

A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS under the provisions in that behalf of section one bundred and eighty-eight of "The Public Works Act, 1905," the middle line of a portion of the branch line from Waikaka Station on the Dunedin-Inver-cargill main line of railway to Waikaka Township was defined by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty seventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven : And whereas it has been found necessary in the construction of such railway to alter such line in manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the aforesaid section one hundred and eighty-eight, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke so much of the Schedule to the said Proclamation as defines the middle line of the said railway beyond the point

revoke so much of the Schedule to the said Proclamation as defines the middle line of the said railway beyond the point marked 11 miles on the plan numbered P.W.D. 22778 re-ferred to therein; and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the part of the said rail-way commencing from the said point marked 11 miles aforesaid shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. hereto.

MY LORD,-With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 28, of the 12th April last, I have the honour to request you to inform your Government that the adhesion of the Dominion of New Zealand to the Treaty of Friendship, Com-merce, and Navigation between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Nicaragua, signed at Managua on the 28th July, 1905, has been duly notified to and accepted by the Nicaraguan Government.

**THE** 'following is a copy of the Treaty referred to in the above Despatch :---

TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BE-TWREN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE REPUBLIC OF NICARAGUA.

Signed at Managua, 28th July, 1905.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, 24th August, 1906.] Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Great Britain and the Republic of Nicaragua.

Great Britain and the Republic of Nicaragua. His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India; and His Excellency the President of Nicaragua; Being desirous to extend and facilitate the relations of commerce already existing between the two countries, have determined to conclude a new Treaty with this object, and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say :--His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, Herbert William Broadley Harrison, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, His Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires in the Republic of Nicaragua; and His Excellency the Pre-ident of the Republic of Nicaragua,

His Excellency the Pre-ident of the Republic of Nicaragua, Dcctor Adolfo Altamirano, Minister of Foreign Affairs; Who, after having communicated to each other their re-spective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following articles:--

#### Article I.

There shall be between the dominions and possessions of the two High Contracting Parties reciprocal freedom of com-merce and navigation. The subjects or citizens of each of the two Parties shall have liberty freely to come, with their ships and cargoes, to all places, ports, and rivers in the do-minions and possessions of the other to which native subjects or citizens coversily are or may be partited to come and minions and possessions of the other to which native subjects or citizens generally are or may be permitted to come, and shall enjoy, respectively, the same rights, privileges, liberties, favours, immunities, and exemptions in matters of commerce and navigation as are or may be enjoyed by native subjects or citizens generally, without having to pay any tax or impost greater than those paid by the same, and they shall be subject to the Laws and Regulations in force.

This stipulation shall not, however, apply to the coasting trade, in respect of which the subjects or citizens of the two Parties shall enjoy the treatment of the most favoured nation.

#### Article II.

The free port privileges at the Port of San Juan del Norte shall be abolished, but the port shall remain open to trade,

shall be abounded, but the port shall remain open to trade, the facilities for shipping shall be maintained and improved, and sufficient bonded warehouses shall be provided. As regards all the dues, taxes, and regulations affecting foreign trade and shipping and the system of municipal taxation, the port shall be on the same footing as the other ports of the Republic.

#### Article III.

No other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed on the importation into the dominions and possessions of His Britannic Majesty of any article the produce or manufacture of the Republic of Nicaragua, from whatever place arriving,

and no other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed on the importation into Nicaragua of any article the produce or manufacture of His Britannic Maj sty's dominions and possessions, from whatever place arriving, than on the like articles produced or manufactured in any other foreign country; nor shall any prohibition or restriction be main-tained or imposed on the importation of any article the produce or manufacture of the dominions or possessions of either of the High Contracting Parties into the dominions and possessions of the other, from whatever place arriving, which shall not equally extend to the importation of the like articles being the produce or manufacture of any other foreign country. and no other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed on country.

This last provision is not applicable to the sanitary and other prohibitions occasioned by the necessity of securing the salety of persons or of cattle, or of plants useful to agriculture.

