Regulations under "The Orchard and Garden Pests Act, 1903," in regard to the Importation of Fruit or Plants.— Notice No. 1182.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twentieth day of February, 1908.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Orchard and Garden Pests Act, 1903" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under the said Act, the introduction into New Zealand, either generally or from any specified colony, country, port, or place, of any plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or any other thing which in his opinion is likely to introduce any disease into New Zealand: And whereas Mediterranean or West Australian fruit-fly (*Halterophora capitata*), San José scale

(*Aspidiosus perniciosus*), Queensland fruit-fly (*Tephryte tryoni*), and vine-louse or phylloxera (*Phylloxera vastatrix*), being included in the First Schedule of the said Act, are diseases within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas American blight (*Schizoneura lanigera*), apple-scab (*Fusicladium dendriticum*), codlin moth (*Carpocapsa pomonella*), mussel or oyster scale (*Mytilaspis pomorum*), and redmite (*Bryobia pratensis*), being included in the Second Schedule of the said Act, are diseases within the meaning of the said Act, but subject in every case to the provisions of section three of the said Act: And whereas the Governor, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him in that behalf by the said Act, has declared by Orders in Council made and gazetted on the dates shown in the First Schedule hereto that the diseases named in the said Schedule are diseases within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the introduction into New Zealand of fruit or plants affected, or liable to be affected, with any of the said diseases is likely to introduce the said diseases into New Zealand: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, it is expedient to prohibit the introduction into New Zealand of grapes, grape-vines, and grape-vine cuttings except as hereinafter provided, and to revoke the Proclamations and Orders in Council named in the Second Schedule hereto, and make other provision in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the several Proclamations and Orders in Council specified in the Second Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the introduction into New Zealand of fruit or plants affected or liable to be affected with any of the diseases specified in the First or Second Schedule to the said Act or in the First Schedule to these regulations respectively is prohibited, except when such introduction takes place in accordance with these regulations; and it is hereby declared that such regulations shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

- For the purpose of these regulations,—
"Fruit" means the edible product of any plant, and includes the peel, skin, or shell of such product, and also the seeds of such plant, whether such fruit is or is not attached to the plant.
"Plant" means any tree, flower, shrub, vegetable, or other vegetation.
Fruit or plants "affected with disease" means any fruit or plant (including cuttings, buds, or any other portion of a plant), or package or wrapping containing the same, in or on which such disease is or has been present in any form or stage of development, or any fruit or plant (including cuttings, buds, or any other portion of a plant), or package or wrapping containing the same, infected with such disease, or with which any such fruit, plant, package, or wrapping has come in contact.
- For the purpose of the said Act the following places are hereby appointed to be the only ports of entry for fruit or plants, viz.:—

Port.	Particulars.
Auckland	Fruit or plants.
Wellington	"
Christchurch	"
Dunedin	"
Bluff	Fruit only.

Provided that in the case of direct consignments of fruit or plants for any other port than those above mentioned the whole consignment or any portion thereof, as may be required by the Inspector, shall be actually landed by the owner or person in charge thereof, at the owner's expense, for examination at a port of entry; and on a permit being issued by such Inspector, after examination, authorising their release such fruit or plants shall be allowed to land on production of such permit to the Customs officer at the port of destination. The form of permit shall be as set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

3. Every shipment of fruit or plants must be accompanied,—

- In the case of grapes from the Australian Commonwealth, by a certificate, as set out in Form No. 1 of the Fourth Schedule hereto, signed by the shipper, setting forth the number and kind of packages, the shipping marks, the name of the occupier of the vineyard, the locality, and the State where such grapes were grown, and that

no phylloxera or no species of fruit-fly is known to exist in or within one mile of the vineyard where such grapes were grown, and that no grape-vine foliage or wood is attached to such grapes; also by a certificate, as set out in Form No. 2 of the Fourth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture in the State where such grapes were grown, certifying that such grapes are clean and free from disease, that no phylloxera or no species of fruit-fly is known to exist in or within one mile of the vineyard where such grapes are certified by the shipper to have been grown, and that no grape-vine foliage or wood is attached to such grapes.

