Altering the Middle Line of the Branch Line from Waikaka Station on the Dunedin-Invercargill Main Line of Railway to Waikaka Township.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions in that behalf of section one hundred and eighty-eight of "The Public Works Act, 1905," the middle line of a portion of the branch line from Waikaka Station on the Dunedin-Invercargill main line of railway to Waikaka Township was defined by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven: And whereas it has been found necessary in the construction of such railway to alter such line in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the aforesaid section one hundred and eighty-eight, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke so much of the Schedule to the said Proclamation as defines the middle line of the said railway beyond the point marked 11 miles on the plan numbered P.W.D. 22778 referred to therein; and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the part of the said railway commencing from the said point marked 11 miles aforesaid shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

GORE-WAIKAKA BRANCH RAILWAY.

LOCALITY AND DESCRIPTION.

The above sections are situated near the junction of the Rai, Ronga, and Opouri Valleys, and are distant about twenty-three miles from Havelock—about twenty miles by good metalled road, and three miles unformed road. The Nelson-Blenheim mail-coach passes on the opposite side of the Rai River daily. Fairly good soil; mixed flat and hill country, originally under bush; milling-timber has been cut out and removed. Despatch.—Adhesion by New Zealand to Treaty between Great Britain and the Republic of Nicaragua notified and accepted.

MY LORD,—With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 28, of the 12th April last, I have the honour to request you to inform your Government that the adhesion of the Dominion of New Zealand to the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Nicaragua, signed at Managua on the 28th July, 1905, has been duly notified to and accepted by the Nicaraguan Government.

THE following is a copy of the Treaty referred to in the above Despatch:—

TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE REPUBLIC OF NICARAGUA.

Signed at Managua, 28th July, 1905.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, 24th August, 1906.]

Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Great Britain and the Republic of Nicaragua.

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India; and

His Excellency the President of Nicaragua;

Being desirous to extend and facilitate the relations of commerce already existing between the two countries, have determined to conclude a new Treaty with this object, and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, Herbert William Broadley Harrison, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, His Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires in the Republic of Nicaragua; and

His Excellency the President of the Republic of Nicaragua, Doctor Adolfo Altamirano, Minister of Foreign Affairs;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following articles:—

Article I.

There shall be between the dominions and possessions of the two High Contracting Parties reciprocal freedom of commerce and navigation. The subjects or citizens of each of the two Parties shall have liberty freely to come, with their ships and cargoes, to all places, ports, and rivers in the dominions and possessions of the other to which native subjects or citizens generally are or may be permitted to come, and shall enjoy, respectively, the same rights, privileges, liberties, favours, immunities, and exemptions in matters of commerce and navigation as are or may be enjoyed by native subjects or citizens generally, without having to pay any tax or impost greater than those paid by the same, and they shall be subject to the Laws and Regulations in force.

This stipulation shall not, however, apply to the coasting trade, in respect of which the subjects or citizens of the two Parties shall enjoy the treatment of the most favoured nation.

Article II.

The free port privileges at the Port of San Juan del Norte shall be abolished, but the port shall remain open to trade, the facilities for shipping shall be maintained and improved, and sufficient bonded warehouses shall be provided.

As regards all the dues, taxes, and regulations affecting foreign trade and shipping and the system of municipal taxation, the port shall be on the same footing as the other ports of the Republic.

Article III.

No other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed on the importation into the dominions and possessions of His Britannic Majesty of any article the produce or manufacture of the Republic of Nicaragua, from whatever place arriving,

and no other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed on the importation into Nicaragua of any article the produce or manufacture of His Britannic Majesty's dominions and possessions, from whatever place arriving, than on the like articles produced or manufactured in any other foreign country; nor shall any prohibition or restriction be maintained or imposed on the importation of any article the produce or manufacture of the dominions or possessions of either of the High Contracting Parties into the dominions and possessions of the other, from whatever place arriving, which shall not equally extend to the importation of the like articles being the produce or manufacture of any other foreign country.

This last provision is not applicable to the sanitary and other prohibitions occasioned by the necessity of securing the safety of persons or of cattle, or of plants useful to agriculture.

Article IV.

No other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed in the dominions and possessions of either of the High Contracting Parties on the exportation of any article to the dominions and possessions of the other than such as are or may be payable on the exportation of the like article to any other foreign country; nor shall any prohibition be imposed on the exportation of any article from the dominions and possessions of either of the two High Contracting Parties to the dominions and possessions of the other which shall not equally extend to the exportation of the like article to any other foreign country.

