ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this first day of April, 1908.

Present :

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, K.C.M.G.,
PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is Native land and is required to be taken for the purposes of public buildings :

And whereas the said land is held or occupied by Native owners under a title which is not derived from the Crown :

And whereas a map of the said land has been prepared in duplicate, as required by the eighty-ninth section of "The Public Works Act, 1905" :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1905," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the land shown upon such map and described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for public buildings as aforesaid ; and the said land shall vest in His Majesty the King, as from the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

Amending Regulations for Trout-fishing, Whangarei Acclimatisation District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of April, 1908.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, K.C.M.G.,
PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 75, of the thirtieth day of the same month, certain regulations were made under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), providing for trout-fishing within the Whangarei Acclimatisation District :

And whereas it is expedient to extend the time during which trout may be caught in the said district :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that, notwithstanding anything contained in the said recited regulations, any holder of a license issued thereunder may fish within the Whangarei Acclimatisation District until the fifteenth day of May in any year, instead of to the fifteenth day of April as provided by clause four of the regulations made by the said Order in Council of the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and six, subject in all other respects to the conditions prescribed by the said regulations.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of April, 1908.

PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS regulations for trout-fishing were made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of the same month:

And whereas clause ten of the said regulations was amended by Order in Council dated the seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the tenth day of the same month:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke clauses three, ten, and eleven of the said regulations of the twenty-third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and to make other regulations in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke clauses three, ten, and eleven of the said regulations of the twenty-third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth order that they shall be substituted for clauses three, ten, and eleven of the regulations aforesaid:—

REGULATIONS.

3. Any holder of a license may fish for trout in the above-named waters from the first day of October in any year to the thirty-first day of May in the following year, both inclusive; but every such license shall be for one season only, and shall expire on the thirty-first day of May following the date on which it was issued, subject, however, to the special limitations and restrictions hereinafter mentioned.

10. No person shall take, fish for, or catch any *Salmonidae* or trout, or in any way injure or disturb the same, between the first day of June and the thirtieth day of September in any year, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish. No person shall have in his possession any *Salmonidae* or trout between the fifth day of June and the first day of October following, whether frozen, chilled, or not: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the General Manager, or his appointee, or officers of the Marine Department, for purposes of acclimatisation.

11. No person shall take, fish for, or catch any *Salmonidae* or trout, or in any way injure or disturb the same, within the County of Rotorua during the month of October, and which month is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish within the said county. No person within the County of Rotorua shall have in his possession any *Salmonidae* or trout between the fifth day of June and the first day of November following, whether frozen, chilled, or not: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the General Manager, or his appointee, or officers of the Marine Department, for purposes of acclimatisation.

With the exception of about 2 acres near the northern boundary, this section is steep and back-lying. The soil is of fair quality, but the aspect is southerly. The timber is not of any value from a milling point of view, but a number of black-pine posts could be obtained. The clearing originally done has become overgrown to a large extent. Situated about three-quarters of a mile from Owaka Railway-station.

WHEREAS by the two-hundred-and-thirty-fifth section of "The Land Act, 1892," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas by the two-hundred-and-thirty-sixth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said two-hundred-and-thirty-fifth section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by the Warrants the dates of which are specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and the notifications of which were published in the *Gazettes* specified in the fourth column, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the lands so temporarily reserved as aforesaid, and enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule, being the same purposes for which the said lands were so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the sixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 56, of the ninth day of the same month, rules were made as to life-saving appliances for ships:

And whereas it is desirable to make additional rules:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section one hundred and ninety-seven of "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby make the following additional rules as to life-saving appliances for ships, and doth order that they shall come and be in force on and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

RULES.

1. ALL lifebelts, with the exception mentioned in paragraph 2, which are inspected for the first time after the 1st January, 1909, must comply at least with the following requirements in the matter of length, covers, tapes, sewing, cork, and marking:—

Length.—The belts are to be at least 50 in. long from outside of cork to outside of cork.

Covers.—The covers are to be made of all-linen Tecklenburg, weighing not less than 6 oz. to the yard, with a width of 27 in.

Tapes.—The tapes are to be of linen-thread web $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide, and capable of bearing a strain of 200 lb.

The ends of the tapes where they are attached to the covers are to be doubled, and the ends are to be displayed.

The free length of each tying-tape is to be 38 in.

The shoulder-connection is to consist of a loop of a free length of 3 in. on one side, and a strap 30 in. long on the other.

