the building known as the Hospital and Surgery of His Majesty's Prison at Lyttelton, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and by Proclamation of the sixth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, the building known as "the separate cells," situated on the north side of the said prison at Lyttelton, were respectively proclaimed to be a "lunatic asylum" within the meaning of "The Lunatics Act, 1882": And whereas the said buildings are no longer required for the purpose of a lunatic asylum:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three of "The Maori Councils Act, 1900," it is provided that the Governor may proclaim any district a Maori district for the purpose of the said Act: And whereas by section four of the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may in such Proclamation appoint a Stipendiary Magistrate or Government agent to be Returning Officer for each of such districts:

And whereas by three several Proclamations under the hand of the Governor of New Zealand, dated respectively

the twenty-sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred, the thirtieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and two, and the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and six, districts were proclaimed and Returning Officers were appointed under powers conferred by sections three and four of "The Maori Councils Act, 1900," aforesaid: And whereas the services of certain of the Returning Officers so appointed are through death and other causes no longer available:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand aforesaid, do hereby appoint the persons named in the first column of the Schedule hereto to be Returning Officers for the district set forth in the second column of the said Schedule, instead of the persons formerly appointed as aforesaid.

WHEREAS the branch of the Hurunui-Waitaki Railway from Waipara to a point in the neighbourhood of the Township of Mackenzie (hereinafter termed "the said railway") is a railway the construction of which is authorised by "The Public Works Act, 1908": And whereas the said railway has been partly constructed, and it has been determined to construct and maintain the remaining portion of the same—Domett-Mackenzie Section:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1908," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

New County of Waikohu divided into Ridings, &c.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Counties Act, 1908," and the Waikohu County Act, 1908, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby divide the new County of Waikohu, as constituted by the said Acts, into six ridings, to be called the Motu Riding, the Kanakanaia Riding, the Karaka Riding, the Ngatapa Riding, the Mangatu Riding, and the Waipaoa Riding, and declare that the boundaries thereof shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

And I do hereby declare that one member shall be elected for each of the aforesaid ridings. And I do further declare that Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine, shall be the day upon which the election of the first Council of the said County of Waikohu shall take place, and that Wednesday, the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine, at noon, shall be the time, and the Waikohu Road Board Office, Te Karaka, shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the said Council shall be held.

SCHEDULE.
MOTU RIDING.

ALL that area in the Waikohu County bounded as follows: Commencing at the junction of the Kaitawa Stream and the Motu River, in Block III, Motu Survey District; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of Opotiki County to the Koranga Stream; thence south-

easterly by the Opotiki County boundary to Maungatapere; thence by the Cook County boundary to the Wharekopae Stream; thence northerly along the Wharekopae and Makaretu Streams to the north-western boundary of Wharekopae No. 2A; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Wharekopae 2A2B, Okahuatiu Nos. 1 and 1c, to the south-western boundary of Waihuka Block; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of Run No. 47 to the south-eastern boundary of Section 2, Block IV, Ngatapa Survey District; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of said Section 2 and Waikohu Matawai 1B Block to the Waikohu River; thence north-westerly along the centre of the said river to its confluence with the Rangiriri Stream; thence north-westerly along the said stream to the western boundary of Mangatu No. 3 Block; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundaries of Mangatu No. 3 and No. 4 Blocks to the Motu River, being the point of commencement.

KANAKANAIA RIDING.

All that area in the Waikohu County bounded as follows: Commencing at a point in the centre of the Waipaoa River opposite the north-eastern boundary of Hauomatuku No. 5B Block; thence easterly along the southern boundaries of the Waingaromia A, 4, and C Blocks and the Kanakanaia Settlement to the centre of the Waihora River; thence easterly along the said river and southern boundary of Small Grazing-run No. 44A to the north-eastern corner of Waihora No. 2B Block; thence southerly to the north-western corner of Lot 1 of Small Grazing-run No. 44; thence easterly to the western boundary of Small Grazing-run No. 58; thence northerly along the Cook County boundary to Trig. Station No. 170, Tangihanga; thence north-westerly along a straight line produced towards Trig. Station No. 178, stopping at its intersection with the northern boundary of the Tutamoe Block; thence south-westerly by the north-western boundary of the Tutamoe Block to the Waipaoa No. 3B Block; thence south-westerly and south-easterly by the north-western and south-western boundaries of that block to the Waingaromia River; thence south-westerly by the course of that river to its junction with the Waitangi Stream; thence north-westerly and south-westerly by that stream to its intersection with the northern boundary of the Pakake-whirikoka Block; thence south-westerly by the north-western boundary of that block to the Mangataikapua Stream; thence south-westerly by that stream to its confluence with the Waipaoa River; and thence south-easterly along the centre of the said river to the point of commencement.

