*Allocating Land reserved and taken for a Railway to the Purposes of a Street in the City of Christchurch.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto forms part of land taken for the purposes of the Hurunui-Waitaki Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of a street:

And whereas it has been certified by the Minister of Railways that such land is not required for railway purposes: And whereas such land is situated in the City of Christchurch, the local authority of which has assented to the issue of this Proclamation:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor is of opinion that the said local authority can conveniently construct and maintain the said street:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by section one hundred and ninety-seven of "The Public Works Act, 1908," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, become a street, and that the said street shall be under the control of the Corporation of the City of Christchurch, and shall be maintained by the said Corporation in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Corporation.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and twenty of "The Public Works Act, 1908" (hereinafter called

"the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, by Warrant under his hand publicly notified and gazetted, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively shall, from and after the date to be fixed in such Warrant, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Warrant; and may by any such Warrant as aforesaid fix and determine whether all or any, and if so what part, of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or local authorities, and, if so, by what local authority or authorities; and may by any such Warrant as aforesaid direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas by the said section one hundred and twenty it is, *inter alia*, provided that the Governor may, with a view of determining what proportion, if any, of the cost of maintaining any work should be borne by any local authority or local authorities, direct any Magistrate or other person to be a Commissioner to inquire and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid:

And whereas it has been found necessary to remove and reconstruct the bridge situated on the Ballance-Gorge Road, and known as Mathieson's Bridge, together with the approaches thereto, and which said bridge and approaches are hereinafter termed "the said bridge":

And whereas the said bridge is necessary, and the local authorities interested in the reconstruction and maintenance of the said bridge would not agree to the apportionment of cost of maintenance of the same as proposed:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed for the purpose as aforesaid, and an inquiry duly held:

And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion thereon:

And whereas the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the cost of maintaining the bridge and approaches thereto mentioned in the Schedule hereto should be provided and paid in the manner and in the proportions hereinafter respectively set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge, known as Mathieson's Bridge, over Mathieson's Creek on the Ballance-Gorge Road, together with the road-deviation, being the approaches thereto, as described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said bridge"), shall, from and after the date of this Warrant, be under the exclusive care and control and management of the Pahiatua County Council; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the aforesaid powers and authorities, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of the present reconstruction of the said bridge and approaches, and the cost of the future maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge, with the approaches thereto, less such sum as may be contributed by Government (if any) towards the cost of the work, shall be borne by the Pahiatua County Council in the proportion of ninety per centum of the cost, and the Woodville Borough Council in the proportion of ten per centum of the said cost, respectively.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me by section 23 of "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903," I do hereby make the following rules for the conduct of examinations for certificates of competency for masters and mates of foreign-going ships (ordinary certificates), and do order that the same shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1909.

## RULES.

1. EVERY candidate for a certificate of competency as master or mate of a foreign-going ship must comply with the requirements of clause 3 of these rules before he is examined in navigation and seamanship.
  2. Courses of instruction in first-aid to the injured will be held at Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin.
  3. Attendance at the course of five St. John Ambulance Association lectures by candidates is compulsory; and each candidate must produce the authorised certificate, signed by the surgeon-instructor or surgeon-instructors, as the case may be, and also a certificate in the approved form of the association from the surgeon-examiner that he has attended the full course, and has successfully passed the required examination showing that he is qualified to render first-aid to the injured.
  4. Candidates who cannot attend the full course of five lectures may take the lectures in such order of procedure and at such port or ports as they may find possible, but no candidate will be allowed to present himself for examination in this branch who has not been certified to by the surgeon-instructor or surgeon-instructors as having attended the full course of five lectures.
  5. A full week must have elapsed between the date when a candidate has attended one lecture and the date when he presents himself for attendance for another lecture.
  6. Candidates may, at their option, attend the ordinary class of the St. John Ambulance Association or the special classes for instruction.
  7. Candidates must make their own arrangements with the local secretary of the centre of the branch of the St. John Ambulance Association for their attendance at either the ordinary or special classes for the purpose of receiving the necessary instruction and training to enable them to pass the required examination.
  8. Candidates must arrange with the local secretary of the branch of the St. John Ambulance Association as to the amount of fees to be paid for instruction to the surgeon-instructors, and also as to the amount of fees to be paid for examination, and all such fees must be paid before a candidate will be allowed to attend the classes or present himself for examination.
  9. Full information as to the hours and places at which the ordinary and special classes and lectures are held, and the names of the instructor-surgeon and surgeon-examiner at each principal port may be obtained from the Superintendent of Mercantile Marine at each such port.
- NOTE.—Attendance twice at the same lecture will not be allowed to count as two attendances, the candidate being required to attend each of the five different lectures.

*Defining Bluff Extended River Limits for Tugs and Pilot Vessels.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section 189 of "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903," I, John Andrew Millar, Minister of Marine, do hereby define the Bluff restricted limits within which extended river tugs and pilot vessels propelled by steam, gas, oil, fluid, electricity, or any mechanical power other than steam may ply to be within a radius of twenty miles from the light on Sterling Point, the eastern extreme of the Bluff.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 4th February, 1909, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 27th January, 1909.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1908; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1908, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under Part I of "The Libraries and Mechanics' Institutes Act, 1908," or "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1908," pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; and from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions, pounds shillings and pence; that the library is public in the sense of belonging to the public, and is not under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership

is composed of a section of the community only; that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received during the year was expended in the purchase of books for the library; and that by the rules of the library it is open to the public free of charge.

*Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.*

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys not over sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, one of which is open to all Maori boys under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools under the control of the Education Department, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory; the other is open on similar conditions to Maori boys whose attendance at any school other than Te Aute and St. Stephen's during the previous year has been satisfactory. The scholarships are open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Appendix to the Native Schools Code, 1908. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 7th and 8th of December, 1908.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted so as to reach the Department not later than the 26th of October, 1908.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary for Education, Wellington.
