is to say:—

1. Subject to the provisions of the said regulations, the lessee will reside on the demised land from the date of this lease continuously.

2. The lessee will put on the demised land substantial improvements as under:—

- (a.) Within one year from the date of this lease substantial improvements to a value equal to ten per centum of the aforesaid capital value of the land;
- (b.) Within two years from such date further substantial improvements to a value equal to another ten per centum of the aforesaid capital value of the land;
- (c.) And within six years from such date further substantial improvements to a value equal to another ten per centum of the aforesaid capital value of the land, so that the total value of such improvements at the end of six years from such date shall not be less than thirty per centum of the aforesaid capital value of the land;

and also, in addition thereto, he will, within six years from such date, put upon the demised land substantial improvements of a permanent character within the meaning of "The Land Act, 1892," to the value of one pound for every acre of agricultural land (first class), ten shillings for every acre of mixed agricultural and pastoral land (second class), and two shillings and sixpence for every acre of third-class land: Provided that, for the purpose of determining whether the lessee has duly performed this covenant (but for no other purpose), there shall be included the value of all substantial improvements existing on the demised land at the date of this lease (which improvements shall be deemed to be improvements required by this covenant), and also all capital sums paid by the lessee in respect of the value of the buildings specified in the Second Schedule hereto, nevertheless to the extent only of the actual value of such of the said improvements and buildings as are subsisting at the time when their value is so included.

"Substantial improvements of a permanent character" mean and include reclamation from swamps, clearing of forest, gorse, broom, sweetbriar, or scrub, cultivation, planting, gardens, fencing, draining, making roads, sinking wells or water-tanks, constructing water-races, sheep-dips, making embankments or protective works of any kind, or in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil, and include the erection of any non-movable building.

3. The lessee will, within two years from the date of this lease, have the demised land fenced with a ring fence, and such fence shall be a sufficient fence within the meaning of "The Fencing Act, 1895."

4. The lessee will once a year during the said term, and at the proper season of the year, properly cut and trim all live fences now on the demised land, or which may be planted thereon during the said term, and stub all gorse not growing as fences, and also stub all broom, sweetbriar, and other noxious plants.

5. The lessee will not take more than three crops, one of which must be a root-crop, from the same land in succession; and will, either with or immediately after a third crop of any kind, sow the land down with good permanent cultivated grasses and clovers, and allow the land to remain as pasture for at least three years from the harvesting of the last crop before being again cropped.

6. The lessee will at all times during the said term so farm the demised land, if the area of the whole exceeds twenty acres, as that not less than one-half of the total area shall be maintained in permanent pasture.

7. The lessee will not cut the cultivated grass or clovers for hay or seed during the first year from the time of sowing as aforesaid, nor at any time remove from the demised land or burn any straw grown thereon.

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8. The lessee will, whenever necessary, but not less than once a year, during the said term properly clean and clear from weeds, and will at all times during the said term keep open, all creeks, drains, ditches, and watercourses upon the demised land; and the Commissioner of Crown Lands (hereinafter called "the Commissioner"), or any Crown Lands Ranger of the land district wherein the demised land is situate, shall have the power at any time to enter upon and make through the demised land any drain that he deems necessary, without payment of any compensation to the lessee.

9. In the event of the lessee at any time failing to faithfully perform any of the foregoing covenants relating to the trimming of live fences, and stubbing gorse, broom, and sweetbriar, or other noxious weeds, or to the cleaning, clearing from weeds, and keeping open all creeks, drains, ditches, and watercourses, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to have such work done, and to recover the cost of the same from the lessee in the same manner as rent.

10. The lessee will pay all rates, taxes, and assessments levied on or payable in respect of the demised land during the said term.

11. The lessee will at all times during the said term keep in good repair and condition, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, all buildings and erections for the time being standing on the demised land, and will not destroy, pull down, or remove them, or any part thereof, without the previous permission of the Commissioner in writing.

12. The lessee will not open up any mine on the demised land without the previous permission of the Commissioner in writing.

13. The lessee will fully and punctually pay the rent hereinbefore reserved, at the times and in the manner hereinbefore named in that behalf.

14. With reference to the buildings which have been valued separately as aforesaid, and the instalments in respect of the value thereof, as specified in the Second Schedule hereto, the following special provisions shall apply, that is to say:—

- (1.) The lessee shall fully and punctually pay the said instalments at the times and in manner mentioned in that behalf in the said Second Schedule hereto: Provided that he may at any time pay the whole or any less number of the then future instalments under a duly proportionate rebate of interest.
- (2.) So long as any such instalment remains unpaid the lessee shall, at his own cost in all things, insure the said buildings and keep them insured in the name of the lessor in an amount equal to the full insurable value thereof in the State Fire Insurance Office or some other reputable insurance office, to be first approved by the Commissioner.
- (3.) The lessee shall deposit with the Commissioner the policy of such insurance forthwith upon effecting the same, and shall also duly pay all premiums in respect thereof, and deposit with him each premium-receipt, not later than the forenoon of the day on which such premium becomes payable.
- (4.) If the lessee at any time fails or neglects to duly effect or keep on foot such insurance, or to duly pay any such premium, or deposit such policy or receipt, it shall be lawful for but not obligatory on the Commissioner, at the cost in all things of the lessee, to effect such insurance in such sum as aforesaid, or in any other sum, or to pay such premium as he thinks fit.
- (5.) Every such instalment as it becomes due, and every sum paid by the Commissioner in respect of cost of insurance, shall be payable by and may be recovered from the lessee in the same manner as rent.
- (6.) The amount of such insurance may, with the consent of the Commissioner, be reduced from time to time, provided that it is not reduced below the total amount of the instalments for the time being remaining unpaid.

