A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Town Boards Act, 1908," that the Governor may declare that any area wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under "The Town Boards Act, 1908":

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Town Boards Act, 1908," and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said area shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district under "The Town Boards Act, 1908," by the name of the Warkworth Town District. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five members.

SCHEDULE.

WARKWORTH TOWN DISTRICT.

*Regulating the Representation of the Borough of Geraldine and the Town District of Pleasant Point on the Timaru Harbour Board.*

#### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS at the time when "The Timaru Harbour Board Loan Act, 1885" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), came into operation there was within the Geraldine Road District of the said harbour district a town district called the Geraldine Town District, which has since, by Proclamation dated the twenty-second day of December, one thousand nine hundred and four, been incorporated as a borough:

And whereas since the commencement of the said Act a town district, called the Pleasant Point Town District, situate within the boundaries of the Northern District, as defined by "The Timaru Harbour Board Amendment Act, 1906," of the County of Levels, within the said harbour district, has been constituted by Proclamation dated the twelfth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight:

And whereas by section twenty-five of the said Act it is provided that, in the event of any alteration in the territorial limits, designation, constitution, or other alteration whatsoever, in any borough, road district, town district, county, or place the ratepayers of which now have, or may hereafter have, the right to vote at the election of one or more members of the said Harbour Board, the Governor may, by Proclamation, make such changes in any or all of the districts or places entitled to elect such members, and in the names of such districts or places as in his opinion such alterations may render desirable:

Provided that the proportion of representation as at present existing shall be interfered with as little as possible by the changes so to be made:

Now, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by section twenty-five of the said Act, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that on and from the twenty-fifth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine, the electors of the Borough of Geraldine, situated within the Timaru Harbour District, shall be entitled to vote at the election of a member of the said Harbour Board for the Geraldine Road District, and for the purposes of section three of "The Timaru Harbour Board Act, 1882," the Borough of Geraldine shall be deemed to be included in the Geraldine Road District, and for voting purposes the electors' roll of the said borough shall be combined with the ratepayers' roll of the said road district.

And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers and authorities, I do hereby proclaim and declare that on and from the said twenty-fifth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine, the electors of the Town District of Pleasant Point, situated within the Timaru Harbour District, shall be entitled to vote at the election of members of the said Harbour Board for the Northern District of the County of Levels, and for the purposes of section three of "The Timaru Harbour Board Act, 1882," the Town District of Pleasant Point shall be deemed to be included in the said Northern District, and for voting purposes the electors' roll of the said town district shall be combined with the ratepayers' roll of the said Northern District.

*Regulations for Deer-shooting, Wanganui.*

PLUNKET, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1908" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Wanganui Acclimatisation District, comprising the Counties of Wanganui and Waitotara, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. FALLOW-deer bucks may be taken or killed within the Wanganui Acclimatisation District from the 1st day of April, 1909, to the 15th day of May, 1909, both days inclusive.

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Wanganui on payment of a license fee of £1, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations. The number of such licenses shall not exceed thirty: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than two bucks, and no buck shall be killed carrying antlers with less than four points.

4. No doe or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Postmaster of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer; such notice to be posted, or delivered, or telegraphed three clear days before such date.

6. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorising any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

7. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

*Regulations under Part VIII of "The Land Act, 1908."*

PLUNKET, Governor.

WHEREAS by section two hundred and sixty-nine of "The Land Act, 1908" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time make regulations for any of the purposes enumerated therein: And whereas it is expedient to revoke all regulations heretofore made under "The Mining Districts Land Occupation Act, 1894," and in lieu thereof to make the regulations for the several purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby revoke all regulations heretofore made under "The Mining Districts Land Occupation Act, 1894," and in lieu thereof do hereby make the following regulations for the issue of leases for the occupation for agricultural or horticultural purposes of Crown lands and reserves within mining districts other than Native reserves not set apart for mining, or land reserved for Native purposes, or an education or university endowment, or any reserve vested in trustees or any local body.

REGULATIONS.