#### Article IV.

No other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed in the dominions and possessions of either of the High Con-tracting Parties on the exportation of any article to the dominions and possessions of the other than such as are or may be payable on the exportation of the like article to any other foreign country; nor shall any prohibition be imposed on the exportation of any article from the dominions and possessions of either of the two High Contracting Parties to the dominions and possessions of the other which shall not equally extend to the exportation of the like article to any other foreign country. other foreign country.

#### Article V.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties shall enjoy, in the dominions and possessions of the other, perfect equality of treatment with native subjects or citizens, or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation, in all that relates to exemption from transit duties, ware-housing, bounties, facilities, and drawbacks.

#### Article VI.

All articles which are or may be legally imported into the All articles which are or may be legally imported into the ports of the dominions and possessions of His Britannic Majesty in British vessels may be imported into those ports in Nicaraguan vessels without being liable to any other or higher duties or charges of whatever denomination than if such articles were imported in British vessels; and, similarly, all articles which are or may be legally imported into the ports of Nicaragua in Nicaraguan vessels may be imported into those ports in British vessels of whatever denomination that is other or higher duties or charges of whatever denomination the ports of set of the ports of british vessels may be imported into those ports in British vessels of whatever denomination the ports of british vessels of the ports of british vessels of the ports of british vessels without being liable to are other or higher duties or charges of whatever denomination than if such articles were imported in Nicaraguan vessels. Such equality of treatment shall take effect without distingtion, whether such articles come directly from the place of origin or from any other place.

origin or from any other place. In the same manner, there shall be perfect equality of treatment in regard to exportation, so that the same export duties and railway charges shall be paid, and the same bounties and drawbacks allowed, in the dominions and possessions of either of the High Contracting Parties on any article intended for exportation which is or may be legally exported therefrom, whether such exportation shall take place in Nicaraguan or in British vessels, and whatever may be the place of destination, whether a port of either of the be the place of destination, whether a port of either of the High Contracting Parties or of any third Power.

#### Article VII.

No duties of tonnage, harbour, pilotage, lighthouse, quaran-tine, or other similar or corresponding duties of whatever nature, or under whatever denomination, levied in the name or for the profit of government, public functionaries, private individuals, corporations, or establishments of any kind shall be imposed in the ports of the dominions and possessions of either country upon the vessels of the other country which shall not equally and under the same conditions be imposed in the like cases on national vessels in general. Such equality of treatment shall apply to the respective vessels, from what-ever port or place they may arrive, and whatever may be their place of destination.

#### Article VIII.

In all that regards the stationing, loading, and unloading of vessels in the ports, basins, docks, roadsteads, harbours, or rivers of the dominions and possessions of the two coun-tries, no privilege shall be granted to national vessels which shall not be equally granted to vessels of the other country, the intention of the High Contracting Parties being that in this respect also the respective vessels shall be treated on the footing of perfect equality.

#### Article IX.

Any ship-of-war or merchant-vessel of either of the High Contracting Parties which may be compelled by stress of weather, or by accident, to take shelter in a port of the

other shall be at liberty to refit therein, to procure all neces-sary stores, and to put to sea again without paving any dues other than such as would be pavable in a similar case by a vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his merchandise in order to defray his expenses, he shall be bound to conform to the Regulations and Tariffs of the place to which he may have come.

If any ship of-war or merchant-vessel of one of the High Contracting Parties should run aground or be wrecked upon the coasts of the other, such slip or vessel, and all parts thereof, and all furniture and appurtenances belonging therethereof, and all furniture and appurtenances belonging there-unto, and all goods and merobandise saved therefrom, in-oluding any which may have been cast into the sea, or the proceeds thereof if sold, as well as all papers found on board such stranded or wrecked ship or vessel, shall be given up to the owners or their agents when claimed by them. If there are no such owners or agents on the spot, then the same shall be delivered to the British or Nicaraguan Consular officer in whose district the wreck or stranding may have taken place, upon being claimed by him within the period fixed by the laws of the country; and such Consular officers, owners, or agents shall pay only the expenses incurred in the preservation of the property, together with the salvage or other expenses which would have been payable in the like case of a wreck of a national vessel.

