Regulations for netting Trout in Lake Hawea, in the Provincial District of Otago.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of October, 1908.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, K.C.M.G., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Act, 1908," His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall have effect on and in the waters of Lake Hawea, in the Provincial District of Otago (hereinafter termed "the said lake ") :---

1. The season for netting trout shall extend from the first day of November in any one year to the fifteenth day of March in the following year, both days inclusive.

2. No net of a smaller size in the mesh than seven inches in diameter when wetted and stretched for the taking of trout shall be used in any portion of the said lake.

3. No person shall be permitted to use a net for the purpose of fishing therewith unless he holds a valid license so to fish issued by the Otago Acclimatisation Society (here-inafter called "the society ").

4. It shall be lawful for the holder of every license issued as aforesaid to use two nets for the purpose of fishing for trout in the said lake.

5. Any person holding a trout-fishing license under the troat-fishing regulations for the Otago Acclimatisation Dis-trict may fish with rod and line in the said lake, anything contained in these regulations to the contrary notwithstanding.

6. The society, through its officers, rangers, inspectors, constables, or other person duly authorised, shall have full power at any time to inspect, examine, and search for any net, tackle, engine, boat, or any utensil or instrument used or employed for the taking of trout within the said lake, and to seize and appropriate in the interests of the society all and every net, tackle, engine, or any utensil or instruall and every net, tackle, engine, or any utensil or instru-ment so used and employed in contravention of these regulations, and also to seize and appropriate as aforesaid all and every fish caught and in the possession of any person who cannot, or who does not, produce at the time of catching or disposing of such fish a license under the hand of the secretary of the society empowering him in that behalf.

7. The fee for every such annual license to net trout in the said lake shall be the sum of one pound for each person so licensed, such fee to be paid to the secretary or other duly authorised officer of the society.

8. It shall be the duty of the chairman of the society to forward to the Marine Department, on or before the fifteenth day of April in every year, a statement, certified by such chairman, showing in detail the number and particulars of all licenses to net granted by the society as up to the fif-teenth day of March previous. teenth day of March previous.

9. It shall be unlawful for any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, to sell trout taken under these regulations.

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10. Any person offending against any of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound and not exceeding fifty pounds.

If any person being the owner of any painting, drawing, sculpture, or other work of art, or literature, or mineral specimens, or mechanical models. applies to the Minister of Internal Affairs for permission to dispose of the same by raffle or chance, the said Minister may, if he thinks fit, grant a license for that purpose, subject to such condi-tions and restrictions as he thinks right to impose. "(2.) If such conditions and restrictions are complied with, the provisions of this Act, or any other law for the time being in force relating to gaming and lotteries, shall not apply to such owner or to any other persons who may be bona fide concerned in such transaction." The words "or other work of art " in the above extract are held to mean articles of the nature of paintings, drawings, or sculptures. No articles exc-pt those mentioned in any license granted by the Minister of Internal Affairs shall be disposed of by raffle or chance, either as gifts to prize-winners or on any other pretext. No. 65 of 1908], further notice is given that on 1st August, 1908, the *fixed white* light shown at Ediz Hook Light-station, Juan de Fuca Strait, Washington, was moved to the new structure recently erected at this station. The structure consists of an octagonal frame tower rising from the south-eastern face of a one-story frame fog-signal building located immediately in rear (southward) of the old bell-tower. The tower and fog-signal building are painted white, with a brown roof on the building and a black roof on

The *net* proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75-that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100. 3. \* These remaining suburbs do not lie within borougn boundaries, and particulars respecting them have not been obtained for the Vital Statistics. Correct annual statements of population outside boroughs are not obtainable.

In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christeburch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christehurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place. i

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Christchurch, and Dunedin.