1. The lease to be granted under these regulations shall be termed an "occupation lease." Every person desirous of obtaining an occupation lease for agricultural or horticultural purposes of any reserve or portion of any reserve set apart for mining purposes, or any other Crown land within any mining district not exceeding 100 acres, shall make application to the Commissioner of Crown Lands or the District Land Officer of the land district in which the land applied for is situated, in the form of the First Schedule to these regulations, or to the like effect.

2. Every application for other than a whole section or whole sections of surveyed land shall state the estimated area, and shall be accompanied by a tracing or sketch from a survey map sufficient to identify the particular area applied for.

3. Every application for unsurveyed land shall contain a written description of the land, with estimated area, and the boundaries shall, so far as practicable, be straight lines, roads, existing survey lines, or natural boundaries.

4. Should the land applied for be unsurveyed, the applicant shall, within thirty days of the notification to him of the approval of his application, deposit the estimated cost of surveying the area applied for, otherwise the application shall be deemed to be cancelled and withdrawn.

5. Every applicant for surveyed land shall pay an amount equal to a half-year's rent within thirty days of his application being granted. He shall also pay for the lease a fee of £1 1s. for the preparation and registration thereof, otherwise the application shall be deemed to be withdrawn and void.

6. Every application shall be advertised by and at the expense of the applicant twice in such one newspaper, or once each in such two newspapers, as the Commissioner of Crown Lands or District Land Officer may direct, and copies of such newspaper or newspapers shall be produced by the applicant at the hearing.

7. If there is no valid objection, and the Commissioner of Crown Lands or District Land Officer is not aware of any sufficient reason why a lease should not issue, the Land Board may grant to the applicant an occupation lease of the land applied for, or such portion thereof as they deem expedient, and such lease shall be in the form of the Second Schedule to these regulations, or to the like effect.

8. In granting any such lease, the Commissioner of Crown Lands may impose such special conditions as he deems advisable.

9. In the event of any person objecting to the granting of an occupation lease, he shall set forth the grounds of objection in writing to the Commissioner of Crown Lands or District Land Officer, and also serve a copy thereof on the Warden and upon the applicant, three days at least before the expiration of the notice; and the person objecting may, at a meeting of the Land Board, urge the objection personally or by agent. The Land Board may refuse any application if the whole or part of the land is auriferous, or for any other reason in its discretion, whether objections are lodged or not.

10. The lessee shall pay to the Receiver of Land Revenue during the currency of the lease the half-yearly rental in advance, on the 1st days of January and July in each year. The rent shall be fixed by the Board, and shall not be less than at the rate of 6d. for every acre or portion of an acre per annum, with a minimum annual rental of £1.

11. Occupation leases will be granted for the term of twenty-one years; but at the expiration of the term the lease may be renewed, subject, however, in each case to the provisions of sections 277 and 278 of the said Act.

12. Free access shall be given to and over the land occupied under any such lease to holders of miners' rights for the purpose of enabling them to cut and remove timber (except kauri or reserved trees) for fencing and for their own domestic use, or for props, caps, laths, sluice-boxes, or paving-blocks for sluice-boxes, to be used in connection with claims held by them personally or conjointly with others, or in which they are working as wages-men; also to prospect for gold, and to mark out and take up claims, and to take levels for and mark out the proposed course and position of races, dams, tunnels, and tramways for mining purposes; and the Warden may on application grant any such claim, race, or other mining privilege without any compensation to the lessee, subject, however, that, if the land or any portion thereof is cultivated or otherwise improved, such cultivated or improved land shall not, unless by consent of the lessee, be interfered with or taken possession of for mining purposes until after three months' notice to the lessee, who shall be entitled to compensation for any buildings or other substantial improvements that he may have on the land, and if the land is in crop he shall be allowed a reasonable time to save and remove the crop.

13. In case any portion of any land occupied under any such lease shall be taken for mining purposes, the lessee shall be entitled to a reduction of rent in proportion to the acreage so taken, or to apply for an equal area of adjacent Crown land, subject to objection as in case of an original application.

14. The lessee shall reside upon and occupy the whole of the land held under his lease, subject, however, to the provisions of sections 159 to 161 of the said Act.

15. The lessee shall put on the land comprised in his lease substantial improvements as follows:—

- (a.) Within one year from the date of his lease, to an amount equal to 10 per centum of the value of the land.
- (b.) Within two years from the date of his lease, to an amount equal to another 10 per centum of the value of the land.
- (c.) And thereafter, but within six years from the date of his lease, to an amount equal to another 10 per centum of the value of the land.