The goods and merchandise saved from the wreck shall be exempt from all duties of customs, unless cleared for con-sumption, in which case they shall pay the same rate of duty

sumption, in which case they shall pay the same rate of duty as if they had been imported in a national vessel. In the case either of a vessel being driven in by stress of weather, run aground, or wrecked, the respective Consular officers shall, if the owner or master or other agent of the owner is not present, or is present and requires it, be au-thorised to interpose in order to afford the necessary assist-ance to their fellow-countrymen.

#### ARTICLE X.

All vessels which, according to British law, are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which, according to Nicaraguan law, are to be deemed Nicaraguan vessels, shall, for the purposes of this Treaty, be deemed British and Nicaraguan vessels respectively.

#### ARTICLE XI.

The High Contracting Parties agree that, in all matters relating to commerce, navigation, and industry, any privi-lege, favour, or immunity whatever which either High Con-tracting Party has actually granted or may hereafter grant to any other foreign State shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the subjects or citizens of the other Contracting Party, it being their intention that the com-merce, navigation, and industry of each country shall be placed in all respects by the other on the footing of the most favoured nation.

#### ARTICLE XII.

It shall be free to each of the High Contracting Parties to appoint Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Con-sular Agents to reside in the towns and ports of the domi-nions and possessions of the other. Such Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents, however. shall not enter upon their functions until after they shall have not enter upon their functions until after they shall have been approved and admitted in the usual form by the Go-vernment to which they are sent. They shall enjoy all the faculties, privileges, exemptions, and immunities of every kind which are or shall be granted to Consuls of the most favoured nation.

#### ARTICLE XIII.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties who shall conform to the laws of the country-

Parties who shall conform to the laws of the country—

 Shall have full liberty, with their families, to enter, travel, or reside in any part of the dominions and possessions of the other High Contracting Party.
 They shall be permitted to hire or possess the houses, manufactories, warehouses, shops, and premises which may be necessary for them.

be necessary for them. S. They may carry on their commerce either in person or by any agents whom they may think fit to employ. 4. They shall not be subject in respect of their persons or property, or in respect of passports, or in respect of their com-merce or industry, to any taxes, whether general or local, or to imposts or obligations, of any kind whatever other or greater than those which are or may be imposed upon native subjects or citizens, or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation.

#### Article XIV.

be exempted from all compulsory military service whatever, whether in the army, nave, national guard, or militia. They shall be equally exempted from all judicial and municipal shall be equally exempted from all judicial and municipal functions whatever other than those imposed by the laws relating to juries, as well as from all extraordinary war con-tributions, forced loans, and every species of military requisi-tions or service. In all other cases their personal and real property cannot be subjected to other charges or imposts than those that may be or have been exacted from the sub-jects or citizens of the country or from subjects or citizens of the most favoured patient. the most favoured nations.

#### Article XV.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall be at full liberty to exercise civil rights, and therefore to be at full hereby to exercise civit rights, and therefore to acquire, possess, and dispose of every description of property, movable and immovable. They may acquire and transmit the same to others, whether by purchase, sale, donation, ex-change, marriage, testament, succession ab intestato, and in change, marriage, testament, succession do virestato, and in any other manner, under the same conditions as national subjects or citizens. Their heirs may succeed to and take possession of it, either in person or by procurators, in the same legal forms and in the same manner as subjects or

same legal forms and in the same manner as subjects or citizens of the country. In none of these respects shall they pay upon the value of such property any other or higher impost, duty, or charge than is or shall be payable by subjects or citizens of the country. In every case the subjects or citizens of the High Contracting Parties shall be permitted to export their pro-perty, or the proceeds thereof if sold, freely and without being subjected on such exportation to pay any duty different from that to which subjects or citizens of the country are or shall be liable under similar dirumstances. shall be liable under similar circumstances.

