In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, but raises it at Christohurah.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 588, against 572 in May—an increase of 16. The deaths in June were 211, a decrease of 1 on the number in May. Of the total deaths, males contributed 112, females 99. Forty-six of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 21.80 per cent. of the whole number; 33 of these were under one year of age.

There were sixty-six deaths of persons of 65 years and unwards: Seven men, 67, 71, 72, 77, 78, 82, 90, and nine women, 67 (two), 70, 72, 73, 75, 76, 77, 78, died at Auckland; six men, 66, 71, 73 (two), 76, 87, and five women, 70, 78, 80, 84, 90, at Wellington; seven men, 65, 67 (two), 75, 77, 78, 79, and eleven women, 65, 67 (three), 69, 74, 75, 83 (two), 89, at Christchurch; and thirteen men, 65, 67, 69 (two), 73, 75, 76 (two), 77 (two), 78, 79 (two), and eight women, 65, 66, 70, 74, 76, 82, 89, 90, at Dunedin.