And in addition thereto, within six years from the date of his lease, he shall put on the land substantial improvements of a permanent character to the value of £1 for every acre of first-class land and 10s. for every acre of second-class land comprised in the lease.

16. Improvements may consist of reclamation from swamps, clearing of bush, planting with trees or hedges, cultivation of gardens, fencing, draining, making roads, wells, water-tanks,

water-races, sheep-dips, embankments, or protective works, or in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil, or the erection of any building, &c.; and cultivation includes the clearing of land for cropping, or clearing and ploughing for laying down with artificial grasses, &c.

17. If it is shown to the satisfaction of the Warden that the ground occupied under any lease or any portion thereof contains a payable deposit of gold, then any miner may lodge an application at the nearest Warden's Office for leave to mine upon or under the ground thus occupied. The applicant shall serve the lessee with a true copy of such application, and such application and any objections that may be made thereto shall be heard by the Warden in accordance with the provisions of the mining regulations.

18. Upon proof of the service of the copy of application upon the lessee, and upon hearing such application and objections (if any), the Warden may refuse to grant the application, or may grant the same upon the applicant depositing in Court such amount as, in addition to the amount standing at the credit of the Mining Districts Land Occupation Account, the Warden may consider sufficient to repay the lessee the compensation provided for in section 276 of the said Act for the loss of or damage that may be done to the dwellinghouse, buildings, orchard, or garden, or other improvements made under the lease, as the result of such grant.

19. The provisions of sections 82 to 94, inclusive, of the said Act shall apply to all leases granted under these regulations.

*Regulations as to the Introduction of Cattle into the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope.—Notice No. 1276.*

Department of Agriculture,

THE following regulations of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, dated 16th December, 1908, as to the examination and quarantine of cattle introduced into that colony, are published for general information.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The word "cattle" in these regulations shall be taken to mean and include all animals of the bovine tribe.
2. Importation will be permitted only through the Ports of Cape Town, Port Elizabeth, and East London.
3. All cattle, save as hereafter excepted, imported from any country whatsoever oversea shall be subjected by a Government Veterinary Surgeon to the test known as the tuberculin test.
4. Immediately upon arrival the cattle shall be removed for quarantine purposes to a place provided by the Government, or by the owners or importers, subject to the approval of the inspecting officer, and there quarantined for a period of not less than thirty days, upon the expiration of which period they shall be subjected by a Government Veterinary Surgeon to the necessary testing by tuberculin to ascertain whether they are or are not affected with tuberculosis.
5. The owners or importers shall receive the cattle at the ship's side and deliver them at their own risk at the place of quarantine.
6. In the event of the test indicating the existence of tuberculosis, the animals shall not be removed alive from the place of quarantine, but shall be destroyed there; and the owner or importer shall be allowed to deal with the carcasses as he may think fit, provided, however, that the flesh shall not be used for human consumption unless the said Government Veterinary Surgeon or a medical officer shall give a certificate that it is fit for that purpose.
7. All expenses of inspection, quarantine, testing, destruction, and otherwise shall be borne by the owner or importer of such cattle, and shall be at the rate of 5s. per head for every day such cattle are necessarily detained for these purposes, which fee shall also be payable by the owner or importer for each day such cattle remain at the place of quarantine owing to failure on the part of the owner or importer to remove such cattle or to pay such expenses. In the event of the owner or importer failing to pay within one month of completion of the quarantine all expenses which have accrued, such cattle may be sold by the Government, the proceeds to be handed over to the owner or importer after deduction of the expenses incurred, or such expenses or any balance thereof as may be recovered at law.
8. The Government shall not be responsible for any loss or damage due to unavoidable accidents by fire or otherwise to the cattle while in charge of the Government or its duly authorised representative.
9. The foregoing regulations shall not necessarily apply to cattle imported from oversea and consigned direct by rail to any other colony or State in South Africa, nor shall they apply to cattle imported solely for purposes of slaughter, provided that, before they are landed, they shall be inspected by the Government Veterinary Surgeon and declared to the best of his belief to be not unfit for human consumption; and the owner or importer shall sign and deliver to such officer an undertaking to the effect that none of such animals shall be used or disposed of for any other purpose than for immediate slaughter for food.

