Removal of Order forbidding Postal Correspondence for Dr. Kempster.

THE Postmaster-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, being satisfied that the person whose name and late addresses are shown hereunder is no longer engaged in late addresses are shown hereunder is no longer engaged in advertising the treatment of diseases of the sexual organs, hereby rescinds the order made under section 9 of "The Post Office Act Amendment Act, 1906," on the 12th day of July, 1907, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the 18th day of July, 1907, forbidding that any postal packet addressed to such person shall be either registered, forwarded, or delivered by the Post Office of New Zealand, and orders that such postal packets addressed to such person at his present address shall be registered, forwarded, and delivered in the usual course.

QUEEN CHARLOTTE ISLANDS.—PARRY PASSAGE.—HYDROGRAPHIC INFORMATION.—DIRECTIONS.—The following information concerning Parry Passage, Queen Charlotte Islands, is furnished by Captain F. Learmonth, R.N., and is derived from a survey recently completed by H.B.M.S. Egeria

A good anchorage can be found in 10 to 12 fathoms in a A good anchorage can be found in 10 to 12 fathoms in a bay off the south-east coast of North Island, with the east extreme of Lucy Island open to the eastward of North Island, bearing S. 1° W. true (S.S.E. § E. mag.), distant a little over 2 miles. This is the best anchorage in the neighbourhood with westerly winds, but in north-easterly winds a heavy sea sets into the bay.

Cloak Bay, on the south-western side of North Island may be used as a temporary anchorage, but is safe only with easterly winds. It is fully exposed to the westward, and is seldom free from a heavy ocean swell

A narrow rocky ridge, with depths of 8 to 3 fathoms over it and 17 to 20 fathoms on either side, extends in a S. 17° E. true (S.E. mag.) direction for nearly a mile from the southern shore of North Island, in Cloak Bay. Nearly in the middle of this challow area lies a rock marked by kelp, with less than 6 ft. of water over it, upon which the prevailing westerly swell seldom fails to break. It lies with the remarkably shaped island in Cloak Bay bearing S. 87° E. true (N.E. by E. \frac{3}{4} E. mag.), distant 1,600 yards.

This area of shallow ground very much restricts the anchorage in Cloak Bay. A berth may be obtained in 18 fathoms eastward of this danger, with swinging-room of over two cables, with the north extreme of the remarkable island in Cloak Bay bearing S. 82° E. true (E.N.E. \frac{1}{4} E. mag.), distant 900 yards. To gain this anchorage after passing Kioo Sta Village the course should be altered quickly to the northward to avoid the shallow depths which extend \frac{1}{2} mile S. 39° 30' E. true (E.S.E. mag.) from the rocky head above mentioned. above mentioned.

There is a confined anchorage in 12 to 13 fathoms at the There is a confined anchorage in 12 to 13 fathoms at the head of Cloak Bay, which can be reached by passing close to and on either side of a reef in mid-channel which is awash at high water. The berth has swinging-room of one cable, and is somewhat protected by this reef to the westward; from it Lacy Island (a bare rock 65 ft. high) should be just seen over the land bearing N. 77° W. true (W.S.W. § W. willy mag.)

DIRECTIONS.—The navigation of Parry Passage in either direction, passing southward of Lucy Island, presents no difficulties, depths in mid-channel being everywhere over

20 fathoms. The drying reefs, which extend ½ mile eastward of Lucy Island, are steep-to. The eastern extremity of this island should be passed at a distance of about 600 yards, when vessels should follow the southern shore of Lucy Island, passing its western extremity at a distance of not more than 400 yards, in order to avoid the foul ground extending from the Graham Island shore. When abreast of the western end of Lucy Island steer to pass the steep cliffs on the North Island shore, opposite the deserted village of Kioo Sta, at a distance of 200 yards. The tidal streams should here he guarded against, and after passing this point Kioo Sta, at a distance of 200 yards. The tidal streams should here be guarded against, and after passing this point the course may be shaped as necessary. The channel is 700 yards wide abreast of the Village of Kioo Sta. Lucy Island is steep-to. The extremity of the land of Graham Island in line with the north-western extremity of Lucy Island bearing S. 88° W. true (S.W. by W. ½ W. w'ly mag.) leads up to the eastern approach of the passage nearly in mid-channel. A vessel should steer midway between the reefs and the shallow water, which is marked by kelp on either side. The passage narrows to less than 150 yards in width at its western end. The tidal streams are always weak, with no eddies. Kelp stretches right across the eastern part of this passage. A conspicuous rock, 30 ft. to 40 ft. high, marks the outer danger westward of Cape Knox. It is situated with Cape Knox bearing N. 49° E. true (N. by E. ½ E. mag.), distant 2 miles, and may be rounded at a distance of 1½ miles. There are numerous rocks above water offshore to the southward of this rock.

No person who has been guilty of any malpractice or dishonourable conduct in connection with racing or betting, or has been warned off any racecourse by any racing club in accordance with the rules of racing, and no person who is at the time a defaulter or is on the Official List of Defaulters published by any racing association or recognised jockey or racing club in New Zealand or elsewhere, and no bookmaker unless licensed by the club under the provisions of the Gaming and Lotteries Act Amendment Act, 1907, shall be admitted or suffered to remain on the racecourse on any day on which a race meeting shall be held; and if any such person shall be found on the racecourse he may be ordered to leave, and if he refuses or fails so to do, then immediately on such refusal or failure to leave he may be ejected from the

leave, and if he reitises of falls so to do, then immediately on such refusal or failure to leave he may be ejected from the course and prosecuted for his breach of this regulation.

No. 2. No such person as in the last preceding regulation is mentioned shall obtain the right to come and go upon the racecourse or to remain thereon by reason of his being a member of any racing or jockey club, or of his having paid any fee or obtained any ticket of admission, and his ejection from the course shall give him no right to a return of his fee or ticket.

or ticket. No. 3. Every person shall, before entering upon the rac No. 3. Every person shall, before entering upon the race-course upon any day on which a race meeting is being held or is to be held, provide himself with a ticket of admission, which ticket he shall, if and when required, produce and sur-render to any steward, secretary, gatekeeper, or other person appointed by the club. Admission to the racecourse shall be only by gates fixed by the club at which gatekeepers appointed by the club are stationed; and if any person enter the race-course by any other way or means he shall be liable to be expelled from the racecourse.

No. 4. Every person who commits a breach of any of the foregoing regulations may be removed from the racecourse by

any constable, or by any member, officer, agent, or servant of the club, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.

TABLE OF FEES.