(b.) In the case of fruit other than grapes, by a certificate, as set out in Form No. 1 of the Fifth Schedule hereto, signed by the shipper, setting forth the shipping-marks, the number of cases of each class of fruit shipped under each mark, the name of the occupier of the orchard, the locality and the country or place where such fruit was grown, and certifying that no species of fruit-fly is known to exist in or within one mile of the orchard where such fruit was grown; also by a certificate, as set out in Form No. 2 of the Fifth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in the country or place where such fruit was grown, certifying that such fruit is clean and free from disease, and that no species of fruit-fly is known to exist in or within one mile of the orchard where such fruit is certified by the shipper to have been grown:

Provided that the last-named certificate shall not be required in the case of bananas or passion-fruit if the aforesaid shipper's certificate states that such fruit was shipped in a green and unripe condition.

(c.) In the case of plants or portions of plants, except grape-vines or portions thereof, by a certificate, as set out in the Sixth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in the country or place where such plants or portions of plants were grown, certifying that the same have been subjected in a suitable enclosure to the fumes of hydrocyanic-acid gas for the space of one hour, and have been sprayed with or dipped in Bordeaux mixture; or, in the alternative, by a certificate, as set out in the Seventh Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in such country or place, certifying that such plants or portions of plants are free from the diseases mentioned in the Schedules hereto:

Provided that in the case of pear, apple, or quince trees from North America every shipment must be accompanied by an additional certificate, as set out in the Eighth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in the country or place where such pear, apple, or quince trees were grown, certifying that such pear, apple, or quince trees came from a district which is free from pear-blight or fire-blight of the pear.

(d.) In the case of fresh grape-vine cuttings, not being rooted vines, from any of the Australian States, by a certificate, as set out in the Ninth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture in such State, stating the name of the district from which such grape-vine cuttings came, that the said district is free from phylloxera, and that the cuttings have been treated in such a manner as to destroy any insects or eggs should such be present.

4. On the production of a certificate as mentioned in the preceding clause at the office of an Inspector under the said Act, such Inspector may, if satisfied that the certificate applies to the fruit or plants proposed to be introduced, and that the law has been otherwise complied with, allow such fruit or plants to be landed and disposed of without further restriction:

Provided, however, that the possession of such certificate shall not relieve any person seeking to introduce such fruit or plants from any other liabilities he may be subject to under the provisions of the said Act or these regulations.

5. If any fruit or plant be introduced or attempted to be introduced contrary to these regulations it shall, together with

any packages, wrappings, &c., containing the same, be dealt with as hereinafter provided, namely,—

(a.) In the case of fruit, plants, or things affected with the diseases included in the Tenth Schedule hereto, such fruit, plants, or things shall be held and fumigated under the directions of the Inspector or other officer authorised by him in this behalf at the port of entry before being handed over to the owner or person in charge thereof; and the fee for such fumigation as provided in these regulations shall be paid by such owner or person on demand.

(b.) In the case of fruit, plants, or things affected with the diseases included in the Eleventh Schedule hereto, such fruit, plants, or things shall be seized and destroyed by the Inspector or other officer authorised by him in this behalf at the port of entry, as provided in section 9 of the said Act; and the fee for such destruction as provided in these regulations shall be paid by the owner or person in charge thereof on demand.

(c.) In the case of plants or things affected with the diseases included in the Twelfth Schedule hereto, such plants or things shall be held and dipped under the directions of the Inspector or other officer authorised by him in this behalf at the port of entry before being handed over to the owner or person in charge thereof; and the fee for such dipping as provided in these regulations shall be paid by such owner or person on demand.