#### Article XVI.

The dwellings, manufactories, warehouses, and shops of the subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other, and all premises appertaining thereto destined for purposes of residence or commerce, shall be respected. It shall not be allowable to make a search of, or a domi-olliour night to each dwellings and premises or to examine

ciliary visit to, such dwellings and premises, or to examine or inspect books, papers, or accounts, except under the con-ditions and with the forms prescribed by the laws for sub-jects or citizens of the country, or of the most favoured nation.

The subjects or citizens of each of the two High Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall have free access to the Courts of Justice for the prose-cution and defence of their right, without other conditions, restrictions, or taxes beyond those imposed on native sub-jects or citizens; they shall enjoy the same treatment as native subjects or citizens in all that concerns deposits, sureties, and fees in legal cases, and shall, in the same manuer as native subjects or citizens, be at liberty to employ, in all causes, their advocates, attorneys, or agents from among the persons admitted to the exercise of those pro-fessions according to the laws of the country.

#### Article XVII.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties shall have in the dominions and possessions of the other the same rights as native subjects or citizens in regard to patents for inventions, trade-marks, and designs, upon fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law.

#### Article XVIII.

All goods bearing marks or descriptions which state, or manifestly suggest, that the goods are the produce or manumanifestly suggest, that the goods are the produce or manu-facture of one of the Contracting States shall, if such state-ment or suggestion be false, be seized on importation into either of the two States. The seizura may also be effected in the State where the false indication of origin has been applied, or in that into which the goods bearing the false indication may have been imported. The seizure shall be effected either at the request of the proper Government, Department or of an interesting party, whether an individual or a society, in conformity with the domestic legislation of each State, but the authorities are not bound to effect the seizure of goods in tran-it.

seizure of goods in tran-it. The Tribunals of each country shall decide what appella-tions, on account of their generic character, do not fall within the provisions of the present Article.

#### Article XIX.

The Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents of each of the High Contracting Parties residing in The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Agents of each of the High Contracting Parties residing in Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall the dominions and possessions of the other shall receive

from the local authorities such assistance as can by law be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries.

#### Article XX.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall not be appli-cable to any of His Britannic Majesty's Colonies or possessions beyond the seas unless notice to that effect shall have been given, on behalf of any such Colony or possession, by His Britannic Majesty's Representative in the Republic of Nicaragua to the Nicaraguan Minister for Foreign Affairs within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifi-cations of the present Treaty. It is understood that, under the provisions of this Article, His Majesty's Government can. in the same manner, give

His Majesty's Government can, in the same manner, give notice of adhesion on behalf of any British Protectorate or sphere of influence, or on behalf of the Island of Cyprus, in virtue of the Convention of the fourth of June, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, between Great Britain and Turkey.

#### Article XXI.

The present Treaty shall come into effect ten days after the day upon which the ratifications are exchanged, and shall remain in force for ten years after such exchange. In shall remain in force for ten years after such exchange. In case neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to the other twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years of the intention to terminate the present Treaty, it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the High Con-tracting Parties shall have given such notice. His Britannic Majesty's Government shall also have the right to terminate separately the present Treaty at any time on giving twelve months' notice to that effect, on behalf of any British Colony, possession, or dependency, as specified in Article XX, which may have acceded thereto.

#### Article XXII.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London, within the period of one year

from the date of signature. Done in duplicate at Managua, this 28th day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five. In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty, and have affixed thereto their seals.

It is declared that the stipulations in Article II of the said Treaty, with respect to the Port of San Juan del Norte, are permanent.

### TTT

The Nicaraguan Government will give Customhouse Bonds to the merchants at the Port of San Juan del Norte for a sum equal to that which they have paid as commercial tax during the last ten years. The merchants will pay for a sum equal to that which they have paid as commercial tax during the last ten years. The merchants will pay Customhouse duties with these Bonds until the said Bonds are extinguished. The value of the Bonds assigned to each merchant will be the sum he has paid as commercial tax during the last ten years, and it is understood that to those who have been tax paying merchants during a shorter time will be assigned the sum corresponding to that time.