Article V.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties shall enjoy, in the dominions and possessions of the other, perfect equality of treatment with native subjects or citizens, or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation, in all that relates to exemption from transit duties, warehousing, bounties, facilities, and drawbacks.

Article VI.

All articles which are or may be legally imported into the ports of the dominions and possessions of His Britannic Majesty in British vessels may be imported into those ports in Nicaraguan vessels without being liable to any other or higher duties or charges of whatever denomination than if such articles were imported in British vessels; and, similarly, all articles which are or may be legally imported into the ports of Nicaragua in Nicaraguan vessels may be imported into those ports in British vessels without being liable to any other or higher duties or charges of whatever denomination than if such articles were imported in Nicaraguan vessels. Such equality of treatment shall take effect without distinction, whether such articles come directly from the place of origin or from any other place.

In the same manner, there shall be perfect equality of treatment in regard to exportation, so that the same export duties and railway charges shall be paid, and the same bounties and drawbacks allowed, in the dominions and possessions of either of the High Contracting Parties on any article intended for exportation which is or may be legally exported therefrom, whether such exportation shall take place in Nicaraguan or in British vessels, and whatever may be the place of destination, whether a port of either of the High Contracting Parties or of any third Power.

Article VII.

No duties of tonnage, harbour, pilotage, lighthouse, quarantine, or other similar or corresponding duties of whatever nature, or under whatever denomination, levied in the name or for the profit of government, public functionaries, private individuals, corporations, or establishments of any kind shall be imposed in the ports of the dominions and possessions of either country upon the vessels of the other country which shall not equally and under the same conditions be imposed in the like cases on national vessels in general. Such equality of treatment shall apply to the respective vessels, from whatever port or place they may arrive, and whatever may be their place of destination.

Article VIII.

In all that regards the stationing, loading, and unloading of vessels in the ports, basins, docks, roadsteads, harbours, or rivers of the dominions and possessions of the two countries, no privilege shall be granted to national vessels which shall not be equally granted to vessels of the other country, the intention of the High Contracting Parties being that in this respect also the respective vessels shall be treated on the footing of perfect equality.

Article IX.

Any ship-of-war or merchant-vessel of either of the High Contracting Parties which may be compelled by stress of weather, or by accident, to take shelter in a port of the

other shall be at liberty to refit therein, to procure all necessary stores, and to put to sea again without paying any dues other than such as would be payable in a similar case by a national vessel. In case, however, the master of a merchant vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his merchandise in order to defray his expenses, he shall be bound to conform to the Regulations and Tariffs of the place to which he may have come.

If any ship-of-war or merchant-vessel of one of the High Contracting Parties should run aground or be wrecked upon the coasts of the other, such ship or vessel, and all parts thereof, and all furniture and appurtenances belonging thereunto, and all goods and merchandise saved therefrom, including any which may have been cast into the sea, or the proceeds thereof if sold, as well as all papers found on board such stranded or wrecked ship or vessel, shall be given up to the owners or their agents when claimed by them. If there are no such owners or agents on the spot, then the same shall be delivered to the British or Nicaraguan Consular officer in whose district the wreck or stranding may have taken place, upon being claimed by him within the period fixed by the laws of the country; and such Consular officers, owners, or agents shall pay only the expenses incurred in the preservation of the property, together with the salvage or other expenses which would have been payable in the like case of a wreck of a national vessel.

The goods and merchandise saved from the wreck shall be exempt from all duties of customs, unless cleared for consumption, in which case they shall pay the same rate of duty as if they had been imported in a national vessel.

In the case either of a vessel being driven in by stress of weather, run aground, or wrecked, the respective Consular officers shall, if the owner or master or other agent of the owner is not present, or is present and requires it, be authorised to interpose in order to afford the necessary assistance to their fellow-countrymen.

ARTICLE X.

All vessels which, according to British law, are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which, according to Nicaraguan law, are to be deemed Nicaraguan vessels, shall, for the purposes of this Treaty, be deemed British and Nicaraguan vessels respectively.

ARTICLE XI.

The High Contracting Parties agree that, in all matters relating to commerce, navigation, and industry, any privilege, favour, or immunity whatever which either High Contracting Party has actually granted or may hereafter grant to any other foreign State shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the subjects or citizens of the other Contracting Party, it being their intention that the commerce, navigation, and industry of each country shall be placed in all respects by the other on the footing of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE XII.

It shall be free to each of the High Contracting Parties to appoint Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents to reside in the towns and ports of the dominions and possessions of the other. Such Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents, however, shall not enter upon their functions until after they shall have been approved and admitted in the usual form by the Government to which they are sent. They shall enjoy all the faculties, privileges, exemptions, and immunities of every kind which are or shall be granted to Consuls of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE XIII.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties who shall conform to the laws of the country—

1. Shall have full liberty, with their families, to enter, travel, or reside in any part of the dominions and possessions of the other High Contracting Party.