KARAKA RIDING.

All that area in the Waikohu County bounded as follows: Commencing at a point in the centre of the Waipaoa River opposite the easternmost corner of Pukepapa E Block, thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of Ruangarehu Block to Trig. Station No. 116, thence along the western boundary of Karaka No. 1 Block to the centre of the Waipaoa River, thence generally northerly along the centre of the said river to a point opposite the north-eastern boundary of Hauomatuku No. 5B Block, thence easterly along the southern boundary of the Kanakanaia Riding hereinbefore described to the county boundary, and thence generally southerly and westerly along the Cook County boundary to the place of commencement.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the Board as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Board to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which are particularly shown and delineated on the plans marked M.D. 3273 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf; such license to be held and enjoyed by the Board upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say :—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf, which are shown on the plans marked M.D. 3273, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

4. The Board shall complete the erection of the said wharf in accordance with the approved plans marked M.D. 3273, within twelve calendar months from the date of this Order in Council.

5. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Board a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the Board, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, the Board shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1908," or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The Board may make such charges for the use of the wharf as may be approved of by the Minister of Marine.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board.

11. The Board shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

12. In case the Board shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for the purposes aforesaid for a period of thirty days,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the Board or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. The erection of the said wharf shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the Board of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

And whereas a dispute has arisen as to which local authority should have control of the said road, and what pro-

portion of the cost of maintaining the said road should be borne by the local authorities affected :

And whereas an inquiry was duly held, and a report was made, in respect to the dispute :

And whereas it is expedient that effect should be given to the recommendations contained in the said report, and that provision should be made under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the said road shall, from and after the date of this Warrant, be under the exclusive care and control of the Werekino Road Board ; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the aforesaid powers and authorities, I do hereby fix and determine that the proportion of the cost of maintaining the said road which shall be borne by the Werekino Road Board shall be such proportion as may from time to time be represented by the total amount of such general rates, being not less than one halfpenny in the pound, as may be collected by the Werekino Road Board from lands that front upon the said road, plus subsidy (if any) paid by Government thereon, but less an allowance of ten per centum of such rates and subsidies, and which allowance the Werekino Road Board shall retain for its own use ; and that the Parihaka Road Board shall bear a proportion from time to time of the cost of maintaining the said road equivalent to the total amount of such general rates, being not less than one halfpenny in the pound, as may be collected by the Parihaka Road Board from lands that front upon the said road, plus subsidy (if any) paid by Government thereon, but less an allowance of ten per centum of such rates and subsidies, and which allowance the Parihaka Road Board shall retain for its own use ; and, in addition to the proportion hereinbefore stated to be paid from time to time by the Parihaka Road Board, such Board shall at once pay to the Werekino Road Board the sum of sixty pounds sterling in respect to the past maintenance of the said road, which sum of sixty pounds shall upon receipt by the Werekino Road Board be spent in the further maintenance of the said road.

Commission to inquire into Question of Native Lands and Native-land Tenure.

PLUNKET, Governor.

To all to whom these presents shall come, and to Sir Robert Stout, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Dominion of New Zealand; and to Jackson Palmer, Esquire, Chief Judge of the Native Land Court: Greeting.

WHEREAS there are large areas of Native lands of which some are unoccupied and others partially and unprofitably occupied: And whereas it would be for the benefit of the Natives themselves and to the advantage of European settlement if prompt and effective provision were made whereby such lands should be profitably occupied, cultivated, and improved: And whereas for the purpose of inquiring and reporting as to the best methods to be adopted in the premises, certain Commissioners were appointed by the Governor in Council on the twenty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seven: And whereas the said Commissioners have made several reports in the premises, but have not finally completed their inquiries: And whereas by virtue of section fifty-two of "The Native Land Settlement Act, 1907," the powers and functions of the said Commissioners ceased on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nine: And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made to complete such inquiries: And whereas it is also expedient that provision should be made for the consolidation of the various Acts relating to Native lands and Native affairs:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by "The Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby appoint you, the said

SIR ROBERT STOUT and
JACKSON PALMER,

to be a Commission to inquire and report as to the following matters—

1. What areas of Native lands there are which are unoccupied or not profitably occupied, the owners thereof, and, if in your opinion necessary, the nature of such owners' titles and the interests affecting the same.