It is understood that nothing contained in the Treaty signed this day shall be held to prevent the Government of either country from taking such steps as they may judge expedient, either by way of countervailing duties or other-wise, to neutralise the effect of bounties granted, either directly or indirectly, on the production or exportation of goods goods.

6. Candidates may graduate in any of the subjects, or groups of subjects, current at the several universities, with the exception of Theology, Medicine, Music, and Commerce.

7. A candidate who has graduated with first-class honours in an approved subject or group of subjects, or with other distinctions recognised by the Army Council as equivalent thereto, will, if nominated, be entitled to count one year of seniority on obtaining his commission.

8. First-class honours are defined as follows :-

- (a.) For the University of Oxford, a first class in any final school.
- (b.) For the University of Cambridge, a first class in any
- (b.) For the University of Durham, a first class in classics or mathematics in the final examination for the degree of B.A.; or special distinction in the final examination for the degree of B.Sc.
  (c) For the University of London, a first class in any statematical distinction in the final examination for the degree of B.Sc.
- (d.) For the University of London, a first class in any subject in which degrees in honours are awarded.
  (e.) For the Victoria University of Manchester, a first class in any honours school for the B.A. or B.Sc. degrees
- degrees (f.) For the University of Birmingham, a Master's or Doctor's degree in arts or science.
- (g.) For the University of Liverpool, a first class in the final examination of any honours school in the faculties of arts or science, or in the honours

- faculties of arts or science, or in the honours school of engineering.
  (h.) For the University of Leeds, a first class in the final examination of any honours school in the faculties of arts or science.
  (i.) For the University of Wales, the degree of B.A. or B.Sc. with first-class honours in any department.
  (j.) For the Scottish universities, a first class in any honours group, or the B.Sc. degree in pure science or in engineering, provided that the diploma of the graduate certifies that he has obtained special distinction in at least one of the subjects of his final science examination. final science examination.

  (k.) For Trinity College, Dublin, the standard of silver medal at the degree examination in honours.
  (l.) For the Royal University of Ireland, a first class in any honours group for the M.A. degree.
  (m.) For approved universities in the Colonies, as may be decided in each case by the Army Council.
  (n.) Any other distinction recognised by the Army Council as equivalent to first-class honours in any approved branch of study.

9. A candidate for a commission in the Royal Artillery must produce evidence satisfactory to the Nomination Board that he has duly qualified in the mathematical subjects set forth in Appendix II.

10. In addition to the academic qualifications specified in paragraph 5 above, a candidate for nomination must present certificates of military qualifications, practical and theoretical.

\* A candidate for nomination to the Indian Army must be within the ages of 20 and 24 on the dates named.

In this connection-

(a.) He will be required, in addition to the military instruction which will form part of the curriculum during his residence at the university, to be attached to a Regular unit for six weeks in each of two consecutive years, or twelve weeks in one year, and to obtain a satisfactory certificate as to his proficiency (Appendix III). In the case of students of Colonial universities, the attachment may be to a unit of the Permanent Forces of the Colony

In the case of students of Colonial universities, the attachment may be to a unit of the Permanent Forces of the Colony. If the candidate is an officer of the Militia or Yeomanry, two trainings with his Militia, or Hilitia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers should apply through his commanding officer for attachment to the Regular Forces. (c.) To reject a candidate as physically unfit. No relaxation of the eyesight-test can ever be allowed. Oandidates who are pronounced unfit by a Medical Board in the United Kingdom under (c) will be allowed to present themselves for re-examination by an Appeal Board which will assemble in London a few days later. Notification that a candidate will appeal must be made to the Director-General, Army Medical Service, War Office, London, S.W., within four days of the first Medical Ex-amination, accompanied by a fee of four guineas, which will be returned if the candidate is passed fit. (Cheques, &c., should be made payable to the Director-General of Army Finance, War Office.) The decision of the Appeal Board will in all cases be abso-

The decision of the Appeal Board will in all cases be absolutely final.

