A PROCLAMATION.

LOCALITY AND DESCRIPTION.

Piripiri Block adjoins the Piripiri and Matamau Railwaystations, on the Wellington-Napier Railway line, two miles from Dannevirke and seventy seven miles from Napier. It stations, on the Wellington-Napier Railway line, two miles from Dannevirke and seventy-seven miles from Napier. It was formerly covered with heavy mixed forest, but nearly all the marketable timber has now been milled. During last summer the greater part of the block was swept by fire, and on the burnt portions a mixture of English grasses was sown, with very good results. When thoroughly cleared and stumped the greater part of the low country, which is level and undulating, with good soil, will be ploughable.