2. They shall be permitted to hire or possess the houses, manufactories, warehouses, shops, and premises which may be necessary for them.

3. They may carry on their commerce either in person or by any agents whom they may think fit to employ.

4. They shall not be subject in respect of their persons or property, or in respect of passports, or in respect of their commerce or industry, to any taxes, whether general or local, or to imposts or obligations, of any kind whatever other or greater than those which are or may be imposed upon native subjects or citizens, or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation.

Article XIV.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall

be exempted from all compulsory military service whatever, whether in the army, navy, national guard, or militia. They shall be equally exempted from all judicial and municipal functions whatever other than those imposed by the laws relating to juries, as well as from all extraordinary war contributions, forced loans, and every species of military requisitions or service. In all other cases their personal and real property cannot be subjected to other charges or imposts than those that may be or have been exacted from the subjects or citizens of the country or from subjects or citizens of the most favoured nations.

Article XV.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall be at full liberty to exercise civil rights, and therefore to acquire, possess, and dispose of every description of property, movable and immovable. They may acquire and transmit the same to others, whether by purchase, sale, donation, exchange, marriage, testament, succession *ab intestato*, and in any other manner, under the same conditions as national subjects or citizens. Their heirs may succeed to and take possession of it, either in person or by procurators, in the same legal forms and in the same manner as subjects or citizens of the country.

In none of these respects shall they pay upon the value of such property any other or higher impost, duty, or charge than is or shall be payable by subjects or citizens of the country. In every case the subjects or citizens of the High Contracting Parties shall be permitted to export their property, or the proceeds thereof if sold, freely and without being subjected on such exportation to pay any duty different from that to which subjects or citizens of the country are or shall be liable under similar circumstances.

Article XVI.

The dwellings, manufactories, warehouses, and shops of the subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other, and all premises appertaining thereto destined for purposes of residence or commerce, shall be respected.

It shall not be allowable to make a search of, or a domiciliary visit to, such dwellings and premises, or to examine or inspect books, papers, or accounts, except under the conditions and with the forms prescribed by the laws for subjects or citizens of the country, or of the most favoured nation.

The subjects or citizens of each of the two High Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall have free access to the Courts of Justice for the prosecution and defence of their rights, without other conditions, restrictions, or taxes beyond those imposed on native subjects or citizens; they shall enjoy the same treatment as native subjects or citizens in all that concerns deposits, sureties, and fees in legal cases, and shall, in the same manner as native subjects or citizens, be at liberty to employ, in all causes, their advocates, attorneys, or agents from among the persons admitted to the exercise of those professions according to the laws of the country.

Article XVII.

The subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties shall have in the dominions and possessions of the other the same rights as native subjects or citizens in regard to patents for inventions, trade-marks, and designs, upon fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law.

Article XVIII.

All goods bearing marks or descriptions which state, or manifestly suggest, that the goods are the produce or manufacture of one of the Contracting States shall, if such statement or suggestion be false, be seized on importation into either of the two States. The seizure may also be effected in the State where the false indication of origin has been applied, or in that into which the goods bearing the false indication may have been imported. The seizure shall be effected either at the request of the proper Government, Department or of an interesting party, whether an individual or a society, in conformity with the domestic legislation of each State, but the authorities are not bound to effect the seizure of goods in transit.

The Tribunals of each country shall decide what appellations, on account of their generic character, do not fall within the provisions of the present Article.

Article XIX.

The Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents of each of the High Contracting Parties residing in the dominions and possessions of the other shall receive

from the local authorities such assistance as can by law be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries.

Article XX.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall not be applicable to any of His Britannic Majesty's Colonies or possessions beyond the seas unless notice to that effect shall have been given, on behalf of any such Colony or possession, by His Britannic Majesty's Representative in the Republic of Nicaragua to the Nicaraguan Minister for Foreign Affairs within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Treaty.

It is understood that, under the provisions of this Article, His Majesty's Government can, in the same manner, give notice of adhesion on behalf of any British Protectorate or sphere of influence, or on behalf of the Island of Cyprus, in virtue of the Convention of the fourth of June, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, between Great Britain and Turkey.

Article XXI.

The present Treaty shall come into effect ten days after the day upon which the ratifications are exchanged, and shall remain in force for ten years after such exchange. In case neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to the other twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years of the intention to terminate the present Treaty, it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.