A candidate who is rejected by that Board can under no circumstances be medically re-examined (unless he be again nominated under paragraph 3).

#### Preliminary Medical Examination.

\* Such a candidate will be re-examined at the end of six months. If not then pronounced fit, his name will be removed from the list of nominated candidates.

(Cheques, &c., should be made payable to the Director General of Army Finance, War Office.) In the Colonies applications must be addressed the Colonial authorities accompanied by a fee to

(b) Instructions will be issued for the examination to take place at the military station nearest the candidate's residence where a Medical Board can be held.

In the Colonies the Board will be constituted by the Colonial authorities, and will be composed of military medical officers or, when this is not practicable, of civil medical practitioners of recognised professional standing. The result will be notified to candidates by the

Board.

- (c.) Candidates must pay their travelling-expenses.
  (d.) Candidates found unfit by the preliminary Medical Board are not bound to accept its finding, but may, at their own risk, continue their studies, and,
- (e.) It must be distinctly understood that passing such preliminary Medical Board is solely for the can-didate's information, and would give him no sort of the present of th of claim to be accepted as physically fit when he is nominated by the University Board. His ac-ceptance will depend entirely upon the report of the *final* Medical Board which examines nominated candidates. Candidates may be fit for nominated candidates. Candidates may be fit for the service at the preliminary examination, but may become disqualified by some subsequent physical deterioration.

PHYSICAL AND MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY.

I. A candidate for a Commission in His Majesty's Army must be in good mental and bodily health, and free from any physical defect likely to interefere with the efficient performance of military duty.

II. The attention of the Board will be directed to the fol-

(b.) Measurement of height.

The candidate will be placed against the standard with his feet together, and the weight thrown on the heels, and not on the toes or outside of the feet. He will stand erect with-out rigidity, and with the heels, calves, buttocks, and the shoulders touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vertex of the head level under the horizontal bar, and the height will be noted in parts of an inch to eighths eighths.

(c.) Measurement of chest.

(c.) Measurement of chest. The candidate will be made to stand erect with his feet together, and to raise his arms over his head. The tape will be carefully adjusted round the chest, with its posterior upper edge touching the inferior angles of the shoulder-blades, and its anterior lower edge the upper part of the nipples. The arms will then be lowered to hang loosely by the side, and care will be taken that the shoulders are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then be directed to take a deep inspira-tion several times, and the maximum expansion of the chest will be carefully noted. It is often attempted to conceal the will be carefully noted. It is often attempted to conceal the true minimum measurement, but it can be obtained by a little manipulation and by drawing off attention from the examination by a few questions.

The maximum expansion rarely exceeds the average mini-mum by more than 2 in. to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  in.

The minimum and maximum will then be recorded thus.  $\frac{33}{35}, \frac{34}{36\frac{1}{2}}, & \infty$ 

In recording the measurements, fractions of less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. should not be noted.

(d.) The candidate will also be weighed, and his weight recorded on the proceedings of the Board.

(e.) Eyesight.

The regulations regarding the examination of eyesight are as follows

as follows: — The Army Test Types and Snellen's Optotypi (1892 edition) will be used for the determination of the visual acuteness. If a candidate can read D=6 at 6 metres (20 English feet), and D=0.6 at any distance selected by himself, with each eye without glasses, he will be considered FIT. If a candidate can only read D=24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each even without glasses, is viewed defined.

It a candidate can only read D = 24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, his visual deficiency being due to faulty refraction which can be corrected by glasses which enable him to read D=6 at 6 metres (20 Eng-lish feet) with one eye, and D=12 at the same distance with the other eye, and can also read D=0.8 with each eye without glasses, at any distance selected by himself, he will be considered FIT.

If a candidate can read D=6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with one eye, a higher defect than D=24 will be accepted in the other; and if he can read D=36 with the defective eye at the required distance, the defect being due to error in refraction which can be remedied by glasses so that he can read at least D=12, he will be considered FIT.

