### Volunteer Regulations amended.

### PLUNKET, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Defence Act, 1908," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke and amend, in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto, such of the General Regulations of the Defence Forces of New Zealand, made on the eighth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and six, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the same date, with amendments thereto, as are set forth in the said Schedule, and do hereby also make the additional regulations set out in such Schedule. And I do hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect, and such amendments and additional regulations shall come into force, on the fourth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

### SCHEDULE.

1. THE following regulations, including all amendments thereof heretofore made, are hereby amended as set forth hereunder :

Regulation 3 with its amendments is hereby further amended by the addition, after "(c.) Company Establishment for New Zealand Engineers," of the following :

"The qualifications for capitation, personal payments, and badges, and also the annual allowance of ammunition, and orders of dress, will be the same as required for infantry.'

### Battalion Bands.

Regulation 3, (k), is hereby amended by adding the following words after the last paragraph :

"In cases where the bandmaster of a battalion or half-battalion band has been seven years in charge of the band, and is efficient, he may be granted the honorary rank of Lieutenant."

Regulation 4 as remade on 1st July, 1907, is hereby further amended by the addition of the words "Railway Pioneer Volunteers," immediately following after the words "Engineers (Field) in subsection (c).

The following new regulation is hereby added after Regulation 57 :-

"57A. A free issue of regulation field service uniform will be made to each Sergeant-Major Instructor every third year.

"Saddlery will be issued on charge to each Mounted Rifle Instructor.

Regulation 97 as amended on the 27th May, 1907, is hereby further amended by adding the words "and allowances" after the word "passages" on line 16, and also by adding, after the word "classes" at end of regulation, the words "In special cases where it is not possible for officers or non-commissioned officers to denote the whele time to be present at Olevana of Lastrantic and devote the whole time to be present at Classes of Instruction, and which necessitates their being absent from home during night-time, a reasonable allowance, not exceeding in the aggregate in any case the daily allowance laid down in Regulation 101, may be granted for a meal and bed on all such occasions, but permission to attend such classes must previously be obtained." Regulation 108 is hereby amended by omitting the words "Notes from Lectures by Lieut.-Colonel R. H. Owen," and sub-

stituting therefor the words "Instructions for Mobilisation, N.Z. Defence Forces, 1908 (Provisional).'

Regulation 325 is hereby amended by adding the words "The provision for leave of absence shall not apply to mounted rifles." Regulation 337 as remade on the 7th May, 1907, is hereby

amended by making the following addition thereto :-

"This regulation shall also apply to cadet corps which may be formed into divisions, regiments, or battalions. In such cases the amount to be deducted shall be half the amount of capitation payable to each efficient officer or cadet per annum."

Regulation 366 is hereby amended by adding the words "whole and continuous" after the word "seven" on second line. Regulation 389 is hereby amended by adding the words " and

horses of Staff Sergeants-Major Instructors.

Regulation 405 is hereby revoked, and the following regula-tion substituted in lieu thereof :---

"405. Personal payments shall be made and certificates and badges shall be issued to Volunteers as hereinafter provided."

Regulation 418 as amended on the 24th August, 1907, is hereby further amended by omitting the words "the four most proficient in each company.

Regulation 419 as amended on the 4th day of April, 1908, is hereby further amended by adding the words "in Field Ambulance duties "after the word "men.

Regulation 460 is hereby revoked.

Regulation 473 and all amendments thereto are hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof :-

### "New Zealand Long and Efficient Service Medal.

"Regulation 473. (i.) Officers of the Permanent Force, officers, non-commissioned officers, and men of the Permanent Staff, and all members of the Volunteer Force who have served efficiently for twenty years, which service need not necessarily be continuous, or those who have served continuously for sixteen years as efficient, are entitled to the New Zealand Long and Efficient Service Medal.

" (ii.) Officers of Defence cadet companies who hold substantive commissions will be allowed to count the whole of their efficient cadet service towards qualifying for the New Zealand Long and Efficient Service Medal; in other cases, officers and members will be allowed to count one-half of their efficient cadet service as qualifying service.

"(iii.) Efficient service in Reserve Corps formed under Regu-lation 540a, and Reserves to Corps under Regulation 540B, will be allowed to count as one-half the required qualifying service.

"(iv.) In exceptional cases, where a break not exceeding one year occurs in the service of an applicant for the medal, the decision as to the validity or otherwise of a claim for the medal shall be given by the Defence Minister, and shall be final

"(v.) Officers and men who are subsequently awarded the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration or Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long-service Medal respectively shall not be required to surrender the New Zealand Long and Efficient Service Medal, but shall not be permitted to wear both.

Regulation 514. Paragraphs (i), (ii), and (iii), and also paragraph (iv) of the amendment of Regulation 3, (h), cadets, made on the 9th March, 1908, are hereby revoked.

The following new regulation is hereby added after Regulation 514 :-

"514A. Officers of Defence cadet corps who have obtained substantive commissions will be paid capitation at the same rate as adult Volunteers."

Regulation 520 as remade on 14th November, 1907, is hereby revoked.

Regulation 582 is hereby amended by omitting the words "Captain two stars, Lieutenant one star," and the following is substituted therefore, "Captain three stars, Lieutenant two stars, Lieutenant (Acting) one star."

And I do hereby declare that such revocations shall take effect, and such amendments and substituted regulations shall come into force, on the fourth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eight.



ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1909, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the 1st of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly quali-fied: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Com-mittee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) members of Parliament and members of Government of the different (c) members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) members and associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) university professors of political science and of law, of history, and of philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize. The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions

or associations. According to the Code of Statutes, § 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to § 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print. For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Par-liament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

Oliver's Elementary Botany, Parts I, II, III, IV.

WIRELESS MESSAGES REGARDING OBSTRUCTIONS. By direction of the Bureau of Equipment the U.S. Naval wireless telegraph stations on the Atlantic and Pacific sea-boards are now furnished daily, or as often as there is occa-sion to do so, by the Hydrographic Office with the latest information relating to the presence of dangerous obstruc-tions to navigation to be transmitted to vessels at sea. Wireless messages will be sent broadoast three times at intervals of eight hours by those stations furnished with them. The hours chosen are 6 a.m., 2 p.m., and 10 p.m., local standard time.