His Britannic Majesty's Government shall also have the right to terminate separately the present Treaty at any time on giving twelve months' notice to that effect, on behalf of any British Colony, possession, or dependency, as specified in Article XX, which may have acceded thereto.

Article XXII.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London, within the period of one year from the date of signature.

Done in duplicate at Managua, this 28th day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty, and have affixed thereto their seals.

PROTOCOL.

The Undersigned, Plenipotentiaries of the High Contracting Parties of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation signed between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Republic of Nicaragua this day, have agreed as follows:—

I.

It is declared that in all cases in which the provisions of the said Treaty grant treatment of the most favoured nation the term shall not be held to include the Central American Republics.

II.

It is declared that the stipulations in Article II of the said Treaty, with respect to the Port of San Juan del Norte, are permanent.

III.

The Nicaraguan Government will give Customhouse Bonds to the merchants at the Port of San Juan del Norte for a sum equal to that which they have paid as commercial tax during the last ten years. The merchants will pay Customhouse duties with these Bonds until the said Bonds are extinguished. The value of the Bonds assigned to each merchant will be the sum he has paid as commercial tax during the last ten years, and it is understood that to those who have been tax-paying merchants during a shorter time will be assigned the sum corresponding to that time.

IV.

It is understood that nothing contained in the Treaty signed this day shall be held to prevent the Government of either country from taking such steps as they may judge expedient, either by way of countervailing duties or otherwise, to neutralise the effect of bounties granted, either directly or indirectly, on the production or exportation of goods.

Regulations under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by University Candidates.

THE following revised Regulations (issued with Army Orders of 1st August, 1907), under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by University candidates are published for general information.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY MAY BE OBTAINED BY UNIVERSITY CANDIDATES, 1907.

[N.B.—Officers appointed to Commissions in the Army may, in case of voluntary retirement from the Army, be called upon, as a condition of receiving the full rates of retired pay, to serve for a time in the Militia.]

1. Commissions in the Cavalry, the Royal Artillery, the Infantry, Indian Army, and the Army Service Corps will be granted each half-year on the nomination of recognised universities, or of groups of recognised universities, as indicated hereafter, to those candidates who have fulfilled certain conditions of academic and military qualification.

2. Subject to such additions or alterations as the Army Council may from time to time determine, the following is the list of recognised universities, arranged as units for purposes of nomination:—

- (a.) The University of Oxford.
- (b.) " " Cambridge.
- (c.) " " Dublin.
- (d.) " " London.
- (e.) The Universities of Scotland.
- (f.) (1.) The Victoria University of Manchester.
- The University of Liverpool.
- Leeds.
- Durnham.
- Birmingham.
- Wales.
- The Royal University of Ireland.
- (g.) Such chartered universities in the Colonies as have established courses of military instruction approved by the Army Council.

For the number and distribution of commissions between the nominating units or groups, see paragraph 12.

3. Each university, or group of universities, in the United Kingdom will appoint a nomination Board, to which the

* Candidates selected for the Indian Army will, in the first place, be gazetted as 2nd Lieutenants in the Unattached List of the British Army under the conditions set forth in the pamphlet "Information regarding Appointment, Promotion, Pay, &c., in His Majesty's Indian Army."

War Office will add one or more military members, who will have a veto on any selection.

The approved universities in the Colonies will, until groups have been formed, each appoint a Board.

[The names of fully qualified candidates who have been nominated by the Nomination Board will be rendered to the War Office by the 15th January and 15th July each year.]

4. A candidate for nomination—

- (a.) Must be between the ages of 20 and 25* on the 1st of April, or on the 1st of October, immediately preceding the half-yearly nomination for which he presents himself.
- (b.) Must be unmarried.
- (c.) Must be, in the opinion of the Army Council, in all respects suitable to hold a commission in the regular forces.

5. A candidate must—

- (a.) Reside for three academic years at an approved university or college of the same.
- (b.) Qualify for a degree in an approved subject or group of subjects.
- (c.) Produce a certificate of good conduct from the head or other competent authority of the university, or college of the same, in which he has resided.

At the Scottish universities a candidate must have graduated after a course of study extended over three academic years.

At the London University, and certain others where there are both internal and external students, a candidate must be an internal student, which is defined as "one who has completed a three-years course under recognised teachers."

6. Candidates may graduate in any of the subjects, or groups of subjects, current at the several universities, with the exception of Theology, Medicine, Music, and Commerce.

7. A candidate who has graduated with first-class honours in an approved subject or group of subjects, or with other distinctions recognised by the Army Council as equivalent thereto, will, if nominated, be entitled to count one year of seniority on obtaining his commission.