2. How such lands can best be utilised and settled in the interests of the Native owners and the public good.

3. What areas (if any) of such lands could or should be set apart—

(a.) For the individual occupation of the Native owners, and for purposes of cultivation and farming.

(b.) As communal lands for the purposes of the Native owners as a body, tribe, or village.

(c.) For future occupation by the descendants or successors of the Native owners, and how such land can in the meantime be properly and profitably used.

(d.) For settlement by other Natives than the Native owners, and on what terms and conditions, and by what modes of disposition.

(e.) For settlement by Europeans, on what terms and conditions, by what modes of disposition, in what areas, and with what safeguards to prevent the subsequent aggregation of such areas in European hands.

4. How the existing institutions established amongst Natives and the existing systems of dealing with Native lands can best be utilised or adapted for the purposes aforesaid, and to what extent or in what manner they should be modified.

For all the purposes aforesaid you are hereby empowered to continue and complete the inquiries commenced by the aforesaid Commissioners.

And you are hereby enjoined to make such suggestions and recommendations as you may consider desirable or necessary with respect to the foregoing matters, and generally with respect to the necessity of legislation in the premises, including the preparation of a draft Bill, embodying your suggested legislation, and consolidating the existing enactments relating to Native lands and the affairs of Natives. In the preparation of the said Bill you are directed to proceed on the lines indicated in "The Reprint of Statutes Act, 1895," with such modifications as you deem necessary.

And, with the like advice and consent, I do further appoint you, the said

SIR ROBERT STOUT,

to be Chairman of the said Commission.

And for the better enabling you, the said Commission, to carry these presents into effect you are hereby authorised and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under

these presents at such times and places in New Zealand as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and from place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath or otherwise, as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording you information in the premises; and you are also hereby empowered to call for and examine all such books, documents, papers, plans, maps, or records as you deem likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject-matter of this inquiry, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful ways and means whatsoever. And, using all diligence, you are required to transmit to me, under your hands and seals, your reports and recommendations from time to time after the inquiries aforesaid have been made in respect of any considerable blocks or areas of Native land; and to transmit to me your first report not later than the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine, or such extended date as may hereafter be named by me in that behalf, and your final report not later than the seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine, or such extended date as may hereafter be named by me. And you are directed to so frame your reports as to facilitate prompt action being taken thereon, and in particular to furnish in such reports such detail as to the lands available for European settlement as will enable Parliament, if it deem fit, to give immediate legislative effect to such parts of your reports. And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry may not be regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournment. And, lastly, it is hereby further declared that these presents are issued under and subject to the provisions of "The Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908."

Authorising Maori Land Board to deal with Native Land by way of Lease.

WHEREAS by section eight of "The Native Land Rating Act, 1904," it is enacted that no judgment against a Native owner or occupier for non-payment of rates shall operate or be enforced until the expiration of one month after the entry thereof, nor shall it operate or be enforced at any time without the previous consent in writing of the Native Minister (hereinafter called "the Minister"):

And whereas by section nine of the said Act it is, *inter alia*, enacted that (1) in lieu of granting such consent the Minister, if he deems it expedient in the interests of all parties so to do, may authorise the District Maori Land Board of the district within which the land is situated to administer the whole or any part of the land; (2) that a notice by the Minister in the *Gazette* and *Kahiti* that the Board is authorised to administer the land or any specified portion thereof shall be conclusive evidence of the fact; and (3) that the said land shall be held by the Board upon such terms as to leasing, cutting up, managing, improving, and raising money upon the same (not being inconsistent with "The Maori Lands Administration Act, 1900") as may be specified in such notice, and shall be dealt with in the same manner, *mutatis mutandis*, as Maori lands duly transferred to the Board under the provisions of that Act:

Now, therefore, I, James Carroll, the Native Minister, being satisfied that it is expedient in the interests of all the parties so to do, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me as aforesaid, and of all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby authorise the Aotea District Maori Land Board to administer the block or parcel of land particularised and set out in the Schedule hereto, upon the terms and for any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

(1.) After reserving and rendering inalienable such portion (if any) of the said land as may be required for the occupation and support of the Maori owners thereof, or for any other purpose, to lease by public auction or public tender the balance of the said land or any part or parts thereof, or any easement, right, or privilege over or in relation to the same, for any term not exceeding twenty-one years, to take effect in possession, and with or without provision for right of renewal, as provided for in Regulations Nos. 83 to 87, inclusive, as published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and one.

