PLUNKET, Governor.

WHEREAS by section six of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act 1885 Amendment Act, 1886," it is provided that the Governor, by Order in Council, shall, before the month of November next ensuing, and at the same period in every third year thereafter, apportion the representation of the various contributory local authorities in any district on the Board of such district in the manner therein set forth :

And whereas in the New Zealand Gazette of the fourteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seven, regulations were published governing the election of members of the Boards of such districts by such contributory local authorities as are grouped together in terms of the above-mentioned section:

And whereas it is necessary that regulations should be

made governing informalities in connection with such elections:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by section ninety-nine of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," and in all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following additional regulation:

REGULATION.

In any case where the Governor is of opinion that by reason of irregularities at or in connection with any election of members of a Board by the contributing local authorities the result of the election has been materially affected, he may declare the election to be void, and in such case a fresh election shall be held at such time and place and under such presiding officer as the Governor appoints.

Regulations for the Manufacture of Methylated Spirits prescribed.

Department of Trade and Customs, Wellington, 11th January, 1908.

I N pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by section 12 of "The Methylated Spirit Act, 1907," I, John Andrew Millar, the Minister of Customs for the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby prescribe the following regulations for the manufacture, use, and sale of methylated spirits: lated spirits :-

REGULATIONS.

No spirits shall be methylated which are of a lower strength than 50 per cent. overproof.
 No mineral naphtha or wood naphtha shall be used for

2. No mineral naphtha or wood naphtha shall be used for the purposes of methylation which have not been reported on by the Chemical Expert to the Customs Department, and approved by the Secretary of Customs.

3. Samples of wood naphtha or mineral naphtha to be submitted for approval must be drawn and sealed in the presence of an officer of Customs; the vessels containing the naphtha must also be sealed prior to delivery from Customs control. toms control.

Samples must not be less in quantity than one half pint, and must bear on the label the marks and numbers of the packages of importation, the name of the country of origin, and the initials of the officer in whose presence they were

4. No wood naphtha shall be approved which is of a less strength than 60 o.p. by Sikes hydrometer, and which is not sufficiently impure to impart to rectified spirit, to which it has been added in the proportion of one-ninth of the bulk of such rectified spirit, such nauseousness as will, in the opinion of the Chemical Expert, render it incapable of being used as a beverage or of being mixed with potable spirits of any kind without rendering them unfit for human consumption sumption.

Wood naphtha must also conform to the tests required by the Inland Revenue Board of Great Britain. (Copies of these tests may be obtained at any Customhouse.)

Mineral naphtha must be of specific gravity not less than

- 5. The following are the kinds of methylated spirit which may be manufactured :-
 - (a.) Mineralised spirit, for sale without restriction, made by the admixture of ingredients in the following proportions :

Rectified spirit . . . 100 gallons.
Approved wood naphtha . . 11 gallons.
Approved mineral naphtha . 3 pints.

(b.) Unmineralised methylated "finish," for sale with

numeransed methylated with thish, for sale without restriction, consisting of rectified spirit mixed with 11 per cent. of wood naphtha, and at least 10 per cent. by weight of sheliac, copal, or other resins, such resins having been dissolved to the satisfaction of the supervising officer before delivery.

Packages containing "finish" shall, prior to delivery, be distinctly marked "Methylated finish N.M." (not mineralised).

(c.) Unmineralised methylated spirit made under conditions hereafter specified in paragraphs (1) to (7), for the manufacture of lacquers, varnishes, polishes, veterinary medicines, and such other articles as may from time to time be approved by the Minister.

(1.) Unmineralised methylated spirit shall be methylated with 11 per cent. of approved wood naphtha, and shall, upon methylation, be distinctly marked "Methylated spirit N.M." (not mineralised), and such spirit shall only be made by or delivered to a manufacturer of approved articles for use in making such articles upon his own premises.

premises.

(2) Every holder of duty-paid "Methylated spirit N.M." shall provide a room or place of security approved by the Collector for the storage of such spirit under the Crown lock. He shall also enter into a bond, with two sufficient sureties, in the form provided, and shall undertake not to sell or dispose of any unmanufactured or partially manufactured product containing "Methylated spirit N.M."

(3.) Every manufacturer of articles approved under these regulations shall keep a book, in which he shall enter all "Methylated spirit N.M." received by him immediately on receipt thereof;

received by him immediately on receipt thereof; he shall also, immediately upon delivery from

he shall also, immediately upon delivery from Customs control, enter the quantity of spirit used to dissolve or treat such materials as are enumerated in paragraphs (4) and (5).