8. First-class honours are defined as follows:—

- (a.) For the University of Oxford, a first class in any final school.
- (b.) For the University of Cambridge, a first class in any tripos.
- (c.) For the University of Durham, a first class in classics or mathematics in the final examination for the degree of B.A.; or special distinction in the final examination for the degree of B.Sc.
- (d.) For the University of London, a first class in any subject in which degrees in honours are awarded.
- (e.) For the Victoria University of Manchester, a first class in any honours school for the B.A. or B.Sc. degrees.
- (f.) For the University of Birmingham, a Master's or Doctor's degree in arts or science.
- (g.) For the University of Liverpool, a first class in the final examination of any honours school in the faculties of arts or science, or in the honours school of engineering.
- (h.) For the University of Leeds, a first class in the final examination of any honours school in the faculties of arts or science.
- (i.) For the University of Wales, the degree of B.A. or B.Sc. with first-class honours in any department.
- (j.) For the Scottish universities, a first class in any honours group, or the B.Sc. degree in pure science or in engineering, provided that the diploma of the graduate certifies that he has obtained special distinction in at least one of the subjects of his final science examination.
- (k.) For Trinity College, Dublin, the standard of silver medal at the degree examination in honours.
- (l.) For the Royal University of Ireland, a first class in any honours group for the M.A. degree.
- (m.) For approved universities in the Colonies, as may be decided in each case by the Army Council.
- (n.) Any other distinction recognised by the Army Council as equivalent to first-class honours in any approved branch of study.

9. A candidate for a commission in the Royal Artillery must produce evidence satisfactory to the Nomination Board that he has duly qualified in the mathematical subjects set forth in Appendix II.

10. In addition to the academic qualifications specified in paragraph 5 above, a candidate for nomination must present certificates of military qualifications, practical and theoretical.

* A candidate for nomination to the Indian Army must be within the ages of 20 and 24 on the dates named.

In this connection—

- (a.) He will be required, in addition to the military instruction which will form part of the curriculum during his residence at the university, to be attached to a Regular unit for six weeks in each of two consecutive years, or twelve weeks in one year, and to obtain a satisfactory certificate as to his proficiency (Appendix III).

In the case of students of Colonial universities, the attachment may be to a unit of the Permanent Forces of the Colony.

If the candidate is an officer of the Militia or Yeomanry, two trainings with his Militia or Yeomanry unit will count as equivalent to a period of six weeks with a Regular or Permanent unit. In the case of universities in the United Kingdom, a candidate who is an officer in the Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers should apply through his commanding officer for attachment to the Regular Forces.

If the candidate is not an officer of Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers he should apply through the authorities of his university to the Secretary, War Office. Arrangements will then be made, firstly, for his appointment to a temporary commission on the unattached list for Auxiliary Forces, and, secondly, for his attachment to the Regular Forces.* In the case of such a supernumerary or unattached officer the compulsory provision of uniform will be limited to the provision of the service dress with sword, &c.

In the case of the Colonial universities, attachment to a Regular or Permanent unit will be arranged between the university and the general officer commanding-in-chief, or Colonial authorities, as the case may be.

During these periods of attachment no candidate who is a supernumerary or unattached officer will receive either pay or allowances from Imperial funds. Nor will any other officer of the Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers of the United Kingdom be paid, unless the attachment is the equivalent of a course of instruction which he is eligible to attend with pay under the regulations of the force to which he belongs.

- (b.) He will be required to qualify in military subjects at an examination, which will be held commencing on the last Tuesday in March and on the second Tuesday in October of each year at the several universities, under instructions from the War Office.

11. Each university in the United Kingdom will furnish to the War Office, not later than 15th February and 15th August, lists of candidates for examination in the following March and October respectively, stating the groups of subjects they wish to take up.

Lists from universities in the Colonies should reach the War Office by 1st January for a March examination, and by 1st July for an October examination.

The subjects† of examination, and the marks allotted thereto, will be as follows:—

Candidates who so desire may take up the examination in two parts. For this purpose the subjects are divided into groups, as shown. Either A or B may be taken first. C cannot be taken alone, but must be taken with either A or B.

To qualify, a candidate must obtain 4 in each paper, and 5 in the aggregate of all the papers taken at any one examination.

A candidate who fails in one paper only, but who obtains 5 in the aggregate of the remaining papers then taken, may be re-examined in that paper only.

A candidate who fails in more than one paper, or in the aggregate, must be re-examined in all the papers taken at that examination.

12. Notice will be given from time to time of the number of commissions which will be allotted to university candidates and of the proportion assigned to each nominating unit or group.