(2.) To borrow money on the security of the said land, or a definite part thereof, to such extent and on such terms in all respects as the Board thinks fit; and, should the Board see fit, to apply the net proceeds so borrowed in or towards discharging valid mortgages, survey-charging liens, rates, or other *bona fide* valid expenses or debts of the Maori owners in perfecting the title to the said land or to any other lands owned by the same Maoris, and to apply the balance in cutting up, surveying, roading, opening up, preparing, and advertising such land for lease, or generally improving such land or any other land of the same owners.

(3.) Generally to hold and administer the said land in accordance with "The Maori Lands Administration Act, 1900," and its amendments, and the regulations made thereunder.

New Zealand Government Railways.—By-laws regulating the Traffic over the Matapuna Railway-bridge.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Government Railways Act, 1908," I, John Andrew Millar, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto for regulating the traffic on and over the Matapuna Railway-bridge, which said bridge forms part of the railway between Auckland and Wellington, and is used for both ordinary and railway traffic.

And I do hereby declare that such by-laws shall come into force from the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

BY-LAWS.

(1.) HORSES not driven in harness or led by bridle or halter, and cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, mules, and donkeys, must have a man behind them; and cattle, sheep, and horses in mobs must also have a man before them.

(2.) Horses or light-wheeled vehicles shall not enter upon the bridge within fifteen minutes of the time that any train is due on the bridge, drays within twenty minutes, and cattle, sheep, or pigs within thirty minutes.

(3.) Horsemen or wheeled vehicles shall not travel faster than at the rate of six miles an hour.

(4.) Traction-engines shall not cross the bridge unless loaded on railway-wagons.

(5.) Portable engines, combines, elevators, reapers-and-binders (excepting reapers-and-binders on special travelling carriages), and such travelling or portable machines or loads, which exceed 11 ft. in width (all of which are hereinafter included in the term "machine") may only be taken over the bridge subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The owner or person in charge thereof shall obtain from the Railway Stationmaster at Taumarunui or Ohakune a permit authorising the passage of the machine over the bridge, accompanied by the bridge-keeper.

(b.) Before such permit is issued, the person applying for the same shall state correctly the description, weight, number of wheels, breadth of tires, and width of the machine or load, together with the name and address of the owner thereof, which particulars shall be entered in the permit.

(c.) The permit is to be given to the bridge-keeper, and the machine shall not enter upon the bridge if the description in the permit does not agree with the machine, nor unless accompanied by the bridge-keeper.

(d.) Every precaution shall be taken against fire or other damage to the bridge or railway, as required by the bridge-keeper, and speed shall be a uniform rate not exceeding two miles an hour.

(e.) The owner of any machine shall be liable to the Minister for any damage done to the bridge or railway during transit of such machine.

(6.) No load shall be taken over the bridge greater than 1½ tons gross per wheel, except with tires 5 in. broad or wider, and no load over 2 tons per wheel shall pass over, except under the regulations for machines; and loads greater than 4 tons per wheel are entirely prohibited from passing over the bridge.

(7.) No person shall go upon or cross the bridge while in a state of intoxication.

(8.) Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws, or shall fail to do any act in any such by-law directed to be done by him, or shall do any act which by any such by-law is directed not to be done by him shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each such breach, or the failure to do or the doing of each such act as aforesaid respectively; but if any such person is employed on or about the railway, and the by-law relates to his conduct, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1 for each breach, failure, or act respectively.

Alterations to the Scale of Fares, Rates, and Charges in Force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under "The Government Railways Act, 1908," I, John Andrew Millar, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of fares, rates, and charges in force on the New Zealand Government railways open for traffic, such alterations to come into force on and after the 1st day of February, 1909:—

PART I.—PASSENGERS.

FREE SCHOOL SEASON TICKETS.

Cancel—
Regulation 31.

Insert—
31. Free second-class quarterly tickets, available for distances not exceeding sixty miles, may be issued to school pupils not over nineteen years of age as follows:—

(1.) To pupils attending the public primary schools, from railway-stations where there is no primary school in the vicinity, and only to the station in the vicinity of the nearest primary school.

(2.) To pupils who are holders of scholarships tenable at a district high school or secondary school, as defined by "The Education Act, 1908," to enable them to attend any such district high school or secondary school.

