MY LORD.—With reference to my Predecessor's despatch, "General," of the 12th of December, 1902, respecting the grant of pensions to widows and children of soldiers of overseas Colonial Contingents whose deaths occurred through serving in the war in South Africa, I have the honour to state for the information of your Government that the limit of time within which the death from War Service of an Officer, Warrant Officer, or Soldier must occur in order that his family may be eligible for pension, &c., from Army Funds has been extended from two to seven years from the date of removal from duty for wounds, injuries, or disease.

I enclose five copies of the Special Army Order of 9th October, 1907, in which the Royal Warrant providing for this extension was issued, and I have to point out that, in connection with the investigation of any fresh claims to pension which may arise under the amended rule, it is of importance that there should be a continuous history of disease clearly connecting the man's death with his War Service. The Army Council ask that the evidence on which any further pensions may be granted may be forwarded for their information when the award of pension is submitted for confirmation.

Learmouth, H.B.M. surveying-vessel "Egeria," of the existence of a shoal about 50 yards in extent, with little water over it and on which the sea was breaking continuously, in the approach to Brown Passage, Chatham Sound, on the following bearings:—

Butterworth Rocks (10 ft.), S. 12° 45' W. true (S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. e'ly mag.).

**VANCOUVER ISLAND.—WEST COAST.—HESQUIAT HARBOUR ENTRANCE.—SHOAL.**—The Canadian Government has given notice that a shoal 400 yards long and 100 yards broad, thickly covered with kelp, on which a depth of 5 fathoms was obtained, exists off the entrance to Hesquiat Harbour, west coast of Vancouver Island.

The shoal extends in an east by south and west by north magnetic direction, and lies 1.7 miles S.  $22^{\circ} 40'$  W. true (S.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. e'y mag.) from the fairway whistling buoy.

Depths of less than 5 fathoms may possibly exist on this shoal, as the sea is reported to break over it in heavy weather.

**QUEEN CHARLOTTE ISLANDS.—FREDERICK ISLAND.—ANCHORAGE.**—Captain F. Learmouth, R.N., H.B.M.S. "Egeria," furnishes the following information concerning anchorage inside Frederick Island, Queen Charlotte Islands, British Columbia:—

The channel between Frederick Island and Graham Island is about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile wide between the reefs, which nearly unite, and is only suitable for the smallest vessels with local knowledge at high water. No directions for this channel can be given.

A temporary anchorage may be found midway between Frederick Island and the shore of Graham Island,  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile inside the northern entrance, in depths of 7 to 8 fathoms, sandy bottom. In entering, vessels should round the Frederick Island shore at a distance of  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile, keeping the detached rocks (dry at high water) off the north-eastern point of Frederick Island, from which shoal water makes off, at a distance of  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile.

The anchorage is protected from all but northerly and westerly winds. When the wind blows from these directions a heavy swell sets in, and vessels should leave the anchorage at once.

The "Egeria," while lying at this anchorage sheltered from a moderate south-east gale, had to leave hurriedly on account of the sudden setting-in of a heavy westerly swell. While regaining the open sea heavy breakers were observed on offlying shoals 2 to 3 miles from the shore, over which depths of not less than 12 fathoms are known to exist.

THE following regulations, received from His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, respecting examinations for the Civil Service for Clerkships (Class I) in the Home Civil Service, are published for general information.

MEMORANDUM.

Notice with regard to any Open Competitive Examinations for the Civil Service of India, Clerkships (Class I) in the Home Civil Service, or Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service that may be held in the year 1908, and also for any other Competition that may be held in combination therewith.

1. In view of the importance of legible handwriting in the public service, Candidates are warned that the provision as to deductions for bad handwriting in these competitions will be strictly enforced.

2. Candidates are warned that full marks cannot be obtained on any paper unless the whole of it is answered, or, in cases where the number of questions to be answered is specified, unless the full number specified is answered.