* Candidates in applying for attachment to the Regular Forces should state the time during which they wish to be attached, and the unit or branch to which they desire attachment. Their wishes will be considered as far as possible.

† See Syllabus in Appendix IV.

In the case of group (f) the number of commissions allotted will be divided evenly between the two sub-groups. Any commissions not taken by one sub-group will be available for the other sub-group.

If any university, or group of universities, in the United Kingdom shall not be able in any half-year to fill up the number of commissions allocated to it, such unallocated surplus will be at the disposal of the Army Council, to be allocated to any other university, or group of universities, which may have qualified candidates over and above the number originally assigned to it.

To provide for such contingencies, any said university, or group of universities, may prepare a supplementary list of qualified candidates both for ordinary commissions and for antedated commissions.

13. The candidates nominated by universities in the United Kingdom each half-year will be arranged in one list, as follows:—

One name will be taken successively from the list of nominations of each university, the order of the universities shown in paragraph 2 being changed in cycle each successive half-year.

Candidates nominated by Colonial universities will also be arranged in one list. Names will be taken successively, and the order of the universities changed in cycle in the same manner as for universities in the United Kingdom.

Honours men who are entitled to antedated commissions, under paragraph 7, will take precedence before all other candidates.

Medical Examination.

14. The selected candidates will be examined by a Medical Board, and no candidate will be accepted unless he be pronounced physically fit for His Majesty's Service. Boards will assemble in London, Dublin, and Edinburgh for candidates in the United Kingdom.

In the Colonies, Boards will be convened by the Governor or other proper authority.

The general conditions as to height, weight, chest-measurement, eyesight, &c., are given in Appendix I.

The Board has power—

- (a.) To pass the candidate as physically fit.
- (b.) To report the candidate as unfit; but—
 - (1.) In a case in which the defect can be cured by operation, to recommend that he be re-examined by a Medical Board after such operation.*
 - (2.) In a case in which the candidate is slightly below one or other of the conditions as to height, chest-girth, &c., enumerated in Appendix I, and in which the Board considers that he will fulfil them within six months, to recommend that he be re-examined at the end of that period. A candidate so recommended will be re-examined at the end of six months, and will not be granted a commission unless he has then attained the standard required according to his age.

(c.) To reject a candidate as physically unfit. No relaxation of the eyesight-test can ever be allowed. Candidates who are pronounced unfit by a Medical Board in the United Kingdom under (c) will be allowed to present themselves for re-examination by an Appeal Board which will assemble in London a few days later.

Notification that a candidate will appeal must be made to the Director-General, Army Medical Service, War Office, London, S.W., within four days of the first Medical Examination, accompanied by a fee of four guineas, which will be returned if the candidate is passed fit. (Cheques, &c., should be made payable to the Director-General of Army Finance, War Office.)

The decision of the Appeal Board will in all cases be absolutely final. A candidate who is rejected by that Board can under no circumstances be medically re-examined (unless he be again nominated under paragraph 3).

Preliminary Medical Examination.

15. It is suggested that a candidate before commencing his course of study should undergo a thorough medical examination. By such an examination any serious physical disqualification would be revealed, and the candidate probably spared expense and the mortification of rejection.

16. Candidates may undergo a preliminary examination by a military Medical Board not more than three years before they compete, under the following conditions:—

- (a.) In the United Kingdom applications must be addressed to the Secretary, War Office, London, S.W., accompanied by a fee of two guineas.

* Such a candidate will be re-examined at the end of six months. If not then pronounced fit, his name will be removed from the list of nominated candidates.

(Cheques, &c., should be made payable to the Director-General of Army Finance, War Office.)

In the Colonies applications must be addressed to the Colonial authorities accompanied by a fee to be assessed by them.

- (b.) Instructions will be issued for the examination to take place at the military station nearest the candidate's residence where a Medical Board can be held.

In the Colonies the Board will be constituted by the Colonial authorities, and will be composed of military medical officers or, when this is not practicable, of civil medical practitioners of recognised professional standing.

The result will be notified to candidates by the Board.

- (c.) Candidates must pay their travelling-expenses.
- (d.) Candidates found unfit by the preliminary Medical Board are not bound to accept its finding, but may, at their own risk, continue their studies, and, if nominated, may then submit themselves for medical examination by the final Medical Board.

- (e.) It must be distinctly understood that passing such preliminary Medical Board is solely for the candidate's information, and would give him no sort of claim to be accepted as physically fit when he is nominated by the University Board. His acceptance will depend entirely upon the report of the final Medical Board which examines nominated candidates. Candidates may be fit for the service at the preliminary examination, but may become disqualified by some subsequent physical deterioration.

APPENDICES.

