Locality and Description.

These sections are opposite the Ohakune Railway-station, on the North Island Main Trunk Railway line, about midway between Auckland and Wellington. The main town, distant rather more than a mile, contains a post and telegraph office, creamery, school, Town Hall, and numerous stores and accommodation-houses. Locality and Description of Reserves.
