WHEREAS by section two hundred and fifty of "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that whenever the Governor is satisfied that any Native lands acquired by the Crown in any way, or purchased out of any sums authorised to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall, by Proclamation, declare such lands to be Crown lands, subject to be sold and dealt with as in the said Act is more particularly mentioned: And whereas in accordance with the provisions of clause twenty of "The Maori Land Settlement Act, 1905," the lands hereinafter mentioned have been purchased out of sums authorised to be issued and expended as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act and by "The Maori Land Settlement Act, 1905," proclaim and declare the lands so enumerated as aforesaid to be Crown lands, subject to be sold and dealt with in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of July, 1908.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the third section of "The Land Drainage Act, 1904," a majority of the ratepayers in the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Horowhenua, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the said area be constituted a drainage district under the provisions of the said Act:

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of August, 1908.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section four of the Native Land Settlement Act, 1907, it is enacted that, when and as often as the Commission referred to therein has reported to the Governor that any Native land is not required for occupation by the Maori owners, and is available for sale or leasing, it shall be lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to declare that such land shall be subject to Part I of the said Act as from the date of such Order, and the same shall thereupon become, and at all times thereafter remain, subject to the said Part I of the said Act accordingly:

And whereas the said Commission has reported that the Native lands specified in the Schedule hereto are not required for occupation by the Maori owners, and are available for sale or leasing:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers in this behalf vested in him by the aforesaid section four, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare that the Native lands specified in the Schedule hereto shall, as from the date of this Order, be subject to Part I of the Native Land Settlement Act, 1907.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of August, 1908.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection one of section one hundred and seventeen of "The Public Works Act, 1905," it is, *inter alia*, provided that the said section shall not apply in any case where the local authority having control of a road or street by resolution declares that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any specified road or street, or any specified part thereof, and such resolution is approved by the Governor in Council:

And whereas by section three of "The Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1906," it is provided that such approval may be either absolute or subject to such conditions as the Governor by Order in Council thinks fit to impose:

And whereas on the seventeenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eight, the Council of the Borough of Roslyn, the local authority having control of the street described in the Schedule hereto, did by resolution declare that the provisions of the said section one hundred and seventeen should not apply to the said street:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved, subject to a certain condition as to the building-line:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the said resolution, subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the south side of the said street within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-line of the said street.

WHEREAS by subsection four of section one hundred and three of "The Public Works Act, 1905" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor may declare that any road or street constructed by the Governor within the limits of a borough shall be under the control and management of the Council of the borough, and such street shall thereupon be deemed to be a street within the meaning of section two hundred and nine of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900":

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, John Harrison, of Aratapu (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore of Wairoa River, in Kaipara Harbour, as shown on plans marked M.D. 1718, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, as a site for a wharf erected in accordance with the said plans: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated in red on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, as a site for a wharf erected in accordance with plans marked M.D. 1718; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such wharf which is shown in red on the plan marked M.D. 1718, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and six, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

4. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister, or any person authorised by him to receive the same, the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of two pounds, payable on the first day of June in each year during the continuance of the license hereby granted; the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

5. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf and foreshore, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

6. The Governor in Council may from time to time fix such payments as he shall deem reasonable to be paid to the licensee by any private persons for the use of such wharf, and of all lines of railway, cranes, or other appliances that may be on such wharf or foreshore.

7. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

8. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

9. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be

therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

10. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law or regulation relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

11. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Harbourmaster at Kaipara, by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

13. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause through any default or neglect on his part.

14. In case the licensee shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinafter set forth, or any of them;

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;

(3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges hereby granted to the licensee, have been revoked and determined.

*Regulations regarding the Introduction into Queensland of Trees, Plants, Fruit, &c.—Notice No. 1221.*

Department of Agriculture,

THE following extracts from regulations of the State of Queensland, dated the 11th June, 1908, as to the introduction of trees, plants, fruits, &c., into that State are published for general information.

The regulations came into force on the date on which they were made, and have superseded those previously in force.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE DISEASES IN PLANTS ACT OF 1896."

*Interpretation.*

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall have and include the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

"Act"—"The Diseases in Plants Act of 1896";

"Minister"—The Secretary for Agriculture or other Minister for the time being charged with the administration of the Act;

"Inspector"—Any Inspector appointed under the Act;

"Place of entry"—Brisbane, Cairns, and such other place as may be appointed by the Minister;

"Tree, plant, and vegetable," respectively, include the fruit or other product of any tree, plant, or vegetable, and every part of any tree, plant, or vegetable, and of the fruit or product thereof.

And words importing the singular number shall include the plural, and words importing the plural shall include the singular, and words importing the masculine gender shall include females.

*Special Importations prohibited.*

3. The importation is hereby prohibited of the following plants:—

- (b.) Potatoes from New Zealand and all other countries in which the disease caused by *Phytophthora infestans* exists;
- (c.) Plants, or portions of plants, of all and every species of *Vitis* from New Zealand, and all other countries in which *Phylloxera vastatrix* is known to exist.