APPENDIX I.

PHYSICAL AND MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY.

I. A candidate for a Commission in His Majesty's Army must be in good mental and bodily health, and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of military duty.

II. The attention of the Board will be directed to the following points:—

- (a.) That the correlation of age, height, and chest-girth is not less than that which is given in the following table:—

- (b.) Measurement of height.

The candidate will be placed against the standard with his feet together, and the weight thrown on the heels, and not on the toes or outside of the feet. He will stand erect without rigidity, and with the heels, calves, buttocks, and the shoulders touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vertex of the head level under the horizontal bar, and the height will be noted in parts of an inch to eighths.

(c.) Measurement of chest.

The candidate will be made to stand erect with his feet together, and to raise his arms over his head. The tape will be carefully adjusted round the chest, with its posterior upper edge touching the inferior angles of the shoulder-blades, and its anterior lower edge the upper part of the nipples. The arms will then be lowered to hang loosely by the side, and care will be taken that the shoulders are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then be directed to take a deep inspiration several times, and the maximum expansion of the chest will be carefully noted. It is often attempted to conceal the true minimum measurement, but it can be obtained by a little manipulation and by drawing off attention from the examination by a few questions.

The maximum expansion rarely exceeds the average minimum by more than 2 in. to 2½ in.

The minimum and maximum will then be recorded thus, $\frac{33}{35}$, $\frac{34}{36\frac{1}{2}}$, &c.

In recording the measurements, fractions of less than $\frac{1}{2}$ in. should not be noted.

(d.) The candidate will also be weighed, and his weight recorded on the proceedings of the Board.

(e.) Eyesight.

The regulations regarding the examination of eyesight are as follows:—

The Army Test Types and Snellen's Optotypi (1892 edition) will be used for the determination of the visual acuteness.

If a candidate can read D=6 at 6 metres (20 English feet), and D=0.6 at any distance selected by himself, with each eye without glasses, he will be considered FIT.

If a candidate can only read D=24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, his visual deficiency being due to faulty refraction which can be corrected by glasses which enable him to read D=6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with one eye, and D=12 at the same distance with the other eye, and can also read D=0.8 with each eye without glasses, at any distance selected by himself, he will be considered FIT.

If a candidate can read D=6 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with one eye, a higher defect than D=24 will be accepted in the other; and if he can read D=36 with the defective eye at the required distance, the defect being due to error in refraction which can be remedied by glasses so that he can read at least D=12, he will be considered FIT.

If a candidate cannot read D=24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, notwithstanding he can read D=0.6, he will be considered UNFIT.

The candidate must be able to read the tests without hesitation in ordinary daylight, and the eyes must be wide open.

Squint, or any other morbid condition, subject to the risk of aggravation or recurrence, in either eye, will cause the rejection of a candidate.

Inability to distinguish the principal colours will not be regarded as a cause for rejection, but the fact will be noted in the report, and the candidate will be informed.

The degree of acuteness of vision of all candidates for commissions (including preliminary examinations) will be entered in their reports in the following manner:—

No relaxation of the standard of vision will ever be allowed.

The following additional points will then be observed:—

(f.) That his hearing is good.

(g.) That his speech is without impediment.

(h.) That his teeth are in good order. Loss or decay of ten teeth will be considered a disqualification. Decayed teeth, if well filled, will be considered as sound.

(j.) That his chest is well formed, and that his lungs and heart are sound.

(k.) That he is not ruptured.

(l.) That he does not suffer from a severe degree* of varicocele or varicose veins. A candidate who has been successfully operated on will be accepted.

* A definition of severe varicocele may be obtained from the Director-General, Army Medical Service, War Office, London, S.W.

(m.) That his limbs are well formed and developed.

(n.) That there is free and perfect motion of all the joints.

(o.) That his feet and toes are well formed.

(p.) That he does not suffer from any inveterate skin-disease.

(q.) That he has no congenital malformation or defect.

(r.) That he does not bear traces of previous acute or chronic disease pointing to an impaired constitution.

(s.) If the candidate is not of pure European descent the fact should be recorded by the Board.

APPENDIX II.

(See paragraph 9.)

A university candidate for a commission in the Royal Artillery must produce satisfactory evidence that he has duly qualified in the following subjects:—

(A.) Elementary Mathematics.

Arithmetic.—The ordinary rules, with applications more especially to the mensuration of plane figures and solids. The metric system and the use of decimals in approximative calculation, with contracted methods, will be specially insisted upon.

Neither the extraction of the cube root nor the use and theory of recurring decimals is required.

