rose from 9.31 to 10.95. The number of marriages (excluding those contracted between Maoris) solemnised in 1907 is estimated at 8,170, giving a rate of 8.89 per 1,000 of the mean population, against 7,592 and 8.48, the actual number and rate in 1906.