(d.) In the case of—
(i.) Fruit, plants, or things affected with the diseases included in the Thirteenth Schedule hereto; or

(ii.) Grapes or grape-vines or portions thereof not affected with disease (excepting such grapes or grape-vine cuttings as comply with the requirements of paragraphs (a) and (d) of clause 3 hereof respectively),

such fruit, plants, or things shall be either reshipped at once to a port or place beyond New Zealand by the person introducing or attempting to introduce them or be destroyed as provided in section 9 of the said Act at the port of entry:

Provided, however, that no such fruit, plant, or thing shall be reshipped without the consent of an Inspector under the said Act first had and obtained; and provided further that in the event of destruction of such fruit, plant, or thing the fee for such destruction as provided in these regulations shall be paid by the owner or person in charge thereof on demand.

6. No fee shall be charged for inspection, but all labour connected with the opening and repacking of packages of fruit or plants for that purpose shall be provided at the expense of the owner or person in charge thereof.

7. The fees for fumigation, dipping, or destruction of fruit or plants as prescribed in clause 5 hereof shall be as follows:—

8. Every person commits an offence against these regulations who,—

(a.) In any way introduces, attempts to introduce, or is concerned in introducing or attempting to introduce, any fruit, plant, or other thing affected with disease, or who keeps, sells, or exposes or offers for sale or barter such fruit, plant, or other thing, or in any way causes the distribution of the same.

(b.) Removes or attempts to remove any fruit, or plant, or package, or wrapping containing the same, from any wharf or landing-place within the Dominion without first having obtained a permit from the Inspector in the form set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by section six of "The Native Land Laws Amendment Act, 1897," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, authorise any Native owning land in severalty to mortgage such land to any lending department of the Government, and that in such case the mortgage shall operate in all respects as if the mortgagor were other than a Native, and accordingly none of the restrictions, limitations, or provisions of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894," or any other Act affecting Native land, or lands owned or held by Natives, shall apply, anything in any such Act to the contrary notwithstanding: And whereas Pura Makirika, of Wanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, in the Dominion of New Zealand, being the owner in severalty of the blocks or parcels of land mentioned and particularised in the Schedule hereto, has applied to be allowed to mortgage the said blocks of land: And whereas by certificate bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seven, under the hand of Michael Gilfedder, Esquire, a Judge of the Native Land Court of New Zealand, and the seal of the said Court, it was certified that the said Pura Makirika possesses, irrespective of the land proposed to be mortgaged, other land sufficient for her maintenance:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorise the said Pura Makirika to mortgage the lands set out in the Schedule hereto to the Government Advances to Settlers Office, being a lending department of the Government as aforesaid.

Regulations under the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907.

PLUNKET, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by "The Land Act, 1892," and the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations for the granting of flax leases, and doth hereby declare such regulations shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context,—

"Board" means the Land Board of the land district in which is situated the land or flax to be dealt with :

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the land district above described :

"Minister" means the Minister of Lands.

2. The Board may, with the approval of the Minister, lease by auction, for growing, cutting, or removing flax, any area not exceeding 2,000 acres, for a term not exceeding fourteen years, at such upset yearly rental as may be determined by the Board.

3. Before any area is so leased, or any flax is in any way disposed of, the Board shall obtain a report from a Crown Lands Ranger, or other suitable officer, as to the estimated quantity, position, and value of the land or flax proposed to be dealt with.

4. On the expiration of the said lease a new lease may be granted to the former lessee, without auction, for a further term not exceeding fourteen years, at a rental to be determined by the Board not sooner than twelve months nor later than six months before the expiration of the first term.

5. The Board may also issue a provisional license to occupy any rural land, not exceeding 200 acres in area, for any term not exceeding three years, and the holder of such provisional license may at any time during the currency of the license apply for and, if the Board sees no objection thereto, obtain a lease of the lands held under such license, and such lease shall be granted for any term not exceeding twenty-one years, at such annual rental and subject to such conditions as the Board may determine.

6. In disposing of flax areas by lease or license the Board may, if it thinks fit to do so, place an upset price upon the standing crop of flax at the time of such disposal, which may be either by auction, tender, or application and ballot. Payment of the price realised at such disposal shall be made as follows :—

(a.) If the price is £100, or under, one-fifth thereof shall be paid in cash at the time of disposal, and the balance within seven days.