Neatness and accuracy of working are expected; and the methods of solution employed must be clearly indicated. There will be no objection to the intelligent use of algebraic formulæ and symbols.

Geometry.—The elements of geometrical drawing and practical geometry.

The substance of Euclid, Books I, II, III, and a working knowledge of as much of the properties of similar figures as is necessary for plan-making, map-drawing, and simple problems in mensuration.

Algebra.—To simple quadratic equations; the elementary use of graphs, particularly in connection with linear and quadratic functions.

The papers will be set to test knowledge of fundamental principles and readiness in application to simple practical problems. The solutions of equations must be worked out to a few significant figures; and candidates must be accustomed to test the accuracy of solutions by substitution. Skill in elaborate analysis, such as the simplification of complicated fractions, will not be looked for.

PRACTICAL MEASUREMENTS.

Measurement of length—verniers, calipers, micrometer, screw-gauge, spherometer.

Measurement of angles—use of protractor, &c.

Measurement of areas—by dimensions, by squared paper, by weighing; area of cross-sections of a tube, calibration of a tube.

Measurement of volume—by dimensions, by graduated jar or burette.

Measurement of weight—use of balance.

Principle of Archimedes—volume by weighing.

Specific gravity.

The examination will deal with the first three paragraphs in the above schedule, with a possibility of questions for written answers on the other four.

(B.) Mathematics I.

Arithmetic.—As in elementary mathematics, with more difficult questions and exercises involving the use of four-figure logarithms. Use of the slide rule.

Geometry.—Geometrical drawing and practical geometry of plane figures, including the use of Marquois and other scales.

The substance of Euclid, Books I to VI.* The special treatment of incommensurables will not be required.

Proportion may be treated algebraically and the complications of Euclid's definitions and nomenclature avoided.

Algebra.—As in elementary mathematics, together with indices and the simpler properties of surds; graphs of the simpler algebraic functions; quadratic equations; use of graphs in solving equations, and in illustrating and solving practical questions; rate of variation of a function and gradient of a graph; graphic interpolation.

Grasp of elementary principles and readiness in practical application will be looked for, but great skill in analytical transformations will not be demanded.

* Schedules A and B of geometry issued by the University of Cambridge may be referred to as indicating the scope required.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including solution of plane triangles; graphs of trigonometrical functions; use of four-figure tables.

Readiness in straightforward practical applications, but no great analytical skill will be demanded.

Dynamics.—Graphical proofs of formulæ for uniformly accelerated motion—impact, work, energy, circular motion.

Statics.—Composition and resolution of forces; parallel forces; centre of gravity; three-force problems; friction; mechanical powers—*e.g.*, lever, wedge, pulleys, &c.

PRACTICAL WORK.

Experimental verification of the above theoretical work, such as the measurement of velocity, impact, work, energy, &c. Exercises in drawing useful graphical demonstrations. Construction of the mechanical powers.

APPENDIX V.

FIRST APPOINTMENTS TO LINE REGIMENTS.

The appointment of qualified candidates to particular regiments of the Line will be made on the following principles:—

1. A candidate having a special family or territorial connection with a regiment may, when fully qualified for a commission, apply to the Secretary, War Office, to be appointed to the regiment, and such consideration as can be afforded will be given to his application.

2. If desirous of waiting for a particular regiment he must state this when making application, but he must clearly understand that he will only be allowed to wait if his claim be a very strong one, and if the conditions at the time are such as to allow of this without detriment to the Service. The period for which he will be allowed to wait will in no case exceed six months, but may be determined at any moment if the needs of the Army so require. After a candidate has once been gazetted on first appointment, no application for a transfer will be entertained.

3. Candidates without special claims are at liberty to apply for particular regiments (not exceeding three in all), but will in no case be allowed to wait.

4. Where the claims of different candidates for the same regiment are evenly balanced, the first consideration will be given to those highest on the nomination lists.

5. All candidates must clearly understand that, while their wishes will be met as far as possible, they will be posted to vacancies as demanded by the interests of the Service.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Te Arai Settlement is situated on the left bank of Te Arai River, nine miles and a quarter by good metalled road from Gisborne, at the nearest point. Gisborne is the centre of a flourishing district.

A large portion of the settlement is under English grass, the remainder is in native grass, a little bush, scrub, and swamp. There is some low-lying country, wet in winter.

The flat land is of very good quality, well adapted for agriculture and dairying; the remainder is good grazing country.

Most of the sections are watered, while on others water will probably be obtained by sinking.

The country varies in altitude from 30 ft. to 1,200 ft. above sea-level.

Te Arai Post-office is within a quarter of a mile of the settlement.

IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDED IN CAPITAL VALUE.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of 6, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
