Additional Rules for the Examination of Masters and Mates.

In pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me by section 23 of "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903," I do hereby make the following rules for the conduct of examinations for certificates of competency for masters and mates of foreign-going ships (ordinary certificates), and do order that the same shall come into force on the 1st day of January. 1909. January, 1909.

#### RULES.

1. Every candidate for a certificate of competency as master or mate of a foreign going ship must comply with the requirements of clause 3 of these rules before he is examined in navigation and seamanship.

2. Courses of instruction in first-aid to the injured will be held at Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dun-

3. Attendance at the course of five St. John Ambulance Association lectures by candidates is compulsory; and each candidate must produce the authorised certificate, signed by the surgeon-instructor or surgeon-instructors, as the case may be, and also a certificate in the approved form of the association from the surgeon-examiner that he has attended the full course, and has successfully passed the required examination showing that he is qualified to render first-aid to the injured. to the injured.

4. Candidates who cannot attend the full course of five lectures may take the lectures in such order of procedure and at such port or ports as they may find possible, but no candidate will be allowed to present himself for examination in this branch who has not been certified to by the surgeoninstructor or surgeon-instructors as having attended the full course of five lectures.

A full week must have elapsed between the date when a candidate has attended one lecture and the date when he presents himself for attendance for another lecture.

6. Candidates may, at their option, attend the ordinary class of the St. John Ambulance Association or the special

classes for instruction.
7. Candidates must make their own arrangements with the local secretary of the centre of the branch of the St. John the local secretary of the centre of the branch of the St. John Ambulance Association for their attendance at either the ordinary or special classes for the purpose of receiving the necessary instruction and training to enable them to pass the required examination.

8. Candidates must arrange with the local secretary of the branch of the St. John Ambulance Association as to the amount of fees to be paid for instruction to the surgeon-

instructors, and also as to the amount of fees to be paid for examination, and all such fees must be paid before a candidate will be allowed to attend the classes or present him-

didate will be allowed to attend the classes or present himself for examination.

9. Full information as to the hours and places at which the ordinary and special classes and lectures are held, and the names of the instructor surgeon and surgeon-examiner at each principal port may be obtained from the Superintendent of Mercantile Marine at each such port.

Note.—Attendance twice at the same lecture will not be allowed to count as two attendances, the candidate being required to attend each of the five different lectures.

Defining Bluff Extended River Limits for Tugs and Pilot Vessels.

# Subsidies to Public Libraries.

Education Department,

OTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries

been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 4th February, 1909, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 27th January, 1909.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without

augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1908; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

is composed of a section of the community only; that the is composed of a section of the community only; that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received during the year was expended in the purchase of books for the library; and that by the rules of the library it is open to the public free of charge.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open these scholarships, to be cannot the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys not over sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, one of which is open to all Maori boys under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools under the control of the Education Department, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory; the spector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory; the other is open on similar conditions to Maori boys whose attendance at any school other than Te Aute and St. Stephen's during the previous year has been satisfactory. The scholarships are open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Appendix to the Native Schools Code, 1908. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 7th and 8th of December, 1908.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted so as to reach the Department not later than the 26th of October, 1000