(3.) To pupils of secondary schools, as defined by "The Education Act, 1908," and of the secondary departments of district high schools, to enable them to attend one or other of such schools, whichever shall be nearest.

(4.) To pupils attending private primary or secondary schools subject to inspection in accordance with section 170 of "The Education Act, 1908."

- (5.) To holders of free places at a technical school recognised under the regulations for manual and technical instruction.
- (6.) To pupils on the roll of a public or private primary or secondary school or of a district high school travelling to attend classes held at especially equipped manual training centres and recognised under the regulations for manual and technical instruction.

Application for these tickets must be accompanied by a certificate in the following form, and duly signed by the head teacher, principal, or director, as the case may be, having charge of the school attended:—

† Give the name of the school or of the manual training centre. (The school may be a public school, a private school subject to inspection, a district high school, a secondary school, or a technical school.)

‡ State whether primary or secondary, technical or manual.

These tickets are not transferable, and are available for use by the holder only when travelling to and from school for the purpose of receiving tuition. If used for any other purpose the ticket will be forfeited.

PART III.—GOODS: REGULATIONS.

Regulation (3), Class E.

Insert—

(3.) CLASS E.

Minimum quantity (except for bonedust and other artificial manures, for which it will be 5 cwt.), 1½ tons. Any less quantity will be charged as such minimum, or at rate and a half, Class E, not exceeding the rate for Class D.

At Auckland, Onehunga, Port Ahuriri, Wellington (Thorndon), Wellington (Lambton), Foxton, Wanganui, New Plymouth Breakwater, Waitara, Greymouth, Westport, Nelson, Nelson Port, Picton, Blenheim, Lyttelton, Christchurch, Timaru, Oamaru, Breakwater, Port Chalmers, Dunedin, Invercargill, and Bluff, 6d. per ton will be charged in addition to the classified rates, except when consigned from or to private sidings at those stations, or except local rates otherwise provide; but such addition will not be made when goods are charged at Class E under small-lots scale, Regulation 2, or at rate and a half, Class E.

At all other stations, when the loading or unloading is done by the owners, or when loaded by owners into sheds, owing to trucks not being available after reasonable notice is given, the classified rates only will be charged. When the loading or unloading is done by Railway Department 6d. per ton will be charged for each operation; minimum charge, 3d. When goods are charged at Class E under small-lots scale, Regulation 2, or at rate and a half, Class E, no charge for loading or unloading will be made.

At all private stores or sidings the loading or unloading shall be done by the owners.

The following method of computing the tonnage of grain will be followed:—

Wheat—12 bags of 3½ bushels to the ton.
Barley—12 bags of 4 bushels to the ton.
Oats—14 bags of 4 bushels to the ton.
Flour, bran, and pollard—2,200 lb. to the ton.
Oats (crushed) and other grain by actual weight.
60 lb. of wheat, 50 lb. of barley, or 40 lb. of oats count as 1 bushel.

The number of bags and the quantity they contain must be declared upon the consignment notes.

The maximum weight of wheat, barley, or oats contained in any one sack to be carried by railway shall be 200 lb. Any sack of wheat, barley, or oats containing a greater weight than 200 lb. shall be charged four times the ordinary rate of freight.

Arrivals and Departures in 1908.

Registrar-General's Office, Wellington, 21st January, 1909.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1908, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The arrivals in the Dominion last year (44,970) were more than the number recorded in 1907 (36,108), and the departures during 1908, which numbered 30,709, were greater than those in the previous year—viz., 30,378.

The excess of arrivals over departures last year was 14,261, against 5,730 in 1907; but this last number was lowered by a special cause, the departures of persons who arrived in the latter months of the year 1906 to visit the Exhibition.

The interchange of people between New Zealand and the Commonwealth of Australia has been in favour of this Dominion, the gain being 5,301 persons after deducting departures to the Continent. The number of departures for other British possessions in 1908 (609) consists mainly of persons who left for British Columbia.

The comparative tables show that the Dominion has drawn to itself in each of the ten years 1899 to 1908 more population than it has parted with.

The figures under the heading "United Kingdom" for 1908 show an excess of 8,713 arrivals over the departures, from Australian States there is an excess of 5,301, and from other countries 247.

Of the 44,970 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 5,037, or 11.20 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 30,709 departures the children numbered 2,566, or 8.36 per cent.

Locality and Description.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of 6, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
