WHEREAS by section four of "The Native Land Laws Amendment Act, 1895," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, except from the operation of section one hundred and seventeen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a limited period or otherwise, and either generally or for such purposes and subject to such restrictions as shall be in such Order specified, any land, wheresoever situate, which is for the time being subject to the operation of the said section, or any interest therein or right over the same, or may in like manner make such exception in favour exclusively of any lessee or other person who has been bond file. sively of any lessee or other person who has been bond fide in occupation of and has made improvements on such land, in occupation of and has made improvements on such land, or has paid money to Native owners for lease or purchase thereof, prior to the passing of the said Act: Provided that no Order in Council under the provisions of this section shall take effect until after the expiration of two months from the date of the publication thereof in the Gazette: Provided also that every alienation under the provisions of this section shall be confirmed by the Court in terms of section fifty-three of the said Act:

And whereas the Waikato District Maori Land Board, by a recommendation made on the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and received on the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eight, has recommended the Governor to except from the operation of section one hundred and seventeen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894," for the purpose of alienation by way of sale, the block or parcel of land particularised and set out in the Schedule hereto:

Regulations regarding the Introduction into South Australia of Trees, Fruits, and Plants.-Notice No. 1223.

THE following regulations of the State of South Australia,
dated 9th July, 1908, as to the introduction of trees,
fruits, and plants into that State, are published for general

information. The regulations came into force on the date on which they were made, and have superseded those previously in force.

THE introduction into South Australia of any grape-vine or

The introduction into South Austrana of any grape-vine or any portion thereof is absolutely prohibited.

The introduction into South Australia of all other living trees and plants of any kind whatsoever and any portions thereof, and of all banana fruit and stalks, is prohibited except under and subject to the following regulations:—

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE INTRODUCTION OF TREES, PLANTS, AND FRUITS INTO SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

- PLANTS, AND FRUITS INTO SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

 1. Living trees, plants, or portions thereof (not being grapevines or portions thereof), and fruits (not being grapes) may
 be introduced into South Australia from any country or
 place under and subject to these regulations, but not otherwise.

 2. Living trees, plants, or portions thereof, and fruits the
 introduction of which is not herein prohibited may be introduced only through the Port of Port Adelaide, by parcelspost at Adelaide, and by railway at Serviceton.

 3. No fruit or other product of any tree or plant shall be
 landed on any wharf, jetty, or other structure in South
 Australia without the written permission of an Inspector
 first obtained.

All living trees, plants, or portions thereof intended for introduction in o South Australia must, prior to being landed or introduced, be thoroughly cleansed of soil: Provided always that any Inspector may admit plants growing in pots, or other receptacle, if in his opinion there is no danger in importing them. importing tuem.

5. Every case, package, bunch, or bundle containing or consisting of any living tree, plant, or portion thereof, or fruir, introduced into South Australia from any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia shall—

(a.) Be accompanied by a certificate signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State, stating that such trees, plants, or portions thereof, or fruit, have been examined by him and found to be reasonably free from disease and fit for export, and that the packages containing the same are new, or have been thoroughly disinfected. same are new, or have been thoroughly disinfected by a process to be named in the said certificate.

(b.) Have indelibly and legibly printed, marked, or stenoilled upon it, or upon a label or tag attached thereto, the grower's or exporter's name and address, or his registered mark or brand, in letters or figures of not less that $\frac{1}{2}$ in. in length.

6. Banana-fruit introduced into South Australia shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by the grower of such banana-fruit and countersigned by an officer of the Depart-ment of Agriculture of the exporting State or country that

ment of Agriculture of the exporting State or country that such banana-fruit has been, prior to examination by the said officer, covered with netting impervious to fruit-flies for three weeks immediately preceding the date of exportation.

7. All living trees or plants, or portions thereof, or fruits, introduced into South Australia from any country or place shall, on being landed or introduced, be forthwich delivered into the custody of some Inspector or some officer of Customs; and shall, at the expense of the importer or consignee thereof, be conveyed in original unopened packages to such place in such manner as the Commissioner shall direct.

8. An Inspector shall examine all trees, plants, or portions thereof, or fruits, and may treat such trees, plants, or portions thereof, or fruits, in such manner as he may think desirable,

thereof, or fruits, in such manner as he may think desirable, or may order that such trees or plants, or portions thereof, or fruit, and the cases or packages in which they were packed, or either of them, shall be destroyed if in his opinion there

11. No person shall be entitled to any compensation by reason of any damage to or by the destruction of any tree, plant, portion thereof, or fruits, or of any case or package, under these regulations.

No plant or portion thereof shall be introduced into South Australia from any country where the insect known as Phylloxera vastatrix is known to exist unless accompanied by a declaration made by the grower before a Justice of the Peace, British consular agent, or officer of the Department of Agriculture in the State or country of origin to the following effect :-
 - (a.) That the plants were grown at a greater distance than 50 yards from any grape-vines or roots of vines.
 - (b.) That no phylloxera exists or has existed in the nursery or garden in which the plants have been growing.

SUMMARY FOR JULY, 1908.

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The weather was generally cold and moist. Several disturbances accounted for an unsettled state of the atmosphere THE weather was generally cold and moist. Several disturbances accounted for an unsettled state of the atmosphere during the greater part of the month, and barometric pressure only rose above the normal for four brief periods. The rainfail was heaviest on all the eastern coast, especially in South Canterbury, also in Northern and Central Otago, where between the 5th and 9th snow fell heavily inland; rain and sleet caused floods in the Taieni Plains. Rainfall was below the average on the west coast of the South Island, also in Taranaki and in parts of the Wellington Provincial Districts. Nelson and Southland escaped the heavy rains. A cyclonic disturbance of small intensity prevailed over the Dominion on the 1st, and a more extensive and remarkable area of low pressure held sway between the 5th and 10th. On the 14th a centre of low pressure was off East Cape: this caused a second fall of snow and rain over the greater part of the eastern coast, causing considerable damage. From the 20th to the 27th low pressure prevailed generally, and brought unsettled weather. On the 29th an area of low pressure passed over the most northern part of the country, but the last four days of the month were generally fine and cold with anticyclonic pressure.

In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland and Dunedin.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 583, against 588 in June—a decrease of 5. The deaths in July were 248, an increase of 37 on the number in June. Of the total deaths, males contributed 131, females 117. Forty one of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 16.53 per cent. of the whole number; 33 of these were under one year of age.