(4.) "Methylated spirit N.M." for the manufacture of varnishes, lacquers, and polishes shall be mixed with and have in solution, before delivery from Customs control, at least 2 per cent. by weight of either shellac, copal, resins, or other material approved by the Minister. Spirit so treated is not to be delivered until the materials added have had time to come into solution. solution.

(5.) "Methylated spirit N.M." for the manufacture of veterinary medicines shall be mixed, while under Customs control, with the ingredients approved for such medicines, time being allowed before delivery for solution, percolation, or

maceration where necessary.

(6.) Every manufacturer of veterinary medicines made with methylated spirit shall cause each package containing the same, and every bottle, tin, or other receptacle filled upon or delivered from his premises for sale, to be distinctly labelled. tinctly labelled-

- "For veterinary use. Made with methylated spirit."

 (7.) The premises of every holder of "Methylated spirit N.M." shall be open to inspection by an officer of Customs, who shall be permitted to examine the book referred to in paragraph (3) and to check the balances shown therein with the stock of methylated spirit in hand.
- 6. One shilling and sixpence per hour will be charged for the services of an officer of Customs when such services are required to supervise the manufacture or delivery of methy-lated spirit, "finish," or veterinary medicines.
- 8. Every person who commits any breach of these regulations shall, except as otherwise provided for under "The Methylated Spirit Act, 1907," be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

An examination of the survey shows that at that date the water in the channel had shoaled through its entire length, and at the shoalest point, a little north-eastward of buoy No. 7, there was 23½ ft. at the mean of the lower low waters.

Entering Naden Harbour, to pass eastward of Hastings Reef, keep Bain and George Points in line bearing S. 38° 45′ W. true (S. § W. mag.). To pass westward of Hastings Reef keep Bain and Mary Points in line bearing S. 28° 45′ W. true (south mag.). This leads across the bar in not less than 13 ft., nearly This leads across the bar in not less than 13 ft., nearly 300 yards westward of Hastings Reef, and the same distance eastward from the dense kelp-field marking the foul ground to the westward. When the extremity of the trees at Cape Naden is in line with the western extreme of the westernmost islet off Jorey Point as before, bearing N. 16° 15' W. true (N.W. mag.), the course should be changed to the southeastward. These marks kept in line astern lead up to Deep Water Point, when the eastern shore should be closely followed, as previously stated. Arrivals and Departures in 1907.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1907, with totals for

the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The arrivals in the Dominion last year (36,108) were less than the number recorded in 1906 (39,233), and the departures during 1907, which numbered 30,378, were greater than those in the previous year—viz., 26,385.

The excess of arrivals over departures last year was 5,730, against 12,848 in 1906.

The Exhibition of 1906—7 caused considerably more arrivals in the latter part of the year 1906 than in the corresponding portion of 1907, and the departures in the first four months of 1907 exceeded those in 1906 for the

More than this, the interchange of people between New Zealand and the Commonwealth of Australia has been more equal during last year than in 1906, as shown above, though New Zealand still gained 1,068 persons after deducting departures to the Continent. The number of departures for other British possessions in 1907 (659) consists mainly of persons who left for British Columbia.

The comparative tables show that the Dominion has drawn to itself in each of the ten years 1898 to 1907 more

The comparative tables show that the Dominion has drawn to itself in each of the ten years 1838 to 1907 more population than it has parted with.

The figures under the heading "United Kingdom" for 1907 show an excess of 5,003 arrivals over the departures, from Australian States there is an excess of 1,068, and to other countries a loss of 341.

Of the 36,108 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 3,762, or 10.42 per cent. of the total, were children—
i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 30,378 departures the children numbered 2,587, or 8.51 per cent.

OTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 4th February, 1908, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 27th January, 1908.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils; or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1907; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:— January, 1908.

If built without springs and carrying three-quarters of a ton or over but not more than 1½ tons to each pair of wheels (including the weight of the vehicle), not less than 3 in.

If built with springs and carrying over 1½ tons but not more than 2 tons to each pair of wheels (including the weight of the vehicle), not less than 3 in.

the weight of the vehicle), not less than 3 in.

If built without springs and carrying over 1½ tons but not more than 2 tons to each pair of wheels (including the weight of the vehicle), not less than 3½ in.

If carrying over 2 tons to each pair of wheels (including the weight of the vehicle), not less than 4 in.

If carrying over 3 tons to each pair of wheels (including the weight of the vehicle), not less than 4½ in.

If carrying over 4 tons to each pair of wheels (including the weight of the vehicle), not less than 5½ in.

The weight of any load shall be ascertained by actual weighing at some public or other authorised weighbridge, or by measurement according to the following scale:—
