WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Prisons Act, 1882," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the Gazette, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison, and from and after the gazetting of any such Proclamation, or from any time later specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the buildings and huts situated on all that area in the Canterbury Land District, containing by admeasurement 754 acres 2 roods, more or less, situated in Lyndon Survey District, bounded towards the north and east by Run No. 17, towards the south by the said Run No. 17 and Section No. 43, Block II, and towards the west generally by the road forming the eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 36, 35, and 33, Block II, by Jollie's Pass Reserve and a public road; and all enclosures used or occupied therewith shall, from and after the publication of this Proclamation in the Gazette, be a prison, known as the Hammer Springs Prison, within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Prisons Act, 1882."

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Regulations regarding the Importation of Sheep or Sheep-skins into Tasmania.—Notice No. 1178.

The following regulations of the State of Tasmania, dated 12th December, 1907, as to the importation of sheep or sheep-skins, or any portion thereof, into that State, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS.

1. REGULATIONS contained in Government Notices No. 131 of 30th April, 1898, and No. 107 of 20th February, 1903, are hereby rescinded.

of 30th April, 1898, and No. 107 of 20th February, 1903, are hereby rescinded.

2. All sheep imported into Tasmania from the States of Victoria, New South Wales, and South Australia, and the Dominion of New Zealand, may be landed at Hobart, Launceston, Devonport, Burnie, Strahan, Stanley, and Currie Harbour (King Island), and not elsewhere, except by previous permission in writing signed by the Chief Inspector, or such officer as he may appoint.

3. Amy person intending to land any sheep at Hobart, Launceston, Devonport, Burnie, Strahan, Stanley, and Currie Harbour (King Island), or elsewhere in this State under any such permission as aforesaid from any place beyond this State or any dependency thereof shall give to the Chief Inspector not less than three days' notice in writing of his intention to do so; and every such notice shall contain a statement of the number of the sheep intended to be imported, and the time when such sheep are expected to arrive at such place. And any person who imports any such sheep and neglects to give notice thereof in accordance with this regulation shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds.

4. Sheep imported from the States of Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, and the Dominion of New Zealand shall be accompanied by a declaration of health by the owner or agent, and by a certificate from the Inspector of Sheep at the port of shipment, that the sheep are free from disease and have not been infected with disease during the preceding twelve months: Provided that any sheep which have not been bred in one of the above-mentioned States or Dominion shall not be landed in Tasmania unless such sheep have undergone in the State or Dominion from whence imported the necessary dipping and quarantine required by the

have undergone in the State or Dominion from whence imported the necessary dipping and quarantine required by the regulations in force in such State or Dominion.

5. Such sheep must be imported by such vessels only as shall not have traded with any place other than the abovenamed States or Dominion within the preceding three months, and shall not have had any sheep on board from

any State, country, or place other than the above named States or Dominion during such period; and the captain of the vessel shall make a declaration to that effect.

the vessel shall make a declaration to that effect.

6. Tasmanian stud sheep reimported from the States of Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, and the Dominion of New Zealand will be admitted into Tasmania upon the breeder's certificate that they were bred in the State of Tasmania: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to stud sheep which have been exported from Tasmania in any vessel by which the importation into Tasmania is prohibited.

7. Any person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall incur a penalty not exceeding the sum of five pounds.

five pounds

8. Notwithstanding any preceding regulation, imported sheep may, on landing, be detained by the Chief Inspector, or any Inspector appointed, pending the decision of the Minister of Agriculture as to their disposal; and any person removing any such sheep or causing the same to be removed from the place of detention without the consent in writing of the Chief Inspector or Inspector appointed shall incur a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every sheep so removed.

9. In addition to the payment to the Inspector prescribed by law of the fee of one halfpenny for every imported sheep inspected by the Inspector, there shall be paid by the importer or his agent to the said Inspector, before being landed at Stanley, Burnie, Strahan, and Currie Harbour (King Island) aforesaid, the following charges for inspection of sheep viz. of sheep, viz.:—
Up to 60 sheep and not exceeding 120 sheep, 5s. per in-

spection.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 609, against 599 in November—an increase of 10. The deaths in December were 220, an increase of 12 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 125, females 95. Fifty-five of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 25 per cent. of the whole number; 40 of these were under one year of age.

There were sixty-two deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Eight men, 67, 68, 69, 75, 77, 80, 85, 89, and eleven women, 65, 67, 72, 74, 75 (two), 83 (two), 84 (two), 88, died at Auckland; eight men, 70, 71, 72, 73 (two), 76, 79, 97, and four women, 69, 70, 73, 88, at Wellington; seven men, 66, 67 (two), 72, 74, 82, 86, and three women, 77, 79, 86, at Christchurch; and twolve men, 68, 69, 71 (two), 73, 74, 77 (two), 78, 80, 82, 88, and nine women, 67, 68, 73, 75, 76 (two), 80, 83, 86, at Dunedin.

In the first table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Dunedin, but raises it at Auckland, Wellington, and Christohurch.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths in this class at the four centres with suburbs in December were 22. Influenza was fatal at Wellington (1 death) and Dunedin (5 deaths). Whooping-cough caused 4 deaths at Auckland, 1 at Wellington, and 1 at Christchurch. Diarrheeal diseases caused 5 deaths at Auckland, and 1 at Wellington. The above, with 2 deaths from measles, 1 from diphtheria, and 1 from puerperal septicæmia, complete the total.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality for December at the four chief towns was heavy (53 deaths). Phthisis and other tubercular diseases caused 33 deaths, and cancer 15.

Local Diseases.—There were 20 deaths from diseases of the nervous system, 1 of organs of special sense, 26 of the circulatory system, 17 of the respiratory, 24 of the digestive, 9 of the urinary, 5 of the reproductive, 1 of the locomotive, and 1 of the integumentary systems.

Violent Deaths.—These were 5, all accidental. One death resulted from fall over cliff, 2 from wounds, 1 from heat-stroke, and 1 from accident at birth.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of the tour centres from six principal specific febrile or symosic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
