A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Town Districts Act, 1904," that, notwithstanding the repeal by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," of "The Town Dis-tricts Act, 1881," and "The Town Districts Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1883," the Governor may, in the manner prescribed by "The Town Districts Act, 1881," declare that any area wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district, and thereupon the last-mentioned Act, and also "The Town Districts Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1883," shall be in force in such town district: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under "The Town Dis-tricts Act, 1881": And whereas the number of householders within such area is not less than fifty: Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Town Districts Act, 1904," and "The Town Districts Act, 1881," and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said area shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district under "The Town Districts Act, 1881," by the name of the Pleasant Point Town Districts. And in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers I do THEREAS it is enacted by "The Town Districts Act,

a town district under "The Town Districts Act, 1881," by the name of the Pleasant Point Town District. And in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and nine of "The Public Works Act, 1905" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that in any case where a road in one district is largely used by or for the purpose of traffic to or from any other district or districts, and affords access to or from such district or districts, and the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the latter district or districts should contribute towards the cost of constructing or main-taining the whole or any portion of such road in the former district, the Governor may from time to time apportion the cost of constructing or maintaining the whole or any part of such road among the local authorities of the respective districts as he thinks fit, and for that purpose, and to enable effect to be given thereto, it is also provided by the said Act that the provisions of section one hundred and nineteen of the said Act shall, mutatis mutandis, apply in the case of the maintenance of the road : maintenance of the road :

maintenance of the road: And whereas application was made by the Hawke's Bay County Council to apportion the cost of maintaining the road hereinafter mentioned: And whereas by the said section one hundred and nineteen it is, *inter alia*, provided that the Governor may, with the view of determining what proportion (if any) of the cost of maintaining any work should be borne by any local authority, direct any Magistrate or other person to be a Commissioner to inquire and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid: as aforesaid :

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed for the pur-pose aforesaid, and an inquiry was duly held : And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor,

And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion thereon: And whereas the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the cost of maintaining the road mentioned in the Schedule hereto should be provided and paid in the manner and in the proportions hereinafter respectively set forth: Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby apportion the cost of maintaining the road described in the Schedule hereto between the Hawke's Bay County Council and the Wairoa County Council in the following proportions, viz.: The Council of the County of Hawke's Bay to contribute two-thirds of the cost of main-tenance, and the Council of the County of Wairoa to con-tribute one-third of the cost of maintenance.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE COMMISSIONERS OF CUSTOMS, UNDER SECTION 50 OF "THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1906."

1. Any person who proposes to make application for the registry of a British ship shall give notice in writing of the proposed name of the ship to the Registrar of Shipping at the intended port of registry at least fourteen days before the date on which it is contemplated to effect the registry.

2. Provided that it shall not be necessary to give notice of the name by which it is proposed to register—

 (a.) A fishing-boat which is only to be entered in the Fishing-boat Register under Part IV of." The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 ";
 (b.) A vector belowing to a recompiled sub and used for

(b.) A yacht belonging to a recognised club and used for pleasure only.
3. When it is proposed to register the ship at a port in the British Isles, the Registrar at that port shall transmit

the British Isles, the Registrar at that port shall transmit the notice to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen. 4. If the proposed name does not appear already as the name of a registered British ship, or if it is not a name so similar to that of a registered British ship as to be calculated to deceive, the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen shall issue a certificate to that effect to the Registrar at the port at which the ship is to be registered, and the ship shall be registered under that name provided all require-ments for registry have been duly complied with. 5. If the proposed name is found to be already the name of a registered British ship, or a name so similar as to be calculated to deceive, the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen shall issue a certificate to that effect and shall trans-mit the certificate to the Board of Trade, who may refuse

Seamen shall issue a certificate to that effect and shall transmit the certificate to the Board of Trade, who may refuse the registry of the ship by that name. The Board of Trade will intimate their decision to the Registrar at the intended port of registry and to the applicant for registry.
6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing regulations, the Board of Trade may allow the registry of a ship by a name or designation which is already the name or designation of a registered British ship,—

(a.) If they are satisfied that the ship is intended to replace a ship of the same name owned by the

- replace a ship of the same name owned by the same owners, where the British registry of the original ship has been closed, or she has been sold on the condition that her name should be changed: or
- (b.) If the designation proposed is a number only and the vessel so designated plies only in or about a port or harbour in which no other vessel is desig-
- port or harbour in which no other vessel is designated by the same number; or
 (c.) If they are satisfied that the case is one of urgency and that the ship will be delayed if registration is refused by the name proposed by the owners. In such a case the Board may allow the ship to be registered by the name proposed by the owners upon the owners depositing £100 with the Registrar of Shipping and guaranteeing to change the.

name of the ship within twelve months to a name allowed by the Board of Trade. The deposit will be returned as soon as the name of the ship has been changed as allowed by the Board of Trade.

Applications for special consideration under the terms of this regulation must be accompanied by a full statement of the circumstances of the case, and in the case of applications under subsection (c) by a remittance of the deposit and by

under subsection (c) by a remittance of the deposit and by the written guarantee required by that subsection. 7. When it is proposed to register the ship at a port not situated in the British Islands, the Registrar to whom the name is intimated may proceed with the registry of the ship if he satisfies himself that the name does not appear in the current Mercantile Navy List; but if the name does so appear, the Registrar shall transmit the application to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen, and the case shall be treated in the manner laid down for registry in the British Islands. SUMMARY FOR FEBRUARY, 1908.

The month of February closed such a period of dry weather as was previously without precedent in New Zealand. The dryness extended generally over three months, and whereas in all the former records there were hardly half a dozen places recording no rain in any month, yet each of the past three months have presented many instances of such droughts. Bush fires were prevalent, and much damage was reported. Smoke haze obscured the sky, and the heat and dryness caused suffering and loss in animal and vegetable life. Conditions were better in Southland, where westerly depressions brought an average amount of rain. Good rains were also experienced from Wairoa South to East Cape. The barometer was high (the range, movements, and gradients being small), and winds generally light. The highest pressure (30.63) during the month was recorded at Cape Campbell on the 19th, and the lowest (29.50) at the Bluff on the 9th.

BY-LAWS, COUNTY OF MANGONUI.

IN pursuance of "The Counties Act, 1886," and of the Counties Act Amendment Acts, 1903, 1904, and of all other powers and authorities thereunder enabling, the Coun-cil of the Mangonui County do hereby make and ordain the full prime to react the United States and ordain the following amendments to the Traffic By-laws for the Mango-

by "The Public Works Act, 1905," shall have tires not less than 6 in. in width.
2. (a.) That any damage done to any road, bridge, or culvert by a vehicle engaged in "heavy traffic" shall forthwith be repaired and made good by or at the expense of the owner of the vehicle, unless it can be proved to the satisfaction of the Council that such bridge or culvert was not in a fit or proper condition to carry the ordinary traffic thereon.
(b.) That previous to the issue of any license to any vehicle engaged in "heavy traffic" shall for y vehicle and two sufficient surfices, shall give security either by way of bond to the Mangonui County Council or otherwise, as the Mangonui County Council shall think proper, conditioned for the payment from time to time of all such damage.
3. These by-laws shall apply to the whole of the county except to the Wainui-Herekino Road, known as Gorge Road, in the Herekino Riding of the Mangonui County.

a. Any person committing a breach of these by-laws shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.
5. These by-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of

January, 1908.