## SUMMARY FOR JANUARY, 1909.

THE weather during the month of January was, on the whole, very unsettled and unseasonably cold. Rainfall was considerably above the average in nearly all stations in the South Island, and also somewhat above the average on the west coast of the North Island to the south of Auckland, but dry and cool elsewhere, especially in Hawke's Bay, where the rainfall is about one-fifth of the average of previous years.

Westerly types of weather prevailed, the barometer being generally below the average and subject to constant fluctuations. The lowest pressure, 28·88, occurred at the Bluff on the 24th, and the highest, 30·31, at Cape Campbell on the 28th. From the 1st to the 9th low pressure prevailed south of New Plymouth and Castlepoint, accompanied by cold and showery weather, but with strong westerly winds and unsettled weather in the north. Anticyclonic conditions with fine weather prevailed in the south from the 9th to the 11th, but pressure remained lower in the north, with very unsettled weather. From the 12th to the 16th rain was very general, being experienced first in the south and spreading northwards. From the 18th to the 22nd the weather was mostly fine, with moderate northerly winds. A westerly area of very low pressure followed on the 23rd, and heavy rain was general over the South Island and also over south-western aspect of the North Island. Pressure recovered rapidly on the 25th and 26th, but was not accompanied by such intense weather conditions as might have been expected. From the 28th to the 30th the heaviest rains were generally experienced in the North Island, accompanied by only slight dips in the barometer.

Mr. H. B. Devereux, of Waihi, records that heavy rain and strong winds occurred on the 28th and 29th, and squally winds and heavy showers on the 30th and 31st. He also reports that he observed "some very remarkable sunsets on 7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th, when the vegetation assumed some extraordinary tints. It would," he says, "be interesting to know whether they were caused by an abnormal quantity of dust-particles in the higher atmosphere, the result of volcanic activity or magnetic disturbance."

Mr. C. Jepson on the 30th notes: "9 a.m. raining steadily from the west; 10.45 cleared up, and sun came out in a clear deep-blue sky, and weather became very hot; at 3.20 p.m. the rumblings of thunder were heard in the east, and storm-clouds began to gather in that quarter, but I only observed one flash of lightning. The clouds assumed an inky blackness and approached with great rapidity. Rain fell in large drops and thickened till the whole place was aswim. The rain continued until dark and then moderated, but showers occurred through the night. This heavy rainfall did a lot of damage to turnip and grain crops."

Teachers' Certificate Examinations, 1909.

Education Department,  
Wellington, 19th February, 1909.

THE following lists contain statements of the principal results of the examinations held in January. In the preparation of the lists consideration has been given to candidates' successes at previous examinations for teachers' certificates and at University examinations.

The first list (I) contains the names of the successful candidates for Classes B, C, and D. Teachers certificates will be issued to such of these as have produced satisfactory evidence of age, have passed the special medical examination prescribed, and have fulfilled the necessary conditions as to length of service and efficiency in teaching. The second list (II) gives the names of those who have passed the examination for a certificate except in one or two subjects. Those candidates for the Class C examination who, though not entitled to be placed in the second list, passed in a "section" under clause 26 of the regulations, are included in the third list (III). In the fourth list (IV) are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of special mention, in accordance with clause 40.

The next examination will take place in January, 1910, beginning about the 5th day of the month. Notice must be sent to the "Inspector-General of Schools, Wellington," so as to reach him not later than the 30th September. Candidates that have obtained "partial pass" must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to

receive any further intimation of the date at which the notices become due. Forms of application can be obtained at the office of the Department or of any Education Board.

Certificated teachers that have gained promotion at this examination may send their certificates to the Department for endorsement.

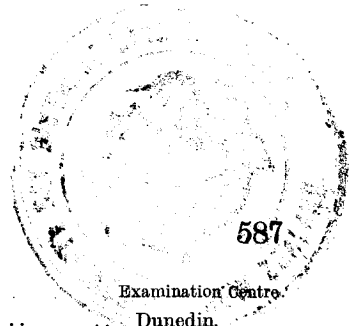