Sewing.—The tops of the covers are to be sewn with material which is to be doubled, and of not less strength than No. 25a five-cord Whitmore cord.

All other sewing is to be made with linen thread not less than No. 50.

Cork.—There shall be not more than ten pockets in a belt; and if more than one piece of cork is used in any pocket the following rules shall be complied with, viz:—

(a.) If the cork is put in lengthways, not more than two pieces may be used in each pocket, and each piece must be the full length of the pocket and not less than half the width.

- (b.) If the cork is put in breadthways, not more than three pieces may be used in each pocket, and each piece must be of the full breadth of the pocket and not less than one-fourth the length.
- (c.) If two or more pieces of cork are pegged or glued together, each piece used in making up the block is to count as a separate piece.

Marking.—Each belt is to be marked "Warranted to pass Marine Department Survey."

2. Nothing in the foregoing is to prevent a higher standard being followed in any of the particulars mentioned; and the specification does not apply in the case of belts of special construction for which a certificate of approval (Surveys 115) has been granted by the Board of Trade.

3. Belts originally passed before the 1st January, 1909, need not be rejected because they do not comply in all respects with the above specification, provided that the buoyancy is satisfactory and the belts are strong and fit for the purpose for which they are intended.

4. Any belt which has not the required buoyancy, or which in the Surveyor's opinion is not fit for the purpose for which it is intended, should be rejected.

5. Belts not previously passed by a Surveyor, but which were obtained or ordered prior to the gazetting of these regulations, need not be rejected because they do not comply in all respects with the above regulations, provided the buoyancy is satisfactory and the belts are strong and fit for the purpose for which they are intended, and provided, further, they are approved and stamped by a Surveyor of Ships.

NOTE.—Weather very unsettled; barometer considerably below the average, and unsteady. Southerly winds on 19th and 20th give records for Wellington, though in the former more sheltered site the record of 960 miles on 22nd October, 1869, probably denoted a greater storm. Bright sunshine amounted to 117 hrs. 1 min.; 8 sunless days. Mean relative humidity, 76 per cent.; mean dew point, 52.2°; and mean elastic force of vapour, 0.391 in. Mean earth temperatures: 1 ft., 58.5°; 2 ft., 61.1°. Decrease during the month from 63° to 59° at 1 ft., and from 62° to 60° at 2 ft.

SUMMARY FOR MARCH, 1908.

THE longest and severest dry period ever recorded in New Zealand ended with the beginning of March. The rainfall returns for the month show very heavy falls at different times in all parts of the country, except southern Otago and Southland, where the total fall was about the average for the month in previous years. These heavy and warm rains on the heated soil produced a wonderful growth of grass, &c., which dispelled the worst fears of a shortage of feed for the coming winter. In places the drought has killed some of the trees and vegetation, and bush fires have also wrought much havoc; but it is now hoped and believed by many that on the whole and in the long-run this experience, most unexpected and grievous as it was at the time, will prove highly beneficial.

The weather conditions during March were very unsettled; cyclonic disturbances and westerly areas of low pressure, though mild in character, frequently succeeded each other, and the barometric pressure was generally below the average, as well as unsteady.

A small westerly depression brought rains on the west coasts of both Islands at the beginning of the month. A cyclonic movement on the 8th brought very heavy rains in the far north, and an extensive westerly depression, which was at its lowest on the 11th, caused general rains over the Dominion. A small anticyclone followed, with fine bright and warm days, but cold nights, with frosts in the high country on the 15th, 16th, and 17th. A westerly depression on the 17th brought a fall of 0.9 in. in thirty-six hours at the Bluff, followed by a quick recovery, and brought some rain over the South. On the 20th a cyclone made its appearance off East Cape, and brought rains to all the eastern coastal stations. The falls occasioned by this disturbance were remarkably heavy in Hawke's Bay. Cyclonic conditions prevailed in the North Island until the 28th; but the decrease in pressure in the South was caused by a westerly depression. The former brought very wet weather, especially on the east coast of the North Island, and the latter brought rain to all the western coast on the 30th and 31st. The mountain-stations at Egmont and Mount Cook record 30.03 in. and 29.51 in. respectively. A most notable difference is seen between the falls recorded on the western and northern watersheds of Wellington: at Wainuiomata, which is exposed to southerly winds, between the 18th and 26th the fall amounted to 17.37 in., while at Karori, during the same period, the fall was 3.70 in., and at the Wellington Observatory 4.15 in.
