REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS. All fees under the Act shall be due and payable in advance. Where several properties are included in one form of application, there shall be charged in respect of each pro-perty an application fee and a fee for bringing the land under the Act. Land included within one outer boundary shall be deemed one property for the purpose of this regulation. In all cases a fee of £1 is hereby prescribed as the charge to be made for advertising notice of application: Provided that whenever it is necessary that unusual publicity shall be given to any application the District Land Registrar may require payment of such additional sum as shall, in his judgment, be sufficient to defray the cost of such advertise-ments. ments.

In all cases where application is made to bring land under the Act, and the certificate of title is directed to issue and is the Act, and the certificate of title is directed to issue and is issued in the name of the applicant, the fees for bringing such land under the Act, with the exception of the applica-tion fee, may, at the request of the applicant, remain unpaid until such land is dealt with by him as registered proprietor. The District Land Registrar shall retain any such certificate of title until the fees due upon the same have been paid, and, until such payment shall not register any dealing with the until such payment, shall not register any dealing with the land included in such certificate of title.

Printed forms for use under the Act are supplied by the Stamp Department at a charge of 1s. each. Solicitors, land-brokers, and others having forms printed for their own use, and at their own expense, shall, on approval of such forms by the Registrar, be entitled to have the same sealed free of charge.

Powers delegated to the Signal Hill Scenic Board under "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1908."

PLUNKET, Governor.

TN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section thirteen of "The Scenery Pre-servation Act, 1908," His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule below (being land re-served under the said Act), for the period of three years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, who shall be known as the Signal Hill Scenic Board, namely,—

The Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Otago Land District (ex officio); Thomas Ross, J.P., Ravensbourne; William Barclay, J.P., St. Leonards; Isaac Stevenson, St. Leonards; James Farquharson, J.P., Signal Hill; and Augustus Marshall, North-sast Valley

(herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust for the preservation of scenery, and subject to the conditions and regulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,---

MEETINGS.

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Tuesday in each of the months of March, May, August, and November in every year, at three o'clock p.m., at the District Lands Office, Dunedin, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Tuesday, the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, pro-Special meetings may be convened by the Obaliman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
 Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be the Chair-man of the Board, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meet-5. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meet-ing to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

OFFENCES.

9. Every person is liable to a penalty of one hundred pounds who, without the written consent of the Minister of Lands first obtained,—

- (a.) Lights a fire within the limits of the reserve; or
 (b.) Cuts or removes any timber or bush thereon; or
 (c.) In any way interferes with or damages the scenic or historic features thereof.

10. No person shall, within the limits of the reserve, with-out the written consent of the Board first obtained,—

- (a.) Take, carry, or use frearms, or any freworks, or any explosive, or any aze, tomahawk, weapon, or instrument of a dangerous nature:
 (b.) Shoot, snare, or destroy any bird, or take or destroy
- (c.) Shoot, kill, or injure any animal, or remove any animal therefrom :
- (d.) Damage any fence, gate, or barrier, or other property belonging to or in the custody of the Board:
 (e.) Destroy, deface, or injure any inscription, or any label attached to or connected with any article, or the second or tree, or shrub, or other plant, or copy of these conditions hung up or affixed at any entrance to or in any part of a reserve.

11. No horses, donkeys, sheep, goats, or cattle shall be allowed within the limits of the reserve without the written consent of the Board thereto being first obtained by the owners of such animals.

12. Any Inspector or person authorised for that purpose by the Board may drive any animal or animals trespassing in the reserve to the nearest public pound and there impound In the reserve to the nearest point point and there impound the same, and any such animal or animals shall not be re-leased therefrom except upon payment of the usual driving-fees and poundage charges. Nothing in this regulation contained shall be deemed to limit or prevent the taking of any proceedings for the recovery of any penalty or other-wise in respect of the trespass of such animal.

13. Wild cattle or horses trespassing within the limits of the reserve shall only be destroyed by persons authorised by the Board to do so, and such persons may be authorised to use firearms for that purpose.

14. No person shall, within the limits of the reserve, use any obscene or profane language, or commit any breach of the peace, act of indecency, or other impropriety, or insult or annoy any person.

15. No persons of bad repute, disorderly persons, or vagrants shall be allowed within the limits of the reserve. 16. Every person who commits any breach of Regulations Nos. 10 to 15 is liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

CHINESE.—Chinese are included in the population given above. The number in New Zealand on 31st December, 1908, was estimated to be 2,998, of whom 61 were females. REMARKS.—Excluding Maoris, the population increased by 31,158, or at the rate of 3:36 per cent., during the year. To this increase, excess of births over deaths contributed 16,897, and excess of arrivals over departures 14,261. The birth-rate for the Dominion in 1908 was 27:45 per 1,000 of mean population, and the death-rate 9:57, as against 27:30 and 10:95 respectively in 1907, the latter having been exceptionally high. The deaths in 1908 (9,043) were less than the number registered in 1907 (10,066) by 1,023, and the rate per 1,000 fell from 10:95 to 9:57.

fell from 10.95 to 9.57.

The number of marriages (excluding those contracted between Maoris) solemnised in 1908 is estimated at 8,220, giving a rate of 8.70 per 1,000 of the mean population, against 8,192 and 8.91, the actual number and rate in 1907.