(b.) If the price is over £100, one-quarter thereof shall be paid in cash at the time of disposal, and the balance may be paid by promissory notes indorsed to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, for such periods as he may fix, interest at the rate of 5 per centum per annum being added to the amount of same. If he wishes, the purchaser may pay the balance of the price in cash.

7. The Board may also, in disposing of flax areas by provisional license, fix an upset annual rental upon the land so disposed of, and such upset rental shall be the rental payable by the lessee or licensee if the land is disposed of by application, but if the land is offered by auction the upset rental shall be subject to advance thereat.

8. In no case shall the flax growing upon the land disposed of by lease or license be cut oftener than once in three years without the express permission of the Commissioner in writing previously obtained. The manner and method of cutting shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner, and any cutting in disregard of his decision shall entail forfeiture of the lease or license issued over the land in question.

9. At the termination of any lease or license all flax growing or planted on the land included in such lease or license shall become the property of the Crown, and no compensation therefor shall be payable to the lessee or licensee.

10. The lessee or licensee shall use every precaution to prevent any flax or timber growing on the land leased or occupied by him being destroyed by fire during the currency of his lease or license, and no compensation for the destruction of any flax from any cause whatever on the land leased or occupied by such lessee or licensee shall be payable by the Crown.

11. The lessee or licensee shall also take every care to protect the flax or timber growing on the land leased or occupied by him from damage or destruction by the trespass or grazing of cattle, from flood, or from improper or careless methods of cutting, or otherwise; and the Commissioner shall have power to determine the lease or license at any time during its currency if, in his opinion, the value of the flax growing

on the land so leased or occupied is deteriorating through the neglect or fault of the lessee or licensee.

12. No compensation whatever shall be payable to any lessee or licensee at the termination of his lease or license for any improvements he may have effected on the land leased or occupied by him, unless a special provision to that effect is included in his lease or license; but the Board may, if it thinks fit, allow a lessee or licensee to remove any buildings or plant erected on such land during the currency of his lease or license.

13. No lessee or licensee shall be allowed to transfer, mortgage, or sublet his lease or license without the written consent of the Board previously obtained.

14. In any lease or license to be issued under these regulations there shall be reserved the right for the Crown, where necessary, to cut drains and to survey and take roads through the land leased without any compensation for so doing being payable to the lessee or licensee.

15. The Commissioner and any person duly authorised by him shall have full power during the currency of any lease or license to enter upon and inspect the land so leased or licensed, and any improvements, plant, or machinery erected thereon, at any time.

16. Rights of passage are reserved for the public along any tracks or road-lines now existing or which may be surveyed or taken during the continuance of the lease or license on the land leased or licensed under these regulations.

17. Should any system of drainage exist or be brought into force in the district wherein is situated any land leased or licensed under these regulations, whether before or after the issue of such lease or license, any drains running through the lands so leased shall be made to connect and conform with such system.

18. Should any land offered for lease or license not be disposed of at the time of offering, it shall remain open for further disposal for a period of six months on the same terms and conditions as it was originally offered, unless the Board withdraws it from disposal.

19. The lessee or licensee shall keep the land leased or occupied by him clear of all noxious weeds during the term of his lease or license.

20. It shall be at the option of the Commissioner whether the land leased or licensed under these regulations shall or shall not require to be surveyed prior or subsequent to the issue of such lease or license, and in case of any doubt or dispute with respect to its boundaries or area his decision shall be final and conclusive.

21. Should any lease or license under these regulations be issued over any land on which kauri-gum exists, whether such land is or is not included within a kauri-gum reserve, the lessee or licensee shall have no right to dig for or take any kauri-gum on or from such land.

22. The lessee or licensee shall have no right to cut or use any timber upon the land leased or occupied by him.

23. Should any portion of the purchase-money for any flax, or any instalment of rent for any land, leased or licensed under these regulations not be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district in which is situated the flax or land so disposed of at the due time appointed for payment, the Commissioner shall notify the lessee or licensee so in arrear, and if the amount then due shall not be paid within fourteen days from the issue of such notice the Board shall have power to forfeit the lease or license in respect whereof the money is due, and all moneys paid thereunder prior to the date of such forfeiture, and no appeal shall lie from the action of the Board in so doing.