*Importations.*

4. Trees, plants, or portions thereof, other than fruit, that are being introduced into the State shall be received at a place of entry, and not elsewhere.

5. All parcels of trees, plants, or any portion thereof, as well as all packages that contain any such articles, introduced from beyond the limits of the State shall on their arrival be distinctly marked with the name of the place or places where the said trees or plants have been grown, and in the case of such as are being introduced or are being transmitted through the Post Office the nature of their contents shall in addition be similarly set forth upon them.

7. At the places of entry all trees, plants, or any portion thereof, and the packages that contain or have contained the same, shall on their arrival be detained for the purposes of inspection, disinfection, or being otherwise dealt with, as provided for in these regulations.

8. All trees, plants, or any part thereof, and the packages that contain or have contained the same, imported or introduced into the State shall be subject to detention and inspection by some person authorised by the Minister at any of the places of entry, and shall be subject to treatment by such person as follows, that is to say,—

- (a.) If such trees or plants be found on inspection to be subject to any disease not already known to exist in the State, but liable if introduced and established to become prejudicial to its agricultural or horticultural interests, they shall be forthwith destroyed.

But in all other cases, and whether diseased or otherwise, they shall on inspection be detained and immediately afterwards disinfected in accordance with any one or more of the methods for disinfection prescribed in Schedule No. 1 hereto.

- (b.) If such trees or plants be found on inspection to be subject to any disease they shall, notwithstanding they have been disinfected, be further detained for a period of not less than fourteen days.

If at the expiration of the said period of fourteen days, and notwithstanding they have been subjected to process or processes of disinfection, they still harbour or are infested by insect or fungus pest or disease they shall be forthwith destroyed.

- (c.) If trees or plants are accompanied by a certificate signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture in the country or place of origin certifying that the same are free from the diseases mentioned in the Schedule to the Proclamation dated 12th June, 1908, or that they have been disinfected or fumigated, such trees or plants may be admitted on inspection only, provided that the Inspector is satisfied that the treatment has been effective or that they are free from each and all of the diseases aforesaid: Provided also that any certificate of disinfection for scale insects shall be taken only as relating to the diseases their presence constitutes.

When such trees or plants have been treated as hereinbefore prescribed a certificate in one of the forms contained in Schedule 2 hereto shall forthwith be issued to the consignees, agents, or other person or persons interested.

11. All imported trees, plants, or portions thereof may be seized and destroyed by or under the authority of the Minister, should no sufficient evidence of their being included in any certificate of disinfection be tendered by their lawful owner or owners on such evidence being demanded from them.

12. Culinary vegetables, cereals, and fruit are hereby excepted from the operation of the clauses 4 to 11, inclusive, of these regulations.

*Imports: Fruit, Vegetables.*

13. All fruit, vegetables, or plants imported into this State from any other State, if accompanied by a certificate in the form or to the effect of the Schedule hereto, shall be accepted as far as possible as being in the state or condition described in such certificate; but if an Inspector thinks fit he may inspect such fruit, vegetables, or plants on landing, and may reject the same if found to be diseased. All such diseased fruit, vegetables, and plants shall be dealt with in accordance with the Act and these regulations.

Before fruit is inspected the importers shall furnish the Inspectors with a list of the number of cases and the various marks of each separate consignment.

14. Potatoes (the tubers of plants belonging to the order *Solanaceae*), when not otherwise within the scope of Regulation 2, shall, as a condition both for their export and import, be accompanied by a certificate from an Inspector of the Department of Agriculture and Stock setting forth that such tubers are free from—

- Potato-rot or Irish potato-blight (*Phytophthora infestans*);
  - Brown-rot or potato bacteriosis (*Bacillus solanacearum*);
  - Scale (*Gelechia solanella*);
  - Potato-moth borer.
  - Rootgall or eel-worm (*Heterodera radicola*);
- or from any other injurious insect or plant-disease to which potatoes are subject.

Use of New or Clean Cases and Bags.

16. Where imported fruit and vegetables are packed in cases, crates, or bags, such cases, crates, or bags shall be either (a) new, or (b), if not new, shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by an Inspector of the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State to the effect that they have been steamed or dipped in boiling water or otherwise cleansed to his satisfaction before being used a second time.

Limit of Weight of Plant Parcels.

17. No package or parcel containing plants imported into this State shall exceed 2 cwt.

33. Any person guilty of a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

DISINFECTATION OF PLANTS AT PLACE OF ENTRY.

A. THEY shall be disinfected by being dipped for a period of not less than two minutes in a solution of 1 lb. of whale-oil or any similar soap (80 per cent.) to every gallon of water. The said solution to be kept at a temperature of 115 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit.

B. Or they shall be fumigated for one hour with hydrocyanic acid vapour within an airtight chamber.

## SCHOOL FOR DEAF-MUTES, SUMNER, NEAR CHRISTCHURCH.

*Under the control and supervision of the Education Department.*

Director: MR. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of 6, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
