MASTERTON FIRE BOARD BY-LAWS.

Br virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it in that behalf by section 43 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1908," the Masterton Fire Board hereby makes the following by-laws :-

Interpretation Clauses.

- "Brigade " means the Masterton Fire Brigade established
- and enrolled under the provisions of these by-laws. "Corps " means the Masterion Fire Police and Salvage Corps established and enrolled under the provisions
- of these by-laws. "District" means the Masterton Fire District, as defined in New Zealand Gazette of 16th May, 1907, No. 43,
- in New Zealand Gazette of 16th May, 1967, No. 43, page 1501.
 "Secretary" means the Secretary appointed by the Masterton Fire Board.
 "Superintendent" and "Deputy Superintendent" and "station-keeper" and "engine-driver" mean respectively the Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, and station-keeper and engine-driver of the Masterton Masterton Fire Brigade appointed by the Masterton
- Fire Board. "Street" means any public or private street, and in-cludes public places.

1. Discipline and Good Conduct.

1. Discipline and Good Conduct. The Superintendent shall have control and sole command of the brigade, and shall be responsible to the Board for the proper and efficient working and discipline of the brigade. He shall perform the duties set forth in the specification of duties under which he is appointed by the Board. The Deputy Superintendent shall assist and act under the direction of the Superintendent, in whose absence he shall take command of the brigade, and undertake all the duties and responsibilities of the office of Superintendent while so acting.

acting. The station-keeper and engine driver shall have charge of all stations, engines, plant, gear, and fire-extinguishing appliances of the Masterton Fire Board, and shall perform all the duties set forth in the specification of duties under which he is appointed by the Board. He shall be under the control of the Superintendent.

2. Fire Brigade.

The Secretary shall enrol the names of all persons now on the active roll of the Masterton Municipal Fire Brigade who volunteer their services as a fire brigade under the Masterton Fire Board.

Any vacancies in the brigade may with the approval of the Board be filled up.

The control of such fire brigade shall vest in the Superintendent appointed by the Board.

Fire Police and Salvage Corps.

The members of the force established by the Board under the authority of section 44 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1908," for the purpose of attending at fires and saving properties shall be enrolled by the Secretary as a fire police and

salvage corps. The control of such corps shall vest in and be exercised by the officer elected to be captain by the members and approved by the Board. The duty of such fire police shall be to attend at any fire, to aid and assist the regular Police Force, to watch over any properties saved, to preserve order, and to carry out any instructions which may be given by the Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent of the fire brigade in command on the spot. Such instructions to be conveyed as far as possible through the captain or officer in charge of the fire police.

3. Discipline and Management.

Subject to "The Fire Brigades Act, 1908," and these by-laws, the brigade and corps respectively may make rules and by-laws regulating the duties and elections of such other officers as are not otherwise provided for in these by-laws, and the internal management of the affairs of the brigade or

and the internal management of the affairs of the brigade or corps, and may from time to time amend, revoke, and make new by-laws. A copy of all such by-laws shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Board for approval. Any member of the brigade or corps who misconducts himself at a fire, meeting, or practice, or at any gathering where the brigade or corps is represented, or appears in a state of intoxication at any fire practice or meeting or gathering as aforesaid, or is insubordinate, or wilfully neg-lects to carry out the instructions of the Superintendent or officer in charge, shall be liable to instant dismissal, and shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

4. Gratuities for Volunteer or other Services.

For the performance of any volunteer or special services rendered by any person, whether a member of any brigade or not, in respect of any fire, there shall be paid out of the funds of the Board such sum as the Board or any committee authorised by the Board may direct, not exceeding the rate of 2s. per hour for the time occupied in such services.

5. Storage of Inflammable Goods.

(a.) No person shall keep or store on any premises any crates, cases, boxes, or other packages, either empty or containing paper, cardboard, or other similar inflammable materials, within 20ft. of any adjoining land, building,

materials, within 2017. or any aujoining rand, building, street, or right-of-way. (b.) No person shall keep or store any wood-shavings or other inflammable substance in any building situate at a less distance than 20 ft. from any adjoining land, building, street, or right-of-way

(c.) No person shall place, or keep stored, any stack of hay, straw, or other inflammable substance on any premises within the elstrict in the open air at a distance of less than 50 ft. from any building, fence, street, right-of-way, or

50 ft. from any building, fence, street, right-of-way, or adjoining land. (d.) No person shall keep or store any hay, straw, or other inflammable substance in any building within the district attached to or at a less distance than 30 ft. from any other building, unless the roof of such first mentioned building is covered with corrugated iron of not less than 26-gauge, or best quality slates or tiles, and its walls are constructed wholly of brick, stone, or concrete, or a combination of such materials; provided that this clause shall not apply to the case of any hay, straw, or agricultural produce required for the keeping of horses, and stored in any building used only for the bona fide purpose of or in connection with a stable. for the bona fide purpose of or in connection with a stable, the storing capacity of which does not exceed 2,000 cubic feet.

Electric Fire-alarm Circuits.

The Board may establish or contract with any person or corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm circuit, or may take over any such circuit now or hereafter established by the Masterton Borough Council, and may from time to time extend such circuit and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings and premises. All connections shall be carried out to the approval of the Board, at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected. The cost of maintenance of all public and private connections, and of the periodical examination and testing of such connections, shall be borne by the owner of the property connected, and all such conby the owner of the property connected, and all such con-nections shall be efficiently maintained to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner, such cost may be commute i to the payment of such annual sum as is agreed on between the Board and the owner.

Fires outside the District.

The Superintendent may render such assistance as he may deem necessary at any fire taking place outside the district, provided he can do so without jeopardizing the safety of the Masterton Fire District. For such assistance the Board may charge the owner of the property endangered such fees as will recoup the Board the costs incurred.

Inspection of Public Buildings.

The fee to be paid by the owner or occupier of any building for the inspection of such building, under the provisions of section 51 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1908," shall be accord-ing to the following scale :—

Penalty Clause.

Every person guilty of an offence against, or committing Every person guilty of an offence against, or committing any breach of or failing to perform any duty imposed upon him by, any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be liable for such offence, breach, or failure to such a penalty not exceeding £20 as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit; and in each case in which such offence, breach, or failure shall be a continuing one, to such a penalty not exceeding £5 as such Court shall think fit for every day or part of a day during which such offence, breach, or failure shall continue.