Regulations for Deer-shooting, County of Hawke's Bay.

PLUNKET, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1907 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Hawke's Bay Acclimatisation District and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. Red deer (stags only) may be taken or killed within the Hawke's Bay Acclimatisation District from the 20th day of March, 1908, to the 30th day of April, 1908, both days inclusive.

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Napier, on payment of a license fee of £5, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than three stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points.

4. No hind or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever, and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorising any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

WHEREAS by section sixty-seven of "The Factories Act, 1901," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time make regulations for the purposes of the said Act, and by section seventeen of the said Act, as amended by section five, subsection two, of the Factories Act Amendment Act, 1907, it is enacted that in every factory the occupier shall at all times cause to be exhibited and maintained at or near the entrance of the factory a statement in the form prescribed by regulations of the procedure required to be observed in order to claim compensation under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900": And whereas it is expedient to prescribe the form of such statement accordingly: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by "The Factories Act, 1901," and its amendments, doth hereby make the regulations and prescribe the form of statement to be made for the purposes above mentioned, namely:—

REGULATIONS.

The occupier of every factory shall at all times cause to be exhibited and maintained in some conspicuous place at or near the entrance of the factory, and in such other part or parts thereof as the Inspector from time to time directs, and in such a position as to be easily read by the persons employed in the factory, a statement in the form following, namely:—

STATEMENT SHOWING THE PROCEDURE FOR THE PURPOSE OF CLAIMING COMPENSATION UNDER "THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION FOR ACCIDENTS ACT, 1900," AND AMENDMENTS.

Notice of Accident.

1. To be given as soon as practicable (1900, section 12), and signed either by the worker or by any person in his behalf (1900, section 13), giving (1) name and address of person injured, (2) cause and nature of injury, (3) date and locality, and to be served on the employer or employers, or any one of them (1900, section 13).

Claim for Compensation.

2. To be made within three months; or in case of death, six months (1900, section 12); or notice of intention to make claim may first be given to employer within the prescribed three months, in which case the time for making claim is extended by one month (1904, section 4).

APPLICATION FOR ARBITRATION.

If the claim is not settled by agreement an application for arbitration may be made by the worker, or his dependants, or an agent appointed in writing by any of them, or by a barrister or solicitor of the Supreme Court, in accordance with clauses 1 to 4 and 6 of the regulations, namely:—

EXTRACT FROM REGULATIONS.

"1. An application . . . shall be made by the claimant filing with the Clerk of Awards of the Arbitration Court . . . an application for arbitration. (See clause 3.)

Teachers' Certificate Examinations, 1908.

Education Department,
Wellington, 22nd February, 1908.

THE following lists contain statements of the principal results of the examinations held in January. In the preparation of the lists consideration has been given to candidates' successes at previous examinations for teachers' certificates and at University examinations.

The first list (I) contains the names of the successful candidates for Classes A, B, C, and D. Teachers' certificates will be issued to such of these that have produced satisfactory evidence of age, have passed the special medical examination prescribed, and have fulfilled the necessary conditions as to length of service and efficiency in teaching. The second list (II) gives the names of those who have passed the examination for a certificate except in one or two subjects. Those candidates for the Class C examination who, though not entitled to be placed in the second list, passed in a "section" under clause 26 of the regulations, are included in the third list (III). In the fourth list (IV) are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of special mention, in accordance with clause 40.

The next examination will take place in January, 1909, beginning about the 5th day of the month. Notice must be sent to the "Inspector-General of Schools, Wellington," so as to reach him not later than the 30th September. Candidates that have obtained "partial pass" must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to receive any further intimation of the date at which the notices become due. Forms of application can be obtained at the office of the Department or of any Education Board.

Certificated teachers that have gained promotion at this examination may send their certificates to the Department for endorsement.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of 6, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