If a candidate cannot read D=24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, notwithstanding he can read D=0.6, he will be considered UNFIT. The candidate must be able to read the tests without hesitation in ordirary daylight, and the eyes must be wide

open.

Squint, or any other morbid condition, subject to the risk of aggravation or recurrence, in either eye, will cause the rejection of a candidate.

Inability to distinguish the principal colours will not be regarded as a cause for rejection, but the fact will be noted in the report, and the candidate will be informed. The degree of acuteness of vision of all candidates for commissions (including preliminary examinations) will be entered in their reports in the following manner :---

#### APPENDIX II.

A university candidate for a commission in the Royal Artillery must produce satisfactory evidence that he has duly qualified in the following subjects :---

#### (A.) Elementary Mathematics.

Arithmetic .- The ordinary rules, with applications more especially to the mensuration of plane figures and solids. The metric system and the use of decimals in approximative calculation, with contracted methods, will be specially in-

sisted upon. Neither the extraction of the cube root nor the use and

theory of recurring decimals is required. Neatness and accuracy of working are expected; and the methods of solution employed must be clearly indicated. There will be no objection to the intelligent use of algebraic formula and armited.

There will be no objection to the intelligent use of algebraic formulæ and symbols. Geometry.—The elements of geometrical drawing and practical geometry. The substance of Euclid, Books I, II, III, and a working

knowledge of as much of the properties of similar figures as is necessary for plan-making, map-drawing, and simple

Algebra. —To simple quadratic equations; the elementary use of graphs, particularly in connection with linear and quadratic functions.

The papers will be set to test knowledge of fundamental principles and readiness in application to simple practical problems. The solutions of equations must be worked out to a few significant figures; and candidates must be accus-tomed to test the accuracy of solutions by substitution. Skill in elaborate analysis, such as the simplification of com-plicated fractions, will not be looked for.

#### PRACTICAL MEASUREMENTS.

Measurement of length-verniers, calipers, micrometer, screw-gauge, spherometer.

Measurement of angles—use of protractor, &c. Measurement of areas—by dimensions, by squared paper, by weighing; area of cross-sections of a tube, calibration of a tube.

Measurement of volume-by dimensions, by graduated jar or hurette

Measurement of weight-use of balance. Principle of Archimedes-volume by weighing.

Specific gravity.

The examination will deal with the first three paragraphs in the above schedule, with a possibility of questions for written answers on the other four.

#### (B.) Mathematics I.

Arithmetic.—As in elementary mathematics, with more difficult questions and exercises involving the use of four-figure logarithms. Use of the slide rule.

Geometry.-Geometrical drawing and practical geometry of plane figures, including the use of Marquois and other scales.

The substance of Euclid, Books I to VI.\* The special treatment of incommensurables will not be required. Proportion may be treated algebraically and the compli-cations of Euclid's definitions and nomenclature avoided.

Algebra.—As in elementary mathematics, together with indices and the simpler properties of surds; graphs of the simpler algebraic functions; quadratic equations; use of graphs in solving equations, and in illustrating and solving practical questions; rate of variation of a function and gradient of a graph; graphic interpolation.

Grasp of elementary principles and readiness in practical appli-cation will be looked for, but great skill in analytical transforma-tions will not be demanded.

\* Schedules A and B of geometry issued by the University of Cambridge may be referred to as indicating the scope required.

### THE NEW ZEALAND GAZETTE.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including solution of plane triangles; graphs of trigonometrical functions; use of four-figure tables.

Readiness in straightforward practical applications, but no great analytical skill will be demanded.

Dynamics.—Graphical proofs of formulæ for uniformly accelerated motion—impact, work, energy, circular motion.

Statics.—Composition and resolution of forces; parallel forces; centre of gravity; three-force problems; friction; mechanical powers—e.g., lever, wedge, pulleys, &c.

#### PRACTICAL WORK.

Experimental verification of the above theoretical work, such as the measurement of velocity, impact, work, energy, &c. Exercises in drawing useful graphical demonstrations. Construction of the mechanical powers.