3. MODERN LANGUAGES.—Paper I will consist of translation from and into the language. In Paper II (Language and Literature) Candidates will be invited to answer in the foreign language some of the questions, and marks will be allotted for accuracy, facility, and elegance in the composition of these answers. Separate papers in original composition will, if necessary, be set to Foreign Office candidates. Passages for translation may be set, and questions asked, demanding a knowledge of the respective languages in their early stages; but it will not be obligatory upon candidates to master in detail the old forms in use, as regards French, German, or Spanish, before 1500, or, as regards Italian, before the time of Dante.

4. GENERAL MODERN HISTORY.—Candidates are warned that high marks will not be awarded in this subject unless the text of the prescribed books has been carefully studied by them. Candidates must be prepared to answer questions on historical geography, and to draw sketch-maps.

5. ENGLISH HISTORY.—The number of marks assigned to the question or questions dealing with the text of the prescribed books will be, both in Period I and in Period II, about one-sixth of that assigned to the whole subject. Can-

didates must be prepared to answer questions on historical geography, and to draw sketch-maps.

6. GREEK AND ROMAN HISTORY.—Candidates must be prepared to answer questions on historical geography, and to draw sketch-maps.

7. POLITICAL ECONOMY.—Candidates should pay attention to the study of statistical methods.

8. NATURAL SCIENCES.—Candidates are warned that the practical Examinations carry a large proportion of the marks.

MEMORANDUM.

It has been decided, in regard to open competitive examinations for Clerkships, Class I, in the Home Civil Service, that, after next year, Geography, treated scientifically, shall be added to the list of subjects included under the head Natural Science, of which four may be taken up. It is proposed to make a similar addition to the list of subjects for open competitive examinations held after 1908 for the Civil Service of India and for Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Services.

The construction and use of the more familiar map-projections. A general knowledge of the methods of exploratory surveying.

The characteristics and cartographical analysis of the physical regions of the world. The configuration of the continents and of the bed of the ocean. The distribution of plant and animal associations.

The classification and distribution of the races of mankind. Past and present lines of communication. The influence of geographical environment (physical features and other natural conditions) upon the habits, arts, industries, social organization, and, generally, the political and economical development of the more important existing peoples.

CHINESE.—Chinese are included in the population given above. The number in New Zealand on 31st December, 1907, was estimated to be 2,724, of whom 59 were females.

REMARKS.—Excluding Maoris, the population increased by 20,763, or at the rate of 2.28 per cent., during the year. To this increase, excess of births over deaths contributed 15,033, and excess of arrivals over departures 5,730.

The birth-rate for the Dominion in 1907 was 27.31 per 1,000 of mean population, and the death-rate 10.95, as against 27.08 and 9.31 respectively in 1906.

The deaths in 1907 (10,067) were greater than the number registered in 1906 (8,339) by 1,728, and the rate per 1,000 rose from 9.31 to 10.95.

The number of marriages (excluding those contracted between Maoris) solemnised in 1907 is estimated at 8,170, giving a rate of 8.89 per 1,000 of the mean population, against 7.592 and 8.48, the actual number and rate in 1906.

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £4,500, authorised to be raised by the Eastbourne Borough Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for borough-site, £225; main road, £1,000; main foot-path, £400; private streets, £1,200; Orua Road extension, £300; Fabian Street improvement, £75; storm-water culverts, £550; rights-of-way, £100; recreation reserve improvement, £250; forest reserve, £170 16s. 10d.; sundries (expenses), £229 3s. 2d., the said Eastbourne Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of 3d. in the pound upon the unimproved value of all rateable property of the Eastbourne Borough, comprising Sections 35, 36, 37, and 39, Block XVI, Belmont Survey District; Sections 38, 40, 41, 42, 44, 45, and 46, Block I, Pencarrow Survey District; and Section 43, Block IV, Pencarrow Survey District; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-six years, or until the loan is fully paid off."