- (7.) In the event of the buildings so insured, or any of them, being destroyed or damaged by fire, all moneys payable to the lessor under the insurance shall be recoverable by the Commissioner, who, after deducting the expense (if any) incurred in recovering the same, shall, in his discretion, apply the residue thereof, or a sufficient part thereof, either in or towards restoring the buildings or in or towards paying the unpaid instalments (a due rebate of interest being made in the case of instalments not then due), and any surplus shall be payable to the lessee.

And it is hereby decreed and declared as follows, that is to say:—

- (A.) For the purposes of these presents the following proportion, to wit, acres of the demised land shall be deemed to be agricultural land, acres shall be deemed to be mixed agricultural and pastoral land, and acres shall be deemed to be third-class land.
- (B.) Subject to the provisions herein contained and implied, and also to those of the said Acts and the said regulations, the provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," and the regulations thereunder with respect to applications for and the grant of renewable leases, the stipulations and conditions subject to which such leases may be granted, the rights and powers of the lessor and of every person or authority in his behalf, the rights, powers, and functions of the Land Board and the Commissioner in relation to land and premises comprised in such leases, and the estate, interest, rights, duties, and liabilities of the lessees, shall, so far as the same are applicable, apply to this lease as fully as if they were fully set out herein.
- (C.) MOUNT WELLINGTON ROAD DISTRICT.

Special Order.

By-laws for the Regulation of Heavy Traffic on the District Roads, made by Special Order by the Mount Wellington Road Board, passed at a Special Meeting of the said Board on the 1st day of November, 1907.

In pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Road Boards Act, 1882," and "The Public Works Act, 1894," and the several amendments thereto, the Mount Wellington Road Board hereby make the following by-laws, which shall come into operation upon the date of publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*:—

1. The owner of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic used in carting stone, earth, scoria, ash, timber, or coal upon any of the roads within the boundaries of the Mount Wellington Road District shall, before using such vehicle upon any such road, apply to the Mount Wellington Road Board for a license, and shall pay to the Mount Wellington Road Board the yearly license fee following, that is to say: For vehicles having tires of the width of 4½ in. or over, £5; for vehicles having tires under 4½ in. width, £10.

2. Provided, nevertheless, that the Board may, in its discretion, and on application of the owner or driver of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic used in carting stone, earth, scoria, ash, timber, or coal, permit the owner or driver of such vehicle to use such vehicle for the purpose of carting stone, earth, scoria, ash, timber, or coal upon or over all or any of the roads within the boundaries of such road district without having paid such license fee upon the payment to the said Board of the following charges by way of compensation for any damage likely to occur to such roads: For every load carried on any one day upon or over any such road, 1s. If more than three loads are carried in any one vehicle in any one day upon or over any such roads, then for the day 3s.

3. Any person who, after the coming into operation of this by-law, shall use any vehicle for heavy traffic within the boundaries of the Mount Wellington Road District without first having paid the said license fee for such vehicle, or without having first obtained the permission of the said Board under clause 2 of these by-laws, and paid the charges prescribed thereunder, or who shall do, or cause to be done, or to be concerned in doing, anything contrary to any provision of these by-laws, or who shall omit to do anything required to be done by him by any such provision, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these by-laws, and on conviction thereof shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.

4. "Heavy traffic" shall mean the transportation of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall, together with any stone, earth, scoria, ash, timber, or coal being transported thereon, weigh more than 1½ tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels.

"Owner" of any vehicle shall include a bailee or hirer entitled to the possession and use or profit thereof.

5. Any constable or any officer of the Board may stop and detain any vehicle which in his opinion infringes any of these by-laws, and inspect, examine, and measure the tires thereof, and the weight of such vehicle and the contents thereof; and the driver or person for the time being in charge of such vehicle shall permit such inspection, examination, measurement, and weighing to be made accordingly, and shall, if so requested by any such constable or officer of the Board, take such vehicle, together with the contents thereof, to the nearest weighbridge, and then and there weigh the same, and no person shall obstruct any such constable or officer in or about the making of such inspection, examination, measurement, or weighing.

6. Applications for licenses under clause 1, or a permit under clause 2, of these by-laws shall be made in writing to the Clerk of the Board. Such licenses or permits shall be under the hand of the Clerk. All licenses shall expire twelve calendar months from the date of the issue thereof.

7. The Clerk shall keep at the office of the Board a register of all licenses issued under clause 1 and permits under clause 2 of these by-laws. Such register shall be open to public inspection without fee.

8. Every license shall be numbered, and the owner of the licensed vehicle shall cause the like number to be legibly painted and maintained during the currency of the license on the off side of such vehicle in white figures on a black ground, together with the letters "M. W. R. B.," each of such figures and letters to be not less than 1 in. in length.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

Education Department,

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 4th February, 1908, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 27th January, 1908.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1907; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—
